Staffing News

Council's Manager, Infrastructure and Civil Works Darren Walker has resigned, and we wish Darren all the best. Darren has been instrumental in leading and innovation in key projects such as the Moore's Boat Ramp Redevelopment, Jetty Platform Refurbishment and the Streaky Bay Waste Transfer and Resource Recovery Centre Operations. Recruitment for the position has commenced.

Council welcomes Ethan Myles into the position of Parks and Gardens Maintenance, and Council looks forward to working with Ethan.

Council has commenced recruitment for the Part Time Customer Information Officer position at the Streaky Bay Visitor Centre.

Eyre Peninsula Local Government Association – Draft Strategic and Business Plans

The EPLGA is the overarching body with representative Mayor's from each of the Council's that make up the Eyre Peninsula LGA.

The Draft Strategic and Business Plans considered by Council are documents that will set the direction of advocacy and strategy for the EPLGA over the next 12 months.

Regional Development Australia Eyre Peninsula – Council Funding Agreement

RDA is a Federal Government initiative comprising a national network of 52 skills-based committees made up of local business leaders in each region that work with all levels of government, industry and community groups to support the development of their regions. There are seven (7) RDAs in South Australia funded via this same tripartite agreement, with the State Government recently re-committing to the RDA Framework in South Australia for a further 4 years.

Local Government are a key partner and co-funder in the tripartite agreement, and Council considered a report on Council's contribution towards the RDA over the next 4 years, with Council ratifying to continue its funding.

Council Officer Authorisations

Council received a report outlining a request for authorization of certain Council Officers to be enabled to undertake the administering and enforcement of certain laws. This report was endorsed by Council and will enable a flexible workforce to spread the load of undertaking these duties, particularly during peak periods.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Western Transit Loop

The Wells Street, AB Smith Road, Alec Baldock Drive, Wallschutzky Road loop project is underway. A project management consultant has been engaged to undertake the project (approved by Council at the April meeting) and final 2d and 3d drawings are being developed with a view to endorsement at the June meeting of Council.

Stormwater Management Plan Review

The existing Stormwater Management Plan is more than 10 years old. With the current level of growth and infrastructure development Council understands the need to review this plan to consider current and future stormwater capture and reuse. Consultant Tenders are currently being assessed with a view to engagement by mid June.

CEO UPDATE

From the CEO's desk

I wanted to take the time this month to talk about undertaking business on council land and the process involved in gaining permission to achieve this.

Firstly, what is 'business use'? From a Council perspective business use can be a variety of activities; it can be facilitating an event, running a store or stand, having alfresco dining on a footpath, storing of items on a roadside verge or even accessing a site for construction via council land.

You may ask, 'why should I seek permission to undertake business on council land, after all its public land?' In terms of the answer to this question, there are several considerations to take place, these are:

- Public safety and liability: To ensure public safety, Council will need to assess each situation on a case-by-case basis to ensure public safety isn't compromised by the proposed activity and to ensure the organisation wanting to use the council land has the appropriate insurance coverage to cover any possible liability claims.
- Damage to public assets and clean-up of Council safety: Business use on council land can lead to the damage of council assets, i.e. Stormwater infrastructure. Hence Council needs to inspect the land and infrastructure on the land, prior to and after the business is undertaken to ensure ratepayers aren't left with the costs associated with clean-up of the land or the restoration of council assets.
- Equitable access to council land: Council land is public land; hence we need to ensure business use isn't unfairly limiting access to other members of the community wanting to utilise it.

In terms of the process to seeking permission to use council land for business purposes, you will need to undertake the following, pending on what your activity is:

- Business use of community land (i.e. public reserve): Seek approval from Council via written submission
- Business use of footpaths: Apply to Council for a Permit
- Business use of public roads: Apply to Council for a Permit
- Establishing an outdoor café on a footpath: Apply to Council for an Outdoor Café Licence
- Mobile food vendors located on Council land: Submit a Mobile Food Vendor Application to Council

If you have any further questions relating to this topic, please reach out to Council's Community and Economic Development team who will be able to assist you.

GREAT WHITE KAOLIN PROJECT MINING LEASE CONDITIONS AND OUTCOME CRITERIA

Andromeda is developing the Great White Kaolin Project, located 15km southwest of Poochera. The mining operation to extract and refine bright white halloysite-kaolin cloy is expected to create up to 75 direct jobs and add a significant economic boost to the region over a 28-year Life of Mine.

Over the last two years, Andromeda has collected the technical, environmental and social information required to understand and develop the Great White Kaolin Deposit. Mining Lease 6532 was granted to Andromeda in December 2021 confirming the technical feasibility of the Project. Andromeda is now in the process of developing the environmental management plan called the Program for Environment Protection and Rehabilitation (PEPR). The plan is based on the findings of investigations for the Project's Mining Proposal and information collected from stakeholders during discussions and community drop-in days.

Andromeda invites interested community members to review and provide feedback on information displayed at recent community drop-in days, including outcomes, control and management strategies, measurement and leading indicator criteria by visiting Andromeda's website: www.andromet.com.au

OUTCOMES (INCLUDING MINING LEASE CONDITIONS)

Andromeda will demonstrate in its PEPR submission that the outcomes are, and will continue to be, achievable throughout the construction, operation and completion of mining operations. These outcomes include those specified in the schedules of the Mining Lease (and the supporting Miscellaneous Purposes Licences) and referred to as the Mining Lease Conditions (MLC).

CONTROL AND MANAGEMENT STRATEGIES

The Mining Regulations require that Andromeda set out the planned strategies to minimise or avoid impacts on the environment to achieve the required environmental and rehabilitation outcomes.

Control and Management Strategies should:

- be proportionate to the consequence of the impacts on environmental receptors
- be technically and economically achievable
- implement best practice in mining and environmental management. Best practice control strategies are accepted or prescribed as being correct or most effective depending on the specific environmental setting and the results of the environmental impact assessment.

MEASUREMENT CRITERIA

Measurement Criteria are how Andromeda will demonstrate that it complies with the *Mining Act* (1971) and that the environmental outcomes (MLC) have been achieved.

Measurement Criteria include:

- what is to be measured and the form of the measurements
- locations where relevant measurements will be taken, or how such locations will be determined
- a proposal of what will constitute achievement of the relevant outcomes, with consideration given to any inherent errors of measurement
- frequency of measuring or monitoring
- background or control data to be used and how such data will be acquired
- set out Leading Indicator Criteria, if there is a high level of reliance on control strategies to reduce risk to the environment.

Measurement Criteria will form the basis for DEM's regulation of the operation, and will also form the basis of Andromeda's operational and closure compliance monitoring programs.

LEADING INDICATOR CRITERIA

Leading Indicator Criteria are required in the environmental outcomes (MLC) where there is a high level of reliance on control strategies to achieve an environmental outcome. These provide early warning that the control strategy may be, or is, failing and that the outcome is potentially at risk of not being achieved, and provides time to respond accordingly. Leading Indicator Criteria relate to the proposed control measures, such as audits of the management system, near misses or trends in environmental data.

Andromeda has developed Leading Indicator Criteria for each environmental outcome that relies significantly on a control strategy to ensure it is achieved. If Leading Indicator Criteria are triggered, Andromeda will undertake immediate management action, intervention and reporting.
