

INFRASTRUCTURE

Road Construction

Construction Staff have completed resheets to Philips Road, Petina Road, Gawler Ranges Road, Cape Bauer Road, Baird Bay Road and are currently working on Moroney Road. Patrol grading has ceased due to the dry weather conditions. 613km of Patrol Grading have been completed this financial year.

Sealed Roads

Woodlawn Road – earthworks and pavement completed. Sealing scheduled for early March 2018.

Sealed road shoulder maintenance will be undertaken in Poochera, Haslam, Streaky Bay and Wirrulla townships. Rural Sealed road shoulder maintenance is currently underway to Witera Road.

Dodgson Drive - Kerbing

Kerbing works have commenced along Dodgson Drive, including driveway accesses to assist with stormwater management.

Speed Limit on Sceale Bay Beach

Responses have been received and will be collated and presented to Council accordingly, to decide if Council will pursue the reduction of the speed limit.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Foreshore Tourist Park Development

Stage 1 is currently underway, with three new cabins currently being constructed for delivery to the site in the coming months. We are currently working with the park operator, Discovery Parks, on timeframes and logistics for installation.

Wayfound Regional Signage Audit

Council staff attended a regional workshop to discuss the draft proposals for the Wayfound signage audit. The Audit looked at existing tourism signage, our visitor attractions, how our visitors might navigate around and provided a number of recommendations to be considered by Council.

COMMUNITY

Community Notice Board

The local ArtsUp community group are currently finalising the mosaicking, the board is nearing completion, and will be a fantastic piece of public art to add to the streetscape.

Service SA Business Proposal

Manager, Community and Economic
Development met with representatives, with a
positive outcome and Council will be presented
with a business proposal for the March 2018
Ordinary Meeting of Council, which could see
the Visitor Centre incorporate a Service SA
agency arrangement.

Blancheport Estate Reserve

Council resolved at the February meeting to include in the 2018/2019 budget consideration, fencing of the Blancheport Estate reserve with locked gates and bollards providing walking and cycling access.

STAFF

Council are currently in the process of recruitment for a new Corporate Services Manager.

Waste Management Committee Meeting

Kerbside Recycling

Council additionally considered a report at the Ordinary Meeting of Council to incur the cost of a 12 month recycling waste management trial for the Streaky Bay and District area in the 2018/2019 Annual Business Plan, this was not adopted.

REGULATING

Microchipping

Council regulatory staff have recently undertaken training that will allow them to provide an in-house microchipping service. Council agreed at the February meeting to provide microchipping as an additional service to the community for a charge of \$40 and provide an additional budget of \$3,544.00 within this financial year to purchase microchips. This will be a valuable service to the community in the future.

Food Van Location Rules

Council adopted the Mobile Food Van Location Rules to commence on 1 March 2018. Food vans seeking to operate within the District Council of Streaky Bay must comply with the location rules. One amendment made to the draft document which was released for public comment was to reduce fees from what was proposed. Fees will be charged from 1 July 2018 at a rate of \$50.00 per month or \$250.00 per year.

Busking Policy

Council considered a report that provided an external request to consider implementing a Busking Policy for the district. Council considered the report and decided not to pursue a policy at this point

GOVERNANCE

Caravan and Camping Committee

Council agreed to dissolve the existing Section 41 Committee of Caravan and Camping, as Caravan and Camping is captured in the newly formed Community and Economic Development Committee.

Community and Economic Development Committee – Membership

Council elected the following four elected members onto the Committee; Cr Stephens, Cr Morgan, Cr Trezona and Cr Karp. The Committee has two independent members and these positions will be advertised to the general public.

A Finance Risk Audit Committee meeting was held on February 8, 2018, and the following recommendations were adopted at the February Ordinary meeting of Council.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Wells Street and Bay Road

Council sought community feedback on concept drawings for street scaping works to Bay Road and Wells Street.

There was around 80 individual responses received for the combined feedback strategy.

A report was presented to Council's Road Action Group Committee to discuss the feedback and make recommendations for Council to consider.

A brief summary of feedback received is tabled below;

Wells Street

Round-a-Bout	Concerns if it is too small punts and heavy vehicles could not navigate, many were in favour of it providing large vehicles could navigate it
School Car Park – Sealing and Delineation	Whilst the design concept was well sup- ported by respondents, this is land under the care and control of Dept Education and not Council
Doctors Beach Carpark - Sealing	Many of respondents were not in favour of it due to concerns over the bitumen being damaged during frequent storm tides
Existing Pedestrian Crossing	All respondents requested it remain as is
Existing Speed Hump/Stormwater Drain	Concerns were raised over it remaining as is due to current design elements
Eyre Ave Pedestrian Crossing	This was support by all respondents
Oval Precinct Entrance	Respondents requested footpath connectivity and the suggestion of the removal of the verge
Kiosk Car Parking	Concept was supported, Caravan Queing area raised concerns due to its visibility and accessibility
Caravan Park Slip Lane Entry	Design was generally supported
Extended Kiss and Drop Lanes	Concepts were well supported

Bay Road

Wide Shared Use Path	Concept supported
Pedestrian Refuge for crossing near Golf Club	Majority supported the concept
Anderson Crescent Realignment	Concerns were raised over its necessity, design and parking locations
Bay Road Carpark	Concept not supported well
Parallel Parking Lanes	Respondents were split, some supported, many did not feel it was necessary
Jubilee Road Slip Lane	As above
Bellenger Wallschutzky Road Intersection	Majority supported, concerns over cutting corners with current design
Dodgson Drive Access Closure	Respondents were divided with if this should occur or not
Drainage Swale	Supported – should be undertaken – stop the flooding to Dodgson Drive
Redding Road, Park Avenue and Centenary Road Intersections	Respondent responses were varied, many were in favour, alternatives including a round a bout were presented, some questioned the cost of works, were refuges going to impair large vehicles

EYRE AVENUE CONCEPT DESIGN DEVELOPMENT

Council sought input, ideas and suggestions from the community to assist with the design of an Eyre Avenue Foreshore Precinct Development.

There were many wonderful ideas and concepts put forward, with a strong response from the community to retain the general amenity of the foreshore precinct.

Some of the ideas and concepts included; improved stormwater (reduced run-off), shelters, seating, viewing platforms, increased footpaths, public art spaces, bbg's, designated parking, play spaces and ensure views are retained, to name just a few.

Council staff and Elected Members were presented with the detailed community feedback and met with Masterplan Consultants to undertake a workshop on the proposed design elements in December 2017 (Masterplan were also provided with the feedback document). The workshop included an onsite visit.

The consultants have been commissioned to undertake a design draft concept, and once this has been received it will be presented to Council for approval to go out for Public Consultation.

DOCTORS BEACH FENCING

Council sought feedback from the community on the relocation of fencing at the Doctors Beach Playground. Council has received many complaints regarding the existing fence and its location and design.

The majority of the feedback indicated that those respondents wished for the fence to be located around the entire perimeter of the lawned area.

Council will also be installing a shade sail to this area and is currently awaiting development approval on the structure.

COUNTRY HEALTH SA

Country SA Primary Health Network (CSAPHN) was very pleased to have been announced as one of twelve new National Suicide Prevention Trial (NSPT) Sites, bringing significant resources, activity and funding to areas of need in regional South Australia.

The trial will be placed at a regional level to better respond to local needs, and identify new learnings in relation to suicide prevention strategies. The 2-year trial will adopt a system based approach to the delivery of suicide prevention services, targeting populations identified at a local level as 'at-risk'.

To help CSAPHN get a better picture of the needs of each community we have developed a survey to engage with stakeholders, community members, consumers, carers, community organisations and service providers, to identify gaps and opportunities in regional suicide prevention. Findings from this survey will help shape the development of local and regional community suicide prevention action plans and the allocation of resources to help prevent suicide. If you live, work or study in the Cities of Port Lincoln, Whyalla, Port Augusta, Port Pirie, Yorke Peninsula or the Country North region of South Australia please take some time to complete the survey.

STREAKY BAY MEDICAL CLINIC - UPDATE

Council officially took over the clinic on 3 February, 2018.

All Council staff and clinic staff have been working hard together to ensure that the transition is as smooth as possible, and a continuation of service is provided.

The intention is that the current operational elements of the clinic will not change.

A Practice Manager and Practice Nurse have been engaged on 6 month basis, pending the development of the Incorporated Association.

There is no resident doctor at the clinic, locum doctors are being sourced through a number of Locum Agencies and these have been secured until mid June 2018.

Council are working with Rural Doctors Workforce Agency and some private advertising agencies to source a resident doctor.

The Chief Executive Officer and Manager, Community and Economic Development are currently investigating housing opportunities and remuneration options for potential successful applicants.

Office for Recreation and Sport

Active Club Program

This program supports community-based sport and active recreation organisations to deliver their programs and services to all South Australians. It provides up to \$5,000 for program and equipment applications or up to \$25,000 for facility upgrades. For facility development projects, organisations can apply for up to 75% of the total project and/or donated materials and in-kind support.

Community Recreation and Sports Facilities Program

This program helps eligible organisations to plan, establish or improve sport and active recreation facilities that meet the needs of the community. Organisations can apply under three categories, with requests up to \$1 million considered.

Female Facilities Program—Round 3

The Female Facilities Program helps eligible organisations to develop sustainable, functional, inclusive and fit for purpose female change room facilities that meet the current and future needs of the South Australian Sporting community.

State sport and Active Recreation organisations, Industry Representative Bodies, Local Government, Community Groups, Incorporated Sport or Active Recreation Clubs that do not hold a gaming machine license are eligible to apply.

Sporting Surfaces Program

The Sporting Surfaces Program helps eligible organisations to develop new or upgrade/enhance or replace existing synthetic and hard-court sport playing surfaces including synthetic turf playing fields, indoor and outdoor courts to support sports in South Australia.

Community Development Grant Opportunities



A new grants program, Grants SA, will provide \$3 million in grants to improve community participation, wellbeing and quality of life for South Australians.

Through Grants SA, four one-off grant programs, the Charitable and Social Welfare Fund (Community Benefit SA), Multicultural Grants, Volunteer Training Grants and the Volunteer Support Fund, have been combined into a single application process.

Community organisations can now apply once to be considered for funding across all four streams, and will also benefit from less restrictive guidelines and simpler reporting requirements.

Minor grants of up to \$5,000 will be open all year and assessed at the end of each month.

Minor round applications close 5pm on the last working day of every month.

A Job Accelerator Grant of up to \$10,000 (\$5,000 each year for two years) per new full-time equivalent (FTE) job created is available for businesses liable for payroll tax in SA with total Australian wages of \$5 million or less.

Job Accelerator Grant for Small business & Startups of up to \$4,000 (\$2,000 each year for two years) per new job created is available for most businesses that are not liable for payroll tax. This includes businesses with Australian wages below the payroll tax free threshold (currently \$600,000) and most organisations that are exempt from payroll tax (e.g. public benevolent institution).

Businesses that increase their number of SA employees will be eligible to receive a grant for each additional worker employed by them in a new position between 1 July 2016 and 30 June 2018.



"I thought I had something to offer and would volunteer for a short time, but here I am still doing the same thing 18 years later," said Wayne.

"I keep coming back because I get such a sense of satisfaction being able to help the community. You see people not at their best but then you see them improve and you know you played a part in helping them."

Wayne became Volunteer Team Leader at Streaky Bay seven years ago and says he would encourage anyone to give ambulance volunteering a go.



Streaky Bay Tourism in partnership with their membership and the District Council of Streaky Bay joined with Regional Development Australia, Whyalla and Eyre Peninsula (RDAWEP) at the 2018 'Let's Go Caravan & Camping Lifestyle Show' held at the Adelaide Showgrounds Wednesday 14 – Sunday 18 February.

- 48.15% had visited the EP between 2-5 times
- 62.15% who hadn't been intended to visit more than once in the future and 36.84%

- would stay between 5-7 nights
- Respondents were predominantly in the 50-65 age bracket
- ~ The average visiting group were between 2-6 people.

Microchipping - It's Compulsory



From the 1st of July 2018 it will become compulsory for all dogs and cats to be microchipped. This includes working dogs and all cats and dogs over the age of 3 months.

Microchips assist Council in returning your pet as quickly as possible and limit the number of impounded animals. Council will be offering microchipping before the 1st of July by trained Council staff for a cost of \$40 per animal. South Australia's liquor licensing system is being comprehensively reformed, starting with several changes on 18 December 2017.

This is the first of several stages of reform, working towards a contemporary and safe liquor licensing system for our state. The changes cut red tape for licensed businesses and remove or modify outdated and irrelevant restrictions. This reduces regulatory burden and creates more efficient processes for industry.

Exemptions for Low-Risk Businesses

Low-risk businesses will no longer require a liquor licence to treat their clients to a drink, reducing administrative burden and supporting industry. Exempt businesses will be able to sell or supply liquor without a licence in certain circumstances, including: • hairdressers and barbers • retirement villages • businesses selling gifts

• jewellers • patient care accommodation

The current licence exemption for bed and breakfast style accommodation is also being extended.

Increased Regulation of Supply to Minors

There will be stronger penalties for people who illegally supply alcohol to anyone under 18. Big parties and events will be targeted, where large groups of teenagers are supplied with alcohol.

Other Red-Tape Reduction

A number of other red-tape reduction measures will also come into effect on 18 December:

• abolishing the requirement for some licensed businesses to provide meals at the request of a member of the public or a lodger • removal of designated dining areas, reception areas and sampling areas • removal of most notification and advertising requirements that currently apply to licence applications

Entertainment Consent

Licensed venues will no longer need consent from Consumer and Business Services to host a range of entertainment, including music and comedy. This will make it easier for businesses to host bands, supporting a vibrant live music scene. Consent will still be required for prescribed entertainment such as boxing, martial arts and sexually explicit entertainment.

Temporary Approval of Responsible Persons

These reforms streamline the responsible person process and support employment.

Reducing Restrictions on New Year's, Sundays and Holidays

Licensed businesses will now be able to trade until 2am on New Year's Day



Councils are part of the democratic framework of Australia. The community elects their council members every four years and the next general elections happen in November 2018.

Unlike State and Federal elections, it is not compulsory to vote in South Australian council elections. However, council elections are the biggest single voluntary civic participation activity in the state with nearly 360,000 people voting in the 2014 council elections.

Another important difference from State and Federal elections is that all voting in council elections is done by post. Enrolled voters receive a **voting package through the mail** and return their votes in a reply paid envelope.
