FROM THE CEO'S DESK

: Preparing for bushfire season

As part of Council's role, we meet with various service providers to discuss preparedness for the various emergencies which can face our region (the Zone Emergency Management Committee). Recently we have spoken about the influx of new residents to the region and how they may have come from areas where bushfires aren't a strong threat and don't understand the need to prepare for fire season. To assist in understanding this, I've supplied below some valuable information from the SA Country Fire Service:

1. Prepare now: clear around your property, pack an emergency kit and know your closest Bushfire Safer Place.

Did you know that nearly half of South Australians living in bushfire prone areas don't know the meaning of their local Bushfire Safer Place or where to find it?

This bushfire season, make sure you know the difference between your Bushfire Last Resort Refuge and Bushfire Safer Place. If you live in or near one, make sure you include this in your bushfire plan and know how to use it.

Emergencies do happen, anytime, anywhere. Make sure you pack an emergency kit with essential items and keep it in a handy place.

The simple things can save your life. Clear around your property to reduce, remove and manage vegetation within 20 metres of your home and within 5 metres of any sheds and garages. Remove any other flammable materials close to your home and sheds.

2. Plan ahead: do your 5-minute bushfire plan and share it with loved ones today, and plan for all your pets and livestock.

Making a choice when a bushfire threatens is too late. Your safety and survival during a bushfire will depend on how prepared you are and the decisions you make, and a written bushfire plan will take the pressure off you and avoid arguments and delays.

The care and transport of pets and livestock before, during and after a fire is something that should be considered with bushfire safety. You can avoid heartache if you include pets and livestock when you develop your bushfire survival plan.

You could be at risk travelling in South Australia during bushfire season. Recognise the warning signs and learn what to do to keep yourself safe.

House fires also happen every day. The biggest tragedy is most house fires are preventable so make sure you have a Home Fire Escape Plan.

3. Stay informed: check the fire danger rating each day and stay informed using more than one source of information in case a fire starts near you.

Fires can threaten suddenly and without warning. You need to be prepared to enact your Bushfire Survival Plan without receiving any emergency warning.

To prepare, you should:

- Know the daily Fire Danger Rating for your area
- Understand the different Bushfire Warning levels
- Watch for signs of fire, especially smoke and flames
- Act decisively the moment you know there is danger
- Put your Bushfire Survival Plan into action (avoid a "wait and see" response)
- Stay informed using more than one source of information

Do not rely on a single source for emergency warning information.

Check the Fire Danger Rating each day

The Fire Danger Rating is an indicator of how dangerous a bushfire could be if it did occur. It is not a predictor of how likely a bushfire is to occur; it should be used as an early indicator to trigger your plans. The Bureau of Meteorology forecasts the rating each day. The higher the Fire Danger Rating, the more dangerous the fire conditions.

You need to understand the Fire Danger Rating to help you assess your level of bushfire risk and to decide what actions to take. The Fire Danger Rating will help you understand the predicted bushfire behaviour, potential impacts and recommended actions you should take for each category level. We recommend you take the time to review and understand the ratings.

Understand Bushfire Warning levels

Warnings are issued when a fire has started and you need to take action, however you should never wait to receive an official warnings before you leave. Make sure you understand the different levels of warnings but don't expect warnings to be issued in any particular order - the first warning you could get could be an Emergency Warning.

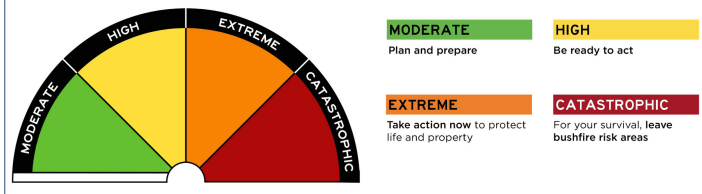
We recommend you keep a battery powered or wind-up torch and radio ready in case the power fails during an emergency or your mobile service goes down. Test the batteries regularly.

Australian Fire Danger Rating System

The Australian Fire Danger Ratings levels are:



The AFDRS will also introduce a new Fire Behaviour Index - a scale of fire danger that takes the latest in fire science and produces outputs across eight different fire behaviour models (compared to the existing two fire behaviour models). Providing fine detail, it will support decisions about fire preparedness and bushfire suppression.

The Australian Fire Danger Rating System (AFDRS) Program is redesigning the forecasting of fire by:

- Improving the scientific accuracy behind fire danger predictions.
- Improving the way that fire danger is communicated.
- Providing government and industry with better decision-making tools.
- Reducing the costs associated with bushfire impacts.

This is a national program funded by the Commonwealth and all the States and Territories and delivered by local implementation teams. The AFDRS is being coordinated by NSW RFS and AFAC (Australian Fire and Emergency Services Authorities Council), with support from the Bureau of Meteorology. A National Program Board, with representation from each of the State and Territories' fire agencies, is overseeing the program.

Perlubie Beach Management Survey

The District Council of Streaky Bay is seeking the community, visitors, and beach users' feedback on proposed management strategies for Perlubie Beach.

Perlubie Beach in the past few years during and post the Covid Pandemic has seen unprecedented numbers of campers and beach users placing an enormous amount of pressure on the beach and sensitive dune environment.

A considerable level of concern was raised by the community, and some campers regarding the ability for the environment to sustain the level of camping that is currently being experienced at the site, following these concerns Council sought to have care and control of the site and were issued with a licence from Crown Land early in 2022. This licence will enable Council to implement management strategies for the site.

The survey will form the first part of the community consultation process, Council CEO, Damian Carter has said "there has been lots of social media and SA Tourism promotion of Perlubie Beach, this has quickly escalated its popularity to levels we were not expecting. Council had always intended on pursuing management of the beach in future strategies; however, we have now had to prioritise this site to ensure we can maintain it for future generations to enjoy".

Community School Pool

Rules

Persons are not permitted to enter the pool without payment of fees. Pool supervisor reserves the right to check for Annual Pool passes.

Persons must not enter the pool grounds without appropriate personnel on site. Swimmers must shower before entering the [SB1] [SB2] [PW3] pool.

Appropriate swimwear must be worn at all times (see details below)

Do not use pool if you are feeling unwell or showing symptoms of cold or flu, or directed [IM4] to be isolating in accordance with SA Health Regulations

Do not use pools if you have suffered from diarrhoea in the past week.

Do not use pool if you have any open wounds

Members and guests, not toilet trained must wear swim nappies.

In the instant that faeces enters the pool the Pool Supervisor **MUST** be notified immediately and the pool must be closed immediately

The pool is a multi-use pool.

Nappies are not to be changed at poolside. Please make use of the toilets or lawn areas.

Safety Equipment must not tampered with

Pool Users are not permitted to enter the Plant Room

Pool Users are not permitted to use school equipment relating to the pool

Do NOT RUN

Do NOT PUSH or THROW People In

The use of flippers is not permitted within the Pool

Diving and Jumping are only permitted in the deep end of the pool

NO glass, food or drinks (other than water) are allowed in the pool area.

NO Smoking or alcohol is allowed within the pool grounds [SB5]

Soft Water toys may be used at the discretion of the lifeguard.

Body boards and surfboards are not permitted.

Sitting or hanging on lap lanes is prohibited.

Avoid eating or consuming alcoholic beverages before using the pool.

Animals are prohibited.

Behaviour deemed not conducive to public safety will not be permitted.

Boisterous or dangerous behaviour will not be tolerated.

The pool must be vacated during electrical storms.

The lifeguards have full authority to enforce rules in pool facilities

All rubbish and waste must be removed from the Pool area and users are responsible for the disposal of their own waste

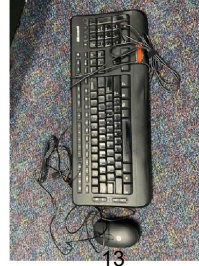

GAZANIA MANAGEMENT

The Eyre Peninsula Landscape Board in conjunction with the District Council of Streaky Bay (DCSB) are implementing measures for the management and control of the pest plant gazania.

Background

Gazania is a weed that is often mistaken for an ornamental plant because of its white, yellow, orange, purple and red daisy flowers. This weed thrives in our climate and is widespread in many coastal towns. The colourful flowers are deceptive though as this weed is particularly destructive for our coastal dunes and alongside roadside vegetation where it forms mat-like colonies that can exclude all other plants, leading to a decline in biodiversity.

Once established, it can be very hard to control, as landholders with infestations on farming land have recently found out.

Gazania is a declared plant under the Landscape South Australia Act 2019. Sale or transport is prohibited throughout South Australia.

Management and Control

Plan

Eyre Peninsula Landscape Board and DCSB staff are commencing a spraying program to target outliers and small infestations of Gazanias first, before working towards more heavily infested areas.

Physical control

For effective control, the entire plant - including its root system - should be dug out. Minimal disturbance techniques should be employed. It is recommended that you first remove and bag the flower heads to prevent seed dispersal and place them in your rubbish bin for deep burial. In situations where the plant cannot be removed, flower heads should be taken off before setting seed. This will prevent the further spread of seed. A minimal level of control is to mow or brush cut the flowers before they develop and set seed.

Herbicide control

The Weed Control Handbook for Declared Plants in South Australia offers advice on suitable herbicides and rates. A copy of the handbook is available at www.pir.sa.gov.au.

Landholders should always read the label of any herbicide to ensure it is suitable for its intended purpose and can be used safely. Care should be taken to avoid herbicide contact with native plants and any spraying of herbicide in native vegetation should be left to qualified bushcare operators.

Timing of control

Control is most effective when the plant is actively growing between June to November. This can be defined as having new lush foliage and flowering. Don't spray when the plant is visibly under stress such as wilted.

How you can you help?

Landholders and residents are encouraged to remove gazania plants from their properties with the aim of containing the spread in the local area and on the Eyre Peninsula.
