#### **Council News**

#### GOVERNANCE

#### Supplementary Election Results

Local Government Elections are held every four (4) years to determine the membership of each Council. The elections must be held in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government (Elections) Act 1999. After the conclusion of the Local Government Elections in 2022, there was one position left vacant for the ward of Eyre. Therefore, a supplementary was required to be held.

The nomination period for the supplementary election opened on 13 January 2023 and closed at 12 noon on 27 January 2023. During the nomination period a total of 1 candidate nominations were received: LA CHINA, Guy (Eyre Ward) As the number of candidates nominated to contest the supplementary election didn't exceed the number of persons required to be elected. The one nomination has been elected unopposed.

#### LG (Casual Vacancies) Amendment Act 2023

Council was unfortunately subjected to the outfall of alleged failure to lodge Campaign Donation Returns on time in accordance with the *Local Government (Elections) Act 1999* (LGE Act) with four members affected, that under Section 54(1)(h) required them to vacate their passion of office.

On 9<sup>th</sup> March 2023, the Local Government (Casual Vacancies) Amendment Act 2023 (the Amendment Act) had received the Governor's assent and has therefore come into effect. This means that —

- effectively mean the office held by the defaulting member was never vacant (s.54(1a)(a); and
- provide that nothing done or purportedly done by the defaulting member in the performance or discharge of official functions or duties during the defaulting period is invalid or unlawful (s.54(1a)(b)(i)); and
- provide that no allowances or other entitlements paid or payable to a defaulting member during the defaulting period is to be recovered or withheld (s.54(1a)(b)(ii)).

This also means that **defaulting members** automatically resumed all other offices held in their capacity as a member of the council (e.g. Deputy Mayor, committee member, council appointment to external body). This is consistent with the resolution passed by Council during February's Ordinary Council meeting.

#### Staffing News

#### Finance and Risk Audit Committee

A meeting was held on 9 February 2023 to review its work program, review policies, investments and borrowings, Asset Management and Long-Term Financial Plans.

#### ESCOSA Local Government Advice Scheme

In April 2022 following the State Government of SA's Local Government Reform, amendments to the Local Government Act were made by which the State Government introduced an advisory scheme that aims to give ratepayers confidence that the rates they pay are set at the level necessary for their Council to provide the services they value. The Essential Services Commission (ESCOSA) is the advisory body and the State's 68 Councils are subject to the scheme, with this review to occur once across a four-year cycle.

The advice to be provided under the scheme is meant to provide independent and transparent information on matters which will be key to those discussions and decisions. The advice is also meant to provide to ratepayers and other interested stakeholders an independent consideration of council's plans, thereby adding value across local communities.

This advice review does not come without a financial cost and the Commission has made a final determination of the scheme costs (which are payable by individual Councils to the Commission) and allocation methodology for the initial four-year cycle of the scheme, as follows:

- 1. Total annual Commission costs: \$680,000 (for each year of the initial four-year cycle)
- 2. Allocation methodology: equal split between councils
- 3. Cost per advice per council: \$40,000, or \$10,000 per annum.

#### Passing of Former Chairman – Peter Dodgson

Council received the unfortunate news of the passing of former Council Chairman Peter Dodgson. Mr Dodgson was Council's chairman from 1977 – 1984.

#### COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

#### Lions Park Renaming

Recently Council Officers had undertaken public consultation regarding design concepts for the Lions Park redevelopment. One of the by-products of this consultation was feedback that Council should rename the park to a name which provides more local context and identity; as many townships across Australia have parks named the Lions Park. Since the consultation process, Council Officers have since received further written correspondence about the matter.

Council considered various options and endorsed at the March 2023 meeting that the Park solely be named "Pioneer Park" to recognise its original name which honours the pioneers who introduced Agricultural production to the region in the mid 1800's. This will be reflected in the new signage for the Park.

#### Volunteer Training Program

The Community Development team are currently sourcing quotes to deliver the Volunteer program. This program will be delivered through online and face to face workshops. The workshops will include event management, grant writing, good governance, sport and recreation, social media, liquor licencing, food safety and WHS. These workshops will be free for any committee or community group within our District to attend.

The first workshop was the Grant Writing workshop which that was hosted in a face to face and online capacity on Friday 31 March and Sunday 2 April this was well received and hopefully community members gained some tricks and tips.

#### Movie Nights

Council hosted it's first "Outdoor" movie night on Friday 17 March at Poochera Sports Oval, with the family movie Bad Guys.

The Poochera Sporting Complex opened the bar and provided light meals and snacks, and the event was supported by over 100 persons (with approximately 65 children). The night couldn't have been better weather wise and was positively reported by those that attended.

The next part of the roadshow is proposed for Wirrulla and officers will be liaising to ascertain suitable dates for this.

#### Adelaide Guitar Festival

The Adelaide Guitar Festival will be hosted in Streaky Bay on Saturday 1 July at the Community complex. The CDS will liaise with festival organisers for advertising closer to the event.

#### Local Drug and Alcohol – Community Action Plan

The Community Action Plan has been developed following the distribution of a community survey. The plan has been submitted to the Drug and Alcohol Foundation with a program of events scheduled between May 2023 and May 2024.

#### School Pool Season

Due to the availability of Pool Supervisors and limited usage of the pool in the past month, Council will be closing the Pool Season early, the last day of opening will be Friday 14 April 2023.

#### PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT

#### Planning Enforcement

Council Officers are continuing to work through a considerable number of complaints with the enforcement of planning issues, noting that they are doing this slowly to ensure everyone is provided with procedural fairness. It should also be highlighted that in the last census period we had 208 people identified as living in a caravan, compared to 2016 where there were only 144 individuals living in a caravan, demonstrating this is a growing problem in the district.

#### Sceale Bay/Heart Bay Access

Council Officers are continuing to work through the required processes to develop proposals and arrangements that will seek to support the continued access to these locations.

#### INFRASTRUCTURE

#### Western Transit Loop Project

We have engaged SGS Economics & Planning to undertake the cost benefit analysis of the project. SGS has developed economic appraisals (also known as cost benefit analysis) across a range of infrastructure, regulatory and service delivery proposal and has done some considerable projects for major clients, such as Infrastructure NSW . This work should be completed in eight weeks, and it should be noted that the cost benefit analysis will

be an important piece of work for any funding applications for the project in the future.

#### Roads Construction

- Emerald Rise Road 2 sections completed
- Westall Way Loop 5km Completed
- Barrets Road 2.5km completed
- Woorong Boolong Rd 6.7km underway
- Chilpenunda Road Rip & Relay underway

#### Lawn Scarifying

The contractor completed this work on the week beginning 20 of March. Post work, the lawn may look like its dying. Although it can be a bit of a shock at first, but the lawn will recover amazingly quickly and look all the better for it (as we are now seeing). The rate at which the lawn recovers can vary depending on weather conditions and the initial quality of the lawn – we are anticipating three to six weeks for the recovery of our lawns (just in time for ANZAC day).

#### Lions Park Development

Council Officers are now commencing the procurement process for the project, there is a list of project components that Council will be seeking local trades for advertised following this section.

#### Streaky Bay Town Entrance Statement Design See separate media release.

#### Waste Management

In early March a working bee was held to clean up the transfer station yard which included picking up loose rubbish, sorting and separating waste, sweeping the bitumen, slashing and mowing of the surrounds. It was a great show of teamwork from the park and gardens team, transfer station and various staff from the Infrastructure and Prosperity administration teams. Styrofoam was most of the waste that staff picked up from site. Council officers are continuing to work on strategies to address some of the key issues and will find an immediate solution for storing Styrofoam. We are continuing to see large volumes of cardboard with some businesses dropping off a full trailer load 2-3 times per week.


#### Streaky Bay Tree Management Assessment

Assessments for the Lions Park and Foreshore Tourist Park have been completed and associated works will now be considered, and an action plan developed accordingly.

Council Officers will be, following the completion of the project, inviting the consultants to undertake a community presentation that will enable interested community members to ask questions and seek clarification on any queries they may have regarding tree management within the township.

#### **ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT**

#### Visitor Centre Numbers



The Visitor centre has continued to see a large numbers of visitors, February recorded 733 visitors which is the highest number ever recorded for February.

#### Office for Regional Housing

The Office for Regional Housing has been created to tackle the unique housing challenges facing regional South Australia by:

 Facilitating the development of new key worker rental housing in regional South Australia through the Regional Key Worker Housing Scheme;

 and supporting the planning and implementation of housing projects through advice and assistance The Office for Regional Housing will, where possible, help to facilitate housing projects identified by local governments, regional employers, the development industry and other peak bodies that provide strategic affordable and key worker housing in the regions.

The new Regional Key Worker Housing Scheme aims to create a continuous pipeline of homes, and in the first instance, will facilitate the delivery of housing to attract and retain police, teachers and healthcare workers in key country areas.

A pilot program will be immediately rolled out to deliver approximately 30 homes for these key services across the Copper Coast, Riverland, Mount Gambier, Port Augusta and Ceduna.

Houses delivered under the scheme may be sold to private investors under long-term lease arrangements. The construction of these houses is expected to reduce pressure on the private rental market.

Following the delivery of the pilot program, there is scope for it to be expanded to other regions and be available to organisations seeking to secure long-term access to new, fit-for-purpose housing for their workers.

The Office for Regional Housing reports to Renewal SA's Chief Executive, the Urban Renewal Authority Board of Management and the Minister for Housing and Urban Development.

The Office will work with local councils, regional businesses, builders, and investors to coordinate the scheme. In addition, the Office will work with these partners to help facilitate other housing projects that specifically contribute to key strategic and economic objectives, and reflective of the unique challenge faced across the state.

#### Murphy's Haystacks Development

Road intersection development has been progressed during the month of December, upon completion of the intersection upgrade the require infrastructure will be purchased for the site, designs and styles have been selected in conjunction with the site owner, it is hoped to have the project completed prior to the end of May 2023.

#### Business/Private Use of Roads and Policy Guidelines

Council endorsed the above policy in recognition and support of the practice of selling or promoting some products from public roads within the Council area and acknowledges the need for appropriate permit procedures and guidelines for these activities to ensure public safety and fair sharing of Council's Road reserve spaces.

This permit system is intended to guide how public road verges are to be used for business and other related purposes in ways that ensure an appropriate balance between the interests of the Council, street traders, residents, and visitors.

This Policy does not apply to mobile food van vendors.

Council Officers in coming months will be seeking to renew and implement all permits relating to the Policy.

#### Business/Private Use of Council Land Policy Guidelines

\*\* Markets, Events, Private Gatherings, Sales \*\*

Council has now put in place a policy that supports procedural and legislative requirements for the use of Council Land for Business or Private Purposes. Under the Local Government Act 1999 a person must not use public land for business purposes unless the use is approved by the Council. Business purposes include the use of land even if it is not intended to make a profit.

Council recognises and supports the practice of selling or promoting some products and hosting of events and other activities from Council Land or Facilities within the Council area and acknowledges the need for appropriate permit procedures and guidelines for these activities to ensure public safety and fair sharing of Council's public spaces (excluding roads).

This permit system is intended to guide how public spaces and facilities are to be used for business and other private purposes in ways that ensure an appropriate balance between the interests of the Council, traders, residents, and visitors.

The permit system (Policy) will include the use of Council Land and Reserves for purposes of construction and building.

#### **CEO UPDATE**

From the CEO's desk

Being a responsible dog owner while at the beach.

Over the past couple of months, we have received numerous complaints about the behaviour of dogs on our beaches. These complaints range from dog poo not being cleaned up, dogs being unsecured while the owner is surfing, dogs not being under effective control while being in an off-leash area and numerous other issues. So, I thought I would take the time to cover the topic of being a responsible dog owner while at the beach.

When does my dog need to be on a lead on the beach?

There are numerous areas where your dog is required to be on the lead on our beaches. All of these areas have signs in the carparks which denote where a dog is required to be on a lead. In the coming months we will be stepping up our patrols of the beaches and it should be noted that infringement notices will be issued if your dog is off the leash in an on the leash area.

Why can't my dog run wild at an off the leash area?

When your dog is at an off the leash area, you still need the dog under effective control. This means your dog needs to be under voice control, within sight and near you at all times. If you can't call your dog away from another person or dog, don't let them off lead.

Please also be courteous of others sharing the off lead space with you. Call your dog away from other dogs or people, unless they are obviously seeking interaction. Remember regardless of your dog's size, temperament or age they are not permitted to jump on another, person or animal or be causing any discomfort to other beach users.

Also, remember if you are out in the surf and your dog is unsecured in an off the leash area. This wouldn't be deemed as being under effective control. Remember, there are provisions under the Dog and Cat Management Act 1995 to issue infringement notices if your dog isn't under effective control.

What is the deal with dog poo?

A single dog poo can contaminate water in an area the size of a tennis court. When animal waste ends up in the water it decomposes, using up oxygen. During summer months, low dissolved oxygen levels harm fish and other aquatic life. Dog

poo can also contain bacteria and parasites, causing infections in other animals, humans and sea life.

Walking your dog in public does require you to carry a suitable dog waste bag at all times. The District Council of Streaky Bay does provide dog waste bags within various high use locations around our district however this this provided as an additional courtesy and should not be exclusively relied on. Please remember to always pick up after your dog and dispose of the bag in an appropriate bin.

Land nesting birds

Many varieties of land nesting birds call the beaches in the District Council of Streaky Bay home. These birds are incredibly vulnerable and we would love to see them grow and fly to their full potential.

Dogs being curious and friendly souls do like to explore and get close to these birds which is one of the main threats to their survival. As much as it may appear that the dogs are "playing" they are indeed causing great distress to these birds. When you do see a sign indicating the birds are nesting or notice a nest please leash your dog, only walk below the high tide mark and move away quietly.

The dunes

Dog poo is harmful to dune habits; it changes soil chemistry which is bad news for wildflowers. It can also contain diseases and parasites which may be fatal to creatures that live in the dunes. When accessing the beaches, please stick to the path, keep your dog on the path as well and pick up their poo.

To help protect our coast, remember:

- Keep your dog on a lead at the beach and don't let them wander through the dunes.
- Keep cats inside at night and avoid letting them roam through the coastal reserve.
- Do not dump lawn clippings or general rubbish in coastal areas.
- Do not plant exotic vegetation (including lawn) on public land.
- Plant native coastal plants in your garden (you can find these at local nurseries).
- Use designated paths when going to and from the beach.

#### Media Release

Council decides on a finalised township entry statement design for Streaky Bay

Community consultation has been completed and during Council's ordinary March meeting, Council had endorsed the preferred concept design for finalisation and construction.

The endorsed concept received the overwhelming community support during consultation. With four different concept designs being presented and over 40% of the community respondents identifying the endorsed design as their preferred design and 63% of the student respondents who were surveyed as part of their school activities identifying the endorsed design as their preferred design.


In identifying the design as their preferred design, respondents had provided the following feedback on the endorsed concept:

- Its bright and colourful.
- It has a modern design and is fresh and vibrant.
- They thought the design was representative of the ocean, beach, surf, land and sky, fish and surfboards.
- The design was a unique design, catches the eye, Different, Not Generic, Different
- shapes and textures, simple, authentic.

Based on some of the feedback provided during the consultation, the designer did make a couple of small changes and that was the inclusion of the silhouette of a jetty which represented Streaky Bay's iconic Jetty, as well as the inclusion of stone walling which was more representative of local stone masonry.

In speaking about the endorsement and consultation process, Council's Chief Executive Officer, Damian Carter had said "We had gone above and beyond to consult with the community, including manning street drop by sessions, consultation via the school, distributing the survey via social media, Council's webpage and the criterion. We are also very thankful for the various local news agencies who publicised the consultation. Ultimately, one design had clear community support as their preferred concept and I liked the approach Council had undertaken in its endorsement which was to take out their subjective opinion of the design and to ascertain whether the community consultation was robust enough and what was the clear feedback during that consultation".

The township entrance statements will provide visitors with a sense of arrival, whilst helping build the township's identity. Streaky Bay is the only major township in the district which doesn't have Town Entrance Statements and Council is looking to address this discrepancy through the installation of the new statements by the end of June 2023.

#### MANAGEMENT PLAN SURVEY

#### **COUNCIL IS SEEKING YOUR FEEDBACK**

In 2010, the District Council of Streaky Bay undertook an extensive planning and consultation exercise to develop a suite of documents, Streaky Bay District Management Plan (DMP), that has guided the strategic planning of the District over the last 12 years. These documents focused on the environment, open space, tourism, land use and urban design.

While much of the information contained within these documents remains relevant, the context and character of the district have changed over the decade. The council acknowledges the changing landscape and community priorities that have occurred over this time.

Consequently, the Council is now preparing a series of Township Management Plans which will provide sustainable planning and development frameworks for each of the following towns within the District of Streaky Bay:

- Streaky Bay
- Sceale Bay
- Wirrulla
- Poochera
- Perlubie
- Haslam



The Township Management Plans (TMP) explore the context of each township and its roles within the district. The key finding and community feedback is summaries to provide a background to the strategic directions and structure plan actions.

The master plan of each township will be influenced by the complex interaction between each of strategic directions. Further details is provided within each of the specific township master plans.

The master plans actions reference the strategic directions and are mapped across specific locations within the townships. The potential timeframe of each action is also quantified to assist the council with forward planning.

Finally, the concept plan illustrates the unique projects for the township that encompasses the strategic directions and themes.





#### **EP LANDSCAPE BOARD UPDATE**

#### **Pest Plants**

The Board continues weed control in the region. During April the following works are planned:

- Boxthorn control along Sceale Bay Road, Jessie Flat Road, Westall Way Loop and the Eyre Highway to Piednippie.
- African Lovegrass control along the Eyre Highway from Ceduna to Kyancutta.

Planning and preparation work is also being undertaken to control the spread of Gazania out of the Streaky Bay township and into our vulnerable coastline, vegetation communities and pastoral lands.

#### **Grant Opportunities**

#### Community grants open for priority landscape areas

More than \$110,000 is available for Eyre Peninsula residents to put towards community-based landscape management and environmental protection projects across the region, under the Eyre Peninsula Landscape Board's Grassroots Grants program.

The grant program is open until April 28 for grants up to \$15,000.

Last year the Board funded 11 projects that focused on a variety of landscape management issues ranging from removing pest plants, revegetating habitat, protecting sand dunes and other sensitive areas, re-populating an endangered species, and educational sessions.

#### **Heritage Agreement Grant Funding**

The Native Vegetation Heritage Agreement Grant Program is now open. Grant funding is available to provide support to landowners to help manage biodiversity on their properties and may include assistance for fencing, pest plant and animal control and biodiversity monitoring.

Grants are available for works on individual Heritage Agreements or works spanning multiple Heritage Agreements. There are three tiers of grants available (GST inclusive), up to \$100,000. Grants can be for one-off activities or activities that span multiple years.

#### NATIONAL TRUST MUSEUM

The Streaky Bay National Trust Museum has had a busy summer. Visitor numbers have increased which reflects on the extra hours put in by the volunteers. In summertime the museum is open four times a week and in winter, its three.

There are new displays to see, along with the restoration of existing ones. Among the new are puppets from the Harold Raymond Concert Party. Harold was a blind violinist and they toured the West Coast in the 1950's, raising money for the Melrose House Institute for the Blind. A Streaky Bay audience filled every seat. To end every concert Oscar (a puppet) would sing his special song accompanied on the piano by local lady Jean Dunn.

Among the restored displays is the Mudge Mail Cart. This historically important display is a link to Streaky Bay's early days when the mail arrived by horse and cart. Tom and Charley Mudge had a twice weekly mail run to Port Lincoln and weekly to Denial Bay, Fowlers Bay and Yardea Station. The Mudge's used 120 horses to keep all lines running.

Renovations and maintenance are continually undertaken at the museum. Currently we are upgrading two of the sheds to enhance the displays within. One of the sheds will house the Birdseye Bus, the Studebaker farm vehicle and the Chevrolet Truck. The Mudge Mail Cart will also be in here along with a restored 1940's hand operated fuel bowser and other mechanical items. The second shed, where the West Coast Sentinel display is located will have a new area featuring entertainment items used in Streaky Bay in the past. We have movie projectors from the Institute, radiograms and TV's amongst other items to display. Information boards in both sheds will detail the historical aspects of these displays.

The museum is always looking for new volunteers to join our team. We need a variety of volunteers, of all ages, to keep the museum running and to undertake the maintenance that is needed to preserve our displays.





#### **CHANGES TO GREEN WASTE**

As part of Council's Environment Protection Authority (EPA) Licence No. 2108 for the Streaky Bay Transfer Station, it is a statutory requirement that the green waste drop off area needs to be securely fenced with restricted and supervised access during transfer station opening times only.

A contractor has been engaged and will soon commence the construction of a secure chainmesh fence which will adhere to Council's statutory requirements of its EPA Licence No. 2108 for the Streaky Bay Transfer Station.

Access to the green waste drop off area once the fence is constructed, will be via the main entrance gate and then via a new access gate into the green waste drop off section.

It is also a requirement that all waste loads are inspected, including green waste prior to drop off. Customers are to present to the attendant on arrival, the load will be inspected and the attendant will advise where to offload.

Please ensure that your green waste is free of contaminants such as plastics, steele and other materials as Council reserves the right to refuse the load until the green waste is clean.
