

Council News

INFRASTRUCTURE

Pioneer Park Development

Demolition on site has been completed and all of the procurement of the materials has been undertaken. The surveyor has mark out and peg the site for leveling. Installation of concrete paths is nearing completion, toilet installation has commenced, laying of all services including electrical, water, and irrigation has commenced. Majority of the nature play rocks and log have been sourced and installation of rocks has started. Preparation of the logs has commenced off-site.

Town Entrance Statements

The concrete footings have been poured for the town entrance statements. It is envisaged that the project should be completed by mid to late December this year.

Youth Precinct

The major construction work for the site has been completed and the public able to use the facility. The toilets have been delivered and construction of the toilets has commenced. SA Power Networks have advised that they are unable to schedule electrical connection until December 2023. All the works required with this facility will require further trenching works to the Montgomerie Terrace side of the facility. Following the installation of the toilets, there will be further works to be undertaken including connection of footpaths, bollards, and further tree planting.

In addition to this due to the safety concerns raised and incident occurring at the front ramp of the Skate Park area, a handrail and screening will be installed to stop loose equipment coming off that section. Council Officers have spoken to the Skate Park construction company, and they advised that under the relevant standards this section did not require balustrading which was why it was not within the design concept. However, they have provided us with a manufacturer, and we will be arranging for purchase and delivery of this to avoid future incidents. This cost is outside of the budget scope however will be implemented as necessary due to the public safety risk.

Haslam Jetty

Engineers have been onsite to undertake the assessment of the Haslam Jetty, the assessment will guide the work and budget Council requires to undertake the restoration of the jetty. Inspections were undertaken on 15th & 16th November, Council is currently awaiting the outcome of those inspections.

CCTV Cameras at Foreshore Toilet

There had been ongoing incidences of vandalism in a around the foreshore toilets over the past 6-9 months. A budget variation was endorsed by Council in Septembers Council Meeting to for the installation of CCTV cameras at the foreshore toilets. The CCTV camera location provides coverage of the entry to the toilets and the surrounding area. The system provided allow for connection of an additional 15 cameras (with 10km of the council building).

Speed Limit Back Beach Road

Council received and considered a report following feedback from the Department of Infrastructure and Transport relating to the reduction of the speed limit on Back Beach Road from 100kmh to 80kmh. The Department is responsible for setting of all speed limits across the state of South Australia including those roads under the care and control of Council's. Officers from the Department recently came out and undertook an audit of speed limits and signage and identified that Back Beach Road under current speed limit guidelines, should be 100kmh. Council considered options provided by the Department which included a full traffic impact statement being completed to demonstrate the requirement for reducing the speed limit however, endorsed for the speed limit to remain at 100kmh.

State Bicycle Fund

Council applied for funding under the State Bicycle Fund to design to "shovel ready" a shared use path that will connect East Terrace to AB Smith Road, running along Montgomerie Terrace. Council were successful in gaining this funding and Council endorsed the signing of the Agreement at the November meeting of Council. This planning will commence in early 2024.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT / TOURISM

Kiosk - Expression of Interest

The Council has recently purchased the building as this was previously owned by an external party and Council is seeking Expressions of Interest from interested parties in taking on the operations of this hospitality business. The EOI registrations will close on the 5th December 2023.

The Wild Side – EP Monopoly

This project has been very successful and well received by the whole Eyre Peninsula. Currently we have 44 monopoly board games left in stock.

Murphy's Haystacks

The development approval has been approved and the shelter is due to arrive mid-October 20233 The builder has been contacted and awaiting final quote.

Council News

RAA Electric Vehicle Charge Network

The charging stations have been completed, there is also now a slow speed charging station installed at the Streaky Bay Hotel for their clients. This project was entirely funded by the RAA with State Government Funding.

Visitor Centre Future Use Report

In September Council considered a report, following the completion of a Community survey on potential future use of the Visitor Centre Front Room following the relocation of the Council Chambers back to its original location within the Council Principal Office. Council endorsed Council Officers to further investigate the costs and operational model for turning the old Council Chambers into multi-purpose space to support art and history exhibitions, community meetings, practitioners, multi-purpose space and youth activities as identified in the community's most preferred use for this space. The proposed operational model and costings to be reported back to Council for consideration.

SUSTAINABILITY

Eyre's Waterhole Overnight Camping

Council Officers met with representatives of the Department for Infrastructure and Transport and discussed this matter. The outcome of this meeting was that both parties agreed that the location would no longer be considered a requirement for an overnight rest stop and the Department representatives would investigate a collaborative approach to cease overnight camping at the location and focus on the location as a visitation attraction as preference to overnight camping.

This process has commenced and Council along with the department are working through the required process including signage for the site.

Perlubie Beach Camping

New pine posts installed as a more permanent fixture for the campground site signage at Perlubie Beach.

Surfers Beach Carpark and Staircase

Council considered a report at the October 2023 ordinary meeting of Council regarding a proposal from Crown Lands to dispose of a portion of the land on which the surfers beach carpark and staircase reside on to the Council. The Council considered this proposal noting that it would increase Council's operational costs through asset acquisition, increased maintenance costs and depreciation, however considered the economic and social value of the asset needed to be maintained for the future. This process of transfer is now continuing.

Stormwater Management Plan Development

The first round of Community Consultation sessions and onsite visits were held in mid-September along with a face-toface Councillor workshop.

There has been an identification of missed LidAR mapping data when this was undertaken which diminishes the accuracy of modelling for the South Eastern corner of the township. Council Officers have organised for this now to be undertaken, this will cause slight delays with the development of the Draft Plan, however will ensure increased accuracy with modelling for that section of the township.

Speed Limits on Council Beaches

This review has been completed. A reduced speed limit from the 100kmh speed limit received an overwhelming response to reduce the speed limit to a default speed of 40kmh and 25kmh when passing or within 100m of a pedestrian. This was also supported by key stakeholders including National Parks and Wildlife and SA Coastal Councils Alliance.

This has now been endorsed and Council Officers will be installing signage as required.

Waste Management Strategy

Council Officers and Rawtec Consultants have undertaken a number of site visits, data collection, community survey and Councillor workshop to discuss future options for Councils Waste Services. A report was presented to the October 2023 meeting of Council where Council endorsed that options report. The preferred options are now being developed into a Draft Strategy that is due for release to Council at the end of November 2023.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Local Drug and Alcohol – Community Action Plan

Friday 13 Movie Night – On October 13th, Council hosted a Free Youth Movie Marathon Night. There was an impressive attendance of over 50 kids to see the first movie screening of Coraline, followed by the throwback classic Freaky Friday to help entertain the parents and lastly, some older Streaky Bay Youth enjoyed Happy Death Day.

Circobats Workshops -

The CircoBats Community Circus visited Streaky Bay and offered 2 days of youth circus workshops to the community. More than 100 children, aged from 3 years old and up, participated in the workshops over the 2 days. The workshop attendees had the chance to explore and develop their circus skills, such as tumbling, aerial silks, lyra, hula hoops, flower sticks, plate spinning, mini trampoline, juggling, and trapeze. The response from both parents and the children who took part in the workshops was very positive.

Council News

Encounter Youth Drug and Alcohol Awareness Session

– On the 6 and 7th of November Encounter Youth delivered workshops to the Streaky Bay Area School year 7, 8, 9 & 10 students on Alcohol and Other Drug awareness with a additional section focused on vaping, on Monday night there was also a Community session open for parents to attend. Encounter Youth will be presenting to the Karcultaby and Miltaburra schools with community sessions also being hosted in Wirrulla and Poochera, will be organized in the new year.

SA Youth Week Grants Program

Council Officers have applied to the SA youth week grants program for youth activities including art workshops and laser tag to be delivered in March 2024.

Australia Day Awards

The nominations for the Australia Day Awards have now closed. The number of nominations received has exceeded those of previous years and Council Officers along with the selection committee will soon begin the assessment process.

Streaky Bay and District Medical Clinic – Current State Review

Council has supported and facilitated a current state review to be undertaken of the Streaky Bay and District Medical Clinic. This project has commenced, with a desktop background review, extensive interviews (both external and internal stakeholders) and an onsite 3 day visit has been completed. The draft review is expected to be received by mid December 2023. The outcomes of the review are aimed to provide the Board/Council with an overview of the current state of the clinic, future opportunities and an insight into if the current Incorporated Association model is the right model for the community.

Recruitment and Attraction Short Video Development

Council have endorsed the development of a short video for the primary purpose of health care professional attraction, however the video will be generalised for the use by other organisations, this is envisaged to be completed by early 2024.

District Council of Streaky Bay and Wellbeing SA Secure Grant Funding for Wellbeing Hub Project

The District Council of Streaky Bay is pleased to announce that it has secured a grant of \$50,000 (ex GST) from Wellbeing SA to support the further development of the business case for a Business, Community, and Health (Wellbeing) Hub in Streaky Bay. The grant will be utilized to conduct a comprehensive feasibility analysis and conceptualization of the Wellbeing Hub, fostering collaboration between the District Council and Wellbeing SA.

The initiative stems from a series of meetings, including the State Government's "Seat at the Table" forum in Adelaide earlier this year, where the General Manager, Prosperity, and Community Development Supervisor engaged with stakeholders in the State Government's Health and Wellbeing Sector, including Wellbeing SA.

Following these discussions, the District Council of Streaky Bay initiated talks with Wellbeing SA to explore potential programs and support for community wellbeing. It was during these discussions that Wellbeing SA proposed grant funding to assist the District Council in identifying and planning programs that align with community wellbeing needs.

The grant's primary objective is to provide seed funding for the further development of the business case for a Business, Community, and Health (Wellbeing) Hub in Streaky Bay. This will include a comprehensive feasibility analysis and conceptualization of the Wellbeing Hub. The concept will incorporate physical, social, and mental wellbeing, fostering a collaborative approach between Wellbeing SA and the District Council of Streaky Bay.

Key deliverables of the grant include:

- Allocation of project resources for project scoping and planning.
- Targeted community and stakeholder consultation to develop a Wellbeing Hub model.
- Delivery of a services feasibility analysis for the Wellbeing Hub
- Development of a Wellbeing Hub Concept Plan outlining purpose, priorities, operating model, and target population groups.
- High-level Implementation Plan, outlining key initiatives and timeframes.
- The co-investment from the District Council of Streaky Bay for this project is estimated at \$15,000 (in-kind), covering support and leadership, community engagement, administrative support, building hire, advertising, and grant administration.

A Streaky Bay Wellbeing Hub Operational Governance Group will oversee planning, engagement, and consultation. This group will include senior officers from the District Council of Streaky Bay and Wellbeing SA.

"In line with our dedication to enhancing community well-being and cultivating a positive and healthy lifestyle for our residents, the potential establishment of the Streaky Bay Wellbeing Hub is under consideration. Understanding the initial misunderstandings surrounding the project, Council acknowledges that its successful realization would require substantial investment from various government levels. Consequently, we are fully committed to conducting a thorough investigation into the project's feasibility to ensure the community will receive optimal value in the project if delivered". Mayor Travis of the District Council of Streaky Bay emphasized, "This marks the next crucial step in our pursuit of this endeavor and Council expresses gratitude for the support and collaboration received from Wellbeing SA in bringing this significant initiative to fruition."

The project is set to run until July 30, 2024, with a portion of the grant allocated to fund a project officer for 1-2 days per week during this period.





Short Term Dry Area - New Year's Eve/New Year's Day Saturday 31 December 2023 and Sunday 1 January 2024

Notice is hereby given that a Short Term Dry Area will be applied during the following period: 6:00pm on Saturday, 31 December 2023 to 8:00am on Sunday 1 January 2024.

The possession and consumption of liquor is prohibited in public areas (excluding licensed premises and privately owned land) in the designated area within Streaky Bay during this period as shown in the map below.

The area includes the whole of any jetty, boat ramp, slipway or other structures that projects below the low water mark from within the area described (as well as any area beneath such a structure).





Also the possession and consumption of liquor is prohibited in public areas (excluding licensed premises and privately owned land) in the area commonly known as Little Islands car park comprising the whole of that part of the government road (the access road between Little Islands Road and the Little Islands car park) that lies between the north-eastern boundary of Lot 101 DP 70670 and the south-western boundary of Lot 102 DP 70670; and

The area at the north-western end of that part of the Government road (including the car park and other land) bounded on the south-east by the south-eastern boundary of Lot 104 DP 70670 from a point 140 metres south-west of the north-east of the south-western boundary of Lot 102 DP 70670 ("point B"), on the north-east by a straight line along the shortest route from point B to the low water mark of Blanche Port, on the north-west by the low water mark of Blanche Port and on the south-west by a straight line along the shortest route from the low water mark of Blanche Port to point A.





Community School Pool

Rules

The following rules must be observed by pool patrons at all times when using the pool and its facilities.

- Persons are not permitted to enter the pool without payment of fees. Pool supervisor reserves the right to check for Annual Pool passes
 - Persons must not enter the pool grounds without appropriate personnel on site
- Appropriate swimwear must be worn at all times (see details below)
- Do not use pool if you are feeling unwell or showing symptoms of cold or flu, or directed to be isolating in accordance with SA Health Regulations
- Do not use pools if you have suffered from diarrhoea in the past week
- Do not use pool if you have any open wounds
- Members and guests, not toilet trained must wear swim nappies
- In the instant that faeces enters the pool the Pool Supervisor MUST be notified immediately and the pool must be closed immediately
 - The pool is a multi-use pool
- Nappies are not to be changed at poolside. Please make use of the toilets or lawn areas.
 - Safety Equipment must not be tampered with
- Pool Users are not permitted to enter the Plant Room

- NO Smoking or alcohol is allowed within the school grounds
- Soft Water toys may be used at the discretion of the lifeguard
- Body boards and surfboards are not permitted. Sitting or hanging on lap lanes is prohibited.
- Avoid eating or consuming alcoholic beverages before using the pool.
- Animals are prohibited.
- If animals are found within the pool (i.e. Snakes), notify the supervisor immediately
- Behaviour deemed not conducive to public safety will not be permitted
- Boisterous or dangerous behaviour will not be tolerated
- The pool must be vacated during electrical storms.
- The lifeguards have full authority to enforce rules in pool facilities
- All rubbish and waste must be removed from the Pool area and users are responsible for the

Child Supervision

- Children 8 years and under are not permitted to use the pool without adult supervision and that supervision must be undertaken from an adult seated within the designated pool area
 - Children 5 years and under must be accompanied by an adult in the water
- An adult must be at least 18 years old

Horseback Police were in attendance to the delight of many children. Commentator Byrce Dodd invited the police officers to compete in next years barrel race. This would be a great promotional event for the police and for Rodeo by the Sea.

Rodeo President Lyn Finch and Vice President Peter McEvoy were very pleased with the success of the event stating: "it's a wonderful event that attracts competitors and spectators from all around Australia, which ultimately contribute to our local economy and the social prosperity. Of course this event couldn't be possible without the generous support of the financial sponsors and the Friends of the Rodeo with in-kind contribution from local businesses and locals volunteering their time and resources to pull this all together. Our sincere thanks and appreciation to them"

Lawn Update: Eyre Avenue and Alfred Terrace Foreshore Lawns

We wanted to keep you in the loop about the current state of the foreshore lawns along Eyre Ave and Alfred Tce.

Unfortunately, we've noticed some browning off, and here are the three main reasons behind it:

- 1. Lawn Beetle or African Black Beetle Infestation: Lawn beetles, particularly the African black beetle, have been chomping on the grass roots, causing damage in a few ways:
 - Root Feeding: Larvae feeding weakens the grass, leading to patches of dead or dying areas.
 - Thatch Accumulation: The feeding process contributes to thatch buildup, hindering water and nutrient absorption.
 - Vulnerability: Infested lawns become more susceptible to stressors like drought, diseases, and pests.

Fear not! We're tackling this issue head-on with a chemical treatment over the next few weeks. With our local expert advising and assisting us to ensure effective management.

- 2. Exposed/Sheet Rock in Some Sections: Certain sections of the Eyre Ave Lawn near Doctors Beach have exposed sheet rock, which is more noticeable during summer. This exposure contributes to the browning off in those areas.
- 3. Sub-Surface Irrigation Blockage: We discovered and have now repaired a sub-surface irrigation blockage, which was impeding proper watering. Adequate irrigation is crucial for a lush green lawn, and we're on top of it!

We appreciate your understanding and patience as we work to restore the vibrancy of our beautiful foreshore lawns

On the Saturday, SES volunteers from Streaky Bay and Ceduna engaged in an annual Road Crash Rescue (RCR) Re-evaluation exercise with District Officers Mike Baker and Lisa Kerslake making the journey over from Flinders Gulf and Eyre respectively to assess the mock rescue. These exercises are vital for volunteers, enhancing the required skills and techniques for using a variety of specialised tools and rescue equipment in the event of an RCR emergency. It also highlights the importance of emergency management including a systematic approach, being familiar with equipment and the diverse structure of various vehicles, ongoing management of an incident scene and successful patient extrication techniques. Thank you to Mark at SB Crash repairs for the use of 2 crash vehicles to cut into and to all the volunteers. Saturday resulted in a successful morning with swift and efficient rescue times recorded.





On Sunday volunteers from Streaky Bay, Ceduna and Port Lincoln SES units gathered in Streaky Bay for a Vertical Rescue training day. The area used was fit for purpose and the weather was warm. The day consisted of practical exercises and a review of competencies for SES members who are accredited to perform such a rescue. Some of the competencies covered on the day were to prepare to respond to vertical rescue, assess the rescue scene including site safety and patient safety, to construct the vertical access system in order to perform the rescue operations and of course, perform several vertical rescues. Followed by the completion of a rescue, equipment recovery and debrief, at the end of which, all in attendance were quite pleased with the success of the day and packed up with a higher measure confidence and competence than had started with.
