Council News

GOVERNANCE

Staffing News

General Inspector - Council's recruitment process for the General Inspector position is continuing.

Urban Maintenance Team – Council welcomes Troy Georgiou to the role.

Council Elections

Council received 7 nominations from the 8 vacancies available at the recent Council elections. This has resulted in 1 vacancy remaining. As part of this election process the Vacancy cannot be advertised until the remaining of the state's Local Government elections are completed.

Council Officers are still awaiting further direction on when and the process of the supplementary election will occur.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Streaky Bay Motorcycling Club Inc. – In Kind

Council Officers received a request from the Streaky Bay Motorcycling Club to assist with the provision of in-kind support for start up requirements for the club. Council endorsed to support the group through the provision of 1600-2000 cubic metres of rubble as in-kind.

Outdoor Blow Up Cinema

Council have purchased an Outdoor Blow up Cinima that will be available for use throughout the district. Council's Community Development team are currently working towards the arrangements of initial community events to be held in 2023.

Australia Day Award Nominations

Nominations opened in October and will close on November 18, 2022 for Australia Day Award recipients.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Council Plant and Equipment Use Policy

Council Officers have reviewed and update the existing Policy to include a wide range of event hire equipment now available through the Council.

Anyone wishing to hire Council Plant and Equipment will be required to complete an application form, fees and charges apply for certain equipment.

A copy of the application form and policy is available at Council's Principal Office and Visitor Centre.

Aerodrome Lighting Upgrade – Streaky Bay

Council Officers were successful in gaining funding through the Remote Airstrip Upgrade Program to replace the existing ground lighting at the Streaky Bay Aerodrome, this will enable lighting to meet new regulatory requirements.

Streaky Bay Jetty Pool Platform Extension and Shade

Construction of framework for Jetty Pool Shade has commenced, there may be period of times where the Jetty Pool or Jetty are closed to enable construction works to be undertaken safely and Council Staff will work closely with the Construction Team to ensure this is kept to a minimum.

Lions Park Development

Council at the October meeting of Council endorsed for funding to be expended from the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program on the redevelopment of the Lions Park. The redevelopment will consider improved traffic flow, management of the black/grey water disposal area, information signage, open space and improved connectivity.

Streaky Bay Town Entrance Statement Design

Council has allocated funding this year to the design and development of Town Entrance Statements for Streaky Bay. The process for design development has commenced.

TOURISM AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Community Strengthening and Planning Committee Meeting – August Meeting

Items discussed at the August Committee meeting and endorsed at the September Council meeting were:

- Visitor Information Centre reporting
- Perlubie Beach Management
- Road & Place Naming Policy Update

Blancheport Council Residential Vacant Land – Inventory Review

Council undertook an independent review of its vacant land stock within the Blancheport Subdivisions, Council resolved at the September meeting to increase the sale costs for its remaining properties currently on the market.

Streaky Bay Rode Dry Zone

Council received a request to progress a designated Dry Zone area at the Streaky Bay Racecourse as part of the annual Streaky Bay Rodeo By The Sea, this was endorsed and will be implemented accordingly.

New Years Eve – Streaky Bay Foreshore Dry Zone

Council at the September meeting also approved the Dry Zone area for the Foreshore as part of the annual New Year's Eve festivities. This Dry Zone will be in place as per previous years.

Sponsorship, Donations and Grants Policy

Council has previously considered all applications for various levels of funding from community organisations and individuals on a case by case basis. A Policy has now been developed and endorsed to provide guidance and delegations in regard to the committing of funds for such applications. A copy of the Policy is available on Council's website www.strekaybay.sa.gov.au

Tractor Beach Wifi Node

The Tractor Beach Wifi Node was a project that was undertaken between South Australian Tourism Commission and Regional Development Australia Whyalla Eyre Peninsula. That trial project has now been completed and Council were offered to take ongoing ownership of the Wifi Node, with Council endorsing that offer and therefore transfer of the asset to Council ownership will occur in early 2023.

Streaky Bay Youth Precinct (Skate Park)

Community Consultation sessions (Round 1) were held in July 2022, following this Council received and were presented with the Community Consultation Summary that provided an overview of what was heard the sessions.

This early consultation was then utilized to develop Draft Concept Plans that were released for Public Comment. Council will consider this feedback at the November meeting of Council with a view to endorsing the Draft Concept Plans.

Once the plans have been endorsed, they will be developed into Engineered/For Construction Plans, Development Approval will be sought and construction is due to commence late January early February. The project is on track to be completed by June 30, 2023.

Streaky Bay Children's Festival

Cutty's Boat Tours

Council Officers have been working with the operators of Cutty's Boat Tours in considering options close to Streaky Bay for tours. Council have endorsed suitable locations and will continue to work closely with the tour operator.

Township and District Management Plan Reviews

Consultant onsite reviews were completed in early August 2022, this was followed by a weeklong of community drop in sessions held throughout the district.

The Consultants are now working closely with Council Officers to consider the feedback, ideas and visions for individual communities in the development of Draft Plans that will be distributed for further consultation.

Perlubie Beach Management (Tractor Beach, Speeds Point)

Council Officers have been working closely with the Community and a community focus group to consider community feedback and options for the ongoing management of Perlubie Beach.

In addition to this as a district nature based camping roll out Council will consider similar options to its other nature based campground sites.

A full report to the November ordinary meeting of Council is being presented to consider a number of options. A full media release following the endorsement of options will be provided.



How Long had respondents been accessing Perlubie beach for?







Respondents strongly felt with 56% indicating that the numbers should be capped at 20 or less.


What is the maximum length of time people can stay on the beach?

The majority of respondents felt that the current rate was sufficient.

72% of respondents also felt that the charge should be inclusive of all persons (e.g. per van per night).

These results were collated the day after the survey closed (noting not all hard copies had been received at this point), and were presented to the Perlubie Management Focus Group on Wednesday 26 October 2022 for their consideration.

Focus group interest was advertised in late August and September with the following persons registering their interest, Brenton Lynch, Larraine Scally and Trudy McGowan. The focus group consists of 3 Council Members and 3 Community Members, in addition is the Mayor and Council Officers.

The Focus Group considered the results and utilising this information have made a number of *recommendations* to the Council for consideration.

The Council has received a report outlining the recommendations from the focus group and will consider these recommendations for possible endorsement at the November 8 meeting of Council.

Project lead and Council's General Manager of Prosperity, Mrs Penny Williams outlined that a balanced approach was needed in the development of the management measures recommendations, she said: "Considering the beach has been a camping spot for some families for over 60 years, consideration needed to be undertaken to ensure the interests of local residents, campers and local families who have camped at the beach for multiple generations were met".

Local Resident and reference group member, Mr Brenton Lynch spoke about the decision-making process that was undertaken by the committee, he said: "The development of recommendations for Council's consideration was challenging in terms of obtaining a balance of everyone's desires. As a reference group the approach we have undertaken was to ensure we have aligned each recommendation with the results from the survey. I think this approach will ensure the most equitable outcomes for all." – Brenton Lynch

Council CEO, Damian Carter spoke the possible adoption and introduction of new management measures and said it was the start of Council's journey to manage the beach, stating "We came into this process knowing that the implementation of the proposed management model might not be an initial success with learning lessons to come. In anticipation of this, we have scheduled further reference group meetings to assess the success of the initial measures and to make further recommendation for the refinement of the measures. However, in saying this Council has put its best foot forward through undertaking extensive consultation, including undertaking a survey which had a record number of responses".

CEO UPDATE

From the CEO's desk

Summer is upon us

The first days of warm weather have certainly made us aware that summer is upon us. This warm weather also ushers in an influx of visitors who come to the Streaky Bay region for a holiday by the sea. Last year we saw an extremely busy summer and as a location we somewhat struggled to deal with the extra visitation.

So, what lies ahead for this summer and what is Council looking to do to handle the extra visitation?

In terms of visitation, we have seen a movement away from interstate and intrastate travel to overseas travel and subsequently, a decrease in the domestic visitation market. However, that doesn't withstand the fact that 1

in 13 Australian families now own caravans, hence we are still expecting high visitor numbers. Understanding this Council is undertaken several initiatives to try and better manage the extra visitation to the region. This includes:

- The placement of extra bins at key locations
- The placement of portaloos at key locations
- Placement of bins outside of the Transfer centre post-Christmas and New Years to assist residents with the extra waste created from their holiday activities
- The facilitation of extra rubbish services when required
- Implementation of additional signage directing caravans and long vehicles to the Wells St long vehicle car park
- Development of a responsible camping campaign
- Engagement of part-time council officer to deal with illegal camping on private property
- Grading of roads to popular tourism destinations
- Council providing staff to open the school pool during non-school hours to provide a safe swimming location for residents and visitors

This year is also the first summer, Council will be managing Perlubie Beach and at Council's November meeting the following recommendations were endorsed for implementation at the beach commencing on the 15th of December 2022

- An introduction of a permit system to camp on the beach
- Capping of numbers to 20 caravans per night
- Allocation of 10 extra sites (30 caravans per night) for residents during the month of January and the Easter holidays
- Banning of camping in the Perlubie Beach Carpark
- Allocating of a set area on the beach for campers

- Beach fires to only occur in portable firepits and campers to bring their own wood
- Allocation of certain beach shelters for day-use only with flexibility being in place for local scout and school group's camping trips to the beach
- Banning of the emptying of grey water tanks onto the beach and introduction of the rule that all campers must have a self-contained toilet system
- Introduction of booking system for beach shelters to be used for special events

Some may see these initiatives as being quite exciting and will hopefully facilitate a better experience for visitors coming to the region and residents enjoying our amazing communities and beaches.

However, we know this is still a work in progress and particular with the management of Perlubie Beach there will be some lessons learnt and fine turning ahead. From Councils perspective, we will continue to observe these lessons, consult with our communities, and continue to strive towards the best possible outcomes for all.

Appropriate swimwear must be worn at all times (see details below)

Do not use pool if you are feeling unwell or showing symptoms of cold or flu, or directed[TM4] to be isolating in accordance with SA Health Regulations

Do not use pools if you have suffered from diarrhoea in the past week

Do not use pool if you have any open wounds

Members and guests, not toilet trained must wear swim nappies

In the instant that faeces enters the pool the Pool Supervisor MUST be notified immediately and the pool must be closed immediately

The pool is a multi-use pool.

Nappies are not to be changed at poolside. Please make use of the toilets or lawn areas. Safety Equipment must not tampered with

Pool Users are not permitted to enter the Plant Room

Pool Users are not permitted to use school equipment relating to the pool

Do NOT PUSH or THROW People In

The use of flippers is not permitted within the Pool

Diving and Jumping are only permitted in the deep end of the pool

NO glass, food or drinks (other than water) are allowed in the pool area.

NO Smoking or alcohol is allowed within the pool grounds[SB5] Soft Water toys may be used at the discretion of the lifeguard.

Body boards and surfboards are not permitted.

Sitting or hanging on lap lanes is prohibited.

Avoid eating or consuming alcoholic beverages before using the pool

Animals are prohibited.

Behaviour deemed not conducive to public safety will not be permitted. Boisterous or dangerous behaviour will not be tolerated.

The pool must be vacated during electrical storms.

The lifeguards have full authority to enforce rules in pool facilities





From there it was back on the bus for the trip home.


On the 17th October we had Ian Jenkins as our guest speaker. Ian is in charge of the Blancheport vineyard run by the school.

Council Waste Matters

Cardboard is free to drop off at the Transfer Station and greatly reduces the volume in your kerbside bin reducing what goes to landfill.

The cardboard is baled on site and freighted to YCA Recycling in Adelaide for recycling. A truck load of 80 bales was transported in January.

A reminder that the transfer station accepts the following non-deposit items for recycling:-

- Plastic milk and cream bottles, washed with the lids removed opaque in colour
- Cardboard, cut or broken up into pieces that fit into a 240litre wheelie bin (please note that cardboard and cardboard boxes not to the correct size will be charged)
- Tin and steel cans, e.g. fruit tins, soup cans, etc. washed with the lid put inside the tin

Please ensure your waste is sorted prior to arrival, this avoids contamination of waste.

The Environment Protection Authority (EPA) has imposed strict conditions on the disposal of waste in South Australia. The attendant will direct you to where your waste is to be placed – penalties will be imposed on Council for contaminated waste by the EPA. Your cooperation in sorting your waste is greatly appreciated.

The attendant has the right to refuse any waste that is not sorted.

Other items which are free to drop off at the Transfer Station are:

- Green waste please see attendant before dropping off
- · Steel; and
- Car Batteries
