#### **Council News**

#### **GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATION**

#### **Chief Executive Officer Resignation**

Recruitment of the position for a new CEO has commenced. The Manager, Corporate Services (Karina Ewer) shall be appointed as the Acting Chief Executive Officer until the new CEO commences.

#### Australian Local Government Association – Call for Motions

The Australian Local Government Association (ALGA) Board is calling for motions for the 2019 National General Assembly (NGA) under the theme of 'future focused'. The theme acknowledges the assembly will be held after a federal election and Local Councils need to come together as a sector to ensure our voice is heard by the incoming government. Council resolved at the January 2019 ordinary meeting of Council to form a working party to formulate motions for Council to consider at their March meeting. The resolution did not indicate which members of Council would form the working party. Interested Councillors and the A/CEO met and have commenced development of the motions and their supporting arguments.

#### Council Meeting Notice Board - Visitor Centre

Council resolved at the February ordinary meeting of Council to purchase a small A Frame sign for placement at the Visitor Centre on Council meeting days to advise the public of a meeting in progress. There is an existing A Frame with a magnet. The MCED has ordered a magnet that will be placed on the existing sign in place of the "I" on days of Council Meetings.

#### Additional Staff 2019/2020 Budget

Council resolved at its February 2019 ordinary meeting of Council, following an elected member question to consider the employment of an additional 0.5 or 1 FTE position, to assist the regulatory services department due to those positions now undertaking shared resourcing contracts with 5 other Eyre Peninsula Councils.

#### Community Forums 2019

Council considered the formats and dates for the first round of Community Forums for 2019. Council resolved;

#### Strategic Management Plan 2016-2026

Council received a report from the Acting, Chief Executive Officer to commence preparations for the review of the Strategic Management Plan, with Council agreeing to commence preparations.

#### EPLGA - Strategic Plan - Draft

The Eyre Peninsula Local Government Association has released a draft of its Strategic Plan for comment. The plan was requested by CEOs, Mayors and other Councillors who attended the last RDAWEP / EPLGA Funding Agreement Preliminary Workshop held in Wudinna on 28 November 2019. The intent of the development of this plan is to assist Councils to access grant funding across boundaries as it will enable larger applications to be undertaken for 58,000 residents rather than just that of a singular Council. This will not negate the need for Council to have its own Strategic Plan but it may assist in aligning some of the larger projects with our own needs.

Further the Regional Strategic Plan will assist Local Councils to consider wider issues and other plans as part of their own considerations. Where local Strategic Plans align with identified State and Federal initiatives, grant funding opportunities and other regionally required planning processes, local Councils may then have access to required expertise and have their projects recognised as part of the larger EP area.

#### **Elected Member Portfolio Proposal**

Council received a report at the November 2018 meeting to consider the CEO preparing a plan to allocate portfolio's to each elected member. Portfolios of responsibility would be based on the Strategic Management Plan and the Elected Members would be required to provide written reports on their portfolio activity each month. Each Portfolio would be provided with the breakdown of the key areas of responsibilities and the relevant managers for the key areas. A further report was presented to the January 2019 ordinary meeting of Council and Council resolved not to adopt the portfolio's until the Council Strategic Management Plan was reviewed.

#### Lease Arrangements for Community Groups

final Adelaide Sea Dragons issues have been considered and a final draft of the lease is being prepared. The Dental Surgery lease required further consideration and a final draft has been sent for signing. Hangar leases are in draft and staff have commenced contacting current owners to negotiate the terms of leases. Christian Vision Media has approached Council in regards to documents to allow access to their infrastructure and this document is being prepared. Wirrulla Sports and Rec, Wirrulla Camp Ground, Central Areas Sports Complex, Poochera Museum, Poochera & Districts Bowling Club and the CFS / SES remain outstanding,

#### Lease Agreement – Streaky and Districts Community Complex

Council resolved at the February 2019 ordinary meeting of Council to retain the clause allowing for a sinking fund within the lease agreement. The sinking fund amount was set at \$3000 per year for the next 5 years. Council also resolved to exclude from the lease area the concrete toilets located near the RV Park on the eastern side of the oval.

#### Loan Redraw – Streaky Bay and Districts Community Complex

Council resolved at the February 2019 ordinary meeting of Council to rescind a motion to provide a cash advance loan for the purposes of acoustic panelling to be installed in the complex. The Council considered that the acoustic panelling should have been installed at the time of construction and resolved to provide the Complex with \$20,000 to install the panelling.

#### Tank and Pump Infrastructure – Streaky Bay and Districts Community Complex

The complex committee put in a request to Council for approval to erect a tank and pump infrastructure at the oval precinct for the purpose of water storage for oval irrigation. This request was granted by Council.

#### Lease Agreement - Streaky Bay Men's Shed

Council resolved to proceed with the development of a lease agreement for the Streaky Bay Men's Shed to remain at the Old Bowls Club facility (Montgomerie Terrace) for a period of 5 years.

#### Finance Risk and Audit Committee – Independent Member

Council resolved at a Special Meeting held February 28 for the Independent Member Selection, that Council accept the nomination of Mr Warwick Koster as the Chair of the FRAC Committee.

#### **ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT**

#### Foreshore Tourist Park Development

The Capital Investment Business Agreement is expected to be finalised with all required signatures by the end of March.

Stage 2 is set to commence in January 2019 with the 9 new cabins expected to be open for the Easter break.

The auction held 1<sup>st</sup> February 2019 yielded a pleasing result with all cabins sold.

#### New Deep Sea multi use Grain Port for Eyre Peninsula – Free to Eyre Limited Port Spencer

Mr Trevor Gilmore, presented a deputation to Council at the February 2019 ordinary meeting of Council regarding the proposed port. The company is called Free Eyre Limited Port Spencer and its mandate is to investigate the establishment of an alternatively owned grain storage, handling, and exporting facility and asking the District Council of Streaky Bay to consider the merit of the project and is seeking a letter of support. Council further considered the request at a Special Meeting and resolved not to provide a letter of support due to the Eyre Peninsula Local Government Association voting Cape Hardy as their priority port on the Eyre Peninsula.

#### **TOURISM**

#### Abalone Promotion Deputation – Streaky Bay Tourist Promotions (Inc)

Council received a deputation from Lyn Finch of Streaky Bay Tourism to take an opportunity in promoting abalone production in the region.

Streaky Bay Tourist Promotions Inc has identified the need and importance of 'creating a point of difference' to build Streaky Bay as a tourist destination.

Other Eyre Peninsula locations have stimulated tourism by creating unique opportunities and experiences specific to their location e.g.: diving with the sharks, eating freshly shucked oyster's straight from the ocean and by being the gateway to the Nullarbor and Great Australian Bight.

Streaky Bay has the opportunity to stand out by creating a point of difference using the \$115 million dollar (per annum) abalone industry.

Streaky Bay Tourist Promotions Inc propose to create an Abalone Interpretive Centre that offers a unique experience for locals and tourists, showcasing abalone as a culinary experience and permanent art gallery, featuring resident artisans and retail outlet.

The concept is already supported by Streaky Bay Tourist Promotions Inc, Regional Development Australia, the South Australian Tourism Commission and the Abalone Industry Association of South Australia. Additional interest has been expressed by the Jam Factory and the National Wine Centre Australia.

Streaky Bay Tourist Promotions Inc would like to partner with the District Council of Streaky Bay to explore relocating and re-vamping the Visitor Centre to incorporate the Abalone Interpretive Centre. Funding would be sourced from the Industry, State and Federal government.

#### **COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT**

#### Service SA Business Proposal

Minister Knoll responded acknowledging receipt of correspondence. Peter Treloar's office received correspondence advising that the government was currently reviewing the delivery of Service SA.

#### Streaky Bay Dragon Boat Regatta – February 2019

Community and Economic Development team worked with the group to provide support for the regatta and assist in event management. Completed.

#### EP Autoclub Show'n'Shine

Community and Economic Development and District Services team worked with this group to hold a show n shine event on February 16, 2019. The event was deemed a success and hopes to be an annual event. Acknowledgement to Council's District Services Manager who volunteered her time to man the aerodrome whilst that component of the event was held.

#### 2019 Wellness Weekend

CEDO / MCED met with the local Thrive wellness group, who have been liaising with Mentally Fit EP and FAB (Drought Group) who are seeking to put on a Health and Wellbeing weekend on the first weekend in April 2019. A report and deputation was presented at the February 2019 Ordinary meeting of Council, where Council resolved to assist in funding the Sunday family day portion of the event.

#### WoTL – Weather the Storm Workshops

The CED team have been working with Women on The Land to co-ordinate the Free Weather the Storm Workshops to be held in Streaky Bay to deliver resilience training to women affected by the drought. These workshops will be held at the Visitor Centre from March through to May.

#### Small Business Disaster Resilience Workshops

The CED team have been working with Rural Small Business Support organisation to deliver the free workshops at the Visitor Centre in Streaky Bay. The workshops aim to provide participants with skills and strategies for dealing with natural disaster events including droughts.

#### Carol J Boat

Council considered a report regarding the future of the Carol J boat that was removed from the Eyre Avenue Foreshore Precinct in 2018. Council resolved to retain the Carol J for its own use and form a working party to come up with a repurpose for the Carol J including full costings.

#### Visitor Centre Room and Bus Hire Waiver

A request was received from Baptist Care SA to waive the fees for the community bus and visitor centre training room for the purposes of enabling the delivery of the Tumbelin "Awake and Live" program that promotes youth relationship building and leadership opportunities. Council supported the request.

#### Wirrulla Oval – Playground and Shade

Council staff attended an onsite meeting with members from the Wirrulla Sport and Recreation Group on the 28 November 2018 where the Committee advised that they wished to relocate the existing playground to an alternative location. Council had initially budgeted to place a shade over the existing playground. Council resolved at the February 2019 ordinary meeting of Council to withdraw the current budget and await final plans and costing from the Wirrulla Committee.

#### Streaky Bay Community Library

A report was presented at the January 2019 meeting of Council following a request from the school that Council increase their funding to the Library by \$22,452. Council resolved to include the increase for consideration in the draft Annual Business Plan for the 2019/2020 Financial Year.

#### Streaky Bay School Pool

Council successfully negotiated with the School an agreement to retain public use of the pool. The agreement is due to expire in March 2019 and Council staff will need to meet with the Principal to ascertain ongoing agreements.

An additional report was presented to the January 2019 meeting where Council agreed to include additional funding of \$12,500 to assist with the ongoing maintenance of the pool for consideration in Council's 2019/2020 Draft Annual Business Plan.

#### Streaky Bay and District Medical Clinic – Photocopying Expenses

Council considered a motion without notice from Streaky Bay and District Medical Clinic Council Representative Cr Philip Wheaton to support the waiver of fees associated with the printing of 500 A4 flyers, with a price cap of \$500.00. The motion was carried.

#### Primal Ephemeral Art Trail

Following the completion of the Ephemeral Art Trail Project that was an initiative of Streaky Bay Tourism with art installations located on Council land, a report was presented at the January 2019 meeting to decide the future location of the works. Council resolved to

keep Item 9 being the sandstone sculpture and move it to Campbell's Landing to form part of the future nature play area.

#### YOUTH

#### Youth Week 2019

Grant funding has been successful with monies previously allocated in the budget. Activities are currently being co-ordinated and booked. The Grant Agreement has not yet been finalised.

#### **Digital Connections Grant**

The digital animation and illustration workshops for the youth of Streaky Bay and Elliston project is underway with dates confirmed and project planning currently underway.

#### **WASTE MANAGEMENT**

Nil

#### STORMWATER MANAGEMENT

#### Stormwater – Redding Road, Bay Road, Swales

Project scheduled to begin in the first half of 2019.

#### Stormwater - Mudge Tce, Jubilee Road

Council have received numerous enquiries regarding the stormwater and flooding at the intersection of Mudge Terrace and Jubilee Road. A report was presented to the February 2019 meeting of Council raising the concerns of the residents in a bid to secure funding in the 2019/2020 annual business plan. Council resolved at the meeting to commit \$25,000 to stage one of the project (surveying and engineering) in the 2018/2019 financial year understanding that this is the initial stage of a project. Council staff will commence negotiations with relevant affected land owners to assess the possible budgetary impacts of undertaking the project. The project will potentially cost Council up to \$370,000.

#### **SEALED ROADS**

#### Dodgson Drive/Bay Road Streaky Bay

Refer to Council Project Update provided in November Council Agenda.

#### **UNSEALED ROADS**

#### **Road Construction**

Council has completed during 2018/2019 the following roads; Kaldoonera Road (8km), Gill Road (7km), Carawa Road (3.56km), Westall Way Loop (7kms). Staff are currently working on the first 1km of Calca Road which is expected to be completed prior to Easter.

#### Road Maintenance

Patrol Grading will follow rain events whereby Council will react to public requests and Category One and Two Roads. All major roads in the District have been graded once this season to date.

To date in the 2018/2019 financial year approx. 993 kms of road has been patrol graded.

Sealed Shoulder Maintenance is currently being undertaken.

#### **PLANT AND EQUIPMENT**

#### Float - Repairs

Council considered a report outlining options for the ongoing use of the Float. Council resolved to adjust the current year's budget to include \$22,000 to undertake repairs to the float.

#### Emergency Response to Bushfire – Council Water Tanker Use

Cr Wheaton raised at the January meeting of Council a question regarding what is Council's Policy for the water tanker on weekends, public holidays and holidays during the fire danger season? Council have in place a Policy that outlines specific details "Council Role in Disaster and Emergency Response". In the event of an emergency the CFS will activate Council's attendance by contacting the CEO or Manager, District Services (MDS). The CFS have these contact numbers displayed on the board in their communications room.

#### **INFRASTRUCTURE**

#### **Building Asset Management**

The initial workshops have been completed. Preparations are being made to hold a workshop on service levels which will then be combined with the revaluation costs when completed to give a full cost of life for each building asset. Elected Members will be asked to review their decision before the result is added to the 10 year Asset Management and Long Term Financial Plan.

#### Aerodrome Grant Funding

Staff sent out a request for quotation for the required fencing, with quotes exceeding the project cost within the grant budget. Council resolved at the February 2019 ordinary meeting of Council to fund an additional \$14,758 to allow the completion of the project.

#### Streaky Bay Sports Complex – Entrance of Wells Street.

The lighting of the access to the Streaky Bay Sports Complex has been raised with concerns cited over poor visibility being a risk/hazard to users. A quote for lighting is being prepared for budget consideration.

#### **REGULATING**

#### Perlubie Beach – Speed limit and motorbike usage

Cr McGowan raised at the January meeting of Council concerns for Perlubie beach with motorbikes driving through the sand dunes and speeding along the beach. Within SA beaches are considered to be roads and come under the jurisdiction of the Australian Road Rules and are not under the jurisdiction of Council, therefore Council's capability to close or restrict access would be difficult.

#### On-line Burn Off and Fire Notification Solution

Council resolved at the January 2019 meeting of Council to expend \$1,200 to enable the implementation of an on line burn off and fire notification system in the 2019/2020 budget and ongoing subscription of \$960. This system will give property owners more flexibility and stream lined processes for notification of burning.

#### Dog Registrations for Month of June Annually

Council received a report and moved at the ordinary meeting of Council held in January to set all dog registrations for the month of June 2019 at \$0 for ease of processing for the Dog and Cat Management Board.

#### **PLANNING**

#### Planning and Design Code – Release for Public Comment

The State Government has released the Planning and Design Code for public comment. This particularly relates to Land not within a Council area. This is the first look into what the planning system will look like. As some of the policies are State Wide it is considered to be beneficial for Councillors to comment at this stage prior to the release of documentation for the next stage.

Public have until 5.00pm Friday 29 March 2019 to comment on the proposed code. To view the draft code visit the SA Planning Portal

#### Land Management Agreement (LMA) Waiver – Kennedy Road, Streaky Bay

A letter requesting a Land Management Agreement Waiver on Kennedy Road, Streaky Bay to enable the construction of a dwelling less than 100 square metres was received and reported to Council in December 2018. Council resolved then to lay the report on the table until a copy of plans were received. Plans were received and Council further considered the report at the February 2019 ordinary meeting of Council and

resolved to waive the requirements of the LMA to enable a dwelling less than 100sqm to be constructed.

#### Anastasia Avenue – Construction Works

Council considered a report regarding construction works for the Woodlawn Heights development which was approved in 2005. Infrastructure works were bonded to enable the allotments to be created prior to installation of infrastructure. This infrastructure has yet to be installed and discussions with the developer have indicated that they are not able to currently fund the works. If was noted the developer believed that if Council drew upon the bonding agreement there was a risk of solvency issues. The developer requested that Council consider an allotment be provided in lieu of a cash payment to Council for the private works. Council resolved not to accept the offer of a transfer of the allotment.

#### Land Management Agreement (LMA) Removal – Clearwater Cove

In July 2016 Council wrote to various developers in regards to Land Management Agreements attached to their developments which are yet to be sold and asked if they would be interested in the removal of the LMA on their developments at their cost.

The current land owner of Clearwater Cove sought approval to remove the LMA from the main section to the rear of the Clearwater cove development. Council considered the request at the February 2019 ordinary meeting of Council and resolved to authorise the removal of the LMA.

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT**

#### Little Islands Road Reserve Revegetation Project Agreement

Council received a report regarding the expiration of a revegetation agreement on Little Islands Road and related vegetation removal to construct a shared use trail. Council resolved not to renew the agreement and approve the removal of portions of vegetation to construct the shared use trail.

#### **Starling Control**

Council resolved to organise a petition on starling control in the district and that the petition be distributed within the area. Following completion the petition will be presented to the Eyre Peninsula Natural Resource Management Board.

#### Great Australian Bight Drilling – Council Position

Cr Trudy McGowan raised a question without notice at the January 2019 ordinary meeting of Council to discuss the process Council will follow to develop a position on drilling in the Great Australian Bight and ensure that Council will follow the views of the *majority* of its constituents. Mayor Barber replied that it would

follow a similar process that was used for the Commercial Fishing Netting where Council would invite representatives to speak for and against the drilling.

At the February 2019 ordinary meeting Council received a deputation from Members of the community (Gemma Bawden, Heath Joske, Sandi Desira and Eliza Joske) who voiced their concerns regarding Drilling and the Bight and requested Council support a moratorium on exploration and drilling until all concerns were addressed by Equinor. Many community members and school children attended the deputation.

Council received a petition with over 1,000 signatures and approximately 120 letters and emails (inclusive) petitioning against "Drilling in the Bight"

Mr Trevor Gilmore also provided a deputation on the risks vs the rewards. Mr Gilmore provided information which included personal experiences and research in support of "Drilling in the Bight".

Council discussed the deputations at a Special Meeting held February 24. Mayor Barber has arranged for Equinor's attendance in Streaky Bay on 7 March 2019. Council resolved that a further special meeting be held after Equinor's meeting and prior to Equinor's 30 day feedback timeline on its Environmental Plan. Council will discuss their position on drilling in the Great Australian Bight at that Special Meeting.

#### **MEDIA RELEASE**

#### Streaky Bay Moore's Boat Ramp Upgrade

In 2017 concerns were raised by Council and the community regarding Moore's Boat Ramp needing repairs and upgrades. A report was presented to the Council indicating the scope of works required with the approximate cost of the works being \$150,000. Council resolved following this report to consider it within the following budget and for staff to seek funding opportunities.

An application was submitted under the Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure's Boating Facilities Development Fund and was successful in receiving \$85,000 of funding towards the project. The fully costed project is estimated at \$166,907 (funding approx.51% of project cost).

Council resolved at the special meeting held February 28 to utilise the Moore's boat ramp fees reserve to fund the majority of Council's contribution towards the project.

Mayor Barber said receiving the grant was a big success for the Streaky Bay community and provided the

opportunity to complete the much needed upgrade for the popular boat ramp.

#### **MEDIA RELEASE**

#### **Drought Communities Funding Success**

On Friday, 26 October 2018, the Federal Government announced the extension of the Drought Communities Program (DCP) under which eligible Councils in drought affected areas could apply for up to \$1 million to spend on locally identified projects aimed at *stimulating the local economy and maintaining jobs*. The District Council of Streaky Bay was fortunate in being included in the latest round of declarations.

Council were presented with a report at the November 2018 ordinary meeting of Council where they selected 6 projects for submission. All six projects were accepted and Council was awarded the full \$1m of their allocation. The following projects are now underway:

- 1. Little Islands Road Coastal Trail;
- 2. Museum Upgrades (Poochera, Streaky Bay Powerhouse and National Trust);
- 3. Poochera Oval Stormwater Storage Project;
- 4. Streaky Bay Hall Upgrade (Flooring and Heating/Cooling);
- 5. Wirrulla Campground Development; and
- 6. Streaky Bay Race Track Upgrade

These projects are required to be delivered by June 30, 2019, which leaves staff and contractors with very limited time frames.

Expressions of Interest are currently being advertised for both casual staff and contractors in accordance with the grant conditions and guidelines to provide employment opportunities for local contractors, farm workers and those currently seeking employment.

Council are confident these projects will be delivered on time and will meet with the objectives of the funding criteria in stimulating the local economy and creating employment.

Mayor, Travis Barber said this was a big win for Council to be able to implement some projects that were years away from being achieved in Council's ordinary budget allocations, or unlikely to be funded. Mayor Barber said he was surprised and excited to see all 6 projects be funded as Councillors tried to allocate projects so they were spread across the district and within varying organisations. Mayor Barber also recognises the challenges that lay ahead with the short time frames and looks forward to working with local community groups, contractors and staff to ensure these projects are implemented.



The cruise was fully supervised with 2 staff, Alan as your experienced skipper and Mick as your swimming guide with the tour catering for all ages.





#### ANIMAL FARM in Streaky Bay!

Country Arts SA presents a State Theatre Company South Australia production.

The highly regarded classic will be hosted by the Streaky Bay Presenter Group on Wednesday 13 March 2019 @ 7pm for a one-off performance in the Streaky Bay Institute Hall.

Outgoing artistic director Geordie Brookman will farewell State Theatre Company with the George Orwell classic, **Animal Farm**, starring Renato Musolino.

Created especially for Renato Musolino (*The Gods Of Strangers, The Kreutzer Sonata*), Brookman's adaptation of the George Orwell classic will tour regional South Australia in February and March.

"We're the State Theatre Company South Australia, not the Adelaide Theatre Company, and so we're really keen to get to the regions to provide access to our theatre shows," Brookman said.

Napoleon and Snowball take control. From here is born the famous quote: "All animals are equal – but some are more equal than others." First published in 1945, *Animal Farm* continues to be a much-loved literary masterpiece.

Brookman is taking it to the stage for a present-day audience. Inspired by TV series *Black Mirror* and connection to contemporary narcissism and online information overload, Brookman's set is contemporary and abstract and will incorporate laser lighting and raw theatre effects to allow the words and images to drive the experience.

Renato Musolino says it's an honour to be working with Brookman in his last show for the Company.
