Council News

GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Council Meetings September/October 2019 – Change of Times

Council have agreed to change the times of the 19 September 2019 Ordinary meeting of Council to commence at 9.30am and 17 October 2019 Council meeting to commence at 3.30pm.

Council Meetings September/October 2019 – Change of Times

Council have agreed to change the times of the 19 September 2019 Ordinary meeting of Council to commence at 9.30am and 17 October 2019 Council meeting to commence at 3.30pm.

SA Oyster Growers – Request to waive launching fees

Council considered a request from the SA Oyster Growers to waive the Moore's Boat Ramp Permit for the financial year 2019/2020 due to ongoing financial hardship. Council resolved at the meeting not to waive the fees as per the request.

Public Street Lighting – LED Lighting – SA Power Networks Proposal

A report was presented to the August 2019 meeting of Council where Council resolved to purchase the lighting through cash reserves. The Chief Executive Officer has ordered the purchase of the LED lights through Enveren. These will be delivered to SAPN. A contract to install the lights has been signed with SAPN. LED lights should start being replaced in the District Council of Streaky Bay area as of 23 September 2019. Once the date is confirmed links to SAPNs website will provide more details and information for the community.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Economic Development Strategy

Council is looking to develop an Economic Development Strategy. The intention is that the Strategy shall remain in draft form until further consultation has been undertaken with the District's Business Sector.

Inventory Land sales and Rebate – Blancheport Heights

Council received a report at the August 2019 ordinary meeting of Council regarding Council land sales, valuations and building rebate on the Council owned allotments at Blancheport Heights. Council discussed the current values in relation to market prices and the ongoing retention of the rebate offered for building within set time frames. Council resolved to retain the current allotment prices and the rebate to also remain in place.

Baird Bay Telecommunications Tower

Council have been successful in gaining blackspot funding for a telecommunications tower to be installed at Baird Bay. Discussions regarding the size and location of the tower prior to the confirmation of the successful bid, led to some confusion regarding the size of the tower to be installed. Advocacy at the State and Federal level by the Mayor and CEO has resulted in the Federal Minister for Grey, Mr Rowan Ramsay MP meeting with Telstra and the relevant communications Minister in an effort to assist with delivery of the correct telecommunications tower. A 20m tower will now be installed with a 2km radius. The permit has been placed out for public consultation today. This does not preclude Council from applying for a larger tower in the future.

TOURISM

Tourism Strategy

Initial Community and Stakeholder Workshops have been undertaken. Draft document received and delivered to May 30, 2019 Community and Economic Development Meeting. The Committee reviewed an amended version at the July 2019 Committee meeting and recommended to Council that it be presented for Public Consultation. A report to the August 2019 meeting was presented where Council resolved to present the document for public consultation.

Abalone Brand – Streaky Bay

An update on the proposal was presented to the 30 May 2019 Community and Economic Development Committee Meeting. The Committee recommended to include the branding option in the Draft Council Tourism Strategy (which has occurred) and ask for community input via the Tourism Strategy Development.

Campground Service Level Review

A report was presented to the July 2019 meeting of the Community and Economic Development Committee, providing details on the budget implications of campgrounds during the 2018/2019 financial year and the budgeted forecast for the 2019/2020 financial year. Staff will be undertaking an internal review of service levels to ensure operating efficiencies of these campgrounds. See Agenda of meeting for full details.

Streaky Bay Tourist Promotions Inc.

Council resolved in the 2019/2020 Annual Business Plan to continue to support this group by a dollar for dollar incentive on membership.

Local Business Group (Chamber of Commerce)

The MCED has been liaising with Streaky Bay Tourism and other Chambers of Commerce to investigate the potential of Streaky Bay Tourism moving to Streaky Bay Tourism and Business, both Port Lincoln and Ceduna have the two combined, as with other examples across the state.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Arts and Cultural Facilitator

Council received a report at the August 2019 meeting of Council to consider a proposal for the future of the Arts and Cultural Facilitator. Council resolved at that meeting to investigate further a three Council partnership with Wudinna, Elliston and Streaky Bay for a contract position utilising the budgeted \$25,000.

Childcare Feasibility Study

Council received a presentation on the Draft Child Care Study and agreed at the August 2019 ordinary meeting of Council to release the document out for public feedback.

Rural Property Addressing Signage

Council staff presented a report to Council outlining their concerns that the rural property addressing signage was fading or faded and individual property owners were reluctant to pay to have their signage replaced. One of the purposes of the system was to allow correct property identification by emergency services. Council resolved to request the EPLGA to lobby the state government to pay for replacement signage.

The EPLGA advised that they would not be pursuing it, as it was a Council responsibility under the Local Government Act.

Bay Road

Stage two of the Bay Road Project being the Anderson Road and Redding Road Realignments have been surveyed, Council has engaged Telstra to relocated the two pits once the Telstra pits have been relocated we will begin earthworks and kerbing for both realignments. This project is currently on hold waiting for Telstra contractors whom have pushed back start dates twice to date. This project is now at risk of being carried through (or re-budgeted) in the new financial year. Footpath replacement and realignment underway, kerb and water table completed.

Reseal Program – Pygery Port Kenny Road, Witera Road, Bay Road

A portion of Bay Road has been completed. Quote to be sought for remaining roads and sealing time negotiated with contractor.

Wells Street – PLEC – Undergrounding of Power

Target Completion Date – September 2019. Initial Hydro excavation completed. Work commenced Monday 19 August, progressing well.

UNSEALED ROADS

Tyringa Road – Proposed Road Realignment Following a report that was presented to Council at the July 2019 ordinary meeting of Council, Council resolved to lay the report on the table pending an onsite inspection. The onsite inspection was undertaken and a further report presented at the August 2019 meeting. Council resolved at that meeting to close certain portions of the road reserve and undertake a land swap in another portion. Please see Report 11.11 and Motion 292/19 of that meeting for full details.

Road Construction

Kingoonya-Yantanabie Road has commenced with 7km completed as at 03 September 2019.

Roads budgeted for the 2019/2020 Financial Year are; Anderson Road, Carawa Road, Dog Fence Road, Emerald Rise Road, Poochera Port Kenny Road, Wallalla Hill Road, Kingoonya – Yantanabie Road.

Road Maintenance - Patrol grading

During the 2018/2019 financial year 1576.5 kms of road was patrol graded.

To date in the 2019/2020 financial year 354 kms of road has been patrol graded.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Footpaths – Asset Revaluation

Council undertook an Asset Revaluation of the entire footpath network. That revaluation was received and noted at the August FRAC meeting and the August 2019 ordinary meeting of Council.

Moore's Boat Ramp Upgrade

Proposed designs are currently at engineering stage. This is a requirement of the grant funding. Materials shall be ordered following approval of the design. During a site visit for design assessment it was found that both pontoons require replacement as well as the pylons and other supporting structures, emergency works have been undertaken to make safe designs and quotations have commissioned for the replacement of both pontoons in their entirety.

PLANNING & REGULATING

Eyre Peninsula Joint Planning Board and Regional Assessment Panel

Council considered options regarding establishment of a joint planning board for the Eyre Peninsula under the new Planning, Development and Infrastructure. Council resolved to notify the EPLGA at their next meeting that Council will participate in the establishment of an Eyre Peninsula Joint Planning Board. In addition to this Council resolved to be party to the implementation of a Regional Assessment Panel with the costs to be shared across the participating Council's using an equitable cost sharing arrangement that reflects levels and complexity of development assessment demands. An initial meeting regards the RAP was undertaken in Streaky Bay on 26 August 2019. Further meetings will be required to establish the RAP and gain Ministerial Approval.

Little Islands Road – Road Closure and Opening

Cr Trezona at the July 2019 meeting of Council raised a question without notice regarding the Little Islands Road Closure. Staff provided a response to the August 2019 meeting of Council that the formal documents have been signed and returned to the surveyor general for lodgement.

Perlubie Land swap

Cr Trezona at the July 2019 meeting of Council raised a question without notice regarding the status of the Perlubie Land Swap. Staff provided a response at the August 2019 meeting that the deed is being negotiated and hopefully will be resolved by the end of August 2019.

HEALTH MANAGEMENT

Streaky Bay and District Medical Clinic - Contribution

Council received a report following a request from the Streaky Bay and District Medical Clinic for a further \$100,000. Council agreed at the August 2019 meeting to advance the Clinic \$100,000, which is to be treated as a loan with the same loan repayments as the previous loan.

In addition to the loan, Council resolved to move a motion without notice to forward correspondence to the Hon. Stephen Wade (MLC), Minister for Health, Mr Rowan Ramsey (Member for Grey), Mr Peter Treloar (Member for Flinders) and Eyre and Far North Local Health Network Governing Board, as a call for action to develop a 12 month plan for strategies to source doctors for Streaky Bay and other affected communities who do not have or will not have doctors in their communities.

PUBLIC CONSULTATION

STREAKY CHILD CARE STUDY 2019

SMALL BUSINESS INFORMATION

THINKING ABOUT A HOME BASED BUSINESS???

Whilst Council strongly encourages small business growth, entrepreneurs and new industry development, many of which start at home, we need to ensure that the appropriate regulations are met and the activities do not impact on your neighbours or outgrow its initial concept.

The following information sheet should assist.

Information Sheet No. 7 Development Act 1993

Can someone run a business from home?

Yes. It is possible for a person to run a small-scale business from a residential premises in some circumstances and only under strict conditions. This is known as a 'Home Activity' and is specifically defined in the Development Regulations, 1993.

See <u>www.streakybay.sa.gov.au</u> – council services – development – Home-Business Activity - Information Sheet 7 for more information.

What is defined as a 'home activity'?

A 'Home Activity' is defined in the Regulations as follows.

A use of a site by a person resident on the site –

- a) That does not detrimentally affect the amenity or any part of the locality; and
- b) That does not require or involve
 - 1. Assistance by more than one person who is not a resident in the dwelling; or
 - Use (whether temporarily or permanently) of a floor area exceeding 30 square metres; or
 - 3. Any source of power other than an electric motor of not more than 0.4 kilowatts; or
 - 4. The imposition on the services provided by any public utility organization of any demand or load greater than which is ordinarily imposed by other users of the services in the locality; or
 - 5. The display of goods in a window or about the dwelling or its curtilage; or
 - 6. The use of a vehicle exceeding one tonne tare in weight

Is an application necessary?

Provided the business activity can be conducted at all times strictly within the criteria above, then no formal approval from the Council is necessary, since a home activity does not constitute development within the meaning of the Act.

However, your attention is drawn to the requirements that any such activity is to be conducted to that it does not 'detrimentally affect' the amenity of the locality. As can be appreciated, this can be rather subjective test and one which has potential to create friction if the impact of the activity, is at all felt beyond the boundaries of the site.

What happens if you can't comply?

If any of the criteria are breached, or if the level of impact is such that it is clearly affecting the amenity. Then you are operating *outside* of the definition of 'home activity' and the business becomes a land use or a development in its own right and not something that is ancillary to the residential use of the land. This can arise from the success of the business, what started out as a 'home activity' or even a hobby, may well reach a stage where it out-grows the residential premises.

In this event, formal Development Application would have to be made to the Council for assessment under the provisions of the Development Act (provided that it is not classes as being non-complying form of development in the area in which it is located).

Additional advice!

Is it strongly recommended that you first check with Council before setting up a business so that the home activity guidelines can be discussed and their ramifications explained to you, especially the importance of not exceeding any of the criteria.

Also, if the business involves the handling of food or personal services such as hairdressing, there may be health requirements under other legislation which need to be met.



Keep South Australia's air healthy and community safe by burning responsibly

Why burning in the open is regulated

Burning in the open is a common practice to reduce the risk of bushfires, manage agricultural land and to dispose of agricultural and forestry wastes. Open fires are also used to cook food, prepare beverages, and as part of recreational activities (ie campfires).

While activities such as burn offs for bushfire reduction are absolutely necessary, smoke from these activities can impact on human health and the environment, and can also cause nuisance. Wood smoke from burning in the open also contributes to poor air quality in South Australia.






I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.
