Council News

GOVERNANCE

Staff Update

Council's General Inspector Rodney Heath has resigned and will be pursuing an alternative career. Rodney has been an extremely valued member of Council's staff over many years commencing as a casual infrastructure maintenance crew member before forging his career in regulatory services. Rodney has played a key role within Council over his years of service and Council would like to thank Rodney for his service and wish him well in his future endeavors.

Council welcomes Sam Hawes into the position of Payroll/Customer Service. Council welcomes Sam into the team and looks forward to her commencement at the end of April.

Council Office Lift Installation

The tender has been received and Council currently working with contractor to negotiate contract and time frames for completion.

Animal Management Fees and Charges

Council received a report regarding fees and charges for Animal Management for the 2022/2023 financial year. Council resolved at that meeting that there would be no increase in fees for the next financial year.

INFRASTRUCTURE

LRCI Phase 3 – Funding Program

Council under the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure funding program been awarded further funding. This funding has been allocated to;

- Streaky Bay Youth Precinct
- Streaky Bay Town Entrance Statements
- Wirrulla Oval Playground Development
- Bay Road Reserve Development

PLEC – Powerline Undergrounding

Council have endorsed staff to proceed to the next stage (following an Expression of Interest Process) to investigate undergrounding of power along Eyre Avenue. This project would not be set to commence until 2024 should it be successful.

Streaky Bay Jetty Platform

The Jetty Platform has been completed and opened. The project has been well received by residents and visitors alike. Congratulations to the Infrastructure Services team and Thirsty Constructions for delivering such a high-class product for everyone to enjoy.

Streaky Bay Jetty Pool Platform & Shelter

Designs have been received for the platform extension and associated shelter. As the project is attached to a Department of Infrastructure and Transport facility approval and independent design verification is required, this is currently in progress.

Western Transit Loop

The Wells Street, AB Smith Road, Alec Baldock Drive, Wallschutzky Road loop project is underway. A project manager has been engaged to manage the project (approved by Council at the April meeting) and tender documents are due to be completed in the coming weeks.

Streaky Bay Cemetery Expansion

Council considered options for expansion of the Streaky Bay Cemetery. Council resolved at the meeting to establish back to back graves (a copy of the proposed plans is available by viewing the Agenda in <u>www.streakybay.sa.gov.au</u>)

Stormwater Management Plan Review

The existing Stormwater Management Plan is in excess of 10 years old. With the current level of growth and infrastructure development Council understands the need to review this plan to consider current and future stormwater capture and reuse. The tender closes May 4, 2022.

Back Beach Road Sealing

The last section of Back Beach Road will be sealed in the coming month.



Council News Cont'd

Finlayson Road Sealing – Funding Application

Council endorsed at the March 2022 meeting a funding application to be submitted to the Federal Government Rural and Remote Roads Upgrade Program. The funding application was to seal the entire length of the road connecting the coastal communities and Streaky Bay to Wirrulla and outback South Australia. This road was deemed the highest priority that fit the purpose and outcomes of the funding program.

COMMUNITY

Streaky Bay Community Library

A request was received from the Streaky Bay Area School to assist with funding of the replacement carpet for the Library. Council endorsed to consider the library carpet replacement within its 2022/2023 financial year budget process.

Wirrulla Sports and Recreation Precinct Playground

Council received a request for a co-contribution from Council towards the redevelopment of their playground located at the Wirrulla Oval. Council endorsed to provide an amount of a \$35,000 contribution towards the project.

Haslam and Poochera Defib Machine Installation

Council has funded the installation of two community defib machines in the townships of Haslam and Poochera. Haslam has been installed at the Post Office (next to the hall) and Poochera at the Hotel/Caravan Park.

Streaky Bay Area School Pool

Council received a request from the Streaky Bay Area School to co-fund the installation of heating to the Streaky Bay Area School Pool. The existing heating system was removed as part of the demolition of the old Art Room building and was not replaced at the time. The Council resolved for Council Officers to meet with the school and discuss all options available.

Rural Womens Gathering

Council is excited to be hosting this event in August 2022. Each year a community in South Australia organises a SA Rural Women's Gathering that brings together women from all demographics from all regions. The concept of a rural women's gathering was born in 1989 by a group of women in Victoria. This informal group of women was a group who called themselves a 'Women on Farms Discussion Group'.

The inaugural South Australian Rural Women's Gathering was held in October 1996 at Murray Bridge. See advert for full details of this years event.

Council in assist in hosting the event was successful in gaining \$27,000 in funding towards the event. This will go a long way towards guest speakers and increasing the number of activities available for participants.

TOURISM AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Streaky Bay Township Management Plan and District Management Plan Review

Tenders were sought and received to undertake a review of the Streaky Bay Township Masterplan and District Management Plan, with the DMP consisting of;

- Open Space and Recreation Plan
- Coastal Plan
- Township & Urban Design Framework
- Crown Land Open Space Development
- Caravan and Camping Guide
- Open Space Category & Hierarchy Guide

Council Officers will work with consultants to develop a community engagement strategy and are seeking expressions of interest from persons interested in joining a focus group to review these documents.

Streaky Bay Tourism and Business Association Partnership Agreement

Council has in place a five (5) year partnership agreement, where Council financially contributes towards the volunteer organization to undertake marketing and events. The Agreement is due for renewal and Council will be seeking to renew this agreement in the coming months.

Murphy's Haystacks Grant Funding

Council worked with the local land holder to secure funding through the Department of Environment and Water State Heritage Fund for infrastructure development, Council as part of this project will be undertaking a road entrance upgrade to provide provision for 2 lanes of traffic at the entrance point from Benbarber Road to assist with traffic congestion and flow at this point.

Council News Cont'd

Murphy's Haystacks is officially a State Heritage listed site (a requirement of the funding application) and one of the region and state's most iconic geological attractions.

Streaky Bay Youth Precinct

Council have endorsed additional funding to be applied to the precinct project. This will enable a greater level of landscaping and sundry items to fully develop the precinct area. A revised costing has been received from the project consultant and we expect consultation to commence on the final design within the next 2 months.

Blancheport Vacant Land – Medical Services Housing

Council at report presented in December resolved to allocate three allotments within its Blancheport Subdivision to donate towards the federal government funding housing for medical services. Council considered at the March meeting to allocate allotments 154,178 and 179.

Perlubie Landswap

Council has been negotiating over the past few years to undertake a landswap to ensure the continuation of access to Perlubie Beach. Council considered a report and resolved to endorse the Chief Executive Officer to continue with signing of the preliminary plan and other relevant documents to commence the public consultation process and potential road closure and road opening of the appropriate roads.

Wirrulla Campground Lease

The Wirrulla Campground lease has been informally managed by the Wirrulla Progress Association for a number of years. Council is now seeking to formalise that lease arrangements, Council at the March meeting endorsed a draft lease that enabled fee setting, capital replacement sinking fund and annual lease fee. Prior to this lease being implemented Council was required to undertake public consultation with no feedback received following this period.



Perlubie Beach Management

State Government hands care and control of Perlubie Beach to Council

If you follow our social media page, you will have seen the Mayor Travis Barber and CEO Damian Carter meeting with the incoming ministers from the new South Australian Government to discuss the issues and opportunities facing the district of Streaky Bay. One of the issues which was discussed was the pressure Perlubie Beach was under through visitation and whether care and control could be handed over to Council who was better equipped to handle the situation.

These efforts were successful and care and control of Perlubie Beach has been handed over to Council. The move will enable localised decision making on the beach's future and will see greater efficiencies with localised resources being used to manage the site.

The intention now is to use the off-peak season to undertake extensive community consultation on how to manage the beach in the next summer period. However, some solutions already being put forward include:

- Introduction of a permit system for the beach, so Council can cap numbers at a sustainable level
- Limiting camping on the beach to selfcontained campers only
- Introduction of speed limits on the beach
- Stopping campers from occupying the day use shelters
- Limiting the area along the beach allocated to campers so habitats of shore birds and other wildlife can be maintained

Council will inform the community of the specifics of the community engagement process via its communication channels in the coming period.

CEO UPDATE

From the CEO's desk

The Australian Bureau of Statistics recently released their latest Estimated Residential Population figures for 30 June 2021. The Streaky Bay population was estimated as being 2,226 individuals, an increase of 150 (7.2%) on the year before. Going by this and previous growth rates, by 2036, the District Council of Streaky Bay's population will have doubled to over 5,000 individuals. This is no secret to us as we can literally see the houses being built around us. However, it does present several challenges to Council in terms of managing this growth.

Regarding the management of population growth, Council is committed to the following:

- ensuring it is facilitating sustainable growth;
- ensuring we have available commercial, industrial, and residential space to house this growth, and;
- ensuring we have the services in place to meet the requirements of its growing population.
- To assist in meeting the following goals, over the next few years you will see a number of key projects rolled out including:
 - Delivery of the District of Streaky Bay Master Plan: Master planning is about making the connection between buildings, social settings, and their surrounding environments. A Master Plan includes analysis, recommendations, and proposals for a site's population, economy, housing, transportation, community facilities, and land use. It is based on public input, surveys, planning initiatives, existing development, physical characteristics, and social and economic conditions.
 - Development of a Health and Community Hub in feasibility study: The feasibility study would look at building a potential Health and Community Hub in Streaky Bay. The Study would capture the following:
 - Needs Analysis/Business Case for Streaky Bay to have a Health and Community Hub
 - Potential operating model for the Hub
 - Possible location for the Hub
 - Engagement of architect to develop designs for the Hub
 - Engagement of quantity surveyor to provide costings for the building of the hub
 - A health and community hub will provide a modern and appropriate centre for the delivery of health and allied health services in the district of Streaky Bay

- Revisiting the Stormwater Management Plan: Changing climate is bringing longer, dryer, hotter summers and more intense rainfall events. Rainfall events such as the one in January this year demonstrated that Streaky Bay's current stormwater infrastructure isn't capable of handling such intense rainfall events and presently stormwater runs off into the sea which will eventually start to have environmental implications. Longer, dver and hotter summers will also see further pressure on the area's water supplies, hence Council needs to look at options for the capturing and reuse of stormwater to green its parks and gardens. The Stormwater Master Plan will help inform us of future infrastructure development so we can meet these challenges.
- Undertaking a commercial and industrial land supply study: A unique issue facing Streaky Bay compared to other rural communities is the lack of commercial and industrial land/premises. This has become an inhibitor for business growth and the attraction of new business. Streaky Bay needs more commercial and industrial land supply to ensure employment and services can be provided to its growing population base. A commercial and industrial land study will identify and establish the business case for new commercial and industrial land precincts and inform the rezoning of identified land.

In addition to these projects, Council will continue to advocate for the following services for its growing population:

- Early Childhood Education places
- Reliable Power Networks
- Additional Water Security
- Provision of additional emergency services
- Better telecommunications infrastructure and digital connectivity

I understand in terms of projects, these are very much paper-base exercises. However, we need community informed, long-term planning that provides a conceptual layout to guide the future growth and development of our township. These activities will assist us in achieving this.

Thanks to Mary Cash for the laying of the wreath at the Anzac day service.






GREAT WHITE KAOLIN PROJECT ROADS AND TRAFFIC

Andromeda is developing the Great White Kaolin Project, located 15km southwest of Poochera. The mining operation to extract and refine bright white halloysite-koolin cloy is expected to create up to 75 direct jobs and add a significant economic boost to the region over a 28-year Life of Mine.

It is expected that up to 10 trucks loaded with bagged product will depart site daily in the initial stages of the Development, with up to 20 proposed when the Development expands.

Trucks will be A-triple or quad road trains, which will be determined through a tender process with logistics companies, and in conjunction with the Department for Infrastructure and Transport.

PROPOSED TRAFFIC ROUTE

Tonkin Consulting have assessed traffic routes from the Development to three potential port options:

- Thevenard
- Lucky Bay
- Whyalla.

Transport routes will vary dependant on the chosen port location. Andromeda has committed to upgrading Poochera – Port Kenny Road and associated intersections to accommodate haulage trucks from the Development. This commitment extends to ongoing maintenance of the road for the life of the mine. The redesign of the road will benefit all road users.

STREAKY BAY ROAD INTERSECTION

The intersection of Poochera – Port Kenny Road with Streaky Bay Road will be upgraded to support the Development. Upgrade designs have been provided to both the Department for Infrastructure and Transport and the District Council of Streaky Bay for review and approval. The intersection will be widened to cater to all trucking configurations considered for use at the Development. An assessment of sight distances for vehicles entering Streaky Bay Road from Poochera – Port Kenny Road has found that the roads exceed the relevant Performance Based Standards (PBS). The existing lane and shoulder widths of Streaky Bay Road to Poochera are also acceptable, based on the PBS.

ROAD SAFETY AND THE CHANDADA SCHOOL BUS

As part of ongoing community engagement, Andromeda maintains communication with the Karcultaby Area School and Chandada school bus drivers. Andromeda has committed to halting haulage trucks along Poochera – Port Kenny Road during the time of school bus runs.

ROAD SAFETY AND LOCAL ROADS

As a result of ongoing discussions with the local community, Andromeda will implement a policy directing all mine traffic to use Poochera – Port Kenny Road, in order to minimise the impact to other roads and road users in the area.




