

Council News

GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Acting Chief Executive Officer Appointment

Council at the April 2019 ordinary meeting of Council resolved to appoint Mr Tony Lines as Acting Chief Executive Officer for a two and half week period while the current Acting Chief Executive Officer is on leave.

Local Government Reform

The Acting Chief Executive Officer has provided the Local Government Association with a submission regarding Local Government Reform and how current considerations will affect the District Council of Streaky Bay.

Federal Road Funding

Council received a report regarding a campaign supporting the "fair share of federal road funding for South Australia". Council resolved to use social media, write to and meet with local federal election candidates, provide information and ensure the federal government is acknowledged and thanked for all projects supported by the supplementary funding.

Council Community and Economic Development Committee

Council rescinded the motion where Mayor Barber was elected onto the Committee due to Mayor Barber no longer having the capacity to fulfil the role. Cr Wheaton declined the position of the third member due to other commitments. Cr Pudney was elected as the third Council Member. The Meeting date was amended to May 23 due to the Drought Forum being held on May 30.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Council Workshop – Economic Profile - RDAWEP Representatives from Regional Development Australia Whyalla Eyre Peninsula recently attended Council to provide a 2 hour workshop on the District's Economic Profile and identify priorities for support and advocacy in our district and the Eyre Peninsula Region.

TOURISM

Abalone Brand – Streaky Bay

Cr McGowan raised a question on notice requesting that Council support the brand positioning that Streaky Bay becomes the home of Abalone and that Council incorporates the Abalone Shell into its branding for Streaky Bay. This follows a deputation provided by Streaky Bay Tourism at the previous meeting of Council where the concept was presented to Council. A report was presented to Council at the April 2019 meeting where Council resolved not to support the concept at

this point and allow the proponents to come back with further information.

Wayfinding, Coastal Access and Regional Camping Strategy (Eye's on Eyre Strategy) - Campgrounds

Design concepts have been completed and Public Consultation was undertaken by Regional Development Australia WEP in February 2019 for Tractor Beach Campground. A report was presented to Council outlining the feedback from these meetings and Council approved the plans. Negotiations for care and control of relevant land will now commence with a full report to Council in the future and the formal adoption of the concept plans for construction.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Rodeo By The Sea – Streaky Bay – Request for Sponsorship

Council received a request from the Committee for Council to provide a \$3000 sponsorship for the event. Council resolved not to sponsor the event and in lieu provide a donation of \$1000 plus any in-kind support up to the value of \$3000.

Childcare Feasibility Study

A project brief was forwarded to relevant consultants to undertake a study into various options for Childcare in Streaky Bay and surrounds. Council resolved to allocate the additional funding as required to enable the engagement of the consultant.

Creative Communities Partnership Program

Council was presented with a report to the April 2019 meeting to approve the submission of an Application to Country Arts SA as part of the Creative Communities Partnership Program. The partnership will involve a joint application between the DC of Streaky Bay, Wudinna and Elliston Council's to engage a contractor on a 3 year basis to deliver Arts and Cultural Services to the region.

YOUTH

Youth Week 2019

Youth Week 2019 was once again a resounding success with high participation numbers again. Congratulations to Jess Davis (Community and Economic Development Officer) for one again co-ordinating this event.

WASTE MANAGEMENT

Streaky Landfill Remediation

The construction works associated with the remediation have been completed. MDS is currently working on the required reporting for the EPA to negotiate final closure of the site.

Council News Cont'd

STORMWATER MANAGEMENT

Stormwater – Redding Road, Bay Road, Swales

This project involves the removal of the existing pit, replacement of existing kerb and water table and installation of 3 double side entry pits that filter into the existing pipework. The existing infrastructure will be thoroughly cleaned out. The materials have been ordered for this project and it is expected to be completed by June 30, 2019.

Stormwater - Mudge Tce, Jubilee Road

Manager, Regulatory Services will begin negotiations will appropriate land owners to secure the required easements.

SEALED ROADS

Bay Road Streaky Bay - Stage 1

Asphalt works and kerbing for the initial 500m and Cash Place have been completed. Line marking will be undertaken once the asphalt has had time to settle. Kerbing has commenced for the next section.

Bay Road Streaky Bay – Stage 2 (Anderson/Redding Intersection)

Intersection has been surveyed. Council has engaged Telstra to relocate required Telstra pits, earthworks will commence upon relocation of pits.

Speed Hump Requests

During recent community forums requests were received regarding the installation of speed humps to the townships of Sceale Bay, Haslam, Perlubie Landing and Eba Anchorage. Council resolved at the April 2019 meeting to undertake community consultation to receive feedback on the proposed installation of the speed humps.

UNSEALED ROADS

Roads Budget 2019/2020

Council at the April 2019 meeting were presented with a report to consider the proposed roads budget and Roads to Recovery funding commitment for the next financial year. Council resolved to commit \$2.249m as presented, this amount was for renewals and no new work was recommended.

Finlayson Road / Eyre Highway concept

A report providing the draft plans for this intersection was presented to Council at the April 2019 Ordinary Meeting of Council. Council resolved to progress with Option 1 (see full report for details), delegated the CEO

to begin negotiations with affected land owners and consult with the broader community on the project.

Road Construction

Council has completed during 2018/2019 the following roads; Kaldoonera Road (8km), Gill Road (7km), Carawa Road (3.56km), Westall Way Loop (7kms). Staff have completed the first 6 kms of Calca Road which is expected to be completed prior to May. Once this is complete we will be moving over to Poochera Port Kenny Road

Road Maintenance

Patrol Grading has begun again this month regardless to the amount of rain, if conditions remain dry we will be concentrating on the Category One and Two Roads. Category 3 and 4 roads will be considered when it starts raining. All major roads in the District have been graded once this season to date.

To date in the 2018/2019 financial year approx. 993 kms of road has been patrol graded.

PLANT AND EQUIPMENT

Nil

INFRASTRUCTURE

Wells Street – PLEC Project

Final construction plans for the project have been confirmed and materials ordered have been delivered. Contractors have been engaged and project meeting held, start date for commencement of this project is expected 20 May 2019.

Footpaths and Kerbing Barnes Street Poochera

A section of path adjacent the Bicycle Path on Wells Street has been replaced. A footpath in Poochera was also budgeted however staff have determined that this is not required. The funds for this have been reallocated to repairing an additional section on Wells Street.

Streaky Bay Hall – Maintenance

Majority of the maintenance has been completed with the final painting inside and stage floor refurbishment remaining on hold pending the completion of the hall floor replacement which is tied to grant funding and therefore the priority.

REGULATING

Dog and Cat Registration Fees

Council considered a report at the April 2019 meeting of Council to adopt its Dog and Cat Registration Fees for the 2019/2020 financial year. A copy of the resolved fees can be viewed in the Minutes for this meeting.

PLANNING

Residential (Sustainability Living Policy Area) Development Plan Amendment Statement of Intent

On the 20 March 2019 Council received a letter from the Minister advising that the Statement of Intent was not supported at this time. A resolution was made at the April 2019 meeting of Council to authorise Mayor Barber to write to Minister Knoll to strongly reconsider his land development decision in Streaky Bay.

ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT

Starling Control

Council resolved to organise a petition on starling control in the district the petition has been distributed and will be finalised at the end of April 2019. The petition will be forwarded to the appropriate Ministers and the Natural Resource Management Board.

HEALTH MANAGEMENT

Spark For Life – International Master Course – Request for Funding – Streaky Bay Hospital

A deputation was made to Council by Ms Chris Boylan in regards to the "Spark of Life" conference and its benefits for the community. Council will discuss the request for donation at its next meeting.

Streaky Bay and District Medical Clinic

Council has received a request from the medical clinic board to provide a further contribution of funding to maintain the current level of service to the Community. Council considered a report to the April 2019 meeting and resolved to invite the Chair and Deputy Chair of that board to Council and provide a progress, financial and status report of clinic operations.

CEO ANNOUNCEMENT

The Mayor would like to announce the acting CEO, Karina Ewer has been successful in the interview process and has been offered the role as our new CEO.

She has done an exceptional job as acting CEO and has built an excellent rapport with staff and elected members and I am extremely excited about working with her in the future.





To prevent the abandonment or dumping of unwanted litters Council Officers will accept surrendered cats and kittens at no charge. This can be done by ringing the Council on 0886261001 and organise collection via Council's General Inspector.

Council staff will endeavour to re-home suitable, healthy surrendered animals via animal rescue groups such as the RSPCA shelter in Port Lincoln.

COMFORT AND COOKING FIRES

People can have a fire for comfort and cooking purposes as long as it is:

- ⇒ Not a total fire ban day,
- ⇒ Is within a fire pit at least 20 cm deep,
- ⇒ Has a 4 metre clearance around the fire,
- \Rightarrow Is smaller than 1 m²,
- ⇒ A person is always in attendance until the fire is totally extinguished,
- ⇒ An appropriate agent to extinguish the fire is on hand.

Microchipping – It's Compulsory

From the 1st of July 2018 it became compulsory for all dogs and cats to be microchipped. This includes working dogs and all cats and dogs over the age of 3 months.

Microchips assist in returning your pet as quickly as possible and limit the number of impounded animals.

If your dog or cat is found to be not microchipped you will be subject to an expiation fee of \$170.00.

Veterinarians regularly visit Streaky Bay, and there are Council employees as well as numerous trained microchip implanters throughout the district that can provide this service.

New Dog By-Laws

The new by-laws require any person with a dog in their care and control in a public place to carry a bag or other suitable container for the collection and disposal of their dog faeces.

If you are found to be without a bag or container while you have your animal in a public place you could be liable to a \$100.00 expiation fee.
