

Council News

GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

SA Industry Participation Policy

Council received correspondence from the Industry Advocate seeking Council's assistance in adopting the Industry Participation Policy for future Council tender processes. The policy included tenderers to undertake an Economic Contribution Test and/or Policy Plan. Council at that meeting resolved not to adopt the policy due to Council's internal policies providing local buy preferences.

Community Project Requests

Cr Karp raised a question on notice requesting further information on how members of the community could put forward project ideas to Council. There are a number of mechanisms including; Community Forums, Annual Business Plan Community Consultation, Strategic Plan Development Phase, Town Masterplan Review, discussions with Elected Members, direct contact with Council staff. Council staff have developed a matrix where community project ideas are logged. There is also mechanisms for communities to fund and implement their own projects with Council approval.

Employee Conduct Policy

Council were presented with a Draft Employee Code of Conduct Policy, the new policy included best practice principles to enable good Human Resource Management. Council resolved at the meeting adopt the policy.

Code of Conduct for Council Members Policy

The Code of Conduct for Council Members Policy was due for review in order to meet legislative requirements. The Council resolved to adopted the updated policy and noted a full overhaul of the policy was currently underway at State level and is expected in the near future.

Public Interest Disclosure Policy

The Public Interested Disclosure Act 2018 (PID Act) supersedes the Whilstleblowers Act. The new PID Act requires Council to have in place by 1 July 2019 a Public Interest Disclosure Policy. The policy was

adopted at the meeting subject to some minor changes sent through recently from the Local Government Association. Senior Managers will work through the Public Interest Disclosure Procedure in the coming days.

A Fairer Share Campaign

The Australian Local Government Association has made the restoration of the Federal Assistance Grants to 1% of Commonwealth Taxation Revenue a key advocacy initiative. Council adopted to continue the

advocacy campaign with our local federal members, especially in light of the continued cost shifting of both Federal and State Governments.

National General Assembly

Both Mayor Barber and the CEO represented the District Council of Streaky Bay at the recent National General Assembly. Council submitted four motions for debate at the assembly and all four were accepted. The motions covered the issues of water management infrastructure, waste management systems, the difficulties faced in rural areas accessing qualified people with specific skill sets, and the significant issue faced by many rural Councils in accessing sufficient medical care.

There were 880 delegates representing all States and Territories present. During relevant sessions at the Assembly the motions were debated and all four were significantly supported. Council received extremely positive feedback from many Council members and Association delegates. Council will continue to follow the work that will be done by the Australian Local Government Association to support and advocate at the Federal level to find answers to these pressing issues.

Public Street Lighting – LED Lighting – SA Power Networks Proposal

SAPN will be presenting at the next EPLGA Board meeting in regards to their LED lighting project. The Chief Executive Officer is pursuing neighbouring Councils to work together to ensure viable costings are obtained for the purchase of the latest LED Lighting and to enable management of an effective roll out.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Regional Development Strategy Development

The State Government's Department of Primary Industries and Regions (SA) (PIRSA), has released a discussion paper regarding the development of a Regional Development Strategy. Council considered a report at the June 2019 meeting of Council providing a draft response from Council. Council resolved at the meeting to submit the answers prepared by the CEO to the questions posed by the Discussion Paper. The submission will include some minor amendments.

Council has completed during 2018/2019 the following roads; Kaldoonera Road (8km), Gill Road (7km), Carawa Road (3.56km), Westall Way Loop (7kms), Calca Road (7km), Poochera Port Kenny Road.

Once this in complete we will be moving over to the Kingoonya-Yantanbie Road which is currently being carted.

Road Maintenance - Patrol grading

To date in the 2018/2019 financial year approx. 1519 kms of road has been patrol graded.

A report was presented to the June 2019 ordinary meeting of Council and resolved that due to the works not being completed in the original required time frame, that Council advise the Developer it will draw upon the bond and complete the works by the 30 June 2020 subject to the roadworks program.

NATIONAL GENERAL ASSEMBLY MOTIONS

The Australian Local Government Association's National General Assembly, held in Canberra, attracted more than 880 representatives from councils across the states and territories, with 90 representing South Australia, including Streaky Bay, Kimba and the LGA President Sam Telfer (Tumby Bay, Mayor).

Three of the four motions proposed by Council were voted on as individual items, the fourth motion (66.3) was included in a larger motion put forward by Leeton Shire Council (NSW) and addressed the long term issues many rural communities are facing when trying to access medical practitioners and providing attractive incentives for them to stay in rural and remote communities.

The Australian Local Government Association will now assess the outcomes of the voting and decide on their priorities for the coming year. Council will endeavour to keep our community up to date on where our ideas and initiatives are up to and what the outcomes are.

Mayor Barber said "It was definitely good to know we are not alone and the issues we face are those many other rural and remote Councils are also experiencing".

The motions presented were;

- Provide incentives for rural / regional Council to create micro systems which allow for effective and efficient water storage and management systems to accommodate domestic use.
- Establish a regional focus through the provision of funding models for waste management systems with an aim to develop a more entrepreneurial framework.
- Provide funding and support for migrant workers with Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM) backgrounds to expedite transition of the recognition of their skills, making them available to re-enter the workforce, with an emphasis to filling rural demands where these skills are in critical shortage.
- Develop better, more effective mechanisms for medical interns to complete placements in rural areas.



Community Development Grant Opportunities

SA Heritage Grants Program

If you own a State Heritage Place or a place in a State Heritage Area and are planning a conservation project that will help to conserve or protect significant fabric or heritage values, you may be eligible to receive a SA heritage grant.

Funding is provided on a dollar for dollar basis and is available for private owners, companies, community groups & local government who are owners of State Heritage Places, and owners or businesses within a State Heritage Area. Unlocking new economic activity in our regions

The Marshall Liberal Government is inviting applications for the second \$5 million competitive funding round of the Regional Growth Fund, which opens today.

Minister for Primary Industries and Regional Development Tim Whetstone said the \$150 million Regional Growth Fund – part of the Recharging Our Regions policy – is designed to facilitate new economic opportunities to build and strengthen communities across regional South Australia.



NEW DOG BY-LAWS

The new by-laws require any person with a dog in their care and control in a public place to carry a bag or other suitable container for the collection and disposal of their dog faeces.

If you are found to be without a bag or container while you have your animal in a public place you could be liable to a \$100.00 expiation fee.

Let's keep our district and public areas clean and free of disease.

UNWANTED CATS & KITTENS

If you are no longer able to care for your cat or kittens, or your cat has an unexpected litter that you cannot care for please be in contact with Council Officers.

At no point should you dump or abandon your cat or kittens.

To prevent the abandonment or dumping of unwanted litters Council Officers will accept surrendered cats and kittens at no charge. This can be done by ringing the Council on 0886261001 and organise collection via Council's General Inspector.

Council staff will endeavour to re-home suitable, healthy surrendered animals via animal rescue groups such as the RSPCA shelter in Port Lincoln.




