

GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

COUNCIL MEETING CHANGE OF TIMES JULY 2021

Council resolved at the June 2021 ordinary meeting of Council to amend the starting time of the JULY 13 2021 Meeting to Commence at 3.30PM

Streaky Bay and District Medical Board – Deputation and Meeting Attendance

Council received a deputation from the Auditor of the Streaky Bay and Districts Medical Clinic Inc. outlining the current operations of the Clinic. Following this deputation members of Council attended an ordinary meeting of the Clinic where Councillors were able to discuss clinic operation and recruitment updates.

Public Interest Disclosure Policy and Procedure

Council were presented with a reviewed Policy and Procedure, there were minimal changes to the documents and a copy of these documents are available on Councils website www.streakybay.sa.gov.au

Mirning Eastern Land and Sea Claim – Native Title

A second application for Native Title affecting land within the District Council of Streaky Bay. Council resolved at the June 2021 meeting to become a respondent to the claim. PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT

Land Management Agreement Waivers

Council considered Land Management Agreement waivers for Herbert Edwards Drive, Streaky Bay. The reports and resolution can be found in the Agenda and Minutes for the June 2021 ordinary meeting of Council.

Golf Course Native Title Update (Wirangu)

Council attended the Court Appointed Mediation Process regarding the Golf Course Appeal. The Appeal will now proceed and is scheduled for late August 2021. The Community will be updated following this process.

Code Amendment Update – Loveshack Route

Council is currently developing a Community Engagement Plan and Code Amendment Repot to support the proposed amendment for Loveshack Route. A report will be presented to the July 2021 Ordinary Meeting of Council where a community consultation period will commence following the endorsement of the proposed plan and report.

BUSINESS AND ADMINISTRATION SERVICES

Budget and Annual Business Plan 2021/2022

Council held their first workshop on the 21 June 2021 to begin the budget process. A presentation of the proposed document and budget will be provided to the Finance Risk and Audit Committee on 5 July 2021, a Special Meeting of Council will follow to endorse the document to go out for Public Consultation. It is envisaged that the budget will be adopted by Council at a Special Meeting to be held 30 July 2021.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Andromeda Metals Deputation

Council received a deputation from Joe Ranford of Andromeda Metals providing an update on the proposed mine and current consultation process.

Streaky Bay Youth Precinct Upgrade

Council were successful in gaining \$352,791 in grant funding through the State Government (Minister for Planning and Local Government) Open Spaces Program. The total development is \$700,000 and will be based on plans that have been consulted on over the past 12 months. Streaky Bay Area School Pool Agreement

Council considered a report to enter into a three (3) year agreement regarding the Public Opening of the Streaky Bay Area School Pool. Council resolved to undertake Community Engagement into the public interest in Council undertaking this initiative, a link to that consultation is provided within the Criterion.

Coast Protection Board Enquiry Committee Visit

Council attended an onsite visit and provided further information to the Board Enquiry Committee following the Council's submission into the enquiry. It was a valuable visit providing Council staff and Mayor the opportunity to visit sites and explain difficulties with project development.

Greg will be officially sworn into Council at the Special Meeting to held July 5, 2021, with Staff and Elected Members looking forward to working with Greg during his term at Council.

- Art, drama and creative expression projects to assist people to creatively express their experiences, which are otherwise limited due to the drought;
- Experiences for school children such as camps that connect young people and provide an opportunity to have fun with other young people off-farm.

Boosting Apprenticeships

The Boosting Apprenticeship Commencements wage subsidy supports businesses and Group Training Organisations to take on new apprentices and trainees, to build a pipeline of skilled workers to support sustained economic recovery.

Through the subsidy, any business or Group Training Organisation that engages an Australian Apprentice between 5 October 2020 and 31 March 2022 may be eligible for a subsidy of 50 per cent of wages paid to a new or recommencing apprentice or trainee for a 12-month period from the date of commencement, to a maximum of \$7,000 per quarter. Community Consultation

SCHOOL POOL PUBLIC USE - CONSULTATION

Background Information

The ongoing negotiations around the long term and future use of the Streaky Bay Area School (the School) for the public commenced in early 2019, when the School was advised by the Department of Education (the Department) that the school could no longer open the pool to the public after school and on weekends, due to insurance issues with the Department.

For the 2019/2020 swimming season a short-term Agreement was negotiated between the Department and the District Council of Streaky Bay to continue the school pool to be open to the public, with the School continuing to engage Pool staff. During this period, the Department and the District Council of Streaky Bay staff commenced negotiations to ascertain a longer term (3-year agreement). Reports were presented to the August 2020 and October 2020 Ordinary meeting of Council.

In early 2020 Council resolved to amend the Agreement budget and the resolved that an amount of \$12,500 (\$5,500 wages \$7,000 operations) contribution from Council to the School was included and endorsed by Council in the 2020/2021 Annual Business Plan.

A further report was presented to the August 2020 meeting of Council with a copy of the Final Agreement proposed, the intention of that report was to seek Council's endorsement of the proposed long term Agreement. Following that report Council resolved that they did not want to endorse the Agreement and that further advice was sought regarding the Council engagement of pool staff.

Following the above Council resolution concerns regarding the requirement of Council to be responsible for engaging the Pool staff as per the Agreement were raised. Council indicated it preferred for the School to continue to provide and engage pool staff with the school contracted by the Council do so, with further discussions with the school to continue.

A letter as per the Council resolution was forwarded to the School and the department deemed that they could not be considered a contractor to the Council to provide staff to open the Pool. Following this the School subsequently sought an emergency exemption to open the pool for the 2020/2021 public season swimming.

On the 24 May 2021, the Chief Executive Officer received correspondence from the Chief Executive, Department of Education, outlining that for the 2021/2022 Summer Season the Streaky Bay Area School Pool will not be open for public use without the Council taking on a joint use agreement including the direct employment of staff to operate the pool.

Community Consultation

In considering the correspondence received on the 24 May 2021 and a report to the June 2021 Ordinary Meeting of Council outlining the history and current situation with the opening of the Pool to the Public Council resolved to seek community input regarding the decision.

The estimated cost to Council to undertake the Public Opening of the pool is estimated between \$20,000 - \$25,000 (dependent on agreed opening hours and employment conditions), in considering this a 1% rate rise across the district is approx.. \$30,000, this contribution would be considered around a 0.8% rate rise.

GREAT WHITE KAOLIN PROJECT

Information Sheet: June 2021

ROADS

The Great White Kaolin Project (the Project) is a proposed small-scale mining operation to develop a world-class deposit of bright white kaolin clay, south-east of Poochera on the Eyre Peninsula, South Australia. Safety for the community and our employees is paramount; effective and efficient roads are part of this focus.

The Project will develop a shallow, open-cut mine with processing facilities on site. Proposed operations include removing ore from the ground, washing, and refining before drying and bagging kaolin product for transport and export. With a mine life of over 25 years, the Project will provide generational jobs and opportunities for the region.

Applications for a Mining Lease and two Miscellaneous Purposes Licences for an access road and water pipeline to support the Project were submitted in February 2021. Andromeda is currently preparing a formal response to public and government submissions on the Mining Lease Application.

POOCHERA - PORT KENNY ROAD


Andromeda has committed to upgrading Poochera - Port Kenny Road and associated intersections to accommodate haulage trucks from the Project. This commitment extends to ongoing maintenance of the road for the life of the mine. The redesign of the road will benefit all road users.

Tonkin Consulting has designed upgrades based on geotechnical investigations and engineering surveys. Proposed upgrades are predominantly within the existing road corridor, minimising impact on neighbouring land.

Intermediate design work for the upgrade of Poochera - Port Kenny Road was provided to the District Council of Streaky Bay in May 2021. Work will now progress to the next stage involving detailed design.

Examples of the proposed upgrades include:

- The intersection with Parla Peak Road (A)
 will be widened to allow vehicles travelling
 south to continue past a vehicle waiting to
 turn west into Parla Peak Road.
- A sharp rise will be removed at (B).
- Re-engineering the corner at (C) to be compliant with current standards.

STREAKY BAY ROAD INTERSECTION

The intersection of Poochera - Port Kenny Road with Streaky Bay Road will be upgraded to support the Project. Upgrade designs have been provided to both the Department of Infrastructure and Transport and the District Council of Streaky Bay for review and approval. The intersection will be widened to cater to all trucking configurations considered for use at the Project.

An assessment of sight distances for vehicles entering Streaky Bay Road from Poochera - Port Kenny Road, was completed and found that the roads exceed the relevant Performance Based Standards (PBS).

The existing lane and shoulder widths of Streaky Bay Road to Poochera are also acceptable, based on the PBS.

ROAD SAFETY AND THE CHANDADA SCHOOL BUS

Andromeda has committed to halting haulage trucks along Poochera - Port Kenny Road during the time of school bus runs.

As part of ongoing community engagement Andromeda met with Karcultaby Area School staff and Chandada school bus drivers in May 2021.

Throughout the school year, the school bus will occasionally run outside its normal schedule, such as on sports days and at the end of terms. Andromeda will work with the school community on changes to operational scheduling associated with irregular school bus trips.

ROAD SAFETY AND LOCAL ROADS

As a result of ongoing discussions with the local community, Andromeda will implement a policy directing all mine traffic to use Poochera - Port Kenny Road, in order to minimise the impact to other roads and road users in the area.

The National Wine Centre Executive Chef, Steven Clark, who is the reigning South Australian 'Chef of the Year', designed the five course menu:



Milk bottles are made from High Density Polyethylene HDPE plastics and are easily recycled into more plastic containers and items such as stormwater pipes, fencing materials - posts, stakes, droppers and bollards and also furniture such as picnic tables and benches.

The milk bottles will be baled at the Transfer Station and sent off to manufacturers for recycling into the above items.





Did you know...?

- Plastic is an incredibly versatile material, made to be strong and durable. Unfortunately, most plastics are made to be used once before being discarded.
- 660,000 tonnes of plastic waste is created by Australians every year.
- It takes Australian households 1 minute to throw out 1 tonne of plastic waste. In one day Australians produce enough plastic waste to fill an entire beach.
- It only takes 125 recycled plastic milk bottles to manufacture one 120 litre wheelie bin from recycled plastic.
- Recycling one tonne of plastics saves enough energy to run a refrigerator for a month.
 - The energy saved recycling one plastic bottle can power a computer for 25 minutes.
- China has banned plastic recycling imports. Councils around the country are grappling with how to deal with not being able to export
