Council News

FROM THE CEO'S DESK

This year's annual business plan and budget is now out for public consultation. In respect to budgets, it has been a difficult year balancing significant rising business costs and ensuring rate bills remain low.

An unprecedent increase in valuations (22% across the board) has caused significant pressure on rate bills across the District of Streaky Bay. For at least the past decade, valuations in the District of Streaky Bay haven't been in double figures, meaning that if Council was to leave its rate in the dollar at the same level as last year, some proprieties in the district rating bills would be more than 30% from the previous year.

Understanding that valuations are independently assessed by the Valuer General with Council having no influence on how these valuations are assessed. Council has reduced its rate in the dollar by 10% from the previous year. This is to assist those households who have received increased valuation assessments. Taking into account the increased valuation of properties and decreased rate in the dollar. A 5.7% rating increase for the 2022/23 financial year is being forecast.

The costs of doing business are also significantly higher, the consumer price index (CPI) for the March quarter was 5.1%, however if the United States is an indication (8.6%). By the end of the financial year, CPI will have been near 6%. Additionally, construction costs are up by 30%, Insurance up by 5% - 10%, Electricity up by 15% - 30%, Fuel up by 10% to 22.61%, all impacting what Council could achieve last year compared to this year in terms of dollar value.

Council has been well aware of not placing too much burden on its rate payers. Including this year, over the past five years increases in rates in percentage terms have failed to keep up with CPI rate increases. Meaning Council has constantly reviewed its service delivery to make up for this shortfall with productivity gains and increases in business efficiencies.

This isn't stopping Council from delivering projects for the betterment of the community. With Council Officers working hard to gain grant funding to deliver some significant projects for the community. Some of the highlights, in terms of the projects being delivered by Council over the 2022/23 financial year, includes:

- The Well Street Upgrade (Western transit loop)
- Delivery of the Streaky Bay Youth Precinct
- Provision of funding for the Wirrulla Sports Precinct Playground
- Delivery of Streaky Bay Town Entry Statements
- The Bay Road Entrance Revitalisation
- Improvements to the Murphy's Haystacks tourism site
- Facilitation of the Rural Women's Gathering event
- Delivery of the Township Master Plans (including Township Master Plans for our smaller townships)

With a growing population and visitor base and a low-rate payer base. Council has to work smarter in the way it delivers it services. However, considering Local Government is responsible for less than 4% of tax collected nationally, yet delivers 24% of all services across the three tiers of Government, we already have a pretty good track record in achieving this.

ENROL

If you are on the State electoral roll you will automatically receive a voting pack in the case of a supplementary election in your area.

NOMINATE FOR COUNCIL

Becoming a councillor presents the opportunity to influence local directions and create long term, positive outcomes within your community and for fellow residents.

The role of councillor is both rewarding and challenging. It requires commitment, responsibility and accountability.

With very few exceptions (such as being an undischarged bankrupt or being disqualified from holding office by a court order), you can nominate for a position on council regardless of qualifications, religion, race, gender, experience or profession.

If you consider yourself to be invested in the future of your community, are willing to learn and participate, and prepared to contribute strategically to decision making processes that benefit your broader community, then you should explore what it takes to be a councillor.

VOTE

All voting in council elections is done by post. Enrolled voters receive a voting package through the mail and return their completed ballot paper in the reply paid envelope provided.

Voting packs are distributed in the mail at least 2 weeks prior to the close of voting. In addition to ballot papers, each pack includes information about the candidates standing for election.

Votes must be received by the Returning Officer no later than the day and time noted on the ballot materials.

Staffing News

Council welcomes Cydney Alfred to the Part Time Customer Information Officer position at the Streaky Bay Visitor Centre.

The recruitment process for the Manager, Infrastructure and Civil Works is continuing. Lachlan Smith is currently undertaking the role of acting manager.

Eyre Peninsula Local Government Association – Draft Strategic and Business Plans

The EPLGA is the overarching body with representative Mayor's from each of the Council's that make up the Eyre Peninsula LGA.

The Draft Strategic and Business Plans considered by Council are documents that will set the direction of advocacy and strategy for the EPLGA over the next 12 months.

Robinson Basin – Care and Control

The Council has recently taken on the lease of the Robinson Basin allotment located on Flinders Highway, following this process the Council has been approached by the Department of Environment of Water to sub-let the land to the Department to take over the care and control. Council discussed the proposal and endorsed Council officers to continue discussions with the department and a further report be presented to Council later.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Streaky Bay Jetty Platform

The official opening of the Jetty Platform was held on Friday 17, June 2022. The platform was officially opened by local member for Flinders, Sam Telfer, and Mayor Travis Barber (see front cover for pictures). In attendance was Chief Executive Officer, Damian Carter, and construction contractor Tony Braz from Thirsty Construction.

The infrastructure team is currently looking to install additional seating to the platform area and an upgrade to the steps leading down to the beach adjacent to the Jetty Platform.

Streaky Bay Jetty Pool Platform and Shelter

Development Approval has now been received for the construction of the Jetty Pool Platform and Shelter, and contractor engaged, it is estimated that Construction will be completed before the summer period.

Western Transit Loop

The Wells Street, AB Smith Road, Alec Baldock Drive, Wallschutzky Road loop project is underway. A project management consultant has been engaged to undertake the project and final 2d drawings will be presented to the July meeting of Council for endorsement.

Waste Management

Council was successful in gaining a grant through Green Industries SA. This grant has enabled the purchase of a new Glass Crusher that will increase site efficiencies and new concrete bunkers have been installed at the Streaky Bay transfer station.

TOURISM AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Streaky Bay Township Management Plan and District Management Plan Review

Tenders were sought and received to undertake a review of the Streaky Bay Township Masterplan and District Management Plan, with the DMP consisting of

Blancheport Estate Land Inventory

Council at its June meeting of Council undertook an inventory of and reviewed its allotments for sale within its Blancheport subdivisions. There is a cashback component applied to some of the allotments within the estate applying to purchasers who buy allotments and build within a certain time period, this offer was also reviewed as part of this report. Council resolved at that meeting to review the value of the blocks and provide feedback on the valuation review and to remove the cashback offer on applicable allotments.

Blancheport Estate Agents – Blancheport Land

Council in addition to the land inventory considered a report regarding real estate agents for the sale of the Blancheport Land. Council currently only had one (1) real estate agent with Ray White Real Estate to sell the land. Council resolved to resign the agreement with Ray White Real Estate and seek further interest from Numerical Real Estate and Elders Real Estate in also undertaking Sales of this land

New Year's Eve Children's Festival

Council Officers presented a report to the June meeting of Council for the consideration of the future of the New Year's Eve Children's Festival. The event is held as a pre cursor to the Annual New Years Eve Fireworks display. The report outlined that the New Year's Eve Fireworks are the main attraction on the night with the majority of visitors and residents attending the foreshore for the Fireworks Event. The report proposed that potenially the funding provided for the Children's Festival event could be utilised for creating an alternative event at a different time of the year and that event would be the primary event and therefore be better value for money for Council with a number of options put forward. Council resolved to consider community feedback in its decision making, with a survey to be developed and distributed.

UNITING CHURCH

The Uniting Church in Streaky Bay has served the community for 110 years. Unfortunately, there has been no permanent minister for the last 30 plus years. The Church being kept going with visiting periodically, and by lay people. The congregations have fluctuated over the years, but somehow with volunteers taking charge of the many tasks associated with keeping the church open, it has been able to survive.

There have been many changes within the Church over the years. One major change being in the seventies, when the Methodist, Congregational and Presbyterian Churches combined to become the United Church. The Church celebrated its centenary in 2011, with many past members returning to enjoy the day and catch up with friends.

The Church hosted several performances by Steve Grace and Dan Vogler, and the first performance of the Watoto Children's Choir. We have hosted the World Day of Prayer and been involved in the organisation of and taken part in Carols by Candlelight, an ecumenical celebration of the meaning of Christmas, for the community. We have seen many celebrations over the years including weddings, funerals, and baptisms. We also had many tourists who came to fellowship with us. We have been able to support many charities and organisations with donations and prayer.

The Church has undergone other changes when Mission Networks took the place of parishes and presbyteries for around 20 years, then recently when Synod (the head of the churches), changed the organization to 3 non-geographic presbyteries, Streaky Bay being part of the Generate Presbytery.

In the past few years our numbers have declined, and Synod has decided to up grade their properties to a certain standard, meaning we are required to organize and fund the work.
