GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

2018 Council Elections – Elected Council

Council held a Special Meeting on November 29 for the newly elected Council to take their oath and a Mayor and Deputy Mayor to be elected. Cr Travis Barber was elected as Mayor and Cr Philip Wheaton elected as Deputy Mayor.

Council Meeting – Timing

Council at their Special Meeting resolved to hold alternate day meetings commencing at 9.30am and night meetings commencing at 3.30pm.

Performance Management Framework

The Performance Management Framework was adopted by Council at the 29 November meeting. Adoption of this framework will form the catalyst for a range of policies and procedures to be adopted around recruitment, selection, and retention.

Chief Executive Officer Resignation

Chief Executive Officer, Joy Hentschke submitted her resignation last month, Council have accepted the resignation and Joy ceases her position on March 15, 2019.

The Chief Executive Officer will be on Annual Leave from 4 February to 15 March 2019, the Manager, Corporate Services shall be appointed Acting Chief Executive Officer for that period.

Council are now reviewing options for the future CEO recruitment.

Long Term Financial Plan/Asset Management Plan

Council following the last Finance Risk and Audit Committee meeting adopted the Draft Long Term Financial Plan and Asset Management Plan for 2018/2019. The Council also resolved to adopt the Treasury Policy.

Section 41 Committee's

Council at its Special Meeting held November 29 considered a report on both Section 41 and Non Section 41 Committees and resolved to continue with the following Committees and appointments;

- Finance Risk and Audit Committee

- Community and Economic Development

 - *Appointed Members:* Mayor Barber, Cr Lauren Karp, Cr Cliff Pudney, Cr Graham Gunn

Council resolved to dissolve the Waste Management and Strategic Planning Policy Committee, with all Committee's to review their terms of reference at the first meeting of the Committees.

Fee Waiver Request

Council at its November 2018 ordinary meeting considered a request to waive fees set for Waste Management under its Waste Management and Fees and Charges Policy. The request was for fees to be waived whilst extensive renovations were undertaken, to a property, Council resolved not to waive the fees.

A second request to waive the fees for the hire of the Community Bus by the SA Ambulance service was considered and the fees were waived as requested.

Local Government Scheme – R&D Research Priorities 2019/2020

Council considered a report at the November meeting of council to consider and make recommendations to the LGA for Research and Development Scheme priorities for 2019-20, Council at that meeting made the following recommendations that Council propose the following *continued* and new initiatives by the LGA under the R&D Scheme;

- Commercial Opportunities – help Council's Identify, assess and pursue commercial opportunities
- Smart City Technologies – focus on regional area adaptations
- Private Sector Learning – exploration of what could apply to Local Government
- Energy Options Assistance – assisting Council's with navigating requests for renewable energy options. Eg: guidelines for how to deal with requests, contact points, etc. We are seeing more and more requests for Council involvement in renewable energies and particularly in the regions the lack of knowledge within staff to assist with the development.
- Economic Development – position and support local government as a driver of economic development, with a focus on understanding the value of tourism and micro industry, a particular focus on elected member training.

Council News Cont'd

Australian Refugee Action Network – Support

Council received a request to support and advocate for the reversal of harsh cuts to the income support for people seeking asylum under the Status Resolution Support Service payments. Council resolved not to support the request.

Elected Member Portfolio Proposal

Council received a report at the November meeting to consider the CEO preparing a plan to allocate portfolio's to each elected member. Portfolio's of responsibility would be based on the Strategic Management Plan and the Elected Members would be required to provide written reports on their portfolio activity each month. Each Portfolio would be provided with the breakdown of the key areas of responsibilities and the relevant managers for the key areas. This report was laid on the table for presentation at the December meeting.

Lease Arrangements for Community Groups

Leases for the Powerhouse Museum, Eyre Crafts, Wirrulla Golf and Bowls and the Streaky Bay Pistol Club have all been signed and finalised. Complete Personnel have signed their commercial agreement also. Adelaide Sea Dragons are almost ready to sign their lease as issues surrounding other property on the site are resolved. MCS has met with Wirrulla Sports and Rec with regards to renewal of their lease and is awaiting the required documentation. Central Areas Sports Complex have commenced sending in their documentation. The lease for the Dental Surgery and a Licence for InStep Dance Group have been sent out for signature. Leases for Aerodrome Hangars, Poochera & Districts Bowling Club, Poochera Museum and Wirrulla Campground will commence in the future.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Foreshore Tourist Park Development

Stage 2 is set to commence in January 2019 with the 9 new cabins expected to be open for the Easter break.

An auctioneer has been engaged and the auction date set for the 31st January 2019. There will be an open day scheduled for the day prior for interested parties to look through the sale cabins. The public will not be able to access the cabins for inspection at any other point in time without booking earlier through the auctioneer.

Australian Tourism Council's Advocacy Group

Council received a request to join the Australian Tourism Council's Advisory Group (cost \$1000 per annum membership), Council considered a report at the November meeting and resolved not to join the group at this point and review in 6 months time when memberships have been finalised to ensure there is adequate South Australian representation.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Drought Communities Program - Funding

The Federal Government has announced the extension of the Drought Communities Program (DCP) under which eligible Council's can apply for up to \$1m to spend on locally identified projects aimed at stimulating the local economy. Council has been included in this extension and Council considered a report where 52 projects were presented to Council. Council resolved to apply for the following;

- Poochera Oval – Irrigation Project
- Streaky Bay Hall – Floor and Air-conditioning
- Museum Upgrades
- Streaky Bay Racecourse
- Little Islands Road Coastal Trail
- Wirrulla Camp Ground Upgrade

Service SA Business Proposal

A response from Minister Knoll was received advising that the Government no longer wished to proceed with the proposal. Council resolved at the November ordinary meeting of Council to reply to Minister Knoll and Local Member Peter Treloar, express disappointment of our community due to on-line technology issues, our ageing population, and other regional complications that the proposal is not being forthcoming.

YOUTH

Youth – Heywire Grant – Skate/Scoot Workshop

Sessions with the school to help assist with the event management and event risks. The skate workshop is scheduled for mid-January 2019.

Council Youth Strategy

Community and Economic Development team have commenced workshops with the Year 7's at the Streaky Bay Area School, investigating community values and strategies to assist our young people.

SEALED ROADS

Streaky Bay Sports Club – Entrance Alec Baldock Drive

Council have now completed this project with sealing contractors visiting last month. It is hoped the works completed will improve the life of the bowling green asset.

Dodgson Drive/Bay Road Streaky Bay

Refer to Council Project Update provided in November Council Agenda.

Pygery Port Kenny Road – Reseal

The reseal of the Pygery Port Kenny road is complete with linemarking scheduled.

Hospital Drive, Williams Cres, Flinders Drive

This intersection was again brought up at the November Council meeting with the elected members being advised that no further progress has occurred. The intersection was discussed at a workshop following the extensive consultation period whereby no direction had been given by the Elected Members to staff.

Staff will develop price estimates and stage the works in line with the concept developed with a view to rolling the project out over a number of years rather than in a “lump” sum.

Wells Street – PLEC Project

Refer to Council Project Update provided in Council Agenda for the ordinary meeting in November.

UNSEALED ROADS

Road Construction

Council has completed during 2018/2019 the following roads; Kaldoonera Road (8km), Gill Road (7km), staff are currently working on Carawa Road which is a 3.566km section and the first 2kms of Westall Way Loop Road is expected to be completed prior to Christmas.

Council has commenced the process for a road realignment to Cape Bauer Road and Anderson Road (Cape Bauer Loop end), survey of the change will be marked in November this year.

Road Maintenance

Patrol Grading will follow rain events whereby we will react to public requests and Category One and Two Roads. All major roads in the District have been graded once this season to date.

To date 2018/2019 financial year approx. 929 kms of road has been patrol graded.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Building Asset Management

Council are due to revalue its building assets in the 2018/2019 financial year. To assist staff in the guidance of a relevant and accurate revaluation cost a series of workshops are planned to review the life and community expectations of the assets.

The first work shop on sport and recreation grounds is scheduled for the 4th December at 9am, followed by the Operational buildings on the 11th December 2018. Public Open Space (playgrounds, toilets etc) is planned for the 8th January and Museums and Halls on the 15th January 2019.

Aerodrome Grant Funding

The grant funding agreement has been authorised and sent off following the Ordinary Meeting of Council on the 29 November 2018.

Staff are preparing the RFQ for the vermin proof fencing at the Aerodrome it is hoped to have the approved contractor engaged and works scheduled by the end of January 2019.

Eyre Avenue Foreshore Development – Funding Option

Council moved a motion at the July 2018 meeting of Council to adopt the Concept Plan for the Foreshore Development and that development would be subject to Council obtaining external grant funding. A report was presented to the November 2018 meeting of Council seeking approval to submit an application to source funding. Council at the meeting resolved not to permit the submission of an application.

Baird Bay Township Coastal Wall

Funding was successful, report presented to November ordinary meeting of Council. Council resolved to authorise for the Chief Executive Officer to sign the Grant Agreement for the Baird Bay Coastal Adaption Strategy under the Coast Protection Board, Coast Protection Fund. This funding will enable a site survey and site assessment to provide future direction for works.

It is with regret The District Council of Streaky Bay announces the resignation of their Chief Executive Officer, Joy Hentschke, after a three year tenure.

Joy announced her resignation to staff and elected members early last week, and said it is something she had deliberated on for quite a while, and it was a difficult decision.

Joy has worked with Council for the past 3 years, commencing as the Corporate Services Manager before her appointment as Chief Executive Officer following the resignation of Chris Blanch. Joy has always been well respected and valued by her peers and colleagues.

Joy during her tenure has achieved a lot within Council including the development and adoption of the Strategic Management Plan and Long Term Financial Plan.

Joy was instrumental in putting together options for Council to consider following the impending closure of the Streaky Bay Medical Clinic, which saw Council become pioneers in their purchase of the Medical Clinic. The purchase saw Council operating the clinic for a period of 6 months, before successfully transitioning the clinic across to a community incorporated body. The purchase and transition of the clinic enabled a continuation of a critical service for the district and for the region.

Importantly Joy has also been instrumental in Council's decision to proceed with its development of the Streaky Bay Foreshore Tourist Park, including the successful signing of the 15 Year management agreement with Discovery Parks.

Joy's leadership has seen Council gain more than \$400,000 worth of external funding during her 3 year tenure, providing much needed financial relief and enabled Council to deliver almost \$2m worth of projects.

Former Mayor and re-elected Councillor, Travis Barber, reiterated that "she has been an invaluable member of the team, her financial, local government knowledge and governance was second to none. She was instrumental in setting up a strong restructure on her arrival along with a much needed long term strategic plan and a major re vamp to our caravan park. I wish Joy and Dennis all the best with their health and future plans after Streaky Bay"

Joy is yet to decide on her next career move, and will take some time to spend with her family, before considering future options. Fire Danger Season

Council is urging residents to start cleaning up their blocks in preparation for the fire danger season.

The Fire Prevention Officers have started their inspections at the beginning of October. If your allotment was found to be non-complying at the time of inspections you would have received a notice under section 105F of the Fire and Emergency Services Act.

If you received a notice you are required to have the grass cut no higher than 10cm. For allotments larger than 0.5ha a 20m fuel reduction zone is required around houses as well as a 5m fuel reduction zone around sheds etc. along with a fire break of 4m around the boundaries.

This MUST be done before the 1st of November.

If you are unable to do the work yourself the area has contractors you may wish to use.

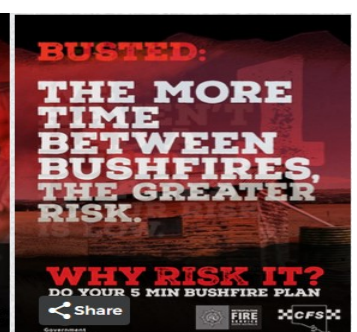
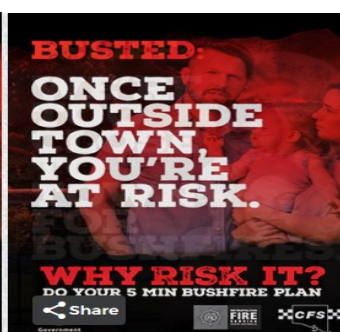
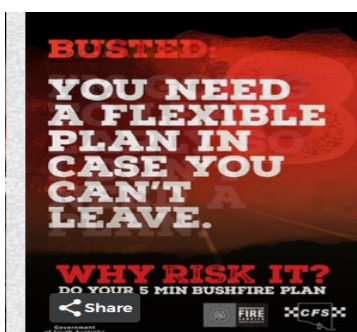
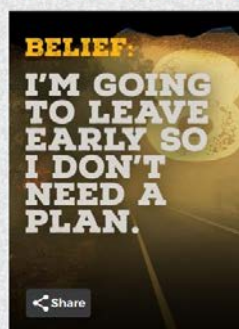
New Dog By-Laws

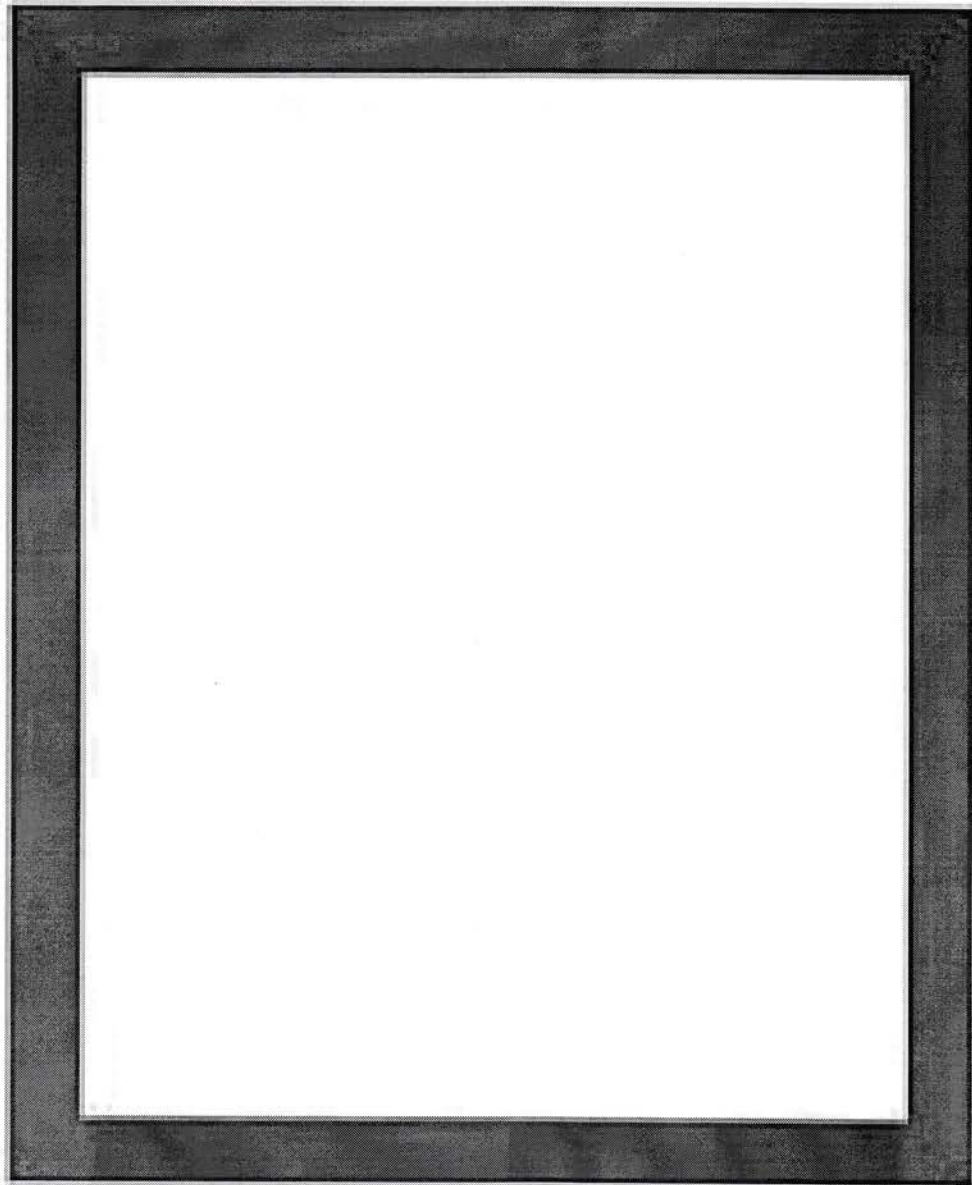
