Fire Danger Season

Council is urging residents to start cleaning up their blocks in preparation for the fire danger season.

The Fire Prevention Officers have started their inspections at the beginning of October. If your allotment was found to be non-complying at the time of inspections you would have received a notice under section 105F of the Fire and Emergency Services Act.

If you received a notice you are required to have the grass cut no higher than 10cm. For allotments larger than 0.5ha a 20m fuel reduction zone is required around houses as well as a 5m fuel reduction zone around sheds etc. along with a fire break of 4m around the boundaries.

This MUST be done before the 1st of November.



It is supported by a vast spectrum of video artworks, video documentation of artistic processes and photography artworks and features work from art projects, research and community work that has been conducted in Rovaniemi (Lapland, Finland), Port Augusta and the Far west communities of South Australia.
