GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Council Meetings September/October 2019 – Change of Times

Council have agreed to change the times of the 19 September 2019 Ordinary meeting of Council to commence at 9.30am and 17 October 2019 Council meeting to commence at 3.30pm.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Economic Development Strategy

Manager of Community & Economic Development has been drafting an Economic Development Strategy. The strategy shall be presented to the Community & Economic Development Committee at its next meeting. The intention is that the Strategy shall remain in draft form until further consultation has been undertaken with the District's Business Sector.

TOURISM

Tourism Strategy

A report to the August 2019 meeting was presented where Council resolved to present the document for public consultation. Public Consultation is now open and will close November 1, 2019

Abalone Brand – Streaky Bay

An update on the proposal was presented to the 30 May 2019 Community and Economic Development Committee Meeting. The Committee recommended to include the branding option in the Draft Council Tourism Strategy (which has occurred) and ask for community input via the Tourism Strategy Development.

Streaky Bay Tourist Promotions Inc.

Annual General Meeting was held on September 10, 2019. The Committee was elected and members resolved to transition to a Tourism and Business Group.

YOUTH

Youth Strategy

Manager of Community & Economic Development & the Community & Economic Development Officer are currently working with the Year 7's at the Streaky Bay Area School, gathering information for strategy development.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Arts and Cultural Facilitator

Council received a report to the September 2019 ordinary meeting of Council outlining that Wudinna and Elliston Councils no longer wished to participate in a three Council partnership. The report was for Council to consider the ongoing employment of an Arts and Cultural Facilitator. Council at this time resolved to remove the funding for the Arts and Cultural Facilitator. An amount of \$5,000.00 has been retained to provide opportunities to run small scale projects and activities.

Childcare Feasibility Study

Childcare study has been presented to the Community for feedback. Once the consultation period has been completed a further report will be presented to Council. It has become apparent during this period that there are other areas in the EP that are also experiencing these issues and there is potential for a regional report to be undertaken.

Wirrulla Triangle Purchase

Council considered a report at the September 2019, ordinary meeting of Council to negotiate with the native title holders and Crown Land to pursue the purchase of this allotment. Council endorsed the recommendation at the meeting.

WASTE MANAGEMENT

Cungena Landfill Land Purchase

Council resolved at the September ordinary meeting of Council to undertake negotiations with the native title holders and consult and negotiate with Crown land for tenure of the Cungena Landfill Site allotments.

Sceale Bay Landfill Site

Council resolved to forward correspondence to the Environment Protection Authority and Minister for Environment and Water to pursue surrendering the license of the Sceale Bay Landfill Site.

STORMWATER MANAGEMENT

Stormwater – Mudge Tce, Jubilee Road

Manager of Regulatory Services will begin negotiations with appropriate land owners to secure the required easements.

SEALED ROADS

Bay Road

Stage two of the Bay Road Project being the Anderson Road and Redding Road Realignments, have been surveyed, Telstra pits have been relocated and kerbing for both realignments are complete. Forming of the road is to be scheduled when patrol grading is complete. Sealing works to be scheduled pending contractor availability.

Wells Street – PLEC – Undergrounding of Power

Target Completion Date – December 2019. Work commenced Monday 19 August, progressing well. Power outages to allow switch over will occur late October / early November. Council and SAPN will advise exact dates when they are confirmed.

UNSEALED ROADS

Road Construction

Kingoonya-Yantanabie Road has commenced with 2km remaining as of the 24 September 2019.

Roads budgeted for the 2019/2020 Financial Year are - Anderson Road, Carawa Road, Dog Fence Road, Emerald Rise Road, Poochera Port Kenny Road, Wallalla Hill Road, Kingoonya – Yantanabie Road.

Road Maintenance - Patrol grading

During the 2018/2019 financial year 1,576.5kms of road was patrol graded.

To date in the 2019/2020 financial year 567kms of road has been patrol graded.

ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT

Baird Bay Coastal Wall

A meeting with Baird Bay residents on Monday 2 September 2019 proved very successful with a number of residents attending. Residents' ideas we considered against the Baird Bay Coastal Adaption Study and priorities regarding mitigation etc. were also discussed. A grant application has been submitted to the Coast Protection Board to survey and develop and concept design (Stage 1) and detailed design works (Stage 2) which meets Council responsibilities and residents' concerns regarding amenity. Further funding has been applied for through the Natural Resources as part of their Saltmarsh remediation funding. Should the grant funding be successful, the design work will commence during this financial year.

Tree Management

The Infrastructure and Civil works team have been working to remove all dead trees and prune dying/diseased trees to ensure safety, when the soils have stabilised replacement trees will be planted. Council recently donated approximately 400 trees to the School, Children's Centre and Sara Goosay's Community group which have been planted around the township. Staff have also been working on replacing street trees with suitable species in appropriate locations.





The Streaky Bay RSL has in its archives its first Minute Book which records details of the first meeting ever held.

On November 3rd 1919 local returned soldiers held their first meeting and were referred to as the Returned Sailors and Soldiers Imperial League Streaky Bay sub branch. There were fourteen ex servicemen present inc G & A Bockleberg, G M Campbell, R Feltus, E. Redding and T.Lee. G. B Bockelberg was elected President and G.M Campbell was elected secretary.

"Its gratifying and rewarding to think that what was started 100 years ago in our town is still a viable organization "says Streaky Bay RSL Secretary Mick Stewart. "We have a very dedicated and enthusiastic group led by Bill Trevena who is a WW11 veteran and former commando".



DECLARED ANIMAL & PLANT CONTROL ON ROAD RESERVES

The District Council of Streaky Bay hereby issues the following notice to landholders to enable the control of declared animals and plants on road reserves.

NRM Boards are able to pass on costs of the control of declared animals & plants on roadsides to adjoining landowners

Section 182 of the Natural Resources Management Act 2004, states that Natural Resource Management Groups or Boards have the responsibility to control Declared Animals & Plants on roadsides. Section 185 of the NRM Act 2004, states that any costs incurred in carrying out this control work may be charged to the adjoining landowner up to half of the road reserve.

(Under Section 221 of the Local Government Act it is illegal for landholders to undertake Declared Animal & Plant control measures on Road Reserve adjoining their property, without written authority from their Council. This Section of the Act prohibits any alteration to a public road, including the removal of vegetation, except by a person acting under a relevant Statutory Authority.)

The District Council of Streaky Bay hereby gives landholders the authorisation to undertake control or removal of declared Plants and/or Animals on Rural Road Reserves within its Council area. Before undertaking any such control/removal, landowners must consult with the EPNRM Board.

Conditions of Authorisation by Council

The landowner shall accept full responsibility for and must ensure that any Declared Animal & Plant control activities undertaken, including the use of mechanised equipment, chemical and/or spraying, does not interfere with or cause any damage to the Road Reserve, other roadside vegetation or in any way affect the property of any other person. Prior approval from the **Native Vegetation Council** is required where a proposed control program is likely to cause damage to native roadside vegetation.

Council would prefer that this situation is alleviated prior to commencing the sale process. Ratepayers who are having financial difficulty, can setup a repayment plan. This has been an effective method for some ratepayers who have entered into an arrangement.

To enter into a payment arrangement, you may either call and discuss this matter with Brooke Cupples and or Sandra Brice, or complete a DCSB-07 Form 78 – Payment Arrangement form. While Council has many methods of payments, the most effective for payment arrangements are:

- (a) Direct Debit a new method Council has introduced in 2018/2019 see the Office staff for a form.
- (b) Direct Deposit where you automatically deposit the amount into the Council bank account see the Office staff for a form.

So, please, if you are having financial difficulty, come in and have a chat.

COMFORT AND COOKING FIRES

People can have a fire for comfort and cooking purposes as long as it is:

- \Rightarrow Not a total fire ban day,
- ⇒ Is within a fire pit at least 20 cm deep,
- ⇒ Has a 4 metre clearance around the fire,
- \Rightarrow Is smaller than 1 m²,
- ⇒ A person is always in attendance until the fire is totally extinguished,
- ⇒ An appropriate agent to extinguish the fire is on hand.





Streaky Bay Property Owners Are You Prepared for the Fire Danger Season??

With the Fire Danger Season expected to commence on the 1 November, the first round of property inspections will occur in the first week of October.

Properties with undergrowth exceeding the legislative requirement will be receiving a Section 105F (*Fire and Emergency Services Act*) Notice which requires the landowner to cut/slash the undergrowth to the required level applicable to that property. Landowners will have 28 days from the Notice's issue to make their properties compliant.

All properties receiving a Section 105F Notice will be reinspected after the 28 day period (early November), and if they remain non-compliant the landowner will be required to pay the cost of having their property cut/slashed by Council or contractor, as well as an administrative fee.

Council has set a charge of \$1120.00 (GST inclusive) to compulsory mow township and outlying area properties that are non-compliant.

Property owners within the Streaky Bay area will be charged \$620.00 (GST inclusive) per property for the compulsory mowing of non-compliant blocks. The 105F process is a legal obligation on every landowner to minimise the risk to both them and their neighbours life and property.

Recycling Depot

Did you know that it's FREE to take cardboard (as long as it is broken down to the required size) and all glass bottles to the recycling depot? Glass bottles include wine, spirits & jars - please note these do not attract a 10c refund.





Development Applications

Are you undertaking any new buildings, extensions or renovations on your property? Do you need development approval?

Many people don't realise that you will need development approval from Council if you are a structure that is;

- ⇒ larger than 15 square metres
- ⇒ over 2.5 metres high
- ⇒ has a span greater than 3 metres
- ⇒ adjoins an existing building
- ⇒ infilling walls of an existing carport/verandah/shed

Some other examples of building work that requires a development application are, building a wall to enclose an existing decking, adding a verandah to your house, a carport attached or detached to a house, a pool or spa.

If you have previously got approval for a structure but are changing the plans you must amend the application to match what you would like to do.




