### Sister reports from London on Kerrin's success

I couldn't quite believe it at first and it took me a few minutes to wake up and realise that the whole of Australia had just stood still and witnessed my brother flashing across the winning post at Flemington. After hearing the news I just wanted to be back home to celebrate and be among others that could associate with what the Melbourne Cup means to Australians.

I am living in London, England and even though the Melbourne Cup is an International Event, the majority of English people don't associate with it at all. But that didn't deter me - I still had to celebrate this fantastic news – so myself and some fellow antipodeans made our way to an Australian pub, 'The Walkabout' in Angel Islington, London, where we were welcomed like heroes!! We celebrated with Moët champagne and watched the replay. Outside at the newspaper

stand, I bought the London Evening Standard, which had a large photo of Kerrin and the headline 'McEvoy's Brew leaves Brits with a Hangover'. It was really quite amazing to be standing on a street corner in London reading about my little brother Kerrin, who not too long ago was only a little tacker riding a chaff bag at Pop's stables in Streaky Bay.

Kerrin was always horse mad and I remember one day when we were at Grandma and Grandpa McEvoy's, in Gawler. Kerrin was 6 years old and I was 8. Kerrin decided that he wanted to be the race horse and I the jockey, but after realising he couldn't really run around with me on his back – he decided he would be a trotting horse instead, so he got Grandpa's sack truck and turned it in to a trotting rig, he stood at the

front with the sack truck behind him and I hopped on, whip in hand – and off we went, Kerrin neighing and snorting like a horse!!! This was entertainment for the whole two week stay at Grandma and Grandpa's – the sack truck definitely got a work out, not to mention us two!

I have enjoyed hearing all the celebrating and events that have taken place since the Melbourne Cup and only wish I could have been there, but I have told Kerrin, he will just have to ride the winner next year – so I can witness it in the flesh!!

# Council News

## INFRASTRUCTURE

### Road Construction

Construction Staff have completed resheets to Philips Road, Petina Road, Gawler Ranges Road, Cape Bauer Road, Baird Bay Road and are currently working on Moroney Road. Patrol grading has ceased due to the dry weather conditions. 613km of Patrol Grading have been completed this financial year.

### Sealed Roads

Woodlawn Road – earthworks and pavement completed. Sealing scheduled for early March 2018.

Sealed road shoulder maintenance will be undertaken in Poochera, Haslam, Streaky Bay and Wirrulla townships. Rural Sealed road shoulder maintenance is currently underway to Witera Road.

### Dodgson Drive - Kerbing

A contractor has been engaged to undertake kerbing works along Dodgson Drive.

### Speed Limit on Sceale Bay Beach

Responses have been received and will be collated and presented to Council accordingly, to decide if Council will pursue the reduction of the speed limit.

### Little Islands Boat Ramp Proposal

Council received a petition regarding the construction of a boat ramp at Little Islands. Council received and noted the petition at the January 2018 meeting.

### Streaky Bay Oval Precinct – Bore Proposal

Council received a deputation from representatives of the Streaky Bay District Community Complex regarding their proposal to establish a water bore at the facility for the purpose of water storage to irrigate the oval in the event that re-use water is not available. While a letter of support has been provided to assist in obtaining grant funding for the establishment of a bore, Council still requires further information before making a decision as to whether the proposal can proceed.

## WASTE MANAGEMENT

### Kerbside Recycling – Proposed Implementation

Council agreed at the January 2018 meeting to go out for public consultation on the proposed kerbside recycling service, and staff are currently working on documentation.

## BUILDING

### Institute Hall Repairs

Contractors have completed the required repairs to the cracks on the front facade which will enable the safety barriers to be removed from site.

### Sceale Bay Shelter

The shelter construction is substantially complete with a contractor engaged to reconnect the power, staff are investigating if the existing BBQ will be repaired or a new BBQ purchased.

### Visitor Centre

Council have requested staff to investigate the cost of upgrading IT Equipment and furniture to combine the Conference Room and Council Chambers at the Visitor Centre.

## REGULATING

### Lease – Cape Bauer – Crown Land

Council has received correspondence from the Department Environment Water Natural Resources, seeking Council's interest in becoming "land manager for the community over this land to either allow or control access to this land". Council considered a report at the January 2018 meeting, and resolved to inform DEWNR that Council is not willing to lease nor take responsibility for maintenance, access control or liability of the area at this time as Council have not, and are not resourced, to act as the land manager. Nor is the access to the cliff via a track under Council's care and control and any (contracted) works/development in the area has always been under the care, control and management of DEWNR/Crown Lands.

## COMMUNITY

### Community Notice Board

The local ArtsUp community group are currently finalising the mosaic design, and workshops to commence mosaicking have been scheduled over the next month.

### Harvest Code of Conduct SMS System

Council have asked staff to investigate the implementation of a harvest code of conduct SMS (text messaging) system, similar to that in place within the Wudinna district. Feedback has been requested and there has been limited response, with those responding raising concerns over the liability of risk associated with decision making, and additionally the varying weather conditions over the breadth of the district would make advice warnings difficult.

### Child Care Centre Study

A report was presented to Council at the January 2018 meeting to seek Council's support in assisting the Little Flippers Play Centre group with undertaking a study/business case into the viability of a Child Care Centre in our district, Council agreed to assist with the undertaking of this study over the next 12 months.

### SA Water

SA Water's customer engagement process – Water Talks – involves a series of events plus a new website for SA Water customers around the state to learn about SA Water and provide their thoughts. Your honest feedback will help SA Water understand what they do well, what needs to be improved and what you value most about your water services. SA Water will use everyone's feedback as they develop their Regulatory Business Proposal for 2020-24. Being part of Water Talks is easy. Visit [watertalks.sawater.com.au](http://watertalks.sawater.com.au) and sign up to find out more and have your say. Events across South Australia will be listed online from January 2018, so sign up to stay informed about when and where these will be held.

SA Water customers, both residential and business, are encouraged to participate in this process and sign up to Water Talks for future announcements, feedback and opportunities to take part in helping us develop our Regulatory Business Proposal.

### Service SA Business Proposal

Council received a call from Service SA staff at the beginning of January, following a direction from Minister Rau's Office regarding Council's proposal to become a Service SA agent.

The Manager has been in contact with the Service SA representative and will be meeting on February 15, 2018 to further discuss a business model.

## GOVERNANCE

### Community and Economic Development Committee – Terms of Reference

Council at an earlier meeting resolved to establish a Section 41 Committee "Community and Economic Development Committee". The terms of reference for this Committee were drafted and adopted at the January 2018 meeting. The objectives of the committee are:

- Assist the Council to facilitate and promote economic growth and community development in the region
- To provide advice to the Council and recommend actions, including the conduct of studies associated with business and economic development, as required, in order to facilitate the identification of opportunities, issues, strategies and actions.
- Provide advice to the Council where necessary to facilitate the creation of business and community networks
- To oversee the implementation of projects (including those identified in the Council's Strategic Plan, marketing and promotion associated with businesses, economic and community development
- To oversee the implementation of projects, marketing and promotion associated with Council's business enterprises (including caravan and camping)

The Committee membership includes two suitably qualified community members.

## ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

### Foreshore Tourist Park Development

Council has made \$2.13m available in the 2018-19 Annual Business Plan for the procurement of 9 cabins to be installed along the foreshore, forming Stage 2 of Council's commitment to redevelop the park. Budget for 2018-19 needs to be considered now so that the cabins can be constructed and delivered during the park's quieter period in August/September (it can take six to eight months from the time of going out to tender to having the cabins installed).

Stage 1 is currently underway, with three new cabins being constructed for delivery to the site in the coming months. We are currently working with the park operator, Discovery Parks, on timeframes and logistics for installation.

Council is seeking funding through the Building Better Regions (BBR) grant to supplement Council's contribution for future stages of the redevelopment, with an outcome expected around mid-year.

### Tractor Beach Campground

Council staff had been investigating the expansion of the Tractor Beach Camp Ground in accordance with the adopted District Management Plan. A report was presented to the January 2018 meeting of Council, requesting funding to pursue the initial process of applying for native vegetation clearance to allow the expansion. This funding was not accepted by Council and therefore proposed works will not be proceeding at this point

## STAFF

Council recently lost the services of Corporate Services Manager, Kristen Clark, who was successful in gaining a position as the Chief Executive Officer at the District Council of Orroroo Carrieton and Ebonie Beard who has completed her traineeship and taken up employment in Adelaide. Council wishes them well in their new endeavours.

Council welcomes back Karli Sargent from her maternity leave, Karli resumes her role as Rates Officer. Council has additionally filled vacancies that have been outstanding, and welcome to the team Brooke Cupples and Prue Dawes who have commenced part time undertaking various roles on a 12 month contract.



## SCHOOL VACCINATION PROGRAMME

Parents of Year 8 and 9 students are reminded to read and complete the consent forms (provided and handed out by the school) and return them to your school for your children to be eligible for the 2018 vaccination programme.

Vaccinations are ordered based on the number of consent forms received. No consent form, no free vaccination for your child. In such instances the cost and booking an appointment at the medical centre will be your responsibility.

## RECYCLING AND CDL (CANS AND BOTTLES)

Council recently purchased the CDL (container deposit legislation) licence and associated equipment from Bay Recycling Pty Ltd. Bay Recycling Pty Ltd had been seeking to sell the business for some time, and Council made the decision to purchase this section of the business to ensure the ongoing service to the community. The existing baling system, sheds and land were sold privately by Bay Recycling Pty Ltd.

Council in 2017 purchased their own baler which is located at the Streaky Bay Transfer Station (Flinders Highway, Streaky Bay), with a view to undertake further recycling options (cardboard, plastics, etc) that are currently being investigated, in the future.

The CDL cans and bottles collection will be a valuable addition to recycling options for the community and is now conveniently located at the Streaky Bay Transfer Station.

Council thanks Julian Kelsh of Bay Recycling for his service to the community in the past.

## COUNTRY HEALTH SA

Country SA Primary Health Network (CSAPHN) was very pleased to have been announced as one of twelve new National Suicide Prevention Trial (NSPT) Sites, bringing significant resources, activity and funding to areas of need in regional South Australia.

The trial will be placed at a regional level to better respond to local needs, and identify new learnings in relation to suicide prevention strategies. The 2-year trial will adopt a system based approach to the delivery of suicide prevention services, targeting populations identified at a local level as 'at-risk'.

To help CSAPHN get a better picture of the needs of each community we have developed a survey to engage with stakeholders, community members, consumers, carers, community organisations and service providers, to identify gaps and opportunities in regional suicide prevention. Findings from this survey will help shape the development of local and regional community suicide prevention action plans and the allocation of resources to help prevent suicide. If you live, work or study in the Cities of Port Lincoln, Whyalla, Port Augusta, Port Pirie, Yorke Peninsula or the Country North region of South Australia please take some time to complete the survey.

### District Council of Streaky Bay Public Meeting Success

The District Council of Streaky Bay recently committed to purchase the Streaky Bay Medical Clinic from current owners Gaye and Dr Rob Oswald, who will be retiring at the end of January 2018, with a view for the clinic to be transitioned to a community ownership through the development of an Incorporated Association.

Council invited all members of the community to a public meeting held on January 16, 2018, 7.00pm at the Streaky Bay Community Complex, to inform the community of the changes and transitioning, and seeking interested persons to establish the future Incorporated Association.

The meeting was a wonderful success with 158 persons registered as attending, an additional 25 apologies were received.

The meeting attendance included Rowan Ramsay, Federal Member for Grey, Peter Treloar, State Member for Flinders, Michele Smith (Country Health SA), Regional Director, Far North and Eyre Region, Doctor Susan Merrett (Country Health SA), Director Medical Services, Far North, Eyre, Yorke and Northern Regions.

The community indicated following the question and session, that they wished to proceed with the development of an Incorporated Association, with 25 persons registering interest on the night.

Mayor Barber said “the great turn out we received on the night and the commitment from the community to go ahead with the incorporation, indicated how important this issue is in our community. Our next step is to hold a second meeting with those people interested in the Incorporated Association to discuss the process. There are still opportunities for those that did not register to be involved, so I encourage people to please contact the Council. The Chief Executive is continuing to work proactively in seeking a doctor for the future, and this is an obvious priority”.



## Active Club Program

This program supports community-based sport and active recreation organisations to deliver their programs and services to all South Australians. It provides up to \$5,000 for program and equipment applications or up to \$25,000 for facility upgrades. For facility development projects, organisations can apply for up to 75% of the total project and/or donated materials and in-kind support.

## Community Recreation and Sports Facilities Program

This program helps eligible organisations to plan, establish or improve sport and active recreation facilities that meet the needs of the community. Organisations can apply under three categories, with requests up to \$1 million considered.

## Female Facilities Program—Round 3

The Female Facilities Program helps eligible organisations to develop sustainable, functional, inclusive and fit for purpose female change room facilities that meet the current and future needs of the South Australian Sporting community.

State sport and Active Recreation organisations, Industry Representative Bodies, Local Government, Community Groups, Incorporated Sport or Active Recreation Clubs that do not hold a gaming machine license are eligible to apply.

## Sporting Surfaces Program

The Sporting Surfaces Program helps eligible organisations to develop new or upgrade/enhance or replace existing synthetic and hard-court sport playing surfaces including synthetic turf playing fields, indoor and outdoor courts to support sports in South Australia.

## Job Accelerator Grant Scheme

The Scheme has been established to encourage South Australian businesses to employ additional full-time, part-time and casual employees, and maintain them for at least 12 months. A Job Accelerator Grant of up to \$10,000 (\$5,000 each year for two years) per new full-time equivalent (FTE) job created is available for businesses liable for payroll tax in SA with total Australian wages of \$5 million or less.

**Job Accelerator Grant for Small business & Start-ups** of up to \$4,000 (\$2,000 each year for two years) per new job created is available for most businesses that are not liable for payroll tax. This includes businesses with Australian wages below the payroll tax free threshold (currently \$600,000) and most organisations that are exempt from payroll tax (e.g. public benevolent institution).

Businesses that increase their number of SA employees will be eligible to receive a grant for each additional worker employed by them in a new position between **1 July 2016 and 30 June 2018**.

“I keep coming back because I get such a sense of satisfaction being able to help the community. You see people not at their best but then you see them improve and you know you played a part in helping them.”

Wayne became Volunteer Team Leader at Streaky Bay seven years ago and says he would encourage anyone to give ambulance volunteering a go.

# LIQUOR LICENSING A MODERN AND SAFE SA

## South Australia's liquor licensing system is being comprehensively reformed, starting with several changes on 18 December 2017.

This is the first of several stages of reform, working towards a contemporary and safe liquor licensing system for our state. The changes cut red tape for licensed businesses and remove or modify outdated and irrelevant restrictions. This reduces regulatory burden and creates more efficient processes for industry.

### Exemptions for Low-Risk Businesses

Low-risk businesses will no longer require a liquor licence to treat their clients to a drink, reducing administrative burden and supporting industry. Exempt businesses will be able to sell or supply liquor without a licence in certain circumstances, including:

- hairdressers and barbers
- retirement villages
- businesses selling gifts
- jewellers
- patient care accommodation.

The current licence exemption for bed and breakfast style accommodation is also being extended.

### Increased Regulation of Supply to Minors

There will be stronger penalties for people who illegally supply alcohol to anyone under 18. Big parties and events will be targeted, where large groups of teenagers are supplied with alcohol.

### Other Red-Tape Reduction

A number of other red-tape reduction measures will also come into effect on 18 December:

- abolishing the requirement for some licensed businesses to provide meals at the request of a member of the public or a lodger
- removal of designated dining areas, reception areas and sampling areas
- removal of most notification and advertising requirements that currently apply to licence applications

### Entertainment Consent

Licensed venues will no longer need consent from Consumer and Business Services to host a range of entertainment, including music and comedy. This will make it easier for businesses to host bands, supporting a vibrant live music scene. Consent will still be required for prescribed entertainment such as boxing, martial arts and sexually explicit entertainment.

### Temporary Approval of Responsible Persons

These reforms streamline the responsible person process and support employment.



# 2018 COUNCIL ELECTIONS



Councils are part of the democratic framework of Australia. The community elects their council members every four years and the next general elections happen in November 2018.

Unlike State and Federal elections, it is not compulsory to vote in South Australian council elections. However, council elections are the biggest single voluntary civic participation activity in the state with nearly 360,000 people voting in the 2014 council elections.

Another important difference from State and Federal elections is that all voting in council elections is done by post. Enrolled voters receive a **voting package through the mail** and return their votes in a reply paid envelope.
