Council News

GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Community and Economic Development Committee – Membership

Council elected the following four elected members onto the Committee; Cr Stephens, Cr Morgan, Cr Trezona and Cr Karp. The Committee has two independent members and these positions are advertised to the general public.

Code of Conduct for Employees

From April 2, 2018 the Local Government (General) Regulations 2013 have been amended by the Local Government (General) (Employee Code of Conduct) Variation Regulation 2018, which provide for a new Code of Conduct for Council Employees. A new Code of Conduct for Council Employees Policy was presented and adopted by Council.

Council Elections – Caretaker Policy

Council will hold elections in late 2018 and as part of this process the current Council will enter "Caretaker Period" and details of this process are required within a Policy. This Policy was presented to Council at the March meeting and taken out for Public Consultation. No comments or feedback was received and Council adopted the Policy at the April meeting.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Foreshore Tourist Park Development

Contracts have been let to level the powered sites along the foreshore (eastern end) and to raise the services to the sites accordingly. This work is being coordinated with the Discovery Park Managers and has been scheduled to occur during the month of May. The works have been timed to occur after the busy Whiting Carnival period as there will be reduced availability of powered foreshore sites while the site works are underway.

The construction of the three new cabins is complete and preparations are being made to take power, water and sewer to the new sites at the western end of the park, with tenders for this work expected to be called shortly. The services for the entire park have been mapped in preparation for this stage (and future stages) of the redevelopment. The location and level of the new cabins — as well as a retaining wall and realignment of the western fence line - have been

pegged and arrangements made for the sites to be levelled. It is expected that the three new cabins will arrive on-site in June 2018.

Quotes are currently being sought from engineering firms so that levels can be confirmed for roads and other services for future stages of the redevelopment.

TOURISM

Wayfinding, Coastal Access and Regional Camping Strategy (Eye's on Eyre Strategy)

MCED and CEO met with representatives of Regional Development Australia Whyalla EP and EPNRM to discuss the preliminary findings of the report. Feedback was provided and a final draft has been provided and will be presented to Council at the June 2018 Ordinary Meeting of Council.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Men's Shed

The Streaky Bay Men's Shed provided a deputation to Council on their current status and future plans. Following this deputation Council resolved to write a letter thanking the Men's Shed for their deputation and enter into negotiations for future use of the old Streaky Bay Bowling Club Facility for use by the Men's Shed.

Streaky Bay Community Library

MCED and CEDO met with Librarian and School Principal to discuss the establishment and formalisation of the new Library Executive Committee and Library Forward Plan. The Library Forward Plan will be presented to Council for adoption at the May 2018 meeting of Council.

Kerrin McEvoy – Request to Honour

The Streaky Bay Racing Club have advised that they are forming a working party to progress a statue in honour of Kerrin's achievement. The group have been liaising with Kerrin and other racing identities and this will now be a community driven project.

Blancheport Estate Reserve

Community Engagement for the proposed fencing will be undertaken following the Eyre Avenue concept closing.

YOUTH

Youth Week - April 2018

Youth Week 2018 was a fun-filled week which saw a great variety of events held for the District's Youth. We had a wonderful turnout for our Youth Week events:

- -Wirrulla Laser Skirmish- 32 participants (full capacity)
- Streaky Ninja Obstacle Course- 40 participants
- Your Future Your Way Mind mapping and Lino Printing Workshop- 22 participants
- -Sceale Bay Surf School- 16 participants (full capacity)

On Friday April 20 a survey was sent out for feedback on Youth Week events, so far we have positive feedback.

WASTE MANAGEMENT

Illegal Dumping - Wirrulla

Council has been made aware of a number of instances of illegal dumping on property under the care and control of Council in the township of Wirrulla. Council were presented with a report to raise awareness of the dumping and seek a budget variation to remove the waste (estimated cost \$11,802). Council resolved to approach the Wirrulla community for their interest in undertaking the removal of the waste.

Kerbside Recycling – Future Direction

Council was presented with a report providing a summary of Councils actions and seeking clarification for the future of recycling services in our area. The introduction of a recycling service has been on Council's agenda for many years with direction from the Strategic Management Plan and Council's Draft Waste Management Strategy both of which were presented for Community Consultation. The report provided a table outlining Councils significant milestones in regards to its consideration of pursuing a recycling service and resolved at the meeting to rescind previous motions to go out for public consultation and include in the draft 2018/2019 Annual Business plan Kerbside Recycling Collection. SEALED ROADS

Dodgson Drive

Kerbing works have been completed and the road has been resealed. Works have now commenced on further stormwater works.

Wells Street and Bay Road Concept Plans

Council considered a report at the April 2018 meeting of Council to make an additional motion relating to the project that endorsed the plan with listed changes to enable staff to proceed with proceeding with the project. Council resolved to endorse the Wells Street Concept Plan with; removal of asphalt at the Doctors Beach Carpark, Single Lane Access to the Oval Precinct and the Caravan Park Entry and Slip Lane between AB Smith Road and Caravan Park entrance to be widened.

Disabled Parking - Chemist

Council considered a report following a Council request (from the September 2017) meeting investigating the feasibility of a disabled carpark in the vicinity of the chemist, with the closest existing parking being at the Newsagency. Reference was made to the Parking Facilities Australian Standard and in summary provided that the most suitable location would be Bay Road, with a parallel park on Bay Road not feasible under the standard. Council resolved at the meeting to investigate the modernisation and line marking of the off street carpark behind the Chemist and engage with the community and business houses to determine the service level required and develop a plan that will suit the current landscape. A letter regarding disability car parking was also received and Council acknowledged receipt of this letter.

Flinders/Hospital Drive- Williams Crescent Realignment

There was a request from Council in the previous years' annual business plan to modify the alignment of the intersection at the hospital to improve traffic congestion. Council has developed plans and Council resolved that both versions will provided for Public Consultation.

UNSEALED ROADS

Road Construction

Construction Staff have completed resheets to Philips Road, Petina Road, Gawler Ranges Road, Cape Bauer Road, Baird Bay Road, Moroney, Jessie Flat Roads and are currently working on Westall Way Loop. Patrol grading has ceased due to the dry weather conditions. 613km of Patrol Grading have been completed this financial year.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Protect Regional Airports - Campaign

Council received a letter from the Australian Airports Association requesting Council to provide a letter of support in the associations bid to increase commonwealth funding for regional airport infrastructure within the 2018/2019 budget. Council agreed and authorised the Mayor to forward a letter to local MP Rowan Ramsay in support of the campaign.

BUILDINGS

Sceale Bay Shelter

The shelter construction is substantially complete with a contractor engaged to reconnect the power, staff are investigating if the existing BBQ will be repaired or a new BBQ purchased. Council considered a report to allocate further funding to enable repairs of the staircase, electrical connection and other minor works, and this was resolved by Council.

DEVELOPMENT

LMA Waiver Request – 41-43 Oscar Williams Drive, Streaky Bay

An application was received for the construction of a shed, where the property owner was seeking to locate the shed on the reserve property boundary and 5.7m from Bockleberg Hill Drive. Council considered the application in a report presented to the April Meeting of Council and approved the waiver of clauses 3 and 4.1 of the Land Management Agreement.

Residential Land Analysis

Council as part of the Streaky Bay Master Plan review undertook a review of existing residential land the potential of releasing additional land. The report provided from the economist and marketing firm concluded that there is currently suitable land stock available to cater for the medium term and that rezoning should only be considered when existing stock has been reduced. The review provided Council with alternative options for marketing to stimulate residential development. The report also noted that one of the missing markets within the township is housing for the aged, and encouraged Council to undertake a review on housing for the aged in further detail. Council moved at the meeting to receive and note the report, with no further investigations.

HEALTH MANAGEMENT

Streaky Bay Medical Clinic Operations

A report was presented to the April 2018 meeting of Council providing a detailed outline of the current status of the Medical Clinic, a copy of this report is available on the website www.streakybay.sa.gov.au.

Streaky Bay Medical Clinic Incorporated Association

On Tuesday, April 10, 2018, a second meeting to further the establishment of the association. A number of resolutions were passed with the adoption of a name "Streaky Bay and District Medical Clinic Incorporated" and the nomination of the Public Officer. There was brief discussion on the constitution (rules), the next meeting scheduled for the first week in May will aim to adopt the rules and nominate persons to the Board and Office Bearer positions.





Country of Origin Labelling

From 1 July 2018, businesses must label their products according to the new Country of Origin Food Labelling Information Standard which has been in a transition period since 1 July 2016. Penalties of up to \$1.1 million (corporations) and \$220,000 (individuals) will apply for non-compliance.

It applies to food offered for retail sale in Australia, e.g. food sold in stores or markets, online or from a vending machine. The law does not apply to food sold in places like:

• restaurants • cafes • take-away shops • schools • food provided by caterers.








- the kangaroo in a triangle symbol tells you that the food was grown, produced or made in Australia.
- the bar chart is shaded, generally in 10 per cent increments, to show the percentage of Australian-grown or produced ingredients in the food. A fully shaded bar chart means the food contains exclusively Australian ingredients.
- the text sets out the origin of the food and, in most instances, the percentage of Australian-grown or produced ingredients in the food.





Dogs and Cats Online

From July 1 2018, Dogs and Cats Online will be the central database for microchipped and registered dogs and cats. This will also include registration payments and the breeders register.

People who wish to breed dogs and cats to give away or for sale after 1st July must be a registered breeder with the Dog and Cat Management Board. All advertisements for new dogs and cats must quote the registration number of the breeder. All breeders will also be required to follow the new industry standards and guidelines.

The owner of existing registered dogs should receive a renewal notice in the mail during the month of July. The notice will include their dog's new lifetime registration disc as well as instructions on how to complete their annual dog registration on Dogs and Cats Online. If you do not receive your renewal letter please contact the council.
