HAVE YOUR SAY ON COUNCIL'S DRAFT ANNUAL BUSINESS PLAN 2018-2019

The District Council of Streaky Bay has released its Draft Annual Business Plan 2018/2019 for public comment from Thursday 28 June to 5.00pm Wednesday 18 July 2018 to assist in determining the priorities, in particular the proposed new and upgraded capital projects and operational new initiatives for the coming financial year.

Council has identified a number of significant projects and/or activities for the coming year:

- Council Building Consolidation Planning
- Streaky Bay Hall Repairs
- New Footpaths and Kerbing
- Resealing Bay Road (Streaky Bay) and Pygery Port Kenny Road
- Wells Street Power Line Environment Committee (power undergrounding) and Round-a-bout Construction
- Cungena Landfill further Cell Design and Land Purchase
- Stormwater Management to Redding Road and Bay Road
- Dental Clinic Chair and Steriliser (New)
- Township Entrance Statement Design
- Tractor Beach Campground Development
- Streaky Bay Foreshore Tourist Park Upgrade
- Wirrulla Oval Playground
- Community Wastewater Management System Upgrades (CWMS)
- Childcare Feasibility Study
- Youth Development Strategy

The projects, programs and services proposed in the Draft Annual Business Plan are to be funded with an increase in rates revenue as follows:

- Overall rate increase of 3%
- CWMS Levy Increase (\$450 to \$477)
- Loan for Streaky Bay Foreshore Tourist Park and Bay Road Upgrades (\$2.4m)

Council News

GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Council Meeting Workshops

Councillors Stephens and Gunn moved a motion at the June 2018 meeting of Council requesting that questions asked by elected members relating to operational matters be answered by staff at the meeting. The second part to that motion is the inclusion of a workshop prior to Council meetings to discuss reports being presented to that Council meeting. This motion was accepted.

Council meeting starting times will be amended to commence at 10.00am and 4.00pm alternatively.

Personal Information Security Policy

On 22 February 2018, new privacy laws came into effect to regulate the reporting and notification of eligible data breaches. Councils are required to have a Personal Information Security Policy in place by 1 July 2018, and were presented with a draft of such Policy at the June meeting. Council resolved at that meeting to adopt the draft policy and a copy of this policy is available on Council's website www.streakaybay.sa.gov.au.

Information and Communication Technology Strategy

Council at the June 2018 meeting adopted the Council's Information and Communication Technology Strategy 2018-2021. The purpose of the strategy is to leverage information technology to advance the objectives of Councils' Strategic Management Plan, and to shape the future direction for IT initiatives to create productivity improvements, address environmental concerns and a competitive advantage for Council.

Elected Member Remuneration Tribunal

The Local Government Association provided correspondence to Council regarding the Remuneration Tribunal (2018 review of allowances for local government members) inviting submissions from Council. Council resolved to nominate Mayor Barber, Deputy Mayor Wheaton and the CEO to prepare a submission on behalf of Council.

FINANCE

Streaky Bay Senior Citizens Homes Inc.

The Senior Citizens Homes Incorporated (community operated organisation) applied to Council for a percentage rebate of future rates to relieve financial pressure for their elderly residents, particularly to enable on-charged fees to be maintained at manageable levels. Council considered the request at the June 2018 meeting and resolved not to grant the requested rebate.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Foreshore Tourist Park Development

A Capital Investment Business Agreement is currently being drawn up to manage the Capital Investment program for the caravan park. Meeting with the Discovery Management Team have commenced with a view to finalising this agreement and allow for the smooth development of the site into the future.

Council have installed 3 new cabins - 1×3 bedroom and 2×2 bedroom, to the Park. Contractors are currently working on external connections and certificate of occupancy requirements which Council is anticipating will be completed in the next few weeks. Council has budgeted for in 2018/2019 9 new cabins and a recreational area, this formulates Stage 2 of the Foreshore Tourist Park development.

Council Community and Economic Development Committee – Independent Nomination

Council were pleased to accept the nomination of Tobin Woolford to sit as an independent member on this committee. Tobin has a wealth of experience and Council looks forward to what he will be able to bring to the discussions. There is still one vacancy on the committee and if anyone is interested they are encouraged to contact Council.

Regional Development Australia Economic Development Conference – Kadina

Manager, Community and Economic Development attended the RDA Economic Development Conference in Kadina during early June. The conference was well attended by Councils all over the state including Elliston, Wudinna and Whyalla. There was a fantastic and broad range of speakers from all over Australia and

the US, talking about economic development and a focus on how local government can support this in the regions.

TOURISM

Signage Hierarchy

Awaiting outcome of 2018/2019 Draft Annual Business Plan to enable this project to be progressed.

Tourism Strategy

A consultant has been engaged to assist with the development of this. The strategy will be a joint collaborative between Streaky Bay Tourism and Council, with a focus to aligning with the recently released South Australian Tourism Commission Regional Visitor Strategy. Development of this strategy will commence in the coming weeks, with an extensive consultation process. The Strategy is envisaged to be

completed early in 2019 to allow the encompassing of the peak tourism season.

Wayfinding, Coastal Access and Regional Camping Strategy (Eye's on Eyre Strategy)

Draft Strategy has been completed, site visits with DEWNR, NRM and the Coastal Protection Board have been undertaken with Council and RDAWEP staff mid June for department feedback on the proposals. RDAWEP met with SA Tourism Commission staff in a bid for funding at the end of June.

Speeds Point Toilet Installation

Council has received development approval for the location of the toilet at Speeds Point. However, at the June 2018 meeting of Council, Council resolved to remove the funding allocation for the purchase of the toilet, therefore the implementation of the toilet is unable to proceed until the required funding is provided.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Old Bowls Club Precinct

The Streaky Bay Men's Shed have now negotiated with Council to lease the facility on a 12 month arrangement.

Streaky Bay Community Library Forward Plan

The Library Forward Plan has been reviewed and was presented and adopted at the Council June 2018 meeting. The group has also put in place the new terms of reference for the Library Management structure.

Kerrin McEvoy – Request to Honour

Members of the working party met with Kerrin and Ken Martin (sculptor) in Adelaide at the beginning of May to discuss and begin to conceptualise the proposed sculpture. Council at the May 2018 meeting of Council approved in principle the statue to be located on Council land. The working party held a further meeting on May 21, 2018.

Community Notice Board

The community noticeboard has now been installed.

Streaky Bay Area School Governing Council

Council following a request from the school nominated Cr Lauren Karp as the Council representative on the Schools Governing Council Committee.

Streaky Bay School Pool

Council at the April 2017 meeting of Council were presented with a proposal to enter into a joint agreement with the school to provide \$20,000 per year

for a 5 year term to assist with the ongoing costs associated with pool. A condition of this funding was the establishment of a Memorandum of Understanding between the two associations.

Council was presented with a Memorandum of Understanding for signing at the June 2018 meeting. Council resolved at that meeting to rescind the April 2017 motion committing to the 5 year joint agreement and associated funding contribution, and a second motion that Council did wish to accept the Memorandum of Understanding due to extraordinary Council budgetary restraints.

Poochera Sporting Complex Request for Donation

A request was received at the June 2018 ordinary meeting of Council from the Poochera Sports Complex Incorporated to provide them with \$5000 to assist with wire balustrading to deck and concreting of access ramp. Council at this meeting resolved to donate the \$5000 requested.

Service SA Business Proposal

Manager, Community and Economic Development received notification from Department of Premier and Cabinet that under the new government, Services SA will now sit under the Department, Planning Transport and Infrastructure and that all new initiatives are currently under review. The Manager has forwarded correspondence to local member Peter Treloar, advising of the advice and seeking his support to ensure this arrangement is forthcoming.

Doctors Beach Playground Fence

The fence at Doctors Beach Playground will be renewed in the next few weeks. Following community engagement, the decision was made to replace the fence around the perimeter of the playground area.

YOUTH

Future Youth Groups

Council staff have been working with the Streaky Bay Area School to establish a youth group within the district. Interested persons are encouraged to register with Jess at the Visitor Centre 08 86267033.

ARTS AND CULTURE

Country Arts Partnership

Council submitted a partnership application jointly with Elliston DC to continue its partnership with Country Arts in providing an arts and cultural officer on the Upper Eyre Peninsula, unfortunately the application was unsuccessful with a position being funded in Port Augusta.

Country Arts SA Trust – Board Nomination

Council considered a proposal to nominate an elected representative to represent the Local Government Association of SA on the Country Arts SA Trust. Council resolved not to nominate a Council member or Council employee to represent Local Government on the Trust.

WASTE MANAGEMENT

Recycle Right Kerbside Education Grant

Green Industries SA have been notified that Council no longer intends to introduce kerbside recycling next financial year, therefore the funding for undertaking the associated education program can no longer be utilised.

Wirrulla – Illegal Dumping of Waste

There has been a level of illegal dumping occurring on Council roads around the outskirts of the Wirrulla Township. Council received a report at the April 2018 meeting where Council resolved to seek interest from the Wirrulla community in the community undertaking the removal of the illegal dumping. A further report to the June meeting sought clarification on the intention of the motion, specifically around the engagement of the community and if the waste removal would be undertaken as in-kind community support. Council resolved at the June meeting to receive and note the report, a further inspection to be undertaken and following the inspection a report to the next Council meeting.

Op Shop Request for Rebate to dispose of waste

Council agreed at the June 2018 meeting of Council to provide a \$500 donation to the Streaky Bay Op Shop for the disposal of extraordinary items at the Streaky Bay Transfer Station.

SEALED ROADS

Dodgson Drive/Bay Road Streaky Bay

Resealing of Dodgson Drive is complete, stormwater infrastructure installed, with driveway cross overs still to be completed.

Bay Road stormwater pipes have been laid, kerb and water table to both sides of the road to be installed, followed by side entry pits and resealing.

Budgeted in 2018/2019 is further stormwater infrastructure to be installed within the road reserve. Councillor Trezona provided a number of questions on notice including what is the cost of Dodgson Drive and Bay Road projects. Dodgson Drive is included within the Bay Road project and a table was provided that

indicated at 15 June total expenditure was \$163,780 from a budget of \$444,475.

A secondary question was raised on the total cost of the Bay Road project from Centenary Road to Wallschutzky Road. The amended concept plans are currently being costed, however the original project cost with first set of concepts being \$500,475.

Council has endorsed the final concept plans and engineered (for construction) plans will not be presented to Council as these documents are operational.

Disabled Parking - Chemist

Community engagement will commence with business houses and key stakeholders in the coming months to discuss options for parking within the Bay Road precinct.

Flinders/Hospital Drive- Williams Crescent Realignment, Streaky Bay

A report was presented to Council at the June 2018 meeting providing a detailed list of community feedback on the proposed works. The report was seeking Council's endorsement of the draft plans and any changes required to those plans. The endorsement of plans does not commit Council financially to proceeding with works. Council resolved at that meeting to note the report and requested a further workshop to discuss the feedback.

PLEC – Wells Street, Streaky Bay

The undergrounding of power on Wells Street is scheduled to start early in 2019, financial agreements have been received confirming funding and concept plans for streetscape were adopted by Council with changes to the Oval Precinct entry, Doctor Beach Carpark and School Carpark.

UNSEALED ROADS

Road Construction

Council has completed during 2018/2019 the following roads; Westall Loop (Sceale Bay Rd to High Cliff), Cape Bauer Road (5km — Stanley Williams), Moroney Road (6.3 to McEvoy Road), Petina Road (2.5km), Gawler Ranges Road (Priest Road for 5km), Philips Road (Princess Highway to Gosling Road 6km), Kaldoonera Road (First 4km), Jessie Flat Road (Kelsh Road for 5km), Baird Bay Road (3km — Calca Road to Calca Bluff).

Council has commenced road realignment to Cape Bauer Rd and Anderson Road (Cape Bauer Loop end).

Gazania (pest plant) control

Council has been working with EPNRM to plan and fund an approach to controlling gazania's along Council roadsides. This work will be commencing shortly with a control program.

Council News Contd.

Road Maintenance

Patrol Graders have completed 868.7km for the financial year until 25 June 2018. (255.6km of patrol grading was undertaken from January 2018 to 25 of June 2018).

Shoulder maintenance 500m Mount Cooper Road (sealed section), various vegetation clearance where required, and general sealed road maintenance.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Eyre Avenue Foreshore Concept

A report was presented to the June 2018 meeting of Council providing a detailed listing of all feedback received as part of the Public Consultation Process. The report sought Council's resolution to make changes to the concept plans, based on community feedback, or adopt the concept plans as presented. Council resolved to receive the plan as presented. A further report will be presented to the July meeting of Council to seek resolution on the community feedback.

Blancheport Estate Reserve

Budgeted amount was removed from the Draft 2018/2019 Annual Business Plan, therefore community consultation will not proceed.

EP Roadside Vegetation Management Plan

Council has been working with all EP Councils to develop a regional Roadside Vegetation Management Plan. A final draft was presented to Council prior to the plan being presented to the Native Vegetation Council for endorsement in June. Council resolved to receive and note the report.

Stormwater Management Plan

Council resolved in July 2017 to authorise staff to undertake costings for a review of the stormwater management plan. A report was presented to the June 2018 meeting to advise Council that a number of actions has since been undertaken from the plan, with an additional 9 upgrades yet to be completed, therefore a review of the plan was not required at this stage. Council resolved to receive and note the report.

Dozer and Float Operations

Council has for the past 3 years being dry hiring a dozer for short term periods to raise its rubble for roadworks and other operations. A report was presented to Council outlining a review of these operations and proposed purchase of a new float due to need of replacement of the existing equipment. Council resolved at the meeting to pursue hire of the dozer and engage a contractor to provide float operations.

BUILDINGS

Sceale Bay Shelter

Shelter has been completed. Awaiting reconnection of power to site. There was no funding provision for a new BBQ to be installed for the 2018/2019 budget, therefore the replacement of the BBQ is not planned at this stage.

DEVELOPMENT

McCormack Way Reserve

Council considered a report at the June 2018 meeting of Council for the approval to locate a rainwater tank on the reserve (resident request) and establish a McCormack Way Reserve management plan. Council considered the report and resolved to refuse the request for rainwater tank location and review the reserve management plan.

LMA Waiver Request – Blancheport Heights

Council at the June 2018 meeting agreed to waive clause 5 of the Blancheport Height Design Guidelines to enable a dwelling and shed to have a finished floor level above the 0.15m of the allotments average AHD defined in the Land Management Agreement attached to 3 Bockleberg Hill Drive, Streaky Bay.

HEALTH MANAGEMENT

Streaky Bay Medical Clinic Incorporated Association

A request was received by Council from the Medical Clinic Board, seeking further financial provisions in 2018/2019 for the board should they not be successful in recruiting a permanent doctor, donation of its fleet car currently utilised by the locums and gifting of the Practices Manager's Long Service Leave entitlements. Council considered this request and resolved to make a \$100,000 provision (as a loan) within the 2018/2019 financial year, donate the Toyota Aurion Sedan and gift (in cash) the Long Service Leave of the Practice Manager.

REGULATING

New Year's Eve Dry Area

Council resolved to again implement a Restricted Dry Area from 6pm on Monday 31 December 2018 to 8.00am on Tuesday 1 January 2019 in the area north of Wells St to the corner of Linklater St and Alfred Tce to the corner of Philip St and Alfred Tce inclusive of Council car parking area, foreshore and jetty areas.

A dry zone will again be implemented at Little Islands carpark and Access Road.



RECYCLING FACTS

- Cans made from recycled aluminium uses 95% less energy than making them from scratch, a massive reduction in greenhouse gas emissions
- Just one aluminium can recycled saves enough energy to power a television for 3 hours
- Aluminium can be infinitely recycled and is made into aircraft, automobiles, boats, computers, cookware, gutters, wire and cans
- Recycling glass bottles saves 74% of the energy required to make glass bottles from raw materials
- One glass bottle recycled saves enough energy to operate a 100 watt light globe for 4 hours
- Bottle glass can be recycled continuously
- The energy saved by recycling just one plastic drink bottle is enough to power a personal computer for about 25 minutes
- As plastic decomposes, methane is produced, which is 20 times stronger than carbon dioxide
- Plastic bottles not recycled, thrown away irresponsibly are responsible for killing birds and marine life
- Recycling juice and milk cartons is a simple process, taking about half an hour to complete. Water is added to the liquid paperboard cartons in a vat, separating the cardboard from the plastic and foil layers. A thick 'slurry' is created as the cardboard fibres 'swell' and are scooped out to be later turned into tissue paper, recycled paper and more
- Cardboard that ends up in landfill produces toxic methane gas, and as stated is 20 times stronger than carbon dioxide and responsible for producing global warming greenhouse gases.



'City Lights to the Country Night Sky' creating new opportunities for South Australian Aboriginal artists

Through art, two rising South Australian Aboriginal artists have found out that the things that are important to them are the same.

After the recent successful opening in Ceduna from 28 May-3 June of the 'City Lights to the Country Night Sky' exhibition, Aboriginal artists Amanda Radomi and Sherrie Jones are continuing their art journey by displaying their works in Elliott's Bakery & Café in Streaky Bay until 28 July 2018.

Elliott's Bakery & Café is a vibrant hub supporting community arts. Dale and Georgina Elliott are excited to display the colourful body of works in support of both artists.

Sherrie Jones hails from Koonibba and is a prolific artist with experience as a painter and sculptor. A fast emerging regional artist of note, Sherrie's dream is to become an internationally renowned fine artist following in the footsteps of her father who is a highly regarded landscape artist. Painting is her life, she states, and telling her stories through her paintings adds meaning. Experimenting with the use of colour, techniques, themes and perspective remains Sherrie's artistic strength. Her mark making on Canvas includes techniques such as Aboriginal dot painting, playful brush strokes and contour lines. Sherrie's colours are boldly juxtaposed, illustrating her fearless approach to contrasts while accomplishing harmony.

Amanda Radomi is based in Adelaide and was named the inaugural 2013 Don Dunstan Foundation Our Mob emerging artist for her piece 'She's Got Roots'. Her paintings and weavings explore the themes of the natural environment and her appreciation of Indigenous world views. The techniques she employs

seek to honour her Indigenous heritage in a modern world.

and Amanda's journey together began when they met during the Artists from the Edges of the World project in Fowlers Bay in October 2016. The successful project brought together 46 Indigenous, traditional and contemporary artists from Finland, Namibia and South and Western Australia in a weaving and project to interdisciplinary art, collaborative and cultural working methods and skills and design thinking. Both artists then travelled to Finland in August 2017 to represent the artists who participated in the project at the opening of NAISIA

Sherrie applied for a mentorship to work with Amanda in 2017 and was successful in receiving a Country Arts SA Step Up grant for \$4,475. In 2017 and 18 the two artists have worked together creatively and artistically, enabling Sherrie to learn as a practitioner and strengthen her professional approach as an artist. The body of work currently on display was produced in the residency exchange.

All art works are for sale. The exhibition will run until Saturday 28 July 2018.





BREEDING DOGS AND CATS

Do you wish to breed your dog or cat from 1 July 2018?

To be able to do so you will need to become a registered breeder through the Dog and Cat Management Board if you are not already registered with Dogs SA, Feline Association SA or the Governing Council of the Cat Fancy.

You are still required to register as a breeder if your animal falls pregnant unplanned and you intend to sell the animal.

To register as a breeder you must wait until after 1 July when you have received your renewal notice. Log into Dogs and Cats Online using your unique renewal code. You will be asked if you are a breeder, upon selecting yes you will be charged the annual breeder fee of \$75. You will receive your registration number after the payment has been processed.

How can you make a difference?

You can influence what happens in your local community in two ways — by nominating for a position on council, or by voting for a candidate who represents your views.

Enrolling to vote

Voting in council elections is open to a broader range of people than State and Federal elections. Even if you are not an Australian citizen, and/or not on the State Electoral Roll you can vote in a council election, as long as you are above 18 years of age and have lived in the council area for more than one month. You can also vote in a council election if you own a rateable property in the area, regardless of whether you live in it.

Another important difference is that businesses and body-corporates can vote in council elections.
