Council News

GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Council Meeting Workshops

Councillors Stephens and Gunn moved a motion at the June 2018 meeting of Council requesting that questions asked by elected members relating to operational matters be answered by staff at the meeting. The second part to that motion is the inclusion of a workshop prior to Council meetings to discuss reports being presented to that Council meeting. This motion was accepted. Council meeting starting times will be amended to commence at 10.00am and 4.00pm alternatively.

Council was presented with a report at the July 2018 meeting, where the above motion from June was rescinded, with a resolution to have workshops prior to the meetings to access further information regarding the upcoming Agenda items was passed.

Leases, Licenses and Permits Policy

A report was presented to Council with the proposal of a Draft Policy that provided basic provisions for the development of leases, licenses and permits in relation to groups occupying Council land. The Policy included conditions, terms and basic fee structures. Council agreed to take out to Public Consultation the Policy and a report presented to outlining current arrangements and proposed future arrangements including fees to be charged.

Risk Framework Policy

A report was presented to Council recommending a Risk Framework which allows Council to comply with ISO 31000. The Framework outlines the requirements and processes required to Council's Risk Management Policy in order to create and protect value by improving performance, encouraging innovation and supporting the achievement of Council's objectives. Council moved to adopt the Framework which will now require review of the Risk Policy. These two documents will assist in compliance with the upcoming WHS and Risk Audit and will allow Council to implement a more robust Risk Management process across all delivery functions.

FINANCE

Draft Annual Business Plan/Budget 2018/2019

Council adopted the Draft Annual Business Plan as presented for the public consultation period. Council considered 16 responses regarding the Annual Business Plan, with 15 survey responses and 1 written correspondence. Council considered the value of the projects to the respondents and the comments received.

Council would like to thank each of the respondents for taking the time to complete the survey (an Annual Business Plan Summary is provided in the Criterion).

Finance Officer (Sandra) is currently preparing document for distribution. Community & Economic Team will work with Finance Officer to develop a new flyer for distribution with first quarter rates notices.

Manager, Community & Economic Development preparing media release and criterion article.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Foreshore Tourist Park Development

Unfortunately the Building Better Regions Fund Infrastructure Stream application was unsuccessful, with a stormwater project at Tumbay Bay being the successful project for this region. Manager, Community and Economic Development has arranged an interview with the funding body.

A Capital Investment Business Agreement is currently being drawn up to manage the Capital Investment program for the caravan park. Meeting with the Discovery Management Team have continued with a view to finalising this agreement and allow for the smooth development of the site into the future.

Council have installed 3 new cabins (1 x 3 bedroom, 2 x 2 bedroom), to the Park, contractors are currently working on external connections and certificate of occupancy requirements, Council is anticipating this will be completed by the end of August.

Council has budgeted for 2018/2019 9 new cabins and a recreational area, formulate Stage 2 of the Foreshore Tourist Park development and work is currently underway to commence delivery of this stage of the overall project.

SA Oyster Growers Association – Request to Waive Boat Launch/Retrieval Fees – Moore's Boat Ramp

A request was received from the SA Oyster Growers Association request to waive the Streaky Bay Moore's Boat Ramp launch/retrieval fees for the next 3 years. Council considered the report and resolved to agree to waive fees for the 2018/2019 financial year only.

TOURISM

Tourism Strategy

A consultant has been engaged to assist with the development of this. The strategy will be a joint collaborative between Streaky Bay Tourism and Council, with a focus to aligning with the recently released South Australian Tourism Commission Regional Visitor Strategy. Development of this strategy will commence in the coming weeks, with an extensive consultation process. The Strategy is envisaged to be

completed early in 2019 to allow the encompassing of the peak tourism season.

Wayfinding, Coastal Access and Regional Camping Strategy (Eye's on Eyre Strategy)

Regional Development Australia will be presenting to Council at the September Community and Economic Development Committee meeting, to provide an update on the project.

Speeds Point Toilet Installation

Council has received Development Approval for the location of the toilet at Speeds Point. However, at the June 2018 meeting of Council, Council resolved to remove the funding allocation for the purchase of the toilet, the funding was not reinstated in the 2018/2019 Annual Business Plan, therefore the implementation of the toilet is unable to proceed until the required funding is provided.

Tractor Beach Toilet

Contractors have been engaged and it is hoped the toilet will be constructed and in operation for the next period of school holidays.

Tractor Beach Campground

Council were successful in receiving a further \$45,000 grant from EP Natural Resource Management towards the upgrade of the Tractor Beach Campground facility. The upgrade will initially include the committed installation of an enviro-style toilet, completion of a masterplan, native vegetation assessment and following this on ground works.

Ingrained (Sand Sculpture Funding)

Council's community and economic development staff have been investigating opportunities to provide other value add activities/events during our peak seasons. The sand sculpturing idea was borne by the team as an opportunity to be a draw card and was not something currently being undertaken in our region.

The sculpture also fit into the theme of the visible festival proposal and upon discussions with the Council/Country Arts, Arts and Cultural Facilitator (Jayne Holland) a number of artist residency and employment opportunities were identified. Jayne was then engaged to prepare the funding submission for Council (due to Council staff being involved in the large submission for the Caravan Park) and subsequently the funding has been successful.

Council resolved to agree to the funding a co-contribute with the \$5000 from the existing New Year's Eve Budget and \$4,750 reallocated from the Community Grant Scheme.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Old Bowls Club Precinct

CEO has completed negotiations with Streaky Bay Men's Shed for the use of the facility. This is in place from 1 July 2018 until 30 June 2019 to support the inaugural setup of the Streaky Bay Men's Shed.

Manager, Community & Economic Development has been continuing discussions with the Memorial Garden concept for the old tennis court site and is currently costing options.

Kerrin McEvoy – Request to Honour

A letter was received from the "Streaky Bay Kid" Committee requesting Council support for the location of a sculpture on the foreshore lawns in front of the hotel and seeking Council's ability to provide in-kind support for earthworks at the site. Council agreed to both the location and to provide in-kind support by means of earthworks.

Streaky Bay Scout Group – Request to Waive Community Bus Fees

Council agreed to waive the per km rate for the Scouts group to hire the bus to participate in an excursion.

Streaky Bay Children's Centre – Request to Open CDL Facility out of Hours

Council considered a report presented to Council requesting that Council facilitate the opening of the CDL facility out of hours, and provide in-kind the supervision of the site, to enable the Children's Centre to undertake their annual bottle collecting fundraising activities.

Streaky Bay Community Library

Council considered correspondence received from the Streaky Bay Area School requesting a further \$20,000 contribution from the Council towards the operating costs of the Streaky Bay Community School Library, Council at this stage will not be increasing their funding due to ongoing pressures of the Medical Clinic operations.

Streaky Bay School Pool

Council at the April 2017 meeting of Council were presented with a proposal to enter into a joint agreement with the school to provide \$20,000 per year for a 5 year term to assist with the ongoing costs associated with pool. A condition of this funding was the establishment of a Memorandum of Understanding between the two associations.

Council News Cont'd

Streaky Bay School Pool Cont'd

Council was presented with a Memorandum of Understanding for signing at the June 2018 meeting. Council resolved at that meeting to rescind the April 2017 motion committing to the 5 year joint agreement and associated funding contribution, and a second motion that Council did not wish to accept the Memorandum of Understanding due to extraordinary Council budgetary restraints.

At the July meeting of Council, further correspondence was received from the Streaky Bay Area School requesting the funding be reinstated for the 2018/2019 financial year, however Council elected not to reinstate the funding siting ongoing financial pressure with lending provided to the Medical Clinic.

Eyre Avenue Foreshore Concept

A report was presented to the July 2018 meeting for Council to consider public feedback received following the Concept Plans public consultation period and provide staff with any additions or amendments. Council discussed the feedback received and resolved the following;

- Lighting to Footpath
- Lighting to play space and BBQ area's
- Lighting to event space
- Removal of boardwalk decking areas
- Inclusion of streetscape furniture
- 2 x sections of parallel parking (first park from Wells Street)
- Provision of cost of paving/concrete vs subsurface irrigation

The amendments will now be provided to the consultants for changes to be made. The plan will be costed and amended plan presented to the August 2018 meeting of Council. The endorsement of plans does not commit Council financially to proceeding with works.

Doc Woods Reserve Opening (Haslam)

Following the completion of the reserve upgrade in Haslam, Council resolved to write to the Honourable Stephan Knoll, Minister for Planning to attend a (bbq) for the opening of the Doc Woods Reserve with a date to suit during September/October 2018.

Sportsground Community Land Management Plan

Council put out for Public Consultation its Community Land Management Plans with an amendment to include Community Gardens as approved activities within the plans. There was no feedback received from

the Public Consultation and the amended plans were adopted at the July meeting.

YOUTH

Future Youth Groups

ARTS AND CULTURE

Arts and Cultural Facilitator

With the adoption of the 2018/2019 Annual Business Plan Council will be continuing its contract with Create With U (Jayne Holland) to undertake Arts and Cultural facilitation services for the next 12 months. Council has a number of projects that were successfully funded in 2017/2018 and will be implementing in 2018/2019 and these include youth programs and the visible festival.

Geolocation Journey Funding

Art Meets Science: Geolocation Journeys On! Residency was born out of a collective curiosity to connect and explore marine environments through an artistic and creative lens. Developed across the conversational threads of digital portals the project began with a multidisciplinary educational outreach project. Following this conversation Council's contracted Arts and Cultural Facilitator (Jayne Holland) submitted a funding application to develop the project, with Council to Auspice the funding/project, subsequently this application was successful.

This collaboration of art, science and education will invoke community activism through: an arts and science field trip, 2 community engagement forums and an eco-art ephemeral installation and workshops. Participants will be encouraged to look at and engage with science through art to enable a discovery of the social and cultural context and stories behind the science

Council resolved at the meeting for Council to auspice the project.

WASTE MANAGEMENT

Wirrulla – Illegal Dumping of Waste

Council resolved at the June meeting to receive and note the report, a further inspection to be undertaken and following the inspection a report to be prepared for Council.

Council News Cont'd

SEALED ROADS

Dodgson Drive/Bay Road Streaky Bay

Stormwater works are nearing completion, contractor has been engaged and are working to a mid September timeline for completion.

Flinders/Hospital Drive- Williams Crescent Realignment, Streaky Bay

A report was presented to Council at the June 2018 meeting providing a detailed list of community feedback on the proposed works at that meeting Council resolved to note the report and requested a further workshop to discuss the feedback.

PLEC – Wells Street, Streaky Bay

No further advise at this stage, works are programmed for February 2019.

UNSEALED ROADS

Road Construction

Council has completed during 2018/2019 the following roads; Kaldoonera Road (8km). Once staff have finished on Kaldoonera Road they will be heading to Gill Road.

Council has commenced road realignment to Cape Bauer Road and Anderson Road (Cape Bauer Loop end).

Road Maintenance

Patrol Graders have completed 96.3km for the financial year (2018/2019) up until 19 July 2018.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Vegetation Control along roadside fence lines

Elected members raised concerns about encroaching vegetation from adjoining landholders, through fence lines and potentially adversely affecting Council's roads. Council resolved to write to the Natural Resource Management Board requesting that they write to land owners encouraging vegetation control along these fence lines.

Stone Rollers on Road

Elected members raised concerns around stone rollers being driven on Council roads and the potential damage to roads incurred from this practice. Council currently does not have a Policy in place, however it is given that persons using stone rollers would take road damage into consideration when transporting. Stone rollers are considered a towed vehicle and would be subject to normal registration/road rules for such a vehicle.

Gazania (pest plant) control

Council has been working with EPNRM to plan and fund an approach to controlling gazania's along Council roadsides. This work was delayed due to wet weather and will be rescheduled for later this month.

BUILDINGS

DEVELOPMENT

Little Islands Road Closure

The Closure of portion of Little Islands Road has finished public consultation. The intention is to swap the current road alignment to land which follows the coast.

McCormack Way Reserve

Council considered a report at the June 2018 meeting of Council to determine the strategic future of the reserve. Council considered the report and resolved to refuse a rainwater tank location and did not set a strategic future for the reserve.

HEALTH MANAGEMENT

Streaky Bay Medical Clinic Incorporated Association

A request was received by Council from the Medical Clinic Board, seeking further financial provisions in 2018/2019 for the board should they not be successful in recruiting a permanent doctor, donation of its fleet car currently utilised by the locums and gifting of the Practices Manager's Long Service Leave entitlements. Council considered this request and resolved to make a \$100,000 provision (as a loan) within the 2018/2019 financial year, donate the Toyota Aurion Sedan and gift (in cash) the Long Service Leave of the Practice Manager.

REGULATING

Restricted Parking Proposal – Streaky Bay Visitor Centre

Council received a request from Visitor Centre staff to consider restricting the two (2) single parks at the front of the Visitor Centre to 2 hour parking to ensure that the parks remained free to provide visitor and Centrelink customer's direct access to the Centre. Council resolved not to support the proposal.



Budget 2018 2019

Council adopted its 2018/2019 Annual Business Plan at its July Ordinary Meeting of Council.

The budget will be funded by;

- Overall rates increase 3% (this is not a 3% increase to each individual rateable property)
- Fixed charge of \$555, levied against all rateable properties
- CWMS Levy \$477 (all applicable land)
- Waste Levy \$200 (all properties within the waste management collection area with an occupiable dwelling)
- Fees and Charges
- Grant Funding
- Council Loans

Council Budget

	Income	\$ 8,926,000
Less	Expenses	\$ 9,699,000
	Operating (deficit)	(\$ 773,000)
Less	Outlays on Existing Assets	(\$ 683,000)
Less	Outlays on New Assets	(\$ 1,276,000)
	Net Lending for Fin Year	(\$2,732,000)

This means that Council's expenditure is more than its projected income, however, Council has indicated that they may borrow for the following projects – Streaky Bay Foreshore Upgrade \$2.1m and Bay Road Upgrade \$300k. If Council, chooses to do this, it would mean that Council would be using \$332k from cash reserves from previous years.

Council Cash

Councils Cash balance relating to 30th June 2018, is **\$5,020,000** (Actual Balance is \$6,038,000 but includes a prepayment of the 2018/2019 Grants Commission Grant of \$1,018,000).



Celebrating Our Success in Last Financial Year



The graph above represents Council recent success in grant funding received, Council staff and contractors secured in total **\$281,200** in grant funding to deliver projects and programs worth **\$1,365,000**, the total cost to Council being **\$466,000** (a significant proportion of this is the Wells Street Upgrade) the remaining difference is in-kind or other funding partners. These grants enable Council to deliver projects that ordinarily would not be funded by Council or come at an increased cost to Council.

Gazania Management

The District Council of Streaky Bay in conjunction with the Eyre Peninsula Natural Resource Management Board (EPNRM) are implementing measures for the management and control of this pest plant.

Background

Gazanias (other names: African Daisies, Treasure Flower) are a low growing perennial herb growing up to 30cm tall, forming clumps and dense mats of vegetation. Native to South Africa, Gazanias were originally brought to Australia as an ornamental plant, however, they soon escaped from private gardens and have spread along roadsides, agricultural areas and into coastal dunes.

Gazanias are very tolerant to fire, frost, salinity and drought. Outside their natural range gazanias can rapidly out-compete native plants, leading to a decline in biodiversity.

Gazania is a declared plant under the *Natural Resources Management Act 2004* and its sale or transport is prohibited throughout the whole of the state of South Australia

Management and Control

Plan

Streaky Bay Council and EPNRM Board staff are commencing a spraying program targeting outliers and small infestations of Gazanias first, before working towards heavily infested areas.

Physical

For effective control, the entire plant, including its root system, should be dug out. Minimal disturbance techniques should be employed. Plants should be removed and correctly disposed of to ensure flowers do not go to seed or the roots re-establish. In situations where the plant cannot be removed, flower heads should be taken off before setting seed.

This will prevent the further spread of seed. A minimal level of control is to mow or brush cut the

flowers before they develop and set seed.

Herbicides

The *Weed Control Handbook for Declared Plants in South Australia* offers advice on suitable herbicides and rates. A copy of the handbook is available at www.pir.sa.gov.au.

There is also a SA Weed Control Phone App available for Android and iPhones.



SA Weed Control 
Primary Industries and Regions South Australia
Free

Landholders should always read the label of any herbicide to ensure it is suitable for its intended purpose and can be used safely. Care should be taken to avoid herbicide contact with native plants and any spraying of herbicide in native vegetation should be left to qualified bushcare operators.

Timing

Control is most effective when the plant is actively growing. This can be defined as having new lush foliage and flowering. Don't spray when the plant is visibly under stress.

How you can help?

Landholders and residents are encouraged to remove gazania plants from their properties with the aim of containing the spread in the local area and on the Eyre Peninsula.

Streaky Bay to host Geolocation Enviro-Art Project *as part of VISIBLE*

The District Council of Streaky Bay in collaboration with Streaky Bay Tourism and the Streaky Bay Area School will host a youth focused enviro-art project 'Geolocation Journeys On!' in Streaky Bay from 1-7 December 2018 as an innovative element of the VISIBLE event.

In July 2018 the Council was successful in receiving a Regional Arts Australia Step Up grant of \$15,000 through Country Arts SA for the youth and community art project which is one of four VISIBLE cultural tourism events to be held in the December 2018-January 2019 period.

Highly regarded South Australian artist, Annalise Rees who is currently an artist in residence at the University of Tasmania with the Institute of Marine and Antarctic Studies, will visit the region with a PHD research scientist studying endangered marine predators.

Earlier this year the Year 6 and 7 classes at the Streaky Bay Area School engaged in online skypes with Ms. Rees and Dr. Jennifer Lavers a marine ecotoxicologist with the Institute who has expertise in tropical and temperate seabird ecology, plastic pollution (marine debris), invasive species management, and fisheries by-catch. The skype sessions focused on the schools' study of the highly acclaimed 'Blue the Film' which explores the challenges of plastic pollution, overfishing, declining marine life, destruction of habitats and ocean change.

On Tuesday 4 December 2018 Ms. Rees will collaborate with Streaky Bay Aboriginal artist Susie Betts and a

mentee artist to engage with youth and community on a geolocation journey field trip along the spectacular Streaky Bay coastline. Participants will be encouraged to look at the marine predator science and research using art as a lens by sketching and painting with mediums such as charcoal, graphite, textas, pastels and watercolours.

Ms. Rees and the broader team will also facilitate two community engagement sessions and an eco-art ephemeral interactive installation on Saturday 1 and Sunday 2 December 2018 along the Doctors Beach foreshore. The installation will introduce the public to marine predator research through mapping and narrative. A mentee artist will be selected to complete the ephemeral installation on Thursday 6 and Friday 7 December 2018. Which will remain on display at the location until the end of January 2019.

Travis Barber, Mayor, District Council of Streaky Bay says, "It is great to see the VISIBLE program of events is shaping up with several successful arts funding

grants being announced recently. The Council and our Community and Economic Development Team are keen to work closely as part of the VISIBLE team to resource and facilitate sustainable cultural tourism projects like this one. We hope that this drive and innovation will build an event of regional significance that will engage our communities and visitors to the region creatively and provide broader benefits for local economies."

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
