Council News

GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Nominations for Local Government Association (LGA) President

Council was presented with a report to the September ordinary meeting of Council outlining the candidates nominated for the LGA President. Council resolved at that meeting to vote for Sam Telfer, Mayor, District Council of Tumby Bay.

Acting Chief Executive Officer

The Chief Executive Officer will be on Annual Leave from 4 February to 18 March 2019, the Manager, Corporate Services shall be appointed Acting Chief Executive Officer for that period.

Elected Member Remuneration Tribunal Determination Following the submission by Council to consider changing the structure of the elected member remuneration for small to medium sized Council, a response was received that outlined that at this time that particular structure would not be amended.

2018 Council Elections - Nominations Received

10 nominations were received. There are 5 nominations per Ward (Eyre and Flinders). The vacancies are 4 per Ward and therefore an election will be held. Details regarding the nominations are provided further in the Criterion.

FINANCE

Nil

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Foreshore Tourist Park Development

The Capital Investment Business Agreement was presented to Discovery Parks. Some preliminary discussions have taken place regards content and finalisation of the Agreement should be achieved within the next few months.

Council have completed installation of the 3 new cabins (1 x 3 bedroom, 2 x 2 bedroom). The first families to utilise the new facilities have already been booked. Landscaping the area should be finished in the next few weeks.

Stage 2 of the development has commenced with a successful tenderer being selected to supply the next 9 cabins. The contract agreement between the successful tenderer and Council is currently being negotiated.

Contracts have also be awarded for the boundary fencing and retaining wall on the south western boundary.

TOURISM

Streaky Bay Tourism recently held their AGM in August, in which all of the positions on the Committee were filled and congratulations to Lyn Finch on her appointment as President. Council has in place a Memorandum of Understanding with Streaky Bay Tourism regarding media, marketing and promotion of tourism in our region.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Memorial Garden – Concept and Scope

A workshop was held on September 12, 2018 to discuss and propose a location and concept for a memorial garden in Streaky Bay. The workshop was attended by 3 elected members, 1 community member and 3 members of staff. Following the workshop a report was presented to Council proposing that the shea oaks site to the West of the Streaky Bay Township be considered as the proposed sites and that the appropriate land management plans and policies be developed to support the project, this proposal was adopted by Council at that meeting.

YOUTH

Youth Week 2019

Grants for SA Youth Week are currently open. The Community & Economic Development Team are working with the Streaky Bay, Miltaburra and Karcultaby Schools to gain feedback on ideas for Youth Week activities for 2019, that will be used to formulate the grant application.

ARTS AND CULTURE

WASTE MANAGEMENT

Cungena Landfill Land Purchase

This process is dependent on the Barngarla Native Title Claim which still is awaiting finalisation.

SEALED ROADS

Dodgson Drive/Bay Road Streaky Bay

Contractor demand has delayed the completion of stage one of the project. Contractors are expected back on site late September / early October.

Council News Cont'd

Bay Road Upgrade – Next section

Final design has been requested for the Redding Road and Anderson place realignment road works which was budgeted. Early project management timelines has works beginning in this area in the first half of 2019 after the initial stage (Bay Road and Dodgson Drive) has been completed in its entirety.

Pygery Port Kenny Road - Reseal

Reseals works are scheduled to be completed prior to Christmas in line with the first stage works on Bay Road.

Wells Street – PLEC Project

This project is currently being delayed with information and other requirements awaiting SA Power Networks response before progression.

Speed Limit 40kmh Wells Street

Council considered a report presented at the September ordinary meeting of Council to consider reducing the speed limit on Wells Street, Streaky Bay (between Bay Road and AB Smith Road) to 40kmh. This followed a request submitted by the Streaky Bay Road Safety Group. Council did not support the proposed reduction in speed limit to this section of road.

UNSEALED ROADS

Road Construction

Council has completed during 2018/2019 the following roads; Kaldoonera Road (8km). Staff are currently working on Gill Road (completed 4km, 3km remaining), once Gill Road is complete the team will move to Carawa Road.

Council has commenced road realignment to Cape Bauer Road and Anderson Road (Cape Bauer Loop end).

Road Maintenance

Patrol Grading is nearing completion until further moisture is received, all roads in the District have been graded this season. To date 2018/2019 financial year approx. 219.3 kms of road has been patrol graded.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Aerodrome Upgrade Funding Application

District Services staff are currently waiting to hear the success of funding application lodged under the Support Regional Aviation Round Three funding program for perimeter kangaroo proof fencing.

Tree Maintenance

The District Services team have been working to remove all the dead trees. Once the soil has stabilised new trees will be planted to replace them.

BUILDINGS

Streaky Bay Hall – Maintenance

Staff are seeking quotes from a stone mason to have the cracks in the Western wall interior and exterior repaired. The new sliding door to the supper room will also be replaced in the coming months with quotes being sought for the installation of the new door.

DEVELOPMENT

Nauo No. 3 Native Title Claim

A report was presented to Council advising that a native title claim (Nauo No. 3) had been submitted impacting on land within the Council area, with one allotment of Council land within the claim area. Council have submitted appropriate documentation to join the process.

HEALTH MANAGEMENT

Regional Health Meeting – Minister Wade

The Mayor, Manager, Community and Economic Development and representatives of the Streaky Bay and District Medical Clinic Board (along with others from the Eyre Peninsula) have been invited to a meeting with Minister Stephen Wade, Minister for Health and Wellbeing on October 9 in Wudinna to discuss issues affecting the District of Streaky Bay and the Eyre Peninsula region.

Fire Prevention





Art V Science Geolocation Project for Streaky Bay

Streaky Bay to host Geolocation Enviro-Art Project as part of VISIBLE

The District Council of Streaky Bay in collaboration with the VISIBLE team, Streaky Bay Tourism and the Streaky Bay Area School will host a youth focused enviro-art project 'Geolocation Journeys On!' in Streaky Bay from 1-7 December 2018 as an innovative element of the VISIBLE event.

In July 2018 the Council was successful in receiving a Regional Arts Australia Step Up grant of \$15,000 through Country Arts SA for the youth and community art project which is one of four VISIBLE cultural tourism events to be held in the December 2018–January 2019 period.

Highly regarded South Australian artist, Annalise Rees who is currently an artist in residence at the University of Tasmania with the Institute of Marine and Antarctic Studies, will visit the region with scientist, Dr. Jaimie Cleeland who researches the foraging and population ecology of endangered marine predators between southern Australia and Antarctica.

Earlier this year the Year 6 and 7 classes at the Streaky Bay Area School engaged in online skypes with Ms. Rees and Dr. Jennifer Lavers a marine eco-toxicologist with the Institute who has expertise in tropical and temperate seabird ecology, plastic pollution (marine debris), invasive species management, and fisheries bycatch. The skype sessions focused on the schools' study of the highly acclaimed 'Blue the Film' which explores the challenges of plastic pollution, overfishing, declining marine life, destruction of habitats and ocean change.



On Tuesday 4 December 2018 Ms. Rees and Ms. Cleeland will collaborate with Streaky Bay Aboriginal artists Susie Betts and Sarah Butcher to engage with youth on a Geolocation Journey field trip along the spectacular Streaky Bay coastline. Participants will be encouraged to look at the marine predator science and research using art as a lens by sketching, painting and, producing etchings and rubbings with mediums such as charcoal, graphite, textas, pastels and watercolours.

Ms. Rees and the broader team will also facilitate two community engagement sessions and an eco-art ephemeral interactive installation throughout the project along the Doctors Beach foreshore. The installation will introduce the public to marine predator research through mapping and narrative. Aboriginal mentee artist Sarah Butcher will complete the ephemeral installation on

Thursday 6 and Friday 7 December 2018. Which will remain on display at the location until the 25 January 2019.

Travis Barber, Mayor, District Council of Streaky Bay says, "It is great to see the VISIBLE program of events is shaping up with several successful arts funding grants being announced recently. The Council and our Community and Economic Development Team are keen to work closely as part of the VISIBLE team to resource and facilitate sustainable cultural tourism projects like this one. 



Funding Boost for Primal Eco Art Project



Funding boost for cultural tourism eco art project!

The 'Primal': Ephemeral Eco Art Residency an initiative of the VISIBLE team and Streaky Bay Tourism will bring together artists, thinkers and community stimulating dialogue around the environmental issues of our time from 1-7 December 2018. The art and culture project hopes to boost cultural tourism visitation and create economies by producing an Ephemeral Eco Art Trail that will be on display along the Streaky Bay foreshore over the peak tourism season until 25 January 2018.

Ten lead artists from Finland, Australia and regional South Australia will work with nine regional artists from the mid and far west region over a sustained period to explore deeper relationship of the systems, processes and phenomena in relationship to the social and cultural aspects of environment. At the forefront will be dialogue, engagement and education around the top 6: climate change; land use, energy extraction and transportation, chemical use, invasive

species and the need for environmental justice.

The Eco Art Residency has four key interdependent elements:

EPHEMERAL INSTALLATIONS

Artists will be primarily asked to address the environmental issue/s as they connect with nature, community and environment to develop representational artworks and installations (develop and deliver a medium to large outdoor installation) through image-making and object-making with the intention of stimulating dialogue.

WORKSHOPS

Artists will engage with youth and community by offering FREE and inclusive workshops in marine debris, weaving, 2-3D construction, limestone sculpture, felting, photography and other mediums throughout the project for other artists, young people and the general community. The Creative Producer will collaborate with schools in the region to bring young people to the site to participate in the residency.

SOAPBOX SESSIONS

Philosophers, thinkers and key note

speakers will be invited to deliver "soap box" sessions at key times throughout the residency. These forums and presentations will occur on given days of the project under the main marquee on Eyre Avenue, Streaky Bay and will be open to the public.

DIGITAL 'FOOTPRINT'

Local digital artist Rose Ayeliffe and Adelaide artist Emmeline Zanelli will be engaged to create time-lapse and other forms of digital dialogues to document the evolution of the project, installations, speakers and the community engagement and interaction over the 4-week period of the VISIBLE events in Streaky Bay. The digital documentation will enable the conversation to continue and create a legacy of the evolution and impact of the project.

In total 24 artists will partake in the 3 simultaneous art projects all with an environmental and eco art theme.

The Primal': Ephemeral Eco Art Residency will facilitate, encourage and enable goals/outcomes in:

Creative sharing, Mentoring, Professional development, Skills development,

Community engagement, Environmental advocacy and activism, Environmental education and; Cultural tourism

The project has been made possible by significant Federal funding received through 2 major art funding rounds in 2018.

On 25 January it was announced by the Australian Department of Communications and the Arts that Streaky Bay Tourism has received \$20,635 for the Primal: Ephemeral Eco Art Residency project in Streaky Bay, SA.

The Festivals Australia funding program boosts regional arts and culture. The Streaky Bay art project was one of just 11 successful projects funded in Australia by Festivals Australia and the only one funded in South Australia!

On 11 September the Australia Council for the Arts announced their latest grant round that delivered \$6.3 million to Australian artists, supporting more than 200 diverse and ambitious projects from individual artists, groups and organisations. The high demand for Australia Council grants continued, with a total of 1,227 applications received. The

Primal project received a further \$49,816 and was only one of 15 projects funded in South Australia and the only one funded in regional South Australia!

A comprehensive VISIBLE PROGRAM will be released in November 2018 outlining all art and culture projects that will be a significant part of VISIBLE in 2018-19.

VISIBLE and Streaky Bay Tourism acknowledge the generous funding and support for the PRIMAL: Ephemeral Eco Art Residency from the District Council of Streaky Bay, Festivals Australia, Australia Council for the Arts, Eyre Peninsula Natural Resource Management Group and the Wilderness Society of South Australia.



New Dog By-Laws

New By-Laws came into effect in December 2017. These new laws require any person with a dog in their care and control in a public place to carry a bag or other suitable container for the collection and disposal of their dog faeces.

If you are found to be without a bag or container while you have your animal in a public place you could be liable to a \$100.00 expiation fee. Let's keep our district and public areas clean and free of disease, while also avoiding a fine by picking up after your animal.

Fire Danger Season

Fire danger season is approaching fast with only two months to go. Council is urging residents to start cleaning up their blocks in preparation for the fire danger season.

The Fire Prevention Officers will start their inspections at the beginning of October. If your allotment is found to be non-complying at the time of inspections you will be issued a notice under section 105F of the Fire and Emergency Services Act.

It is required for allotments under 0.5ha to maintain grass and weeds to a height no higher than 10cm. For allotments larger than 0.5ha a 20m fuel reduction zone is required around houses as well as a 5m fuel reduction zone around sheds etc. along with a fire break of 4m around the boundaries.

If you are unable to do the work yourself the area has contractors you may wish to use.


