Council Endorses Lion Park's Revised Redevelopment Plans Following Public Consultation

At Tuesday's ordinary Council meeting, Council endorsed the revised Lions Park redevelopment plans for construction.

The plans were revised following extensive community consultation on the original design concept. With these revisions being based on the feedback provided by the community during consultation.

The proposed design element changes which resulted from community feedback included:

- Retention of as many of the existing trees as possible (including quandongs) this was achieved through moving the play spaces and open lawn area
- Reduction in lawn area
- Use of existing roadway within Park precinct
- Designing the new Park features to fit within existing Park footprint
- Ensuring the internal footpaths keep to the existing footprint
- Retention of the majority of existing garden beds
- Retention of existing shelter (to be refurbished)

The revised plans will still meet the original objectives of the redevelopment and space activation. With Initial Design concepts that were well received and have been retained including:

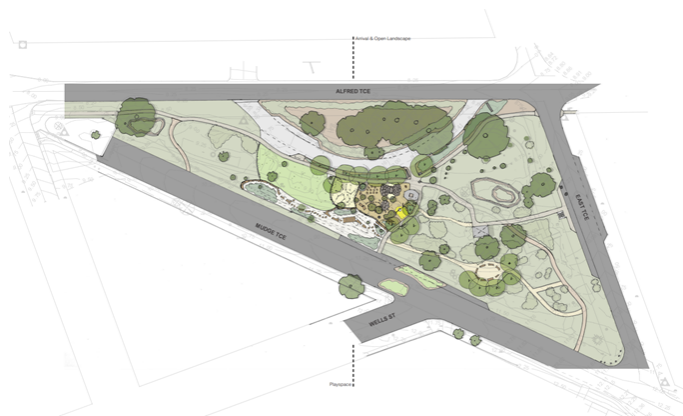
- Development of a Swale which incorporates water play
- Development of a Nature Play Space (now co-located with trees)
- Inclusion of BBQ
- Inclusion of New Toilet Facilities
- Development of a Bush Garden and Yarning Circle
- Inclusion of Wells Street/Mudge Terrace Intersection Works
- Development of the Dump Point Area

In speaking about the endorsed plans, Council's CEO Damian Carter had stated: "The revised Lions Park redevelopment plans are a good example of using public consultation processes to ensure Council projects met the desires and wants of our communities. To this end, I congratulate the redevelopment's project manager Penny Williams on the community engagement process she had undertaken in the development of the plans".

Construction for the redevelopment of the park will commence soon with the project completion date anticipated to be completed by the end of August.

At February's Ordinary Council meeting on Tuesday 21st February, the District Council of Streaky Bay elected an interim Mayor and Deputy Mayor. With the appointments being:

- Mayor – Cr Graham Gunn
- Deputy Mayor – Cr Cliff Pudney

The appointment will be for a term expiring once the council is formally advised the vacancy in the office held by the former Mayor and Deputy Mayor is filled (either by legislative change, SACT order, countback process, or supplementary election).

We congratulate Cr Gunn and Cr Pudney on their appointments and thank them for their flexibility during this time.



Township Entrance Signs Consultations

Community consultation is now open for the Streaky Bay Town Entrance Statements.

Streaky Bay is the only major township in the district which doesn't have Town Entrance Statements and Council is looking to address this discrepancy through the roll out of this project.

The township entrance statements will provide visitors with a sense of arrival to Streaky Bay, whilst helping build the township's identity. The four design concepts have been developed to stimulate discussion and guide feedback on what the community wants. Central to the design intent was to create an abstract reference (as opposed to literal) to the environmental surrounds, using natural elements as the source of these colours and graphics.

Common themes throughout the designs are the wave like lines indicative of the ocean and it's myriad patterns. Other graphics make use of oceanic themes and colours have been selected that represent the environment.

The project revisits a proposal which was put towards Streaky Bay residents over six years ago, which ultimately wasn't continued due to budgetary pressures. In speaking about the history of the project General Manager of Prosperity, Penny Williams outlined "Council previously had design concepts undertaken approximately six years ago in which at the time did not receive the funding to implement, as the current funding is provided under a new Council and was some time ago, we thought it would be prudent that we undertook the design development from the beginning again, those previous design concepts have been considered as part of this project".

In speaking about the rollout of the project, Council's Chief Executive Officer, Damian Carter had said "Entrance statements play an important role in the aesthetics of a township and assists in building the identity of that town. They also enhance the overall experience of visitors as they know they have arrived at destination safely and helps the visitor form a positive perception of the township they are visiting. It is hoped that this project will achieve this for Streaky Bay".

As you would be able to tell it's currently a busy time for Council with the roll out of many projects and the facilitation of numerous consultations for strategy and project developments. Littered through this month's criterion is a number of updates and notices about these projects and at the moment we are undertaking the following work:

- Rollout of events, including Community Movie Nights, Adelaide Guitar Festival and Streaky Sounds Music Festival
- Development and rollout of the Volunteer Program
- Construction of the Youth Precinct – Skate Park
- Redevelopment of the Lions Park
- Installation of a lift in the Council Office
- Removal of asbestos and upgrade of depot toilet and office
- Upgrade of the Aerodrome Lighting and runway resheeting
- Sealing of the Wirrulla Bypass
- Consultation and Review of the Stormwater Management Strategy
- Scarifying of the RSL, Streaky Bay foreshore and Eyre Avenue foreshore lawns

Acknowledging it's a busy time for us, we also acknowledge the impact on you as we bombard you with communications and restrict your access to some much-loved community infrastructure while construction is occurring.

All I can say is thank you for your patience and in many situations' participation in this important work. I hope the outcomes of this work will have a long-lasting benefit to our community.

MASTERPLAN UPDATE

Township Masterplans are periodically developed with the community to provide a long-term vision for our townships. A township masterplan is a plan showing the potential future land use patterns and layout of an area. They aim to articulate a clear and unique vision and identify key objectives and priorities across a number of themes to ensure that our townships continue to develop as highly desirable places to live, visit and do business.

Late last year, Community Consultation sessions were held across the District Council of Streaky Bay seeking each community's feedback on what residents would like to see their communities look and feel like in the future. This process was the first stage in the proposed development of management plans for each township.

This consultation feedback was consolidated by Consultants WAX Design to develop the initial concepts of the township masterplans. These concept plans were presented at a second round of community consultation sessions held March 6-8 across the Council District.

The sessions were held at Scaale Bay, Streaky Bay, Poochera, Wirrulla, Perlubie and Haslam. All sessions were well attended with numbers increasing from the Round 1 presentations, it is great to see that the community is engaging in these projects and they can be supported by the community for inclusion in future planning across the region.

There will be an opportunity for those who did not attend the sessions to review the Draft Proposals and complete an online survey, this survey will be available in the coming weeks.

Following the closure of the survey feedback and collation of feedback, the plans will be updated, and further consultation sessions will be made available.

Why have the lawns turned brown?

To ensure the health of the lawns, we have to scarify them every now and then. As part of the scarifying process, they will go brown for a period of three to six weeks.

What is lawn scarification?

Lawn scarification is the process used to remove excessive amounts of thatch from a lawn and is an important part of lawn care and maintenance. Scarifying is done using a mechanical lawn scarifier which have adjustable rotating steel blades to cut the thatch out without destroying the healthy grass. In some cases, they can even penetrate the soil below the surface to improve aeration and the quality of the grass roots.

Why scarify a lawn?

Scarification is necessary when thatch in the lawn becomes excessive and begins to damage the grass. Too much thatch in a lawn can suffocate rather than protect plants, stopping them getting the necessary light, water and air that they need. In itself thatch isn't a bad thing – a layer about 0.5-1cm thick is fine – anything thicker will begin to damage the grass and removing the build-up will improve the health of the lawn ultimately making it more resilient.

So, what is thatch?

Thatch occurs naturally but as with many plants, over time old grass leaves and stems die away and are replaced with new ones. As the dead material can be slow to decay it sits in a spongy layer under the green sward of the lawn. Having some thatch under the top surface of the lawn is not necessarily a bad thing as it acts as a protective layer, shielding both soil and grass plants from the elements. In addition, the correct amount can also give the surface of the lawn a firmer, thicker look and feel.

How can I tell if the lawn needs scarifying?

Too much thatch in a lawn will give the grass a spongy feel when you walk on it. You should be able to see a layer 0.5-1cm thick when you look at the sides of the turf – anymore than this is excessive and unhealthy for the lawn.

Why scarify now?

Ideally scarification should be carried out in the late summer and early autumn as this provides better results in terms of recovery. It's carried out during this period because of the warmth and moisture present in the soil in the autumn will help the lawn to recover more quickly.

What are the time frames for this work to be completed?

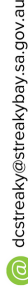
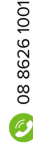
The contractor will start on the 20th of March and be here for that entire week. The contractor will start on the RSL lawns before moving to the Eyre Ave (Foresore Lawn) and Alfred Terrace Lawns (in front of the hotel).

What happens afterwards?

The lawn can look pretty scary, like its dying. Although it can be a bit of a shock at first, the lawn will recover amazingly quickly and look all the better for it. The rate at which the lawn recovers can vary depending on weather conditions and the initial quality of the lawn – we are anticipating three to six weeks (just in time for ANZAC day).

The benefits of lawn scarification include:

- Removes harmful levels of thatch
- Prunes grass roots encouraging growth
- Allows water to reach the soil
- Allows air to reach the sward
- Allows nutrients to reach the grass plants
- Removes moss and dead weeds
- Reduces the likelihood of future moss problems
- Improves the health of the lawn
- Refreshes tired or poor quality lawns
- Good preparation for over-seeding

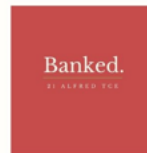

CHANGES TO GREEN WASTE

As part of Council's Environment Protection Authority (EPA) Licence No. 2108 for the Streaky Bay Transfer Station, it is a statutory requirement that the green waste drop off area needs to be securely fenced with restricted and supervised access during transfer station opening times only.

A contractor has been engaged and will soon commence the construction of a secure chainmesh fence which will adhere to Council's statutory requirements of its EPA Licence No. 2108 for the Streaky Bay Transfer Station.

Access to the green waste drop off area once the fence is constructed, will be via the main entrance gate and then via a new access gate into the green waste drop off section.

It is also a requirement that all waste loads are inspected, including green waste prior to drop off. Customers are to present to the attendant on arrival, the load will be inspected and the attendant will advise where to offload.

Please ensure that your green waste is free of contaminants such as plastics, steel and other materials as Council reserves the right to refuse the load until the green waste is clean.

A WORD ON CARDBOARD

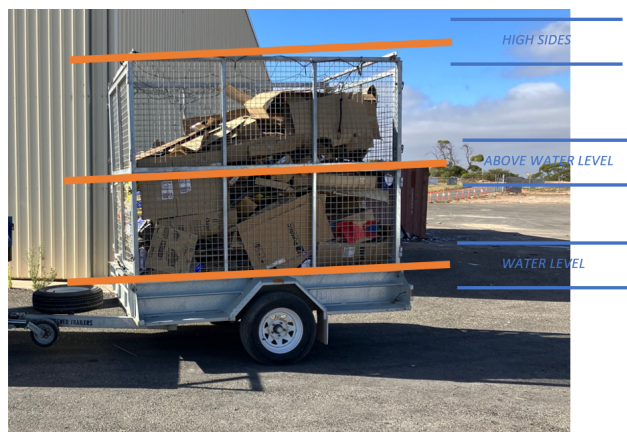
We are seeing huge amounts of cardboard being deposited at that Transfer Station that is becoming increasingly difficult to manage and noting large amount of contamination that is occurring that requires staff to sort and dispose prior to baling.



Council Officers / Transfer Station attendants will be monitoring this and loads may be rejected should they deemed to have high levels of contamination.

All Cardboard should be cut to size of 500mm x 500mm (or fees apply)	
All Cardboard MUST be flattened	
All packaging MUST BE REMOVED from the box and disposed of in general waste	
No Magazines, Paper, Wrapping Paper, Polystyrene, Plastic or Bubble Wrap as these are considered contaminants
