# Council News

## GOVERNANCE

## ANNUAL BUSINESS PLAN & BUDGET

Council endorsed its Annual Business Plan and Budget for 2022/2023 at the August 2022 Ordinary meeting of Council.

The endorsement of the Annual Business Plan includes the adoption of;

## INFRASTRUCTURE

### Poochera Port Kenny Road – Kaolin Mine

Council endorsed the signing and implementation of a Memorandum of Understanding between Andromeda (Kaolin Mine proprietors) and Council that outlines the in principal agreements regarding the future development of the Poochera Port Kenny Road.

The next step of this development and forming part of the MOU will be the development of a binding construction and maintenance agreement.

In preparation for the development of the agreement was for Council to endorse the proposed Construction Plans and this was undertaken at the same meeting.

### Part Road Closure and Transfer to Andromeda

Council received a proposal from Andromeda to close a portion of an unformed road that would result in the road being absorbed into the mining lease area.

The partial section of that being the unformed/unnamed road (adjoining Parla Peak Road (adjacent to Section 32 (CT5804/980), Lt 102 (CT5845/97), Section 515 (CL 6212/124) and Section 100 (CT5762/604) Hundred of Inkster.

The report was with a view to transfer the land to Andromeda Metals Limited with no cost for the value of the land, however Andromeda to pay all

costs associated with physical survey, legal advice, conveyancing, plan development and lodgement and any other fees and charges as deemed necessary to this process. This proposal was endorsed by Council.

## TOURISM AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

### Streaky Bay Jetty Platform

New concrete stairs and railing to the Western side of the Jetty Platform currently being constructed. Bollards have been ordered to be installed in front of the platform to protect it from cars that park near the jetty platform.

### Streaky Bay Jetty Pool Platform Extension and Shade

Construction of framework for Jetty Pool Shade has commenced off-site.

### Streaky Bay Children's Festival

Council at its June meeting considered a report to look at holding an alternative event to that of the current New Year's Eve Children's Festival. At that meeting Council resolved to go out to Community Consultations.

Council considered the survey responses and resolved to not hold the Children's Event on New Year's Eve, that the event be opened to carnival and stall holders to attend, and those providers charge accordingly, and that a single similar large event be held at a different time of year.

This decision will not affect the fireworks and plans for an alternative event are currently being discussed.

### Perlubie and Speeds Point – DEW Funding

Council applied for and received an offer from Department of Environment and Water, the funding is to plan and support the formalisation of camping and general sustainability of the sites. Council endorsed the signing of the funding agreement at the August meeting.

## CEO UPDATE

*From the CEO's desk*

I've noticed a spike in expiation notices being issued for dogs wandering at large, so I thought I would provide a brief overview about the issue:

### ***Dogs wandering at large***

Dog owners are responsible for ensuring their dog is safely contained to their property. A dog not under the effective control of its owner is considered to be 'wandering at large' which is an offence under the Dog & Cat Management Act 1995.

### ***The danger of wandering***

Dogs that wander on the streets or in public areas without an owner present are referred to as dogs "wandering at large." While some people might think this is harmless exploring, these dogs cause a nuisance, are often distressed and may attack or harass people or other animals. In some cases, they cause road accidents resulting in injury to the dog and on occasion to vehicle occupants and may cause property damage – all of which becomes the responsibility of the owner of the dog.

Dogs wander for many reasons; they might be looking for a mate, they have been scared away from their home by loud noises, or a gate has simply been left open.

### ***Wandering: the Fast Facts***

- If your dog is found wandering, council can legally seize it.
- Council will apply an expiation notice to the owners of wandering dogs.
- If a dog is found wandering, or unaccompanied, and the council cannot identify or locate the owner, the dog is taken to the council pound.
- Council Officers will refer to their council database of registered dogs to obtain the owner's contact details and where the dog lives.
- Council is required to place a public notice in the council office describing the dog, colouring, sex and the time and place it was collected
- As soon as you realise your dog is missing, please contact council and your neighbours
- If the dog is not claimed within 72 hours of the notice being placed by council, the dog legally becomes council property.

### ***The benefits of identification***

Council is responsible for dealing with dogs that are wandering at large. In most instances, if the dog is registered, it can be returned to its owner. From 1 July 2018, your dog must also be microchipped. It must also wear a collar with current registration disc, and a name tag with your mobile phone number listed is a good idea, too.

### ***If you find a stray dog***

Any person who finds a wandering dog should notify council in which the dog was found as soon as possible. If it is not reported, council cannot reunite the dog with its owner. Some people mistakenly keep the lost dog rather than notifying council. This makes it all the more difficult for the owner to find their pet. If a person keeps a stray dog and fails to notify council, they may be guilty of "theft by finding", which is a serious criminal offence. Dog pounds and shelters are required to meet the standards set by law and offer adequate and appropriate facilities for the short-term holding of dogs. You can be sure any dog you find will be safe for the short term if surrendered to council. If the dog does have a name tag with contact details listed, try calling its owners before taking it to council, as this saves time and money for all involved.

### ***If you lose your dog***

If your dog is lost or missing, you should act immediately. Contact council and your neighbours. You may also consider conducting a letterbox drop in your area, telling your neighbours, putting a notice in the local shop window or placing an advertisement in local newsletters. If unclaimed, and the owners cannot be contacted, council will give the dog to an animal shelter for re-homing. If the dog is not fit for re-homing due to poor health or poor temperament, it may be humanely euthanased.

### ***Wandering: a good owner tip***

Before you bring a dog into your life, it's a good idea to do an "escape audit" of your home. Is your fence secure? Could a dog burrow under gates or squeeze between gaps? Is there anything in the neighbourhood that might frighten your dog and cause it to flee?

### CHANGE IN NEW YEAR'S EVE CHILDREN'S FESTIVAL ARRANGEMENT

Council recently went to Community consultation on the future of the New Year's Eve Children's Festival event. The current New Year's Eve Children's Festival (noting this event is separate to the Fireworks), currently was provided free of charge to participants and is held prior to the commencement of the Fireworks.

Council Officers were considering the creation of more events throughout the year and proposed that instead of the team focusing on a New Year's Eve event, at a time with already high visitation time, that focus is instead directed to an alternative event planned earlier in the year, with a focus on youth engagement/ family friendly events and school holiday programs. Council resolved at that meeting to seek community input via an electronic survey.

After considering the community feedback, Council at its August meeting moved to not host the children's festival and instead, it will be open to carnival and stallholders to attend the event, with participants required to pay for any associated activities. The council will seek host an alternative family festival at a different time of the year (yet to be determined).

Council Chief Executive Officer Damian Carter said by encouraging the visit of carnival operators and stallholders, and utilising council funds on an alternative event, it would provide the "best of both worlds".

"The community valued the fireworks more so than anything else. For what occurs at the children's festival, through inviting carnival providers on New Year's Eve, we are creating a similar experience and council could then use money for another festival," he said.

"It can provide twice as many events with the same resources."

He continues to state that an alternative event during the year would encourage visitation to the region and provide more community activities, with a quarter of the population of the district under 20. "Having another event gives the youth additional things to do," Mr Carter said.

The fireworks are a stand-alone event and will not in any way be affected by this change.



# MASTERPLAN CONSULTATION SESSIONS

Council is beginning its consultation sessions as the first step towards undertaking masterplans across the district.

Township Masterplans are being developed for;

- Streaky Bay, Sceale Bay, Haslam, Poochera and Wirrulla

Management Plans are being developed for;

Community consultation sessions are to be hosted throughout the district. The consultation sessions will be hosted by WAX Design consultants and Council staff. WAX Design recently undertook an independent site visit across the district to familiarise themselves.

# ANNUAL BUSINESS PLAN SUMMARY

## 2022-2023

*The 2022-2023 Annual Business Plan aims to strike a balance between the level of services the community has expressed a desire for, and the need to ensure the long-term financial sustainability of Council. The primary source of income for Council is property-based tax (rates).*

### RATES AT A GLANCE

Comparing rates between Councils is difficult as each Council has different attributes and provides varying services or similar services at different standards. The District Council of Streaky Bay delivers an extensive range and level of services with the greater part determined by the expectations of our community.

### METHOD USED TO VALUE LAND

All land within a Council area, except for land specifically exempt (e.g. Crown land and Council occupied land) is rateable. Council has decided to continue to use **site value** (the value of the land and any improvements which permanently affect the amenity of use of the land, such as drainage works, but excluding the value of buildings and other improvements) as the basis for valuing land within the Council area. The site value is determined by the Valuer-General, not by Council. Council considers this method of valuing land provides the fairest method of distributing the rate burden across all ratepayer.

### GENERAL RATES

Council sets differential general rates by the following zones: Neighbourhood, Town Activity Centre, Strategic Employment, Rural Aquaculture, Rural, Employment (Bulk Handling), Deferred Urban, Caravan Park and Tourist Park, Township, Rural Settlement, Rural Shack Settlement, Conservation Visitor Experience, Rural Living, Rural Neighbourhood and Recreation. These differential general rates are further divided between land uses. **A fixed charge of \$640.00** will be levied against each separate assessment with only one fixed charge levied against two or more pieces of adjoining land. **An overall rate Increase of 5.7%** has been applied. The actual increase payable by any individual rate payer may be more or less than this, depending on the movement in the site value of each property.

### RATE REBATE

A rebate of rates of any rateable land in the Council area will be in accordance with the Local Government Act 1999 and Council's Rate Rebate Policy.

### SERVICE CHARGES

#### EFFLUENT MANAGEMENT

Council maintains and manages a Community Wastewater Management System. A charge is applied to each property that is serviced by this system. Council has increased this service charge by 4% to \$511 for the 2022-2023 financial year.

#### KERBSIDE COLLECTION

The Council charges a service fee to offset the cost of kerbside waste collection. Council has not increased this for the 2022-2023 financial year. The service charge per 140 litre bin is \$260.00 per annum.

#### REGIONAL LANDSCAPE LEVY (RLL)

The Regional Landscape Levy, formerly the 'Natural Resource Management Levy'. Council is required to collect this levy on behalf of the State Government for no net gain to Council. The rates are as below:

### NEW JOINT STRATEGIC REGIONAL PLAN IN DEVELOPMENT

A new Strategic Regional Plan (the Plan) for the sustainable economic growth of Eyre Peninsula is being prepared.

The Plan is being prepared by Regional Development Australia Eyre Peninsula (RDAEP), in partnership with the Eyre Peninsula Local Government Association (EPLGA) and the Eyre Peninsula Landscape Board (EPLB).

The Plan will outline priorities for 2023 to 2026 to support the prosperity of the region by:

- leveraging regional advantages
- managing regional growth pressures
- addressing economic development and infrastructure needs
- identifying other important opportunities.

It will also provide stakeholders, policy makers and potential investors with a better understanding of the Eyre Peninsula (EP) - what our challenges are and what makes our region unique and great.

The existing Regional Strategic Plan was prepared jointly in 2019 by the RDAEP and the EPLGA, and is now due for review.

URPS, well-respected leaders in planning and engagement, have been appointed to prepare the new Plan and ensure strong consultation.

The project partners want to work closely with community and stakeholders to ensure that the Plan addresses what matters most to our industries and communities.

*"The new Plan will be underpinned by wide-ranging engagement and consultation with key stakeholders"* said RDAEP Chair, Bryan Trigg.

*“It is important that stakeholders are involved in identifying shared priorities for the region so that efforts can be focused and coordinated to best deliver outcomes over the three year period of the Plan.”*

## FACT SHEET

### Eyre Peninsula Strategic Regional Plan 2023-2026

A new Strategic Regional Plan for the sustainable economic growth of Eyre Peninsula is being prepared.

This discussion paper provides information about the Plan, who is preparing it, how it is being prepared, and how community and stakeholders can have a say in its development.

#### **Who is preparing the Plan?**

The Plan is being prepared by Regional Development Australia Eyre Peninsula (RDAEP), in partnership with the Eyre Peninsula Local Government Association (EPLGA) and the Eyre Peninsula Landscape Board (EPLB). The existing Regional Strategic Plan was prepared jointly in 2019 by the RDAEP and EPLGA and is now due for review.

- RDAEP works with all levels of government, business and community groups to support economic development in the region. RDA boards are required to co-ordinate the development of Strategic Regional Plans, which align with Commonwealth priorities.
- The EPLGA is a membership organisation providing service and leadership to its 11 member councils, acting as an advocate on relevant legislation and policy issues.
- The Eyre Peninsula Landscape Board works with partners to deliver practical, on-ground programs to manage landscapes, investing levies into regional priorities as well as leveraging government funding to manage and protect the environment.

#### **What will the Plan do?**

The Plan will identify a shared vision and priorities that the partner organisations will work towards over the 2023-2026 period to support the prosperity of the Eyre Peninsula region by leveraging regional strengths, managing growth pressures, addressing economic development and infrastructure needs and identifying other important opportunities.

It will address regional economic strengths and challenges and align to the Commonwealth Government required priorities for Regional Plans of:

- Connectivity and Infrastructure (digital, transport, freight and supply chain)
- Human Capital and Skills (education and workforce)
- Regional Employment and Business
- Leadership and Collaboration
- Amenity and Liveability
- Sustainable Natural Resource.

The Plan will assist the region make the most of future opportunities, the evolving economy and changes in the demographics of our society. It will align to government priorities to support future funding.

It will be used by the RDAEP, EPLGA and the EPLB and partners to guide decision-making and annual business plans and budgets.

It will also provide stakeholders, policy makers and potential investors with a better understanding of the Eyre Peninsula (EP) - what makes our region unique and great – supporting investment attraction.

### **How will the Plan be prepared?**

URPS, well-respected leaders in planning and engagement, have been appointed to prepare the new Plan.

The Plan will be prepared through:

- research and analysis of economic and demographic trends
- consideration of council, regional, state and national policy and plans
- engagement with communities and key stakeholders.

The Strategic Regional Plan Working Group will oversee and guide the development of the Plan. The Working Group will be coordinated and chaired by RDAEP, and will have senior membership from the RDAEP, EPLGA, Eyre Peninsula Landscapes Board and URPS.

### **Engaging with Communities and Stakeholders**

We want to work closely with our region's communities, industries and stakeholders to ensure that the new Plan addresses what matters most to them. As a key facilitator of economic development on the Eyre Peninsula, the RDAEP plays an important role in bringing stakeholders together.

It is important that a breadth of people and organisations are involved in identifying the new Plan's regional priorities so that our efforts are focused and coordinated to best deliver outcomes over the next three years of the new Plan.

We will engage with local communities and key stakeholders to understand what they see as the key challenges and opportunities for the economic sustainability of the region. Key stakeholders include governments, community organisations, business and industry groups, education institutions and not-for-profits.

The information gathered through the engagement will be used to prepare the draft Plan, which we will bring back to community and stakeholders for consultation when it is ready.

It is hoped that once developed, the new Plan will assist stakeholders and the community to identify competitive advantages, manage regional growth pressures, identify opportunities and address economic development and infrastructure needs.
