The decision to make Streaky Sounds a family inclusive event really paid off with Event Organiser, Jess Davis saying 'originally we had mixed feedback about having the family component ie: with kids activities, etc., but knowing our community and having so many families, to have an event that is inclusive of everyone was something we really wanted to make happen'.

So far, there has only been positive feedback for the event - Raves about the fantastic kids' entertainment put on by Xtreme Kite and Paddle from Port Lincoln, amazing food and drinks from over 10 different food vans (a lot of whom managed to sell out at some point during the night) and of course the brilliant line up of artists that we saw take the stage.

### ETTERS TO THE EDITOR

### To the editor.

As a member of the Streaky Bay and District Medical Clinic I then seconded a motion that followed, Association Inc I attended the general meeting called on 5 June 2023 at the Streaky Bay Hotel 6.30pm. That meeting was well attended, and available to us on the way in was pictorial diagram showing the current Operational Responsibility and Structure. Most importantly there was also a four-page briefing paper, however I only managed to read a quarter of the material before the meeting started otherwise I would have known and understood why the Chairman (Jonas Woolford) struggled in an attempt to inform us of the situation relating to communications and meetings the board and members had over the past several months with a proposal to transition from the current SB&D Medical Clinic Inc to being run by Eyre and Far North Local Health Network - SA Health (Because we knew the current situation had already become unsustainable).

Part of the problem being the board could not get defined answers to questions and apparently anything that was proposed by those government connected groups kept changing. It was clear members of the board were tired and not happy with the situation as they currently saw it and had been trying to sort out.

At 7pm members from those organisations who were supposedly likely to be 'taking over' the running of our medical system was connected by computer to the meeting. No wonder the chairman had trouble telling us what was being proposed. I think the room full of people like me were utterly disgusted with what the 'invited guests' had to say and what they thought the outcome might look like. To start with it sounded horribly like they did not really know what they were proposing and how it would work. On top of that we find out something like what was put to us is in operation over parts of lower Eyre Peninsula and not working very satisfactory. That lower Eyre Peninsula area contains towns much smaller and closer together than Streaky and the other communities within our council area without worrying about Elliston, Wudinna, and our own ongoing tourist influx.

As a person who had been an both employer and an employee, there was no way I would ever agree to anything like the dodgy proposal which was actually going to be a nightmare with nobody likely to be held responsible or accountable. The term 'faceless bureaucrats' sprang to mind.

As soon as possible after the 'invited guests' disappeared off the computer I moved a motion that was worded. Medical Clinic Board approach The District Council of Streaky Bay to assist in engaging a consultant to investigate the business case of becoming a full time private practice. That motion was seconded and carried.

The medical Clinic Board also ask Council for assistance in the undertaking of a Community Survey.

That motion was also carried. - While I have no idea what that survey will look like or what information might accompany it there are two really important points you need to be aware of.

(1) Currently private practice GP's in Streaky and Ceduna are unable to directly admit a patient to a hospital.

(2) The bottom line being, do we want permanent Doctors serving our community (Private practice) or are you prepared to accept an endless run of locums who also are straddled with duties outside our community besides attempting to look after us.

I highly recommend everyone should get a copy of that 5th June briefing paper as it does a reasonable job of outlining the current situation and possible/probable (maybe?) situation assumed but not guaranteed by those who will become faceless and disappear if it does not work out. Before filling out any survey make sure you understand the implications of the answers you provide.

In closing I express my gratitude to the members of the Board (present and past for the work they have done.

### A TASTE OF STREAKY BAY - DELICIOUS CONT

### LYNDEY MILAN'S RECIPE FOR GIN BLOODY MARY OYSTER DRESSING

100 Freshly shucked oysters on the shell - Placed on bed of ice or bed of salt or small river stones for service.

### INGREDIENTS

400g (2punnets) ripe small grape tomatoes 40ml (2 tablespoons) local Streaky Bay Gin 20ml (1 tablespoon/4 teaspoons) Worcestershire sauce 2.25ml (1/2 teaspoon) Tabasco, or to taste Pinch caster sugar, or to taste Pinch each salt and ground white pepper, or to taste.

### CELERY SALT

4 teaspoons celery seed 1 teaspoon salt flakes 1 teaspoon crushed black peppercorns.

### TO SERVE

2 small bunches chives, very finely chopped.

## TO PREPARE IN ADVANCE GIN BLOODY MARY DRESSING

Wash the tomatoes & process until smooth in food processor.

Strain into a glass jug/airtight container, discarding seeds & skins.

Add the Gin, Worcestershire sauce, Tabasco.

Test taste mixture and add sugar, salt, and pepper to taste.

Mix well. Store in refrigerator.

### TO PREPARE IN ADVANCE CELERY SALT

Combine all ingredients for Celery Salt. Keep at room temp until needed.

### TO PREP/1 HOUR BEFORE SERVICE

Place the Bloody Mary mixture into the freezer, to become slightly icy/slush but not solid - about 1 hour.



### FAITH NOTES

We are familiar with the frequently used saying to come the full circle, which means that people or things, having set out on a journey or task, have returned to where they started. It happens when a team gets to the end of their football or netball season or a student successfully negotiates their academic year. They have successfully completed the cycle and are back at the beginning. This applies particularly to our thoughts about Jesus on the Feast of the Ascension, which the Christian Churches celebrated recently.

In one sense, the Ascension celebrates that Jesus has come full circle because, having come from the Father to accomplish a specific mission, He returns to the Father having achieved what He was sent to do. And He was sent to save us from spiritual death and alienation from God that is due to our sins.

But in another sense, the Ascension marks the passing on of the baton by Jesus to His apostles. At the beginning of his public ministry, He had preached that the kingdom of heaven was close and He had challenged people to repent of their sins and believe in the Good News, which involves putting the teachings of Christ into practice in their lives. Now the responsibility for that ministry was being passed on to the apostles and disciples. They were mandated to continue his saving work, drawing all nations to the truth of the Gospel.

Jesus' departure from the earth and His return to heaven did not mean that His apostles and disciples would remain alone in their mission.

Although He would no longer be physically present, He told them: And know that I am with you always; yes, to the end of time (Mt 28:20).

The message of the Ascension is clear. The saving work of Christ is now being handed over to the Church. The baton is being passed on to us. Yet so many today have not grasped the baton of faith gifted to them and passed it on with energy and joy to others. There is a deep sadness here because when a person chooses a life without faith they are denying themselves the deep friendship of a life lived with Jesus, the support and love of a faith community and a goal and ultimate meaning in their life.

Just as in a relay race, it is imperative that we do not drop the baton, so it is in the race of life and very especially in our spiritual lives. The responsibility for passing on the baton of faith rests with us. Let us carry the baton of faith with courage and conviction and let us pass it on to all those we meet.

### DOG OWENERSHIP IN STREAKY BAY

Owning a dog brings joy, companionship.....and responsibility. In Streaky Bay, as in many jurisdictions, dog owners are subject to various legal obligations to ensure the welfare of their pets and the safety of the community.

### 1. Dog Registration

The first and foremost legal requirement for dog owners in Streaky Bay is dog registration. According to the Dog and Cat Management Act 1995, all dogs over three months old (within 14 days of taking possession) must be registered with the local council which you can do on Dogs and Cats Online or contact the Council and we can assist. Existing dog (and cat) registrations are due by the end of August. Registration helps identify dogs, ensures they receive appropriate vaccinations and health checks, and assists in returning lost dogs to their owners. Failure to register a dog can result in fines or other penalties.

### 2. Controlling Dogs in Public Places

Dog owners have a responsibility to keep their dogs under control when in public places. Dogs must be on a leash when outside of designated off-leash areas. Check the signage in public areas such as parks and beaches. Dog owners must also clean up after their dogs and dispose of their waste appropriately. We are increasing our inspections at Back Beach where we have received some complaints.

### 3. Responsible Dog Ownership

Responsible dog ownership means meeting the needs of the animal and ensuring it does not pose a threat to public safety. Owners must provide proper food, water, shelter, and veterinary care for their dogs. Additionally, it is essential to prevent dogs from roaming or causing a nuisance to neighbours, such as excessive barking, and restrain your dog if you are transporting in the open tray of a ute.

### 4. Dog Attacks and Dangerous Dogs

South Australia has strict laws regarding dog attacks and the ownership of dangerous dogs. If a dog attacks or injures a person or another animal, the owner may be held liable for any resulting damages.

### 5. Microchipping and Desexing

Microchipping and desexing are vital aspects of responsible dog ownership. In South Australia, dogs must be microchipped by 12 weeks of age (unless exempt) or within 28 days of acquiring it. Microchipping helps identify dogs and enables quick reunification with their owners if they become lost or stray. All dogs born after 1 July 2018 must be desexed before 6 months or within 28 days of taking possession (unless exempted).

### 6. Restricted and Prohibited Breeds

Certain dog breeds are deemed "restricted" or "prohibited" under South Australian legislation. Owners of these breeds must adhere to specific regulations, such as keeping the dog securely confined and muzzled when in public.

Owning a dog in Streaky Bay comes with a range of legal responsibilities that promote the welfare of the animal and the safety of the community. By adhering to these obligations, dog owners can create a harmonious environment where their pets can thrive while respecting the rights and well-being of others. We seek your cooperation.

And just so you know.... you can marry a dog in India. It happened recently in a lavish ceremony because the dude was convinced that his health issues were the result of his killing two dogs when he was a child and the only way to atone for his sins was to marry a dog. 



## The Great White Project

Andromeda is developing The Great White Project (GWP), located 15 km southwest of Poochera. Approval of the PEPR for The GWP from South Australia's Department for Energy and Mining (DEM) has been received, that allows the processing of up to 300,000 tonnes per annum (tpa) of ore, producing up to a nominal 150,000 tpa of kaolin products from The GWP.

Construction of the mining operation to extract and refine bright white kaolin clay is expected to start following lodgement of the environmental bond and the Native Vegetation Fund offset. Both are required prior to construction commencing, which is anticipated to be before the end of 2023.

Andromeda seeks to provide local businesses and interested parties an update on The GWP's development, by hosting Business Drop-In sessions on:

Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup> June 11am – 2pm and 4pm – 6pm at Drift, Alfred Terrace, Streaky Bay.

This is an opportunity for local businesses to:

Andromeda is now in the process of preparing for the construction phase of The GWP later in the year, where a number of work packages will be offered for tender.

The Project will create up to 40 direct jobs along with supply and contracting opportunities. Future expansion plans are expected to see us grow to 70 direct jobs at full operating capacity and add a significant economic boost to the region over the 28-year Life of Mine operations.

### **CHANGES TO GREEN WASTE**

As part of Council's Environment Protection Authority (EPA) Licence No. 2108 for the Streaky Bay Transfer Station, it is a statutory requirement that the green waste drop off area needs to be securely fenced with restricted and supervised access during transfer station opening times only.

A contractor has been engaged and the chainmesh fence is now complete this adheres to Council's statutory requirements of its EPA Licence No. 2108 for the Streaky Bay Transfer Station.

Access to the green waste drop off area once the fence is constructed, will be via the main entrance gate and then via a new access gate into the green waste drop off section.

It is also a requirement that all waste loads are inspected, including green waste prior to drop off. Customers are to present to the attendant on arrival, the load will be inspected and the attendant will advise where to offload.

Please ensure that your green waste is free of contaminants such as plastics, steele and other materials as Council reserves the right to refuse the load until the green waste is clean.
