Council News

Streaky Bay and Districts Medical Clinic Board

Council received a report following correspondence received from the Medical Clinic requesting the nomination of a new board member representative from Council. The report was received and noted with no nomination resolved at that time.

Sceale Bay Road Land Parcel

Council received an offer for purchase of the land owned by Council on Sceale Bay Road. Council resolved due to pending future use of the land to retain the land for its own purposes.

New Year's Eve Dry Zone

Council resolved to put in place a Dry Zone for New Years Eve. The Dry zone shall be in the same location as previous years.

Streaky Bay Rodeo Dry Zone

Council received a request to support and implement a Dry Zone for the Rodeo Carparking area, the same as applied for the event held in 2019. Council resolved at a Special Meeting to gazette this proposal.

Social Media Policy

In the judgment in Fairfax Media Publications Pty Ltd v Voller [2021] HCA 27, the High Court upheld the lower decision that the administrators of social media pages can be held liable for defamatory comments posted on those pages by third parties.

Council Officers acknowledge the advantages of social media as an engagement tool for Council and still see the value of having the ability to maintain a two conversation via social media with ratepayers and other stakeholders. Therefore, Council has updated its media policy to implement the following measures to its social media pages:

- Switch off comments on any post which has been up seven or days longer, so it no longer has to be moderated
- Automatically switch off comments on an issue which may be controversial or draw offensive third-party comments before posting
- Hide or delete any third-party comments made which may be perceived as being offensive, malicious, defamatory or may negatively impact the reputation of another
- Use "filters" to block posts using particular words or offensive language
- If resources aren't in place to monitor & moderate social media content, switch off comments

Streaky Bay Area School Pool

Council resolved the following fees and charges as listed below

No payment = no entry.

Please note: Adults accompanying children at the pool but not swimming also need to pay the entry fee. Pool hire \$33.00 inclusive of GST (Per hour)

Council is continuing to negotiate a long-term agreement for public opening with the Minister for Education.

The Streaky Bay Area School Principal has advised there will be a delay in Council being able to open the pool due to current maintenance. Council has not been advised with a possible opening date at this time

Land Management Agreement Waiver

Council received a request to waive the Land Management Agreement for Oscar Williams Drive. Council resolved at the meeting to not waive the requested clauses regarding height restrictions and front boundary setback, however did waive the request for rear boundary setback.



Waste and Recycling Matters

Important Changes to Transfer Station Operations

As you probably know by now, the Transfer Station is changing how it operates, including adding some New Recycling processes and adding more controls around Waste Management.

We're Opening Longer:

The Transfer Station is moving from 9.5 hours (open to the public) to 22 hours (open to the public). We trust that this will significantly increase access opportunities for our ratepayers and visitors alike. New opening times are displayed separately in Criterion.

This initiative also provides staff the opportunity to better manage our resources, recycling and landfill. Every time we re-use or recycle, this saves or generates money for our community. If something goes to landfill, we all pay.

The Green Waste area:

The Green Waste area at the Transfer Station has traditionally been open 7 days a week to ratepayers.

The Environmental Protection Authority (EPA) conducted inspections during June 2021 and as a result, the Green Waste area will need to be controlled. Unfortunately, due to the actions of a couple of people, Council has no choice but to change the way we manage this area and to avoid any further incidents of illegal dumping. Over the coming weeks a fence will be erected where the existing gate is now. Entry to the area will only be available through the Transfer Station during opening hours.

We understand that this may be an inconvenience for some, however the option has been taken out of Council's hands. This will, however, help us better manage the size and type of green waste and its conversion to reusable mulch and compost.

Every waste delivery will be fully inspected on entry to the Transfer Station and persons will be directed to the relevant areas by our attendants.

The "Second Chance" Shop:

When you go through the Transfer Station shed, you'll notice a small area set aside for products which we think deserve a second chance at life.

While still evolving, the area already has some great gear. A couple of things could still make a nice gift, or that weekend project you've been looking for.

Thought of the Month – Did you know....?

Sorting your Waste WILL save you money!

In case you're not already aware, Council pays a Landfill Levy to the EPA based on the volume of waste delivered to landfill. Together, we can significantly reduce the levy and transportation costs. We can also recoup costs through Recycling and Reusing but again we need your help.

Our Staff will inspect every load that comes into the Transfer Station. If they can easily identify and access products that can be recycled, you won't be charged. **A full caged trailer may end up costing you as little as a small wheelie bin, but it must be sorted.** It is unsafe for our staff to search through your trailer to pull out a tin can or two. We need your help.

Focus "Non-refundable" Products:

- Cardboard Clean and cut to size (talk to our Transfer Station Staff for details)
- Plastic Milk Bottles Rinsed with caps removed
- Tin Cans Rinsed, preferably with labels removed
- Plastic Bottle Caps
- Wine and "non-deposit" bottles and casks

Again, please sort the products as well as you can. Transfer Station attendants may refuse unsorted product, including 10c deposit items, if they deem the sorting process to be unsafe and time consuming.

- Be located within South Australia
- Have an annual turnover of \$75,000 or more in 2020-21 or 2019-20, and be registered for GST
- Employ people in South Australia
- Have an Australia-wide payroll of less than \$10 million in 2019-20
- Have a valid Australian Business Number (ABN)
- Experienced at least a 30 per cent reduction (compared to the week prior) in turnover due to the restricted trading conditions

**To be eligible for the one-off \$1,000 emergency cash grant, a non-employing business must meet the criteria listed above excluding the requirement to employ people.

Boosting Apprenticeships

The Boosting Apprenticeship Commencements wage subsidy supports businesses and Group Training Organisations to take on new apprentices and trainees, to build a pipeline of skilled workers to support sustained economic recovery.

Through the subsidy, any business or Group Training Organisation that engages an Australian Apprentice between 5 October 2020 and 31 March 2022 may be eligible for a subsidy of 50 per cent of wages paid to a new or recommencing apprentice or trainee for a 12month period from the date of commencement to a maximum of \$7,000 per quarter. 




