

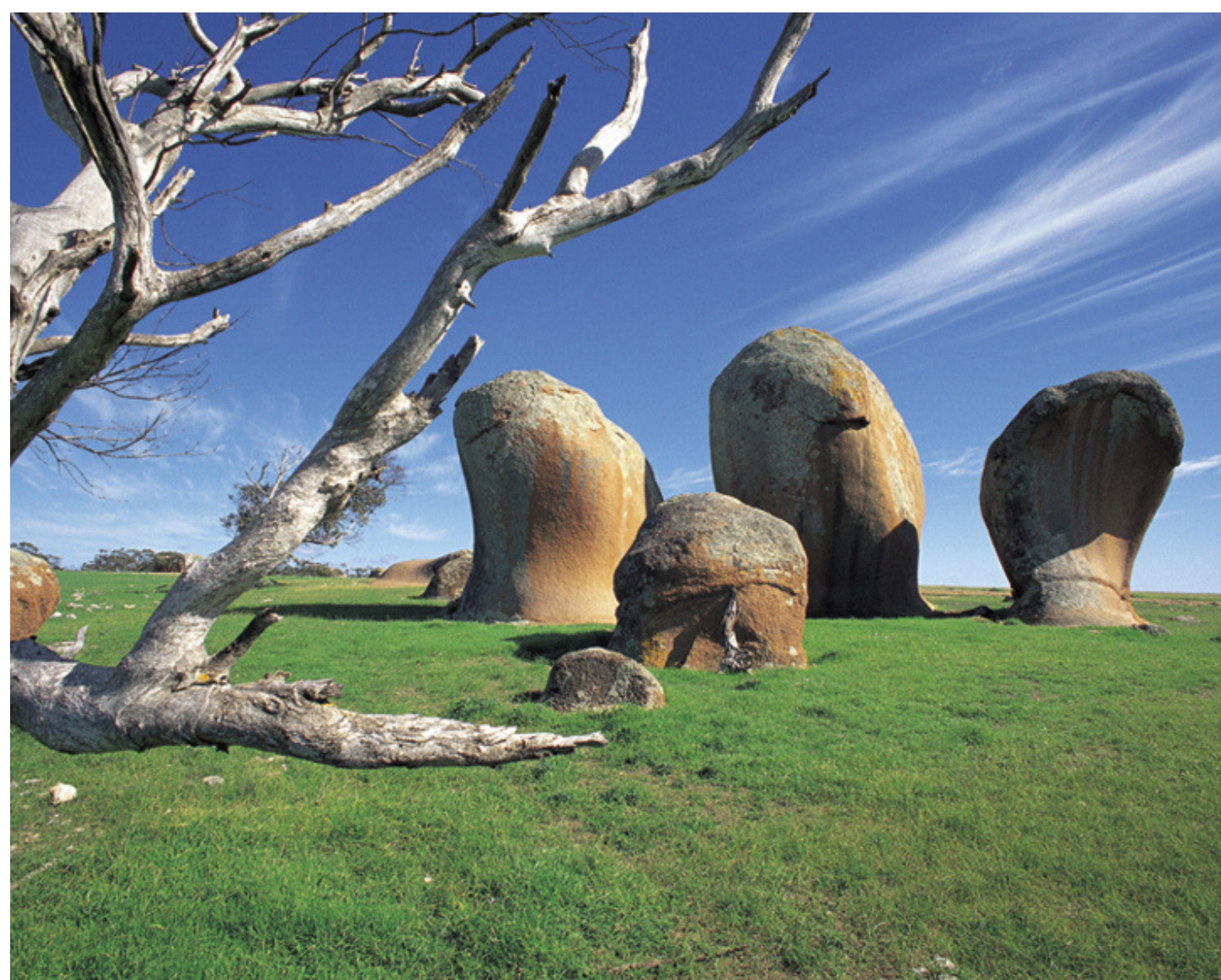

COUNCIL ELECTIONS 2022

ENROL

If you are on the State electoral roll you will automatically receive a voting pack in the case of a supplementary election in your area.

To check if your residential and postal details are up to date on the State electoral roll go here
www.ecsa.sa.gov.au/enrolment

If you have moved house or changed your name, you need to complete a new enrolment form, available at:

1. your local Post Office, or
2. at the Electoral Commission of South Australia office (located at Level 6/60 Light Square, Adelaide), or
3. by calling Electoral Commission of South Australia on 1300 655 232 to request a form be sent to you.

NOMINATE FOR COUNCIL

Becoming a councillor presents the opportunity to influence local directions and create long term, positive outcomes within your community and for fellow residents.

The role of councillor is both rewarding and challenging. It requires commitment, responsibility and accountability.

With very few exceptions (such as being an undischarged bankrupt or being disqualified from holding office by a court order), you can nominate for a position on council regardless of qualifications, religion, race, gender, experience or profession.

If you consider yourself to be invested in the future of your community, are willing to learn and participate, and prepared to contribute strategically to decision making processes that benefit your broader community, then you should explore what it takes to be a councillor.

For more information to help you appreciate the role and responsibilities of a council member, understand the election process, and assist you in deciding whether to nominate, visit www.councilelections.sa.gov.au.

VOTE

All voting in council elections is done by post. Enrolled voters receive a voting package through the mail and return their completed ballot paper in the reply paid envelope provided.

Voting packs are distributed in the mail at least 2 weeks prior to the close of voting. In addition to ballot papers, each pack includes information about the candidates standing for election.

Votes must be received by the Returning Officer no later than the day and time noted on the ballot materials.

The Streaky Bay Presenters Group supported the inaugural Adelaide Guitar Festival event held in Streaky Bay. There were over 100 persons who attended this event, and it would be anticipated that this could become an annual event in line with the Adelaide Guitar Festival each July.

Streaky Bay Youth Precinct

The first round of community consultation was completed on Tuesday, July 26, 2022, with Convic's Angus Thomas coming across from Melbourne to host the sessions.

The afternoon was very well attended with a range of participants from Council staff, parents, children and the adult skate community, a sincere thank you to those that were able to attend and provided valuable feedback.

RAA Electric Vehicle Charge Network

RAA as the state's largest member organisation, has won a State Government grant worth more than \$12 million to create a statewide network of electric vehicle (EV) charging points along highways, regional cities, tourist destinations and Adelaide suburbs.

Over the next two years, with partner Chargefox, we'll be installing 536 EV charging points at 140 new locations to create the state's first EV charging network. More than three-quarters of the new charge points will be in regional SA. The CEO and MCED have continued to advocate for a public station to be located within Streaky Bay as part of this roll out, and this has been successful.

SA Power Networks – Customer Engagement Session

The MCED and CEO attended this session in Port Lincoln. It was a great opportunity to put forward concerns, issues and ideas for technology advancement, increased renewables, and infrastructure that supports our ongoing reliability issues.

National Economic Development Conference 2022 - Sydney

The Manager, Community and Economic Development has been successful in gaining a full scholarship that includes conference registration, flights, accommodation to attend the NEDC 2022. The application process was a national competitive application process with only two (2) applicants chosen in the regional category.

The conference includes Study Tours, Masterclasses, Demographic modelling, circular economy, capacity building, community led economic development, workforce challenge discussion, creating innovative spaces, place disruption, future trends, smart communities, cycle tourism, agri-food opportunities and liveable places, plus more.

Eyre Peninsula Destination Management Plan 2025

Regional Development Australia EP developed in consultation with EP stakeholders, the 25 regional priorities outlined in the SARVS (SATC, 2021) form the strategic roadmap for EP tourism. The priorities summarise marketing, supply development, collaboration, leisure and events and industry capability objectives, which when successfully implemented using the guiding principles of the EP DMP, will position the EP tourism sector with a sustainable visitor economy.

CEO UPDATE

From the CEO's desk

I wanted to take the time this month to talk about an important community consultation which Council is about to embark on. We have all seen firsthand the impact of the pandemic and how it has promoted a trend in migration from metro areas to regional areas. Streaky Bay is no different with the ERP population stats suggesting growth over the last 12 months has been around 7.2%

Internally, over the past year Council has undertaken over 220 section seven searches and processed over 70 development applications. We have up to a three year wait for builders and as we are all aware, we have limited to no options in terms of available retail and industry space to attract new or expanding businesses.

The property market in Streaky Bay has been quite strong. The medium sales price for Streaky Bay is now \$338k and over the past year we have seen a 16.5% increase in the median price for houses. In terms of the rental market, we have a current vacancy rate of 0.75%, which is lower than the national vacancy rate (1.1%, which is the lowest point on record). Meaning there is little to no options for individuals wanting to move to Streaky Bay without buying.

Additionally on Census night, 34.5% of all private dwellings were empty which suggests that a significant amount of the housing stock is being dedicated to holiday housing or air BNB rental stock.

This is placing significant pressure on businesses as they struggle to attract and retain workers to the region, whilst placing pressure on rental prices. All of which compounds the effect of having the lowest unemployment rate in almost 50 years at 3.9%. COVID-19 has also seen a change in the way we travel. In 2019 more than 33,707 new caravan registrations were made, we saw a spike of 30% in new caravan sales and a record-breaking 14 million caravan trips were taken by Australians. In 2019 alone, 1 in 13 Australians households owned a caravan.

Streaky Bay as a destination has been of significant focus for this visitation with social media influencers producing content featuring the area. This has placed significant pressure on the region's infrastructure in handling the extra visitation, estimated to be near double of our winter's population (i.e. telecommunications & medical services). This also impacts Council significantly as we must deliver extra services to facilitate this visitation.

It would be naive to think that there wouldn't be snap back in growth as we emerge out of the pandemic. To the extent which we will see, is the question we cannot define.

In terms of my personal experience, many of issues I hear today in Streaky Bay were very similar to the issues I heard of in Torquay in 1996. In this situation, the population was just over 5000 individuals and today is now nearing 20,000. In 1995, the issues

being discussed by locals were carparking, getting staff for retail and hospitality services as there was nowhere affordable to live, lack of local medical services, illegal camping, individuals competing for surf etc.

I do not believe, Streaky Bay's population is on a similar trajectory, our location to the nearest capital city alone will somewhat ensure restricted growth. However, considering the way the pandemic has changed the way we work and what has occurred in Streaky Bay over the past twelve months. I think we should be planning for a population of between 3,500 and 4,000 individuals by 2036 – 2040 and a summer population of 5,500 – 6,000 individuals.

This may be a shock to some of you and like the locals of Torquay in 1996, unwanted by some, as they loved their small sea-side hamlet and didn't want to see change. But the lesson I've learnt through living in Torquay at this time and working for another Council which area was growing at 28% annually, is you can't fight growth, only guide it.

In guiding it you need to ensure that growth is sustainable and controlled. Therefore, I believe the most important project Council is undertaking this year is the development of its various township masterplans.

A master plan is a dynamic long-term planning document that provides a conceptual layout to guide future growth and development. Master planning is about making the connection between buildings, social settings, and their surrounding environments. A master plan includes analysis, recommendations, and proposals for a town's population, economy, housing, transportation, community facilities, and land use. It is based on public input, surveys, planning initiatives, existing development, physical characteristics, and social and economic conditions.

From Council's perspective, once the Master Plan is in place, we will use it to:

- Identify priorities for action and develop a phasing and implementation schedule
- Define public, semiprivate, and private spaces and public amenities.
- Act as a framework for regeneration and attract private sector investment.

Ultimately, as part of the Master Plan consultation, I would like to engage the entire community and have the plan act as a builder of consensus in terms of what we see future growth as being. Therefore, I encourage you all to engage with the consultation sessions in September and ensure your say is heard.

Deane was assisted by his wife Kelly, who actually spent much time in the Sydney fish markets preparing seafood for cooking demonstrations. Their course looked fabulous with the oysters being served on a bed of tiny seashells.



Once Deane's starter had been served, he addressed the guests and explained how oyster beds are established and maintained.

Brock and Sally Trezona followed with a trio of prawns that looked like something straight out of the pages of a Gourmet Traveller magazine. The couple used Limnos prawns and prawn harvester Terry Paul shared interesting facts about the local prawn industry.

Guests asked many questions, and it was an extremely interesting presentation.



Simon Bryant's entrée of abalone followed, and it looked exquisite and tasted delicious. Simon conducted a cooking demonstration and showed how to prepare the abalone. Simon was engaging, effervescent and very entertaining. Simon's presentation was supported by local abalone diver Tobin Woolford of Eyrewoolf Abalone. Tobin's talk was insightful and was supported (as all suppliers were) with a PowerPoint presentation that depicted harvesting in the beautiful ocean scapes of our district.



The main fare of lobster with nannygai mousse was spectacular. Served with pilaf rice, butter sauce and the prettiest vegetables, was to the delight of everyone.

Simon demonstrated using a live lobster to prepare the dish and kindly provided the guests with his recipes.

Gavin Myer director of Myers Seafood spoke about the importance of the Eyre Peninsula fishing industry as did Jeff Schmucker about the Marine Fishers Association and the importance of the local artisan fishers.



Petaluma wines were a sponsor of the event and served delicious wines with each course and for the beer drinks Peroni quenched their thirst.

Accessibility self-assessment for tourism and hospitality businesses

What is the Accessible Tourism Module?

The Accessible Tourism Module is part of the Quality Tourism Framework. It is a self-assessment program for tourism and hospitality businesses to evaluate the inclusivity of their offerings and identify areas for development.

Businesses that meet the extensive criteria are awarded badges to verify they meet requirements for a range of disability categories.

What is the Quality Tourism Framework (QTF)?

The Quality Tourism Framework is a business pathway supporting continuous growth and development of Australian tourism businesses.

The QTF includes Quality Tourism Accreditation, Star Ratings, EcoStar accreditation and more modules.

The Value of Accessible Tourism in Australia

Accessible tourism benefits everyone. More people can enjoy the opportunity to travel, the tourism industry welcomes more visitors and new markets, and visitor experiences are enhanced for all.

How do businesses become accredited?

Businesses go through a self-assessment process to identify their accessible features available to guests. Two helpful reports are generated on completion:

1. An internal report, designed to help identify areas for development for experiences and facilities.
2. An Accessibility Guide to easily communicate key accessibility information to potential guests

An Accessible Tourism Accreditation logo is awarded in the categories where all essential criteria is met.

What are the eligibility requirements and cost?

Businesses must undergo Quality Tourism Accreditation before registering for the Accessible Tourism Accreditation. Quality Tourism Accreditation is free for TICSAs members. The Accessible Tourism Module is \$100 + GST p.a.

What does the Accessible Tourism Module assess?

The Accessibility self-assessment explores provisions across six disability categories:

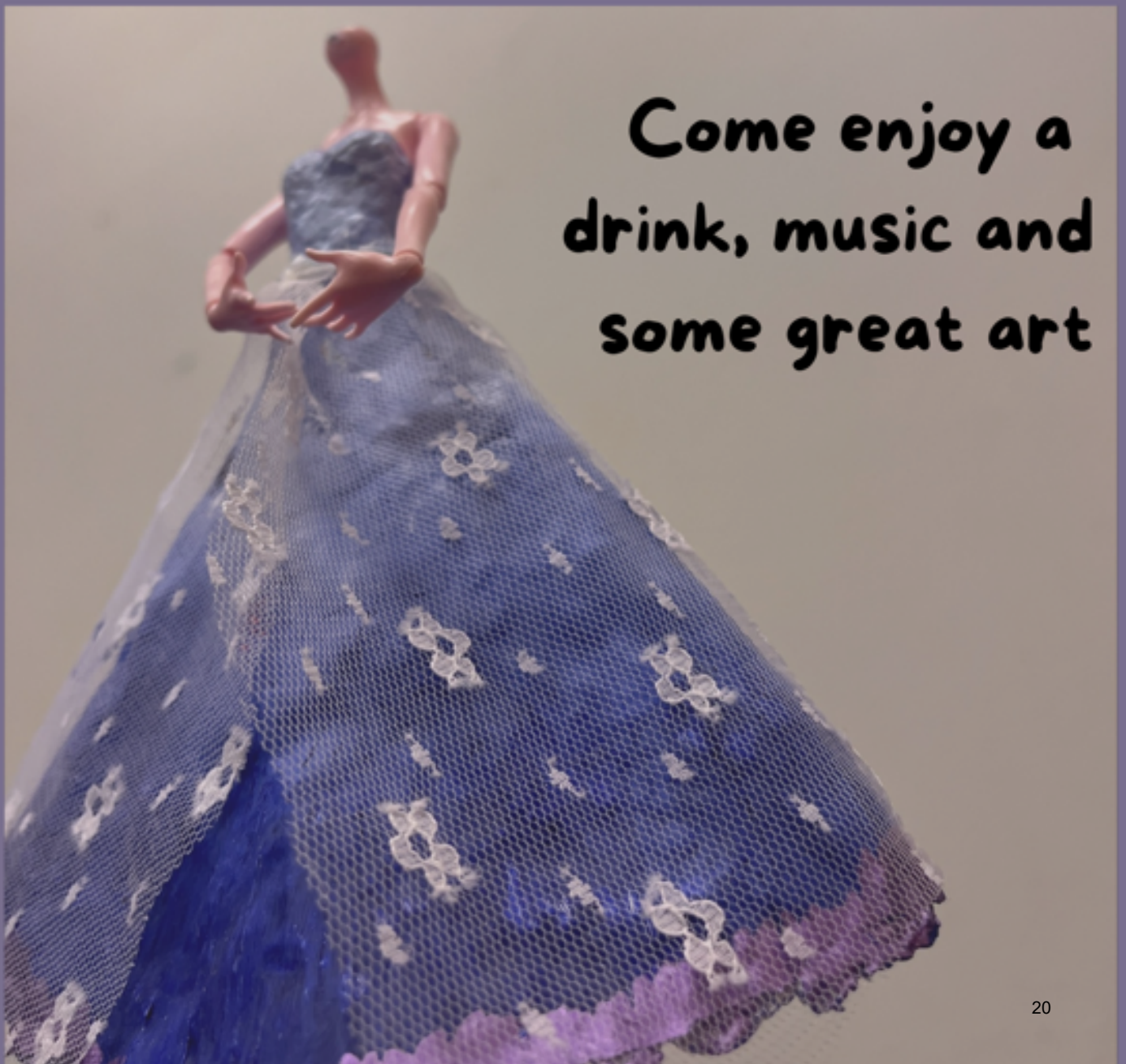

Gazania management



The Eyre Peninsula Landscape Board in conjunction with the District Council of Streaky Bay (DCSB) are implementing measures for the management and control of the pest plant gazania.

Background

Gazania is a weed that is often mistaken for an ornamental plant because of its white, yellow, orange, purple and red daisy flowers. This weed thrives in our climate and is widespread in many coastal towns. The colourful flowers are deceptive though as this weed is particularly destructive for our coastal dunes and alongside roadside vegetation where it forms mat-like colonies that can exclude all other plants, leading to a decline in biodiversity.

Once established, it can be very hard to control, as landholders with infestations on farming land have recently found out.

Gazania is a declared plant under the *Landscape South Australia Act 2019*. Sale or transport is prohibited throughout South Australia.

Management and Control

Plan

Eyre Peninsula Landscape Board and DCSB staff are commencing a spraying program to target outliers and small infestations of Gazanias first, before working towards more heavily infested areas.

Physical control

For effective control, the entire plant - including its root system - should be dug out. Minimal disturbance techniques should be employed. It is recommended that you first remove and bag the flower heads to prevent seed dispersal and place them in your rubbish bin for deep burial. In situations where the plant cannot be removed, flower heads should be taken off before setting seed. This will prevent the further spread of seed. A minimal level of control is to mow or brush cut the flowers before they develop and set seed.

Herbicide control

The *Weed Control Handbook for Declared Plants in South Australia* offers advice on suitable herbicides and rates. A copy of the handbook is available at www.pir.sa.gov.au.

Landholders should always read the label of any herbicide to ensure it is suitable for its intended purpose and can be used safely. Care should be taken to avoid herbicide contact with native plants and any spraying of herbicide in native vegetation should be left to qualified bushcare operators.

Timing of control

Control is most effective when the plant is actively growing between June to November. This can be defined as having new lush foliage and flowering. Don't spray when the plant is visibly under stress such as wilted.

How you can you help?

Landholders and residents are encouraged to remove gazania plants from their properties with the aim of containing the spread in the local area and on the Eyre Peninsula.
