INFRASTRUCTURE

Tractor Beach Hybrid Toilet System

Council received a report outlining the costs received for the supply and installation of the new Hybrid System and agreed to the funding of this that will replace the existing labour-intensive composting system.

Town Entrance Statements

The township Entrance Statements have been substantially completed. A false stone wall is to be installed along the front of the sign followed by backfilling and planting out to provide some low key landscaping. Additional costs are being sought for a "Thanks for Visiting" sign to be placed on the back of the statement located near little islands to improve the visual amenity from the back of the sign.

Unmade Roads Policy

Council considered a Policy on the development of unmade roads (for example roads that are road reserves but have never been formed), Council endorsed the Draft Policy subject to being reviewed to ensure that it meets the new Planning and Design Code and any legislative requirements.

SUSTAINABILITY

Tree Management

Council Officers have put together a three year tree removal program based on risk assessment undertaken as part of the Tree Management Assessment and will be going out to tender for the removal of the highest risk trees in the coming months.

PLANNING & REGULATORY

Land Management Agreement Waivers

Council received a request to waive Land Management Agreement restrictions for an allotment on Bockelberg Hill Drive in the Blancheport Heights subdivision, this request was not endorsed by Council.

A request for a Land Management Agreement waiver for Edgewater Close was received and the proposed clauses for waiver were approved.

Bushfire Hazard Overlay

Council received a report regarding changes that the State Government are wanting to apply in terms of grading of current Bushfire Hazard Risks across district. The proposal significantly increases the number of areas that will be in a high bushfire risk zone which will have several implications for those wishing to develop.

Council as well as the Eyre Peninsula will be providing a written response to these changes citing that many areas are not high-risk areas (e.g., Golf Course), cost implications, restrictions to those with the 100m zone of the impact areas, delays in approval processes, CFS resourcing impacts for reporting and the requirement for site-based assessments.

Road and Place Naming Policy Review

Council received a reviewed Road and Place Naming Policy, the Policy is an existing Policy that outlines legislative requirements and community consultation requirements. The Policy was endorsed without any major changes to the existing Policy.

Surfers Beach Access Road

Council endorsed the road access from Sceale Bay Road to the Surfers Beach carpark be named "Surfers Beach Road" the naming of this road was required as Council will be extending the road reserve to encompass the boardwalk and will then take ownership of the Boardwalk.

Shipping Container Policy

Council has endorsed a Policy regarding the amenity of shipping containers on allotments. This Policy is in addition to the requirements under the Planning and Development Code. A development application must generally always be submitted for having a shipping container on your allotment.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT/ TOURISM CONTINUED

Draft Caravan and Camping Strategy

Council reviewed and endorsed to go to Community Consultation the Draft Caravan and Camping Strategy. The Strategy will go out to community consultation in April/May 2024.

Visitor Centre Monthly Update

The month of February the Visitor Centre recorded 1405 visitors. The Visitor Centre continues to operate Monday — Friday 9-5pm with a high flow of traffic through the doors.

The room bookings for the month of February were high. It was utilised for 2 x NBN Information sessions, First Aid and CPR Training for staff, The Streakers poetry, Fairy Tern Awareness Workshop, and the Port Lincoln Training First Aid for community.

Regional Connectivity Planning

Council Officers have engaged in collaborative efforts with counterparts from the District Council of Ceduna, District Council of Elliston, and District Council of Wudinna to explore mutual interests and opportunities for shared procurement and service delivery.

This collaboration aims to ensure operational efficiencies and savings for ratepayers. The inaugural project under this collaborative endeavour is the formulation of a Western Eyre Peninsula Connectivity Plan in partnership with Telstra. This plan is a strategic framework designed to enhance digital connectivity within the region, addressing key issues such as broadband access, mobile coverage, and digital infrastructure.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Streaky Bay Area School Community Pool

The community school pool during the School term operates Monday – Friday 330-6pm and 2-5pm on Saturday and Sunday. Pool passes are available from the Visitor Information Centre. February had 904 users at the pool a significant increase on 623 throughout January.

Unfortunately, due to the availability of chlorine testing and planned maintenance on the school grounds in April there will be limited opening times.

CEO UPDATE

From the CEO's Desk: Exploring the Rationale Behind Council's Climate Change Initiatives

It's common knowledge that conversations regarding climate change often provoke scepticism and debate and some may question with scepticism why their local council is engaging in climate change policy matters. It is to these individuals that I write this column for.

Beyond the scientific discourse, the reasoning behind council's involvement in climate change policy is rather straightforward: it's a necessity.

Both federal and state governments have taken significant strides to combat climate change through legislative actions like the Federal Government Climate Change Act 2022 (Cth). This legislation emphasizes the importance of setting and reporting emission targets, underlining the pressing need for action across all government levels. Consequently, it's imperative for us to adhere to these regulations. At the state level, initiatives such as the South Australian Government's Climate Change Action Plan 2021-2025 set ambitious targets, aiming to slash greenhouse emissions by over 50% below 2005 levels by 2030. As members of the South Australian community, it's our responsibility to align with these objectives and actively pursue them. This is especially pertinent considering the South Australian Government's amendments to the Climate Change and Greenhouse Emissions Reduction Act 2007, which seek to update emission reduction and renewable electricity targets while reinforcing requirements related to government planning and action on climate change.

These regulatory shifts, along with changes in business practices, are already impacting council and the way we do business. We're witnessing alterations in accounting standards and insurance reporting, necessitating council to initiate and report on environmental measures such as emission levels.

In anticipation of these changes, our council is actively participating in programs like the LGA Net Zero Accelerate Program, which equips council officers with the necessary tools to measure Council emissions. Additionally, initiatives like Climate Ready Costs aim to enhance our understanding of coastal hazards and risks, bolstering Council's capacity and confidence in undertaking coastal adaptation planning. By taking proactive measures, our council aims to position itself to meet regulatory obligations and avoid potential financial penalties or increased insurance costs in the future.

CEO UPDATE CONTINUED...

While some may view these efforts as yet another financial burden on our community, it's essential to recognize the multifaceted benefits of climate change mitigation, spanning environmental, social, and economic realms. Government policies promoting localized renewable energy solutions could see a more reliable energy supply for our community in the future, while initiatives like tree planting can foster improved public health, enhance urban infrastructure, and elevate the aesthetic appeal of our region.

In essence, the council's commitment to implementing climate change policies isn't driven by ideology or political agendas; rather, it's a reflection of our council's adaptation to the realities of the modern world.

- Please ensure items are sorted appropriately.



- Engage with stakeholders and the community to develop a long-term vision for stormwater management in the region, and to identify existing risks and potential opportunities.
- Identify appropriate, fit for purpose upgrades and/or new management strategies, with associated costings and priorities so that they can be implemented when funds become available.

Council received a Draft Preliminary Findings (Review) Report that provides an overview of existing catchments and issues relating to current stormwater management and the opportunities to improve stormwater management to address both flood protection and the sustainable management of this resource and the environment.

Weed Control

Annual spraying of summer grasses - Buffel Grass, African Lovegrass (spp. Eragrostis Curvula, Eragrostis trichophora), and Fountain Grass, has been carried out on major roadsides on the Eastern and Western Eyre Peninsula. This includes the Eyre Highway from Port Augusta through to Penong, and the Lincoln Highway from Port Augusta through to Arno Bay. The bulk of this work was completed by a contractor in a combined effort with Landscape Officers totalling over 200 hours of spraying and survey work completed on major roadsides over summer.

These are three of our priority pest plants for the Eyre Peninsula region. Visit http://www.landscape.sa.gov.au/ep/plants-and-animals/pest-plants-and-animals/pest-plants more information including control options. As declared plants, land owners have a legal responsibility to manage these plants on their property; while the Landscape Board control them on State Government roadsides such as major highways.

Workshops

80 primary school students from Karcultaby and Miltaburra Area Schools have learnt about Malleefowl in the past few weeks when two of our Landscape Officers visited them for highly engaged workshops.

The students learnt about Malleefowl threats and habitat disturbance along with how integrating conservation with agriculture can increase the species' chance of survival. The workshops culminated with students creating a Malleefowl habitat collage.

Malleefowl are listed as vulnerable in Australia and on Eyre Peninsula their numbers are declining. The Landscape Board is involved with an annual monitoring program and encourages the community to submit sightings at www.landscape.sa.gov.au/ep/malleefowl

Grassroot Grants Program

More than \$110,000 is available for the Eyre Peninsula community to put towards local landscape management projects or events focusing on water, sustainable agriculture, pest plants and animals, biodiversity and community through the EP Landscape Board Grassroots Grants program.

These grants are about inspiring the community to become actively involved in the sustainable management of our local natural resources.
