Eyre Peninsula Leadership Development Program

In 2023 RDAEP is teaming up with Champions Academy to deliver a deep impact leadership program, designed to empower individuals to recognise and apply their human potential, to shape the future that they want for Eyre Peninsula.

Over the course of three 'retreat-style' residentials, participants will:

develop strong peer networks;

work together with behavioural expert and 'humanpreneur' Shelley Wild;

work together with leading demographer, author and futurist Bernard Salt; and

work with award-winning change agent Sarah Prime – along with a number of inspirational local leaders and guest mentors.

What do you need to know?

Each two-day residential will be hosted in a different location across Eyre Peninsula, two months apart.

Dates are currently being finalised but sessions are expected to be held in late March/early April, June and August (with some short online group catch ups and individual mentoring in between).

Program completion and a graduation event will take place in October.

Anyone aged 18 or older and residing on the Eyre Peninsula is eligible to apply.

A program of this calibre would generally cost in excess of \$5,000 per person, but scholarships are being offered to a limited number of lucky Eyre Peninsula applicants through funding from Primary Industries and Regions SA (however, please note that there is an expectation that successful applicants do contribute a small amount to demonstrate their commitment to the program – this contribution will be confirmed with participants at the time of acceptance into the program).

### Rules

- In the instant that faeces enters the pool the Pool Supervisor MUST be notified immediately and the pool must be closed immediately
- The pool is a multi-use pool.
- Nappies are not to be changed at poolside. Please make use of the toilets or lawn areas.
- · Safety Equipment must not be tampered with
- Pool Users are not permitted to enter the Plant Room
- Pool Users are not permitted to use school equipment relating to the pool
- Do NOT RUN
- Do NOT PUSH or THROW People In
- Diving and Jumping are only permitted in the deep end of the pool
- NO glass, food or drinks (other than water) are allowed in the pool area.
- NO Smoking or alcohol is allowed within the school grounds
- Soft Water toys may be used at the discretion of the lifeguard.
- · Body boards and surfboards are not permitted.
- Sitting or hanging on lap lanes is prohibited.
- Avoid eating or consuming alcoholic beverages before using the pool.
- Animals are prohibited.
- If animals are found within the pool (i.e. Snakes), notify the supervisor immediately
- Behaviour deemed not conducive to public safety will not be permitted.
- Boisterous or dangerous behaviour will not be tolerated.
- The pool must be vacated during electrical storms.
- The lifeguards have full authority to enforce rules in pool facilities
- All rubbish and waste must be removed from the Pool area and users are responsible for the disposal of their own waste

### **Child Supervision**

- Children 8 years and under are not permitted to use the pool without adult supervision and that supervision must be undertaken from an adult seated within the designated pool area





### **Council Waste Matters**

Cardboard is free to drop off at the Transfer Station and greatly reduces the volume in your kerbside bin reducing what goes to landfill.

The cardboard is baled on site and freighted to YCA Recycling in Adelaide for recycling. A truck load of 80 bales was transported in January.

A reminder that the transfer station accepts the following non-deposit items for recycling:-

- Plastic milk and cream bottles, washed with the lids removed opaque in colour
- Cardboard, cut or broken up into pieces that fit into a 240litre wheelie bin (please note that cardboard and cardboard boxes not to the correct size will be charged)
- Tin and steel cans, e.g. fruit tins, soup cans, etc. washed with the lid put inside the tin

Please ensure your waste is sorted prior to arrival, this avoids contamination of waste.

The Environment Protection Authority (EPA) has imposed strict conditions on the disposal of waste in South Australia. The attendant will direct you to where your waste is to be placed – penalties will be imposed on Council for contaminated waste by the EPA. Your cooperation in sorting your waste is greatly appreciated.

The attendant has the right to refuse any waste that is not sorted.

Other items which are free to drop off at the Transfer Station are:

- Green waste please see attendant before dropping off

- Car Batteries
