### **INFRASTRUCTURE**

#### **Sealed Roads Construction**

Woodlawn Road – sealing has been completed.

#### **Sealed Roads Maintenance**

Sealed road shoulder maintenance has been completed for the 2017/2018 financial year.

### **Dodgson Drive**

Kerbing works have been completed. Works have now commenced on further stormwater works, and preparing the road for resealing.

### **Love Shack Ridge (Gibson Peninsula Holdings) - Road Care and Control**

A question on notice was raised at the March 2018 meeting of Council asking for confirmation of the care and control of roads located within the Love Shack Ridge development. The CEO is currently investigating the matter and Council was provided with evidence of ownership. Refer to Minutes 15 March 2018 www.streakybay.sa.gov.au , Council Meetings for details.

### **Wells Street and Bay Road Concept Plans**

A report was presented to the March 2018 meeting of Council for Council to adopt the concept plans for both Wells Street and Bay Road to enable the progression of works on both roads, with a critical component being the undergrounding of the power along Wells Street, requiring plan confirmation by mid April 2018. Council resolved to adopt the plans subject to changes.

### **Anderson Road – Sealing – Private Works**

Council received a request and considered a report and agreed at the March 2018 meeting to enter into a private works agreement to seal 100m of Anderson Road, and Council accepts that ongoing costs will be the responsibility of Council.

### Alfred Terrace / Bay Road Intersection – Risk Assessment

Council had requested that staff undertake a Risk Assessment of the above mentioned intersection, as part of that the assessment identified replacement of existing bollards and other works, staff provided a number of options for works in that report. Council resolved to receive and note the report at this stage.

### Resealing of Intersections within the township of Streaky Bay

Council had requested that staff investigate the cost of resealing some of the intersections within the Streaky Bay Township, particularly those with heavy vehicle usage. A report was presented to Council at the March 2018 meeting of Council detailing options and costs. Council resolved to receive and note the report at this stage.

### **Back Beach Road Drainage Swale**

A question on notice was raised at the March meeting of Council regarding the planned location of works for stormwater management relating to Gibson Peninsula Holdings. The swale is to be located on land owned by Gibson Peninsula holdings, therefore Council will require the establishment of an easement before it undertakes the works. The easement plan does not show water being discharged under Cape Bauer Road. The swale works have been budgeted for this financial year.

### **Sceale Bay Shelter**

The shelter construction is substantially complete with a contractor engaged to reconnect the power, staff are investigating if the existing BBQ will be repaired or a new BBQ purchased. Council considered a report to allocate further funding to enable repairs of the staircase, electrical connection and other minor works. The report was laid on the table pending further financial details.

### **GOVERNANCE**

### Community and Economic Development Committee – Membership

Council elected the following four elected members onto the Committee; Cr Stephens, Cr Morgan, Cr Trezona and Cr Karp. The Committee has two independent members and these positions are advertised to the general public.

### **COMMUNITY**

### **Service SA Business Proposal**

Council agreed to proceed with signing off on the agreement for the Visitor Centre to become an agency outlet for the Service SA. Currently awaiting finalisation of the agreement for signing off.

#### **Haslam Post Office**

Council recently has taken over care and control of the existing Haslam Post Office following the closure of the Haslam Parks and Foreshore Committee. Council considered a report and resolved to include relevant fees and charges for Post Office Boxes and keys in its fees and charges.

### **Eyre Avenue Foreshore Concept**

Council agreed at the March 2018 meeting of Council to proceed with public consultation for Eyre Avenue design concepts that were received.

### **Blancheport Estate Reserve**

Council resolved at the February meeting to include in the 2018/2019 budget consideration, for fencing of the Blancheport Estate reserve with locked gates and bollards providing walking and cycling access. Subsequently following this resolution, staff received feedback from some local residents that they were not in favour of this. A report was presented to the March meeting outlining concerns and Council resolved to undertake a small community engagement program to seek further feedback on this proposal.

### **STAFF**

Council are currently in the process of recruitment for a new Corporate Services Manager.

### **ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT**

Foreshore Tourist Park Fees and Charges
Following the development of the Foreshore Tourist
Park, the park will see the introduction of two new
product categories being; Deluxe 3 Bedroom and
Deluxe 2 Bedroom Cabins. This will require the
introduction of new tariff's, Council at the March 2018
meeting of Council resolved and adopted two new
seasonal tariffs for this product.

### **MEDICAL CLINIC**

### **Streaky Bay Medical Clinic Operations**

A report was presented to the March 2018 meeting of Council providing a detailed outline of the current status of the Medical Clinic, a copy of this report is available on the website www.streakybay.sa.gov.au.

Council agreed to proceed with the current arrangements for negotiating long term accommodation for locum doctors.

### Streaky Bay Medical Clinic Incorporated Association

A further report was presented to the March 2018 meeting of Council providing information around the requirements of an incorporated association. This report was received and noted by Council.

On Wednesday, March 21, a very successful first steps to incorporation meeting was held with approximately 25 persons attending. Attendees were provided with detailed information on responsibilities and legislation of Incorporated Associations. Some basic modelling of rules and determination of a committee was discussed. A further meeting has been set for April 10, 2018.

### **Dog and Cat Registration Fees**

Council at the March 2018 meeting of Council considered a report to resolve to set Dog and Cat registrations for the 2018/2019 financial year, with the following resolved;

- Non-standard (full fee)— \$80.00
- Standard (microchipped and desexed) 50% rebate (this is legislated)
- Aged Pensioner Discount 50%
- Working Livestock Dog \$20.00
- Business Registration dogs (section 35) \$240.00
- (assistance dogs are entitled to a free registration (section 41(2) of the Act))
- Puppy fee. 50%
- Council Administration Transfer fee \$5.00 waived for 2018/2019 financial year.
- Cat registration Free

### **NEW LAWS FOR DOG AND CAT OWNERS**

New laws will come into effect on the 1st of July 2018 for owners of dogs and cats. These new laws and rules will help to make registration for dog's easier, help prevent euthanasia rates and put a stop to puppy farms.

Some of the new rules and laws include;

- Desexing of dogs and cats born after 1 July, 2018
- Compulsory microchipping
- New rules for breeders
- Introduction of a State-wide database, called Dogs and Cats Online

### **BIRD MANAGEMENT - CARAVAN PARK**

Council and the Foreshore Caravan Park management have received numerous complaints in recent months regarding the starlings that settle in the caravan park in the evenings, and the resulting mess and health concerns arising from excessive amounts of droppings on vehicles, caravans, boats and park amenities. The problem is compounded by a large SA Water sign at the park entrance warning of penalties if cars, vans or boats are washed in the caravan park and it has now reached the point where the caravan park managers are experiencing a loss of business (or the need to refund fees) because of it.

A number of approaches have been tried including directing LED lights into the treetops however this wasn't successful. Other parks have trimmed tree canopies as birds only settle in the upper parts of the trees but this wouldn't be viable (or desirable) with the size of the trees at the Foreshore Caravan Park. The Department of Environment, Water and Natural Resources/ Natural Resource Management Board have suggested trapping the birds however with the amount of people moving around in the park the birds would be unlikely to come out of the treetops into traps.

The park manager has approached Council with a request to use a gas gun each evening for 1 hour commencing at 8.30pm which is when the birds regularly come in to settle in the trees, with 5 shots fired within that hour. Our Regulatory Services department has advised that there is nothing to prevent this from occurring, but advised that it would be good practice to advise the police, guests and nearby residents so that people are not alarmed by the sound. The park managers are therefore proposing to purchase a gas gun and implement this practice over the coming week or so.

This practice is similar to that implemented by Council when the front lawns were established a few years ago, when gas guns operated throughout the day and were turned off at dusk – in this case, however, the gas guns will only be fired for one hour per day. It is worth noting that Regulatory Services did not receive any complaints during the establishment of the lawns. The park manager has observed that the bird problem eases in winter and is hopeful that the practice can be reduced or wound up by then and used on a short term basis at the start of next season if the birds return.

### **EYRE CRAFTS**



On Thursday 1st March the Streaky Bay Children's Centre, as part of their program to become socially responsible and show respect for the natural environment, participated in "Schools Clean Up Day 2018" at Jetty Beach

Searching, Discovering, Finding, Wondering, Noticing, Observing, Collecting, Thinking, Listening, Discussing, Participating, Understanding, Sorting, Classifying, Measuring and Cooperating.

The children carried out a risk assessment to identify possible hazards and establish rules to keep us safe. Then armed with bags, gloves and tongs the children set off on their first excursion to Jetty Beach to collect rubbish. The children did a great job collecting 10 bags of rubbish,

including bottle tops, paper wrappers, cans, rope, plastic, straws, cigarette butts, carpet, a sponge, a thong and lots of glass. On returning to the Kindy, the rubbish was examined, sorted and weighed with 23kg of rubbish (including 15kg of glass) being collected. Discussions were held about recycling and the impact rubbish has on our environment and wildlife. 



Can you tell a story about the ketches, schooners and other sea vessels that visited Streaky Bay?

Have you any relics from the days of the Mosquito Fleet or Maritime Streaky Bay?

Illuminart in partnership with the District Council of Streaky Bay and Country Arts SA are creating a touring light show about the Mosquito Ketch trade.

Eyre Peninsula Illuminart Leading Lights, Lauren Karp and Sue Wegener, will dive into the depths of National Trust archives, private and public historical collections of Streaky Bay to uncover the stories of the Mosquito Fleet.

Community from Streaky Bay district and surrounds are invited to share memories in the form of a yarn, photos, artefacts, slides, old film and relics of the time of the Mosquito Fleet; from South Australian colony's establishment in 1836 until well into the 1970's.

These vessels are known as "the mosquito fleet because of their ability to flit across the mudflats."

They were ketches and other small sailing vessels like cutters and schooners, which worked South Australia's coasts carrying important cargos like "wheat, wool, live animals, gypsum, salt, firewood" and even helped carry our groceries and precious gifts from afar.




### ISLAND TO INLAND CONTEMPORARY ART FROM KANGAROO ISLAND






### **Dogs and Cats Online**

From July 1 2018, Dogs and Cats Online will be the central database for microchipped and registered dogs and cats. This will also include registration payments and the breeders register.

People who wish to breed dogs and cats to give away or for sale after 1<sup>st</sup> July must be a registered breeder with the Dog and Cat Management Board. All advertisements for new dogs and cats must quote the registration number of the breeder. All breeders will also be required to follow the new industry standards and guidelines.

The owner of existing registered dogs should receive a renewal notice in the mail during the month of July. The notice will include their dog's new lifetime registration disc as well as instructions on how to complete their annual dog registration on Dogs and Cats Online. If you do not receive your renewal letter please contact the council.





### Microchipping – It's Compulsory

From the 1<sup>st</sup> of July 2018 it will become compulsory for all dogs and cats to be microchipped. This includes working dogs and all cats and dogs over the age of 3 months.

Microchips assist Council in returning your pet as quickly as possible and to limit the number of impounded animals.

Council will be offering discount microchipping days before the  $\mathbf{1}^{st}$  of July by trained staff for a cost of \$40 per animal.

### How can you make a difference?

You can influence what happens in your local community in two ways — by nominating for a position on council, or by voting for a candidate who represents your views.

### **Enrolling to vote**

Voting in council elections is open to a broader range of people than State and Federal elections. Even if you are not an Australian citizen, and/or not on the State Electoral Roll you can vote in a council election, as long as you are above 18 years of age and have lived in the council area for more than one month. You can also vote in a council election if you own a rateable property in the area, regardless of whether you live in it.

Another important difference is that businesses and body-corporates can vote in council elections.
