Council News

GOVERNANCE

Human Resource Movements

Council is currently advertising for a Customer Service position this is to replace Amber Bawden who resigned prior to Christmas.

Council this month farewells Luke Kelly from its town maintenance team, Luke leaves Council to take up a position with a local private company and we wish Luke all the best in his future endeavors.

Council Office Lift Installation

Construction drawings have been completed and provided to consultants who are developing Tender Documents that are due for release last week in January.

Generators Main Office

Local Government Procurement are currently preparing tenders for Generators for the main office.

REGULATORY

Cat Trap and Trapping Policy

Council staff reviewed the existing Policy and identified that current practice was for hirers to pay a fully refundable deposit upon hiring.

The policy and fees have been amended in that hirers will now only receive a partial return on their deposit when hiring.

Boat Ramp Permit Policy

Council has reviewed the Policy and amended clauses regarding registers of annual permits to be kept enabling notification of permits expiring and time limits to be applied to those not displaying their permits to the latest period they can present a valid permit to Council.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Patrol Grading

December saw some reactive works being undertaken and Council has been utilising contractors and hire plant to keep up with its maintenance requirements.

With the recent heavy rain events our graders will be prioritising those roads that have a combination of the worst affected and the highest traffic volumes. This will form a challenging time for Council as we attempt to repair these roads.

Road Construction

Council has been working out on Cape Bauer Loop and will continue this as weather conditions permit.

It was intended that following this road construction would move to Poochera-Port Kenny Road (Inkster Road to Conglima Road), however storm damage repair will now need to be prioritised.

Streaky Bay Jetty Pool Shade and Shelter

Designs have been completed and currently awaiting independent design verification.

Hally's Boardwalk Repairs

Restoration work on the boardwalk providing access to Hally's beach has been completed and access has reopened. The boardwalk was damaged via a significant weather event and required extensive restoration work to ensure its safety.

Streaky Bay Jetty Platform

Demolition work on the jetty platform has been completed and the new poles and decking has arrived. The reconstruction works, including concreting have begun. Completion planned for February - March 2022, depending on availability of some critical products.

Wells Street / Western Transit Loop Upgrade

Survey work has been completed, and final construction drawings are being prepared. Upon completion of the final construction drawings, Tenders for works will be called via SA Tenders.

Vehicles and Machinery

We are in the process of trading in and upgrading 2 x Utes (Toyota Hilux Tailgate Loader & Toyota Hilux Tipper), 1 x SUV (Toyota Kluger), 2 x Graders (one in the 22/23 FY). Request for Quotes have been called through the LGA Vendor Panel.

Glass Crusher

A Request for Quote is out for a new Glass Crusher for the Transfer Station.

Robinson Basin Development

Council received notification from Crown Lands in late December advising that SA Water's care and control had been revoked and would now be vested in Council. Council staff will be providing a further detailed report to Council in March 2022.

COMMUNITY

Streaky Bay Area School Pool

The Streaky Bay Area School Pool has now been opened, the initial phases have been challenging with staffing and extreme weather events.

A reminder that third party or private hire of the Pool needs to be undertaken through the Streaky Bay Area School.

Streaky Bay Hall Airconditioning Upgrade

During the installation phase of this project, it was identified that power supply to the hall to adequately service the air-conditioning units in at an upgrade was required. Council has been liaising with SA Power Networks to undertake this work and it is due for completion mid-February.

TOURISM AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

District Town Management Plan Development Council staff are currently preparing a briefing document to be utilized in a tender process to engage a consultant to review its Streaky Bay Town Masterplan and District Management Plan(s) incorporating its rural townships and coastal settlements.

The current document was undertaken in approximately 2010 and Council is acutely aware given the recent increases in visitation and resident population growth that it is of vital importance these documents be reviewed.

Tractor Beach Campground Development

Infrastructure has been completed and campground sites to the newly developed area. Council staff in the coming weeks will be tidying up the old camping area, further access management and working on signage options that were delayed due to holiday period closures.

It was good to see this holiday period that there was no camping occurring on the crown land to the west of the site, where native vegetation survey's have identified the west coast mint bush that is listed as vulnerable under the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999.*

CEO UPDATE

From the CEO's desk

Streaky Bay and its surrounds are one of the most beautiful places in Australia and it is clear to see why so many people want to visit or live here. Over the summer period, one of the things I've noticed is caravans parking on vacant blocks and regarding this I just wanted to bring some clarification about the matter.

Under the Planning, Development and Infrastructure Act 2016 (PDI Act); the only time where a caravan does not require approval to be located on an allotment is when it is parked on the occupant's residential property with an existing dwelling. Therefore, the parking and/or living in a caravan on land without an existing dwelling will require Development Approval.

If someone reports to Council that an individual has a caravan on a vacant block, Council Officers will assess whether an appropriate Development Approval is in place. If not, Council officers will contact the owners of the block and request that they remove the caravan. If this doesn't occur, Council will then issue the owners of the block with an enforcement notice pursuant to Section 213 of the PDI Act providing them with the direction to remove the caravan.

If the owner doesn't comply with that direction, Council will remove the caravan and charge the cost of doing so (pursuant to Section 213(6) of the PDI Act). If required to do so, Council will store the caravan and will advise the owner where and when they can pick it up.

Council Waste Matters

The holiday period has seen a large increase in waste and recycling items being taken to the Transfer Station. Our staff have been working hard to keep up with this increase.

Cardboard drop offs have increased over the last couple of months, from businesses, residents and visitors. Cardboard is free to drop off at the Transfer Station and greatly reduces the volume in your kerbside bin reducing what goes to landfill.

The cardboard is baled on site and freighted to YCA Recycling in Adelaide for recycling. A truck load of 80 bales was transported in January.

A reminder that the transfer station accepts the following non-deposit items for recycling:-

- Plastic milk and cream bottles, washed with the lids removed opaque in colour
- Cardboard, cut or broken up into pieces that fit into a 240litre wheelie bin (please note that cardboard and cardboard boxes not to the correct size will be charged)
- Tin and steel cans, e.g. fruit tins, soup cans, etc. washed with the lid put inside the tin

Please ensure your waste is sorted prior to arrival, this avoids contamination of waste.

The Environment Protection Authority (EPA) has imposed strict conditions on the disposal of waste in South Australia. The attendant will direct you to where your waste is to be placed – penalties will be imposed on Council for contaminated waste by the EPA. Your cooperation in sorting your waste is greatly appreciated.

The attendant has *the right to refuse* any waste that is not sorted.

Other items which are free to drop off at the Transfer Station are:

- Green waste please see attendant before dropping off
- Steel; and
- Car Batteries

Strengthening Rural Communities – Round 12

The Rural and Regional Enterprise Scholarships (RRES) program

The Rural and Regional Enterprise Scholarships (RRES) program was announced in 2016 as part of the Australian Government's election commitment to improve access, educational opportunities and attainment for regional and remote Australians by supporting undergraduate, postgraduate and vocational education and training students from Certificate IV to PhD level. Scholarships support flexible study arrangements, and are available to eligible students:

- commencing a new course of study in 2021
- studying on campus, online or via distance education
- studying from six months full-time up to eight years part-time
- Éligible students may receive up to \$18,000 each (e.g. for a full-time, four-year qualification). Shorter, part-time qualifications are paid on a pro rata basis. An extra \$500 is also available to support an internship. Note: If you are a school leaver relocating from an outer regional or remote area to study, you may also be eligible for the Tertiary Access Payment.

Boosting Apprenticeships

The Boosting Apprenticeship Commencements wage subsidy supports businesses and Group Training Organisations to take on new apprentices and trainees, to build a pipeline of skilled workers to support sustained economic recovery.

Through the subsidy, any business or Group Training Organisation that engages an Australian Apprentice between 5 October 2020 and 31 March 2022 may be eligible for a subsidy of 50 per cent of wages paid to a new or recommencing apprentice or trainee for a 12-month period from the date of commencement to a maximum of \$7,000 per quarter. 
Business hardship grant - \$6,000 for employing businesses or \$2,000 for non-employing businesses.

STREAKY BAY INDOOR BOWLS


The current SA Covid restrictions have brought the indoor bowls activities to a halt.




