# Kerrin McEvoy – Request to Honour

Members of the working party met with Kerrin and Ken Martin (sculptor) in Adelaide at the beginning of May, to discuss and begin to conceptualise the proposed sculpture. Council at it's May 2018 meeting approved in principle the statue to be located on Council land. The working party held a further meeting on May 21, 2018.

# Youth - Heywire Grant

A grant has been submitted to undertake a youth event management mentoring program that incorporates two youth events. If successful this will have involvement with the Streaky Bay Area School and Drug and Alcohol Action Awareness Committee.

#### **Future Youth Groups**

MCED and CEDO have been liaising with Streaky Bay Area School and will be commencing some workshops with the middle school and upper school SRC groups to ascertain interest in a future youth group with a similar focus to the previous YAC (that is no longer funded).

# STREAKY BAY AREA SCHOOL

During term 1 of the school year, the Year 6 and 7 students of Streaky Bay Area School were involved in an inquiry learning project where, after viewing 'Blue The Film', they identified a personal inquiry issue around the big question of 'If oceans are considered the lungs of our planet, what does this mean for our future responsibility and how might we educate our community on this?'.

After researching their topic and identifying a solution, alternative or action to a current local, community or global issue, students then hosted the community premiere of 'Blue The Film' and presented their learning, which included interactive displays, demonstrations, opinion polls, quizzes, promotional materials and the opportunity to purchase environmentally friendly alternative products made by the students themselves (including bees wax wraps, produce and shopping bags made of natural material). Over 150 community members attended the community evening, including students, family members, mentors and community members.

As students investigated their issue during the inquiry learning project, students connected with mentors within the community and experts from afar as well as local businesses to help bring about change. This included local and Port Lincoln employees from DEWNR, local community members with expertise in their specific topic and people from the Darwin whose work surrounds Ghost Nets.

Examples of student learning included:

- Effects of Single use plastic in our community and what actions can we take to reduce it?
- Importance of recycling in Streaky Bay
- What would our world be like without sharks
- If we are what we eat then are we our own waste?
- Is washing your face costing the earth?
- What can we do to stop seabirds eating plastics?

We would like to continue this initiative at a year 6 and 7 level, where each year we have a different focus.

#### INDOOR BOWLS

The Streaky Bay Indoor Bowls Club is a story of success. From December 2014 the club was without a venue following the closure of the Montgomerie Terrace clubhouse. However months later the old sports clubhouse at the Streaky Bay Town Oval became available and a group of Indoor Bowls volunteers cleaned and outfitted the premises to re-establish the highly successful activity on June 4, 2015. Improvements to conditions continued throughout the year and today, three years later there are 29 names registered on the book, all are either full or associate members of the Streaky Bay Bowling Club.

General business centered round subscription and play fees, the purchase of 2 additional high chairs, a \$500 donation to the complex and replacing a number of the heavy chairs with lighter weight models.

Following the meeting 2 games of Indoor Bowls were played to complete the days outing. The Wednesday afternoon competition continues all year round and now members are looking forward to a special day in June. The future certainly looks brighter for the club as in just a short time the group has recorded a remarkable advancement.

# **KERBSIDE WASTE COLLECTION BIN SIZE IS 140 LITRE**

As per Council's Waste Management Policy a **140 litre** mobile garbage bin (wheelie bin) must be supplied by the resident for their kerbside waste collection.

Please note that the 120 litre bin is **not suitable** for use by residents as their kerbside waste collection bin.

The 120 litre bin poses many problems for the waste contractor:-

- ♦ The bin grab jaws on the waste contractors truck are only set to pick up 140 litre and the larger 240 litre bins.
- Due to their narrower body the 120 litre bin slides through the bin grab jaws and the wheels and axle can be dislodged causing damage to the bin.
- ♦ Also due to its narrower body, cardboard and other items get lodged in the bin and is not emptied properly.
- It is easily blown over and waste gets strewn everywhere and the waste truck driver has to get out to pick up this waste.

Also note that bins must be placed at least 1 metre from any fixed object, i.e. fence, stobie pole or tree and multiple bins are required to be at least half a metre apart.

Your co-operation in this matter will enable the efficient and safe pickup and disposal of all residents household rubbish on collection day.



# Don't let your food waste become illegal pig feed

It is against the law in Australia to feed your pigs any food containing meat or meat products or food that has been in contact with meat or meat products. This type of feed is known as swill and is illegal in Australia.

Feeding pigs swill can cause many diseases and has been linked to some outbreaks of foot and mouth disease and other livestock diseases.

Foot and mouth disease is a highly contagious virus and affects not only pigs but sheep, cattle, goats, llamas and more.

Some examples of prohibited pig feed or swill are sausage rolls, pies, pizza, sandwiches with deli meats, household waste and used cooking oils.

These rules apply to all pigs including pigs kept for personal consumption and pet pigs. Anyone who is caught feeding pigs these types of feed can be fines under the Livestock Regulations 2013.



Councils are part of the democratic framework of Australia. The community elects their council members every four years and the next general elections happen in November 2018.

Unlike State and Federal elections, it is not compulsory to vote in South Australian council elections. However, council elections are the biggest single voluntary civic participation activity in the state with nearly 360,000 people voting in the 2014 council elections.

Another important difference from State and Federal elections is that all voting in council elections is done by post. Enrolled voters receive a **voting package through the mail** and return their votes in a reply paid envelope.
