Council News

GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Nominations for Local Government Association (LGA) President

The LGA called for nominations for the position of LGA President as well as for members of SA Regional Organisation of Councils (SAROC) and Greater Adelaide Regional Organisation of Councils (GAROC) to commence from the conclusion of the 2018 Annual General Meeting (AGM) and to remain in office until the conclusion of the 2020 AGM. The LGA sent letters to Councils calling for nominations for the positions, Council considered the offer and moved not to nominate any candidates.

Strategic Management Plan 2016-2026 Objectives Only Report 30 June 2018

Council were presented with a report to provide Council with the results and progress of the Strategic Management Plan 2016-2026 (SMP) focussing on the achievements at 30 June 2018. Council received and noted the report.

Whistleblowers Policy

Protections for Whistleblowers has become increasingly important in our very recent history. The phenomenon is occurring on a National and International scale and is having far reaching and powerful impacts on corporations, government institutions and individuals alike. The implications are that community expectations, regulatory expectations and now Australian legislative obligations have and are changing rapidly. The first step in addressing potential impacts of the introduction of the legislation is to implement a Whistleblowers Policy which will meet the standards as they are currently understood. Council resolved to adopt the Policy.

Risk Policy

Council adopted an updated Risk Policy at the August meeting of Council. As part of the introduction of *ISO 31000: Risk Management – Guidelines* Council adopted the Risk Management Framework at its meeting in July 2018. Council is required to have a Risk Framework and Policy in place as part of its management practices. A Risk Audit is expected in late September and the adoption of the Risk Policy will also allow for risk considerations to be included in the development of the Asset Management Plan and other planning tools as they are developed.

Streaky Bay Senior Citizens Homes – Request to Waive Advertising Fee

A request was received for Council to waive \$60 worth of advertising fees for the advertising of an available housing unit at the Homes. Council considered the report and resolved not to waive the fee. Council moved an additional motion requesting a future deputation from the Committee to provide Council with information on their business plans for the future.

2018 Council Elections – Nominations Open – September 4

Election Material Brochure Mail Out was undertaken during early August, social media and criterion campaigning is continuing.

Candidate nomination packs are available at the Council Office and Visitor Centre, social media and criterion campaigning will continue.

Leases, Licenses and Permit Policy (DCSB-PM-16.08)

Council considered a report regarding the public consultation phase for the policy. With limited feedback provided, Council adopted the Policy as presented.

FINANCE

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Foreshore Tourist Park Development

The Capital Investment Business Agreement is at draft stage and will be presented to Discovery Parks in the next week for their approval.

Council have installed 3 new cabins (1 x 3 bedroom, 2 x 2 bedroom), to the Park, contractors are currently working on external connections and certificate of occupancy requirements, Council is anticipating this will be completed by mid-September.

Council has budgeted for 2018/2019 - 9 new cabins and a recreational area, formulate Stage 2 of the Foreshore Tourist Park development and work is currently underway to commence delivery of this stage of the overall project.

TOURISM

Gawler Ranges Road (Wirrulla to Kingoonya)

Council resolved at the August 2018 meeting of Council that a notice of motion be prepared for the next EPLGA Executive Meeting that the EPLGA lobby the Department of Planning Transport and Infrastructure to upgrade the Finlayson – Gawler Ranges- Kingoonya Road to open up the Eyre Peninsula to tourism, services

and freight in conjunction with the Eyre Peninsula Road Transport Strategy.

Streaky Bay Hall Carpark – Tourism Signage

Council raised a motion without notice at the August 2018 meeting of Council and resolved to investigate the potential for utilising the Streaky Bay Institute Car Park as a first point of call for road touring caravans and with considerations for a town map and photographic display of local attractions that exist within the District, and for staff to seek advice from Regional Development Australia on the proposal.

Caravan Parking Signage

Council raised a motion without notice to plan for and adopt signage to designated caravan parking within the township of Streaky Bay.

Streaky Bay Visitor Centre – Volunteers

Expression of interest has been called for volunteers to assist with Saturday Morning volunteers, to date a limited response has been received and this may inhibit the ability of Saturday morning openings. Management will assess various options in the coming weeks.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Wirrulla Oval – Playground and Shade

Staff are currently investigating costs and co-funding options for the provision of this project.

Haslam – Playground and Fitness Equipment

The Haslam Playground and fitness equipment has been installed. If people are looking for an afternoon drive on the weekend take a trip out to Haslam for a bbq at the newly restored coastal reserve.

Council identified within their strategic management the development of a project scope for a Memorial Forest (Garden), a report was considered at the December 2017 meeting of Council following a proposal put forward by interested members of the community and Council resolved at that meeting that the preferred option for the facility can be pursued as a Men's Shed with the potential co-sharing arrangements with the Manager to report back to Council at the January 2018 Council Meeting.

A meeting between Community Groups for co-sharing options was not forthcoming in January 2018 due to the unavailability of key persons.

A meeting was attempted to be co-ordinated in January 2018 of all interested parties in that site, however this meeting was unable to be co-ordinated due to interested persons having other commitments. In mid 2018 Council resolved that the old Bowling Club

Building and Site be rented to the newly formed "Streaky Bay Men's Shed" for a period of 12 months, therefore that building/site is now occupied.

At the August 2018 meeting a report was presented with a concept for the Old Tennis Courts site for the planting of a living "maze" on the site with the theme "Amaze with Meaning", the report was considered and Council moved not to proceed with the maze concept, as they supported the location however would like a more feasible concept. A second motion was moved to hold a workshop for the proposed Memorial Park, a workshop has been scheduled for 3pm, Wednesday, September 12, 2018.

Eyre Avenue Foreshore Concept

Council in October and **November 2017**, sought community input into the development of a foreshore development plan for Eyre Avenue, Streaky Bay. This plan was initiated following a requirement to provide subsurface irrigation to the area, and investigating the reduction of the total lawn space to reduce ongoing maintenance costs.

The input provided by the community was collated and a workshop was held with elected members and Masterplan (in **December 2017**) to prioritise concepts and ideas for what the future foreshore precinct could incorporate. Following this workshop Masterplan (Consultants) developed a *draft* concept plan that was presented to Council at the **March 2018** meeting and agreed to take out to Public Consultation.

At the **June 2018** meeting of Council a report was presented for Council to make any changes to the concept plan presented taking into consideration public consultation feedback provided. Council at that meeting did not make a recommendation, and a further report was presented to the **July 2018** meeting of Council, where a recommendation by Council was moved to make amendments to the *draft* plan based on public consultation.

The motion moved by Council was forwarded to the consultant where the amendments to the plan were made, the revised plan was then presented to the **August 2018** meeting of Council. Council considered the revised plan and moved to adopt the concept plan subject to external funding being provided to proceed with works.

YOUTH

Youth – Heywire Grant

Grant for a Streaky Sk8z event was successful, funding amount of \$6300. Funding will include 1 day skate and scoot workshop in January, followed by 2 days of aerosol workshops in April 2018. Special meeting of

Council was held on Monday, September 3, 2018 where the grant was approved.

ARTS AND CULTURE

WASTE MANAGEMENT

Jetty Cutting – Waste and Cans/Bottle Bins

Council resolved in December 2017 to reinstate bins in that area, currently awaiting written approval from Department Planning, Transport and Infrastructure.

Sceale Bay Road Land (potential landfill site)

Council resolved at the August 2018 meeting of Council that the Mayor meet with the Minister of Environment to investigate the potential of a dump site on Sceale Bay Road and close the dump at Cungenah.

SEALED ROADS

Dodgson Drive/Bay Road Streaky Bay

Stormwater works are nearing completion, contractor has been engaged and are working to a mid September timeline for completion.

Flinders/Hospital Drive- Williams Crescent Realignment, Streaky Bay

A report was presented to Council at the June 2018 meeting providing a detailed list of community feedback on the proposed works at that meeting Council resolved to note the report and requested a further workshop to discuss the feedback. This workshop was held and the Flinders Drive Report will be taken back to Council at a later date.

Bay Road Upgrade – Next section

Final design has been requested for the Redding Road and Anderson place realignment road works which was budgeted. Early project management timelines has works beginning in this area in the first half of 2019 after the initial stage (Bay Road and Dodgson Drive) has been completed in its entirety.

Pygery Port Kenny Road – Reseal

Reseals works are scheduled to be completed prior to Christmas in line with the first stage works on Bay Road.

Wells Street – PLEC Project

Request for quotations for trenching will be forwarded in coming weeks. Manager currently sourcing contracts, materials and labour. PLEC have advised the project can commence once final plans have been signed off on at their end.

Disabled Parking - Chemist

Feedback from the Public Consultation has been collated and will be provided to the Manager, Regulatory Services to be included as part of the Streaky Bay Town Masterplan review.

UNSEALED ROADS

Road Construction

Council has completed during 2018/2019 the following roads; Kaldoonera Road (8km). Once staff have finished on Kaldoonera Road they will be heading to Gill Road. Council has commenced road realignment to Cape Bauer Road and Anderson Road (Cape Bauer Loop end).

Road Maintenance

Patrol Graders have completed 96.3km for the financial year (2018/2019) up until 19 July 2018.

Patrol Grading Report

A question without notice was raised at the August 2018 meeting of Council, regarding the provision of a monthly report on which roads are being patrol graded, roads that are under construction and updates on Bay Road. A response will be provided at the September 2018 meeting.

Little Islands Road Closure

Council considered a report to the August 2018 meeting of Council which outlined a proposal for Council to contribute \$15,000 towards road construction works for a portion of the road outlined above that traditionally provides unrestricted access to Whites Beach and Windmill Point.

The Manager, Regulatory Services is currently working with Mr Standley with regards to road opening and closing procedures. Once these are complete Council's Unmade Road Reserve Policy would become effective and Council will be required to include the road in their regular road works program. The application to close the road as a private access road and open it as a public road on a public road reserve is expected to be lodged with the Surveyor General prior December 2018. Council considered the request and moved to lay the report on the table.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Primary Producer Fencing

A question without notice was raised at the August 2018 meeting of Council regarding whether Council have jurisdiction or are we able to ask primary producers to fix their fencing so as to not be a danger to road users. Managers advised that Council has various powers under various acts and regulation. Depending on the

circumstances, the condition and location of the fence will depend on what action can be taken. If Councillors or public have a particular concern about a specific fence they need to report it and it will be acted upon accordingly.

Tree Maintenance

District services investigating options for the procurement of a botanist to undertake tree assessments. This process will be two-fold confirming the reason for the death of a large number of Tuart trees and completing an assessment of large trees in High Risk areas of the townships. (i.e. areas where damage to life and property may occur)

Stormwater Issues Scaale Bay

A question without notice was raised at the August 2018 meeting of Council, regarding the investigation of stormwater issues at Scaale Bay. A response will be provided at the September 2018 meeting of Council.

BUILDINGS

DEVELOPMENT

Draft State Planning Policies for South Australia

The State Government has released the Draft State Planning Policies for South Australia. These policies guide development within the State and will be used for the development of Regional Plans which will then flow down to development controls for the District Council of Streaky Bay. This is the opportunity for Council to provide comment and influence the development of the State, region and the Council area. If the policies do not reflect how the Council wishes to see development within the district this is the opportunity to make comment. Council resolved at the last meeting to review the documents and make comments as individuals in preference to a collective

HEALTH MANAGEMENT

Dental Clinic – New Dental Chair, Steriliser and confidential medical records storage

Manager Corporate Services has met with the Dentist to assess the requirements for the surgery. The steriliser was repaired late last year and this will ensure it works correctly into the future. Quotes are being obtained for repairs to the chair. Some further minor equipment repairs are also required and being addressed. Quotes have been sought for the medical records storage.

Streaky Bay Medical Clinic

A report was tabled by Cr Wheaton, being the Streaky Bay and District Medical Clinic Incorporated Chairman's Report "Chairs Report Since Inception 2018", following the tabling of this report, Council resolved to provide a funding donation of \$100,000 to the Streaky Bay and District Medical Clinic Incorporated to enable the association to continue with the operation of the clinic.

REGULATING

Dog Registrations

Dog registration were due on 31 August. Approximately 40 % of owners have not paid their registration fees. Council staff will be following this up with owners and if people fail to register their animal we will be looking at fining people for not paying their registration fees.

Fire Prevention

People are reminded that the fire danger season is fast approaching and people should start preparing their properties. The first round of inspections will occur in the first week of October so make sure your properties are mowed so you don't get a notice.

MEMBERSHIP DRIVE TO KEEP OUR CLINIC

The Inaugural AGM of the clinic was held last night and membership voting fees for 2018/2019 set at \$15 per member less than the fuel to drive to Ceduna to see a doctor.

The Board is seeking a large take up in membership to assist with the advocacy and Lobbying to assist with meeting a \$245k deficit if we must rely on Locum Doctors to provide services for the next 12 months.

The Board is confident we will be able to secure at least one doctor within the next 12 months and are hopeful of securing 2 doctors. Recruitment Agencies are advertising for potential GPs on our behalf, and the agent supplying our locums is doing the same. Dr Rob and Gaye Oswald have also helped with pointers for our recruiting effort. The Board will look to engage Jayne Holland to design and deliver an advertising/ marketing programme to attract GPs from within Australia and overseas countries. Clinic managers in Port Lincoln have also been approached for tips on how they have attracted and employed overseas doctors. The Board is currently in discussions with one prospective GP in Port Lincoln and a decision on taking up a position at Streaky Bay is likely in the next few weeks. There are currently adverts for 14 GPs in medical practices on EP. We are well aware that securing a permanent GP will not be easy, but the Board is certainly giving it our “best shot”

Artist Annabelle Collett conducted a series of FREE visual art Workshops to explore pattern and motif through the contrasting use of Black and White in Elliston and Streaky Bay in August 2018.

Fire Danger Season

Fire danger season is approaching fast with only two months to go. Council is urging residents to start cleaning up their blocks in preparation for the fire danger season.

The Fire Prevention Officers will start their inspections at the beginning of October. If your allotment is found to be non-complying at the time of inspections you will be issued a notice under section 105F of the Fire and Emergency Services Act.

It is required for allotments under 0.5ha to maintain grass and weeds to a height no higher than 10cm. For allotments larger than 0.5ha a 20m fuel reduction zone is required around houses as well as a 5m fuel reduction zone around sheds etc. along with a fire break of 4m around the boundaries.

If you are unable to do the work yourself the area has contractors you may wish to use.

Abandoned Cats and Kittens

If you are no longer able to care for your cat or kittens, or your cat has an unexpected litter that you cannot care for please be in contact with Council Officers. At no point should you dump or abandon your cat or kittens.

To prevent the abandonment or dumping of unwanted litters Council Officers will accept surrendered cats and kittens at no charge. This can be done by ringing the Council on 0886261001 and organise collection via Council's General Inspector. Council staff will endeavour to re-home suitable, healthy surrendered animals via animal rescue groups such as the RSPCA shelter in Port Lincoln.



STOPPING SEMI-OWNERSHIP OF CATS

Semi-owned cats are cats that have food left out for them but are not claimed as pets.

These cats can prey on wildlife, fight with other housed cats and spread disease. They often suffer from poor health and live significantly shorter lives than housed cats.

To reduce the number of semi-owned cats we can ensure that our cats are desexed, easily identified with collars and microchipped, stop feeding cats that are not yours. If you are no longer able to care for a cat or kitten, try to rehome or take them to a shelter.

If you wish to keep a stray cat you must have it microchipped and desexed. We also recommend registering your cat with www.dogsandcatsonline.com.au to ensure a safe return.

New Dog By-Laws

New By-Laws came into effect in December 2017. These new laws require any person with a dog in their care and control in a public place to carry a bag or other suitable container for the collection and disposal of their dog faeces.

If you are found to be without a bag or container while you have your animal in a public place you could be liable to a \$100.00 expiation fee.

Let's keep our district and public areas clean and free of disease, while also avoiding a fine by picking up after your animal.

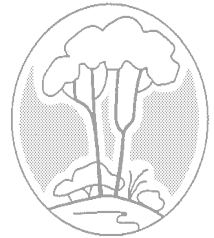
