

Council News

GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Strategic Plan Review

Council has commenced is Strategic Plan Review. Consultant Jeff Tate (Tate Consulting) has been engaged to assist with the review process. Council is seeking a refined finished plan. Community Forums were held throughout the district between March 2-4 with and Elected Member workshop on the afternoon of March 4 to discuss the outcomes of the community forums. A draft document will now be formulated for presentation to Council.

Live Audio or Video Streaming of Council Meetings

Cr McGowan raised a question on notice regarding the availability of being able to audio or live video stream Councils meetings. The CEO replied that staff had investigated options however Council currently does not have the IT infrastructure available to facilitate delivery but we are working on those solutions. See September Council Minutes for full question and response.

Corflute Election Signs

Council considered a report to restrict the use of corflute signs for elections as indicated by the Local Government Association of South Australia. Several issues with corflute signs have been identified during recent federal, state and local government elections, including roadside amenity, roadside safety, potential for damage to roadside infrastructure and the council resourcing required to regulate use. Council resolved not to support the restricted use of election signs.

Regional Connectivity Program Discussion Paper

The issue of connectivity both within the Streaky Bay district and across the Eyre Peninsula has become an increasingly important concern for the local community. Council was provided with a regional connectivity program and subsequent discussion paper to consider. This discussion paper provided Council with an opportunity to consider the framework within which a Regional Connectivity Program might operate. Council resolved to the submit the responses as detailed within the February 2020 Council report and support the investigation of the development of an Eyre Peninsula Wide Regional Digital Plan with any relevant costings to be brought back to Council for consideration.

TOURISM

Sceale Bay Beach Camping

Cr Hackett raised a question without notice if staff could please provide a report to the March 2020

meeting regarding the petition received "opposed camping on sceale bay beach" presented to the February 2020 meeting and letters to all Sceale Bay Residents explaining camping rules. Response to be provided at the March 2020 meeting.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Wirrulla Triangle Use

Mellor Olsson have received direction from the Traditional Owners of the site and will provide advice to Council in the coming weeks regards the requirements of the Traditional Owners in respect of site usage and recognition. Council resolved at the February 2020 ordinary meeting of Council to approve the CEO to sign the application to dedicate crown land for the purpose of having the parcel of land locally known as the "Wirrulla Triangle" dedicated to Council and required trust account to be established.

Streaky Bay Rodeo 2020

Council received a request from the Rodeo Committee to provide in-kind support to the value of a Diamond Sponsor as outlined in the February 2020 report to Council. Council resolved to provide the inkind support as per the cost estimates.

Carol J Boat

A report was presented to the February 2020 ordinary meeting of Council to discuss the future of the Carol J Boat. Council resolved to place the boat out for Tender until March 30, 2020, if no tender is received or the boat has not been removed from Council land by 30 May 2020 the Carol J shall be dismantled and placed in landfill.

Australia Day Awards Review

A report was presented the Community and Economic Development Committee undertaking a review of the current Awards process and recommending some inclusion to enable further transparency. Council resolved to include a Community Group of the year award, and a long term recognition of service award (that will be issued at the Committee's discretion). A Terms of Reference for a Committee was established and the Committee shall now include members of the Community and the previous year's Citizen of the Year winner on the selection panel (Committee).

Community Asset Grant Scheme

A report was presented to the Community and Economic Development Committee who recommended that the Community Asset Grant Scheme be reinstated for the 2020/2021 financial year and Council endorsed that it be included for consideration in the Draft 2020/2021 Annual Business Plan. Grant Guidelines will be developed.

Council News Cont'd

Security Training

Cr Wheaton raised a question without notice regarding if the CEO could investigate if Council could arrange for security training to be held in Streaky Bay. The Community and Economic Development Officer is currently researching relevant options.

Memorial Garden – Memorial Policy

Council when establishing a location for a proposed memorial garden received feedback from the community with wishes to be provided with alternative options for the provision of remembering those passed. Council has developed a proposed Policy that provides the framework for this opportunity and will be further discussed at workshop to be held in April 2020.

In addition to this Councils Community Land Management Plans were required to be altered to enable the establishment of Community Gardens on Community Land. The Plans have been revised to include this option and will be going out for public consultation as per Council's Public Consultation Policy.

Arts and Cultural Facilitator Position

A report was presented the Community and Economic Development Committee to reconsider the reinstatement of this position as this role is unable to be resourced with the existing FTE for the Community and Economic Development Team. Council resolved to include consideration of funding in the Draft 2020/2021 Annual Business Plan.

Bendigo Bank

Council received a deputation at the February 2020 ordinary meeting of Council outlining the options for the establishment of a Community Bank within the region.

Streaky Bay Solar Farm

Council staff and elected members recently met with Todae Solar and Flow Power who will be facilitating the development of the Streaky Bay Solar Farm. Todae Solar who will predominantly be overseeing the construction phase advised construction is due to commence in May 2020, the company indicated that they will be seeking to use local contractors where possible. Flow Power expect that the SA Power Networks commissioning will commence October and the site will come online shortly after.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Council Building/Visitor Centre Consolidation Planning

A full costing and budget is to be developed for Councils consideration in April 2020, following a report to the Community and Economic Development Committee for Council to consider relocating the Council Chamber to an alternative location.

Baird Bay Public Amenities - Sand Blasting

Assessment of the amenities has been complete. Works department to rectify lower rust erosion with quote to be sourced to replace the top of the structure.

Patrol Grading

To date in the 2019/2020 financial year 928kms of road has been patrol graded.

Generators - Council Offices

Council requested staff to quote generators suitable for operating the Council's Office and Visitor Centre. Quotes have been received and a further report will be presented to the April 2020 meeting of Council.

ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT

Cungena Landfill Cell Design and Build

An addendum to the current Cungena Landfill Environmental Management Plan with particular focus on longer life of the landfill has been developed and lodged with the Environment Protection Authority.

Cungena Landfill Land Purchase

Mellor Olsson have received direction from the Traditional Owners of the site and will provide advice to Council in the coming weeks regards the requirements of the Traditional Owners in respect of site usage and recognition.

Review CDL Operating

A report was presented to the February 2020 ordinary meeting of Council detailing the operating costs of the CDL facility at the transfer station. Council resolved for staff to investigate ways of increasing the cost efficiency of the site and enabling effective services to the community.

Jetty Sand Replenishment

Councillor Karp requested further information regarding the potential to rejuvenate the sand at the Jetty each year with more sand and what is the process if the community are asking for this to be done. The Manager for Infrastructure and Civil Works has inspected the affected area and will seek further advice on remediation options. Vehicular access to this area is currently restricted and will need to be considered in the resolution process.

Youth Week - April 2020

Council were successful in gaining funding for Youth Week in April 2020. A week long program of activities that is expected to be delivered during the April 2020 School Holiday period.

Moores Boat Ramp Delayed

The District Council of Streaky Bay wished to advise that the replacement of Moores Boat Ramp has been delayed due to unforeseeable circumstance.

Karina Ewer, CEO of the District Council of Streaky Bay said "Initially the project was to replace one pontoon only. Inspection of the site mid-last year however determined that Moores Boat Ramp had serious issues that needed urgent attention. Council have therefore undertaken a project to totally replace the boat ramp to ensure its safety and structural viability for many years to come."

Significant negotiations with oceanographers, marine engineers and Coastal Protection have been required in order to develop suitable engineering drawings which will deliver a practical and more resilient product. An initial costing to complete the project has however indicated that Council must now go to tender to complete the works.

Mayor Travis Barber said "It is unfortunate the delivery of the boat ramp has taken so long however the extent of the damage was unknown until divers were employed to inspect the site. The pontoons have already been built and all we have to do now is find a suitable contractor or contractors to deliver the entire project. That project will include fully removing the old concrete ramp, replacing the concrete and reinstalling longer and more durable pontoons."

The project is expected to go out to tender in the next two weeks. Tender documents will be available through Council's website www.streakybay.sa.gov.au and through the Local Government Vendor Panel site.

"We know the delay in the project has been a significant issue for our community and understand the frustration being experienced. We also know Council are determined to deliver our community the best product possible," Mayor Barber said.

The Shed now has a computer of its own that will make it a little easier to look items up that we need to purchase, or to check on woodworking projects to make. Members have used their mobiles in the past.

Marine Safety Notice—Streaky Bay, Sceale Bay, Baird Bay & Haslam

Locally available 24/7 Adelaide Monitored VHF Marine Emergency Radio Service is on Ch 16 and on supplementary CH 67, via equipment on Government Radio Network towers at Elliston and Streaky Bay's Gibson Peninsula and is well receivable within Streaky Bay. However in some areas both inside and outside of some of the other bays, that signal can be marginal due to terrain shadowing.

Daylight Hours Local VHF Marine Radio Services: The call signs are WMR Baird Bay, WMR Haslam and SES Streaky Bay these are manned by SES members. Call sign VMR Streaky Bay is a non SES operation from Killas Service Station, Wells Street - manned during business hours.

Local Services Provided:

Locally operated stations primarily monitor for general calls and the hours are usually 8.00am to 5.30pm varying to 8.30pm. Some stations can provide you with a signal check, but they do not normally offer a regular voyage booking/tracking service unless that is agreed by prior arrangement. They also can be used for emergency calls and will monitor emergency calls.

Local Streaky Bay UHF CB Repeater is CH7 and can often be used for all types of emergencies during long term blackouts to Streaky Bay area mobile phone services. Radius is approx 35kms from Streaky Bay

Cat Ownership within the District Council of Streaky Bay

Over the last six months Council has experienced a significant increase in complaints relating to feral cats and cat hoarding within the district. It is considered a timely reminder of what it means to be a good cat owner.

Register your cat

Within the District Council of Streaky Bay your cat must be registered. Having your cat microchipped is <u>not</u> the same as registering your pet.

Identification must be on your cat

It should be noted that if your cat is not microchipped or clearly identified with a collar with contact details the cat will be treated as an unowned cat.

Just having a collar with no other identification is not sufficient to show ownership.

If your cat is not identifiable the council will be left in a position of treating the animal as if it was an unowned cat. As there are not holding facilities for cats, such animals may be at risk of being euthanized.

Lost and found

If your cat goes missing you need to act quickly. Your first step should be to call Council to see if your cat has been found or handed in. Other options include:

- a letterbox drop in your area, preferably with a picture of your cat
- an advertisement in the local newspaper
- posters on notice boards in shopping and community centres
- contacting neighbours in your immediate vicinity. Any advertisements should include:
- your cat's breed
- the sex of your cat (e.g. desexed male)
- approximate age, size, and colour of your cat
- any distinguishing features
- a clear colour photo of your cat (if possible).

Do not delay: Under the Dog and Cat Management Act 1995, any cat that is found without identification can be euthanized.

Stop feeding strays

There has been a significant increase in the prevalence of feral cats and semi owned cats within the district.

Feeding a cat that is not yours is not caring for it. Feeding unowned cats allows them to breed, continuing the cycle of nuisance and feral cats spreading disease and killing wildlife. Avoid contributing to the problem by feeding your cat in an enclosed area and not leaving food out.

Stray cats are attracted to the food source and can spread diseases to your own beloved furry friend.

De-sex your pet

Uncontrolled cat breeding is a huge problem within our district. Every year, thousands of healthy cats die needlessly across South Australia because homes cannot be found for them. If more cats are desexed, there will be fewer unwanted kittens in our community. De-sexing your cat means you are doing your part about controlling the cat population.

Animals which are de-sexed are shown to live longer, improves the cats temperament, stray less, reducing unwanted behaviour such as spraying, marking, fighting and yowling.

Cats mature quickly, and can breed from four months of age, so it's important to be proactive. The surgery is quite safe, and in most cases your cat will be ready to return home within 24 hours.

If you find that your cat has had an unwanted litter or that you no longer can look after your cat, instead of abandonment of kittens on the side of the road, contact Council for help to rehome.

Purchase from a registered breeder

Like with dogs all kittens must come from a registered breeder. By purchasing a kitten from a registered breeder you are ensuring that you are getting a kitten from a controlled environment. Kittens when purchased from a registered breeder should also be microchipped.

If you wish to become a registered cat breeder visit the DACO website and complete the registration online. Alternatively attend the Council office and staff will help you complete your registration.

What is e-waste?

E-waste – or electronic waste – refers to **electronic products** that are no longer wanted or working. You are able to take these items to the Streaky Bay Transfer Station (fees apply) for disposal. Items accepted are -

Computers * monitors * laptops * computer keyboards * mice * printers * fax machines * mobile phones * CD Players * VCRs * gaming consoles and controllers * televisions

Please note that vacuum cleaners, microwaves, fridges, other kitchen appliances and electrical equipment are not accepted as e-waste but are accepted as other general waste at the Transfer Station (Fees apply)

NEW ONLINE BURNING NOTIFICATION SYSTEM

People wishing to undertake broad acre burning during the 2019/2020 fire danger season please be aware that there is now a new online notification system.

If you have not yet met with staff you are asked to arrange a meeting with Rodney Heath on 0427 400 584 to arrange a time to be walked through the new program and obtain your seasonal burning permit.



COMFORT AND COOKING FIRES

People can have a fire for comfort and cooking purposes as long as it is:

- ⇒ Not a total fire ban day,
- ⇒ Is within a fire pit at least 20 cm deep,
- ⇒ Has a 4 metre clearance around the fire,
- \Rightarrow Is smaller than 1 m²,
- ⇒ A person is always in attendance until the fire is totally extinguished,
- ⇒ An appropriate agent to extinguish the fire is on hand.



WHAT'S THAT SMOKE!!

During the fire danger season from the first Monday in February each year, farmers can apply for a broad acre burning permit. These permits come with strict conditions that the landowner must comply with. Historically most burning takes place during March, through until the end of the season which 'normally' finishes on 15th April every year – dependant on seasonal conditions.

Council has Authorised Officers that can issue permits for broad acre burning.

This year the minimum amount of water needed to be portable in the paddock has been increased to 1000 litres.






