## GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

### Strategic Management Plan Review

The process of redeveloping the Strategic Management Plan and subsequent implementation of the Corporate Plan is continuing with the following milestones currently planned:

- A workshop for Elected Members was held on 1 September 2020;
- Presentation of the Draft Strategic Management and Corporate Plans to the Elected Body to be undertaken at the 17 September 2020 Ordinary Council meeting
- If endorsed at the above meeting with documents will go out for Public Consultation from 21 September to 21 October 2020
- A second workshop will then be held with the Elected Members in November 2020 to consider all public feedback received
- Presentation of the Strategic Plan and Corporate Plan for Adoption will be made at the 19 November 2020 Ordinary Council Meeting

### Wirrulla Triangle Use

Action is currently on hold due to other Native Title hearings in the area. Further follow up will occur in the near future regarding progress of this matter.

### Local Government Reform Bill

120 changes to the Draft Bill have been suggested. The LGA and Local Councils are assessing those changes and further submissions are expected soon.

### GMO – Moratorium Lift

Councillor Karp moved a motion without notice to request more time and more consultation regarding Council's decision to support the lifting of the Moratorium. The motion lapsed due to a lack of a seconder.

## BUSINESS AND ADMINISTRATION SERVICES

### Rates Notices by email

Notices have been included in the 1st Quarter rate notice, offering the ratepayer the option to receive their rate notice by email, and so far there has been a good response to this initiative.

### Office Staff Replacement

The Council Office is currently advertising for two positions – Customer Service and a Finance Officer, this has been a result of the resignation of Chelsea Matthews and Aud Starkey.

Aud will be leaving us at the end of October, and we will certainly miss her, as her personality has really assisted in developing a “cohesive” workplace.

### Work Health and Safety

Face to Face LGA Workers Compensation Scheme (LGAWCS) evaluations are not taking place in 2020, due to Covid 19. All Councils that have closed out 33% of their planned actions will receive 100% rebate for 2020. Congratulations to Tracy McEvoy and associated staff who have closed out 67% of our planned actions.

A Work Health Safety and Return to Work Plan has been developed for 2020/2021, and the following Key Programs and Key Projects have been identified.

### Strategic Risk Workshops

Local Government Risk Services have been running monthly Risk Workshops, encompassing all of Council's core responsibilities. The purpose of these Workshops is to identify Council's Strategic Risks, and to assess them to ensure that the risks are reduced. A total of 9 have been completed.

### INFRASTRUCTURE

#### Moore's Boat Ramp Upgrade – Construction

Final notification has been received that our funding application was successful. Works have begun and final design discussions have been held between MICW, Thirsty Constructions and WGA Engineers.

#### Jetty Platform Upgrade and Future

Council received a report to the May ordinary meeting of Council outlining proposed upgrade information and short-term closure of the Jetty Platform located in Streaky Bay. That report also included options for Council to consider pursuing ownership of the facility. Council resolved at the meeting lay the report on the table until further asset costing considerations are available, those considerations have yet to be reported back to Council.

CEO and Manager, Infrastructure and Civil Works met with Mr Dimas from DPTI on 16 September 2020. DPTI will be placing the work out to tender in the near future, thought Council have offered to assist with the process. Mr Dimas is to work with Council to complete the project.

#### Road Maintenance

##### Patrol grading

Graders will be working their way around the district (moisture/weather permitting). During this patrol grading season (commencing in April) staff have patrol graded approximately 1150 kilometres. With graders currently out on Kingoonya Yantanabie Road and Emerald Rise Road.

#### Rubble Raising

\$418,000 has been approved by Council for blasting and crushing of rubble for future road construction.

### PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT

#### Planning Reform

Phase 3 has been extended to "after Christmas". Phase 2 Councils (us) are live. There are many issues with the new system and it is quite frustrating.

EPRAP approved after many issues, Assessment Manager also appointed (Jess Burns). First RAP meeting held 10 August to adopt Terms of Reference etc.

Looking to engage planning consultant with a group of EP Councils for better pricing. RFQ was sent out to LGA approved Consultants on 1 October 2020

#### Finlayson Road Intersection with Highway

Lack of survey data delaying Bob Andrew. Roberts Rd design also has issues crossing into farmer's property. Working on realignment of that intersection. Further discussion with Tonkin and Department of Infrastructure.

#### Tyringa Road Realignment/Land Swap

A report was presented to Council at the September meeting where Council endorsed to certify that the Road Process order and associated plans as being true and correct and allowing the Mayor and CEO to execute the Road Process Order under the Council seal. Council's surveyor will now finalise the requirements of the Land Titles Office to allow the land swap to be gazetted.

#### Andromeda Mine Site – Unmade Road Reserve

The CEO has provided a letter of support to allow Andromeda to continue to undertake exploration of the site (in this case the Road Reserve). Once the Great White Kaolin Project are ready to "peg the claim" Council will issue a section 222 Permit to allow the operation of a business on a Road Reserve. Once the mine is operational, Council will work on undertaking closing of the road reserve and reopening the reserve across the haul out road.

### COMMUNITY & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT



#### Streaky Bay Youth Precinct

Meeting was held on site with 3 members of the Streaky Bay Area School Senior School, 3 local community members, MICW, MCED, CEDO and landscape architect to discuss priorities.

Following this it was identified that a site survey should be undertaken, and this has now been completed. This data will be reviewed and forwarded to the landscape architect.

The landscape architect has been discussing with local Skate Park construction experts on options of the potential insertion of a half pipe and street section. All the components will be costed, and draft concept amended accordingly.

#### Streaky Bay Area School Pool

Draft three (3) year lease agreement has been received, required funding has been allocated within the Draft Budget, the Agreement was presented at the August 2020 meeting of Council, Council laid the report on the table pending further investigations regarding the employment of the pool staff and seeking further legal advice (this advice was with Council's Risk Services not the Department). At the September Leadership meeting the CEO and other Senior staff members raised concerns regarding Council engaging the staff and they felt that the School should engage the staff, and Council engage the School as a contractor to do so. Following this information, the Department was contacted, discussions around this were had and the department were to follow up with the School Principal and their team to amend the contract.

The Department advised that they have the revised contract back prior to the start of the holiday period, at the time of writing this report the Agreement has not been received.

Cr Wheaton at the September ordinary meeting of Council moved a motion to remove the funding for the School Pool for this financial year. The Motion lapsed due to a lack of a seconder to the motion.

#### Tractor Beach Campground Development

Crown land consent has been approved. Survey has been undertaken and will be forwarded to landscape architect to produce concept drawings. Once concept drawings completed, Development Application can be submitted.

## Drought-affected farmers get \$3.45 million water boost

**Drought-affected South Australian farmers will get more support to install on-farm water infrastructure with a rebate scheme getting a \$3.45 million boost from the Marshall Liberal Government.**

The funding boost is from the Marshall Liberal Government's \$21 million Drought Support Program which has already provided immediate support through a council rate rebate and pastoral lease rent relief, expanded the Rural Financial Counselling Service and increased the Family and Business mentor program.

Minister for Primary Industries and Regional Development David Basham said the increased funding would provide further support to South Australian drought-affected farmers. "Our farmers are the backbone of the state's economy and agriculture will be a critical part of our recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic," said Minister Basham.

"Many parts of South Australia are still suffering through drought and we are proud to continue to support those farmers doing it tough. "The On-Farm Emergency Water Infrastructure rebate scheme has been very popular with nearly 450 primary producers across South Australia receiving support so far and we have expanded the program following feedback from a series of recent drought forums. "This \$3.45 million funding boost will allow more drought-affected farmers to access help and install vital on-farm water infrastructure such as water storages, pumps, pipes, distilling dams, and associated power supplies such as generators.

"Our \$21 million Drought Support Program builds on the support measures already in place and we will continue to work with industry and all levels of government to make sure assistance is targeted and effective." Funding for the On-Farm Emergency Water Infrastructure Rebate was exhausted earlier this year, with the scheme closed to new applications from 17 June 2020. The program was jointly funded by the State and Federal governments and has already been provided to 442 primary producers under the scheme since July 2018.

An extra \$2 million will allow existing applications to be processed and \$1.45 million will allow potential applicants who have already undertaken work and incurred costs, but not yet applied. Those applicants will be entitled to 30 per cent funding (up to \$30,000 per application), while the State Government has requested the Commonwealth consider additional funding for the program.

If the Commonwealth fulfils this request it is expected the total support for each applicant would return to \$50,000 in line with the original rebate.

A regional and remote customers sub-group was established to look at opportunities for worst served customers in the State in terms of reliability and electricity supply. One of the objectives of the group is to become better informed about the technical and economic aspects of Single Wire Earth Return (SWER) lines, the role they play in the network and the particular issues SWER customers on SWER lines face.

To understand the particular issues or challenges SWER customers face, the sub-group propose to run a number of focus groups with SWER customers in late 2020 or early 2021. ### Visitor rush in Streaky Bay

Discovery – Parks Streaky Bay is reporting an extra 1,000 room nights sold since the height of COVID, showing that the town's tourism recovery is well underway.

Like many businesses in Streaky Bay, Discovery Parks was forced to wind back staffing levels over the COVID period and has faced the recent challenge of hiring staff again. However, Chief Executive of Discovery Parks Grant Wilkens, says that the park will soon be at full staff levels again.

"Across Australia, we're finding hiring staff quite challenging at the moment. Jobkeeper has meant that people who would usually have a couple of casual jobs, now only require one job and we are also without our usual backpacker workforce."

"However we're pleased to have found some fantastic new staff and by mid-October staffing will be back to pre-COVID levels. Meanwhile, we've never been busier and with \$1 from every accommodation booking resulting in \$2 of economic benefit to the Streaky Bay community, we hope the whole town feels the benefit of our recovery," said Grant.

Finding people to fill vacancies has been a challenge faced by many businesses in Streaky Bay.

Mayor Travis Barber said Council had been working closely with many businesses, including Discovery Parks to try to address the shortfalls being experienced.

"The inability to fill vacancies has really hampered efforts of all businesses to recover from Covid 19 closures and to find our way back to normality.

"Businesses being unable to open as they normally would at peak times has led to considerable frustration. Council has received complaints regarding service levels and visitor have expressed concerns related to reduced opening hours and difficulties making all types of accommodation bookings," Mayor Barber said.

It is therefore important to celebrate the fact Discovery Parks have been able to recruit a new Caretaker and fulltime housekeeper/grounds/administration person, as this will see the Streaky Bay Foreshore Tourist Park back to normal operating conditions from 19 October 2020.

Return to normal operations will mean Discovery will be accepting bookings for the Streaky Bay park through their office in Streaky Bay rather than through the call centre hub set up in response to Covid 19 restrictions. It will also mean the same high level of service and experience will be the centre piece of the park as Discovery turn their focus fully to recovery.

Council advises that construction work has commenced at Moore's Boat Ramp to install 2 new floating pontoons.

Weather and tides permitting, this work is due for completion at the end of November 2020.

Work is currently in progress on the northern side ramp and once the pontoon is installed and operational then the old southern side (wooden) pontoon will be removed and a new one installed.

The southern side (wooden) pontoon is currently available for the launch and retrieval of your vessel.

# GREAT WHITE KAOLIN PROJECT

## Business Bulletin

*The Great White Kaolin Project is located near Poochera, on Eyre Peninsula, South Australia.*

The Exploration Licence (EL 5814) is held 100% by Great Southern Kaolin Pty Ltd, a wholly owned subsidiary of ASX listed Minotaur Exploration Ltd (Minotaur; ASX: MEP).

Andromeda Metals Ltd (Andromeda; ASX: ADN) is the majority partner in a Joint Venture with Minotaur to develop the Project.

There are two stages proposed for the Project:

- Stage 1 – Direct Shipping of Ore (DSO)
- Stage 2 – On-site (wet) processing

An Ore Reserve of 12.5 million tonnes of kaolin with high brightness has been calculated from exploration drill results at the Great White Deposit. At a proposed mining rate of 500,000 tonne per year, the Project has a 26-year life-of-mine (LOM).

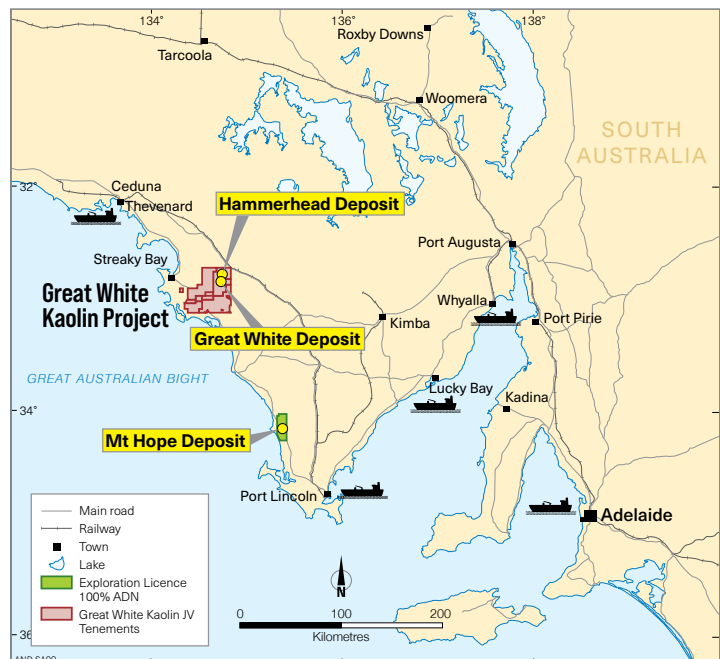


Figure 1 Great White Kaolin Project location.

Andromeda's additional deposits on the Eyre Peninsula (refer Figure 1) show the potential for developing additional resources into a world class kaolin region. Initial test work shows that the kaolin within these other deposits is of the same high quality as that from the Great White Deposit.

## Market

The Andromeda halloysite-kaolin is ideally suited for the high-quality porcelain market. The global market for kaolin into ceramic applications is about 9 million tonnes per annum with a projected compound annual growth rate of 4% through to at least 2027.

Andromeda is targeting the high value end of the US\$62 billion ceramics market which is expected to reach US\$91.5 billion by 2026. China has historically produced approximately 40% of the market demand.

### GLOBAL KAOLIN CONSUMPTION

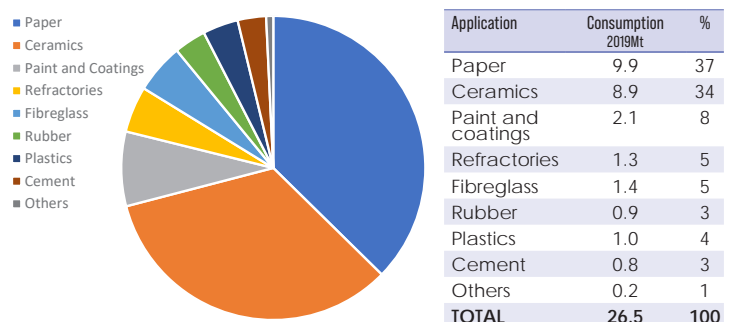


Figure 2 Percentage of markets by application (2019).

## Economic Benefit

First Test Minerals, a world authority on clay materials, undertook market research and investigated project economics on behalf of Andromeda. This research identified high grade, halloysite-kaolin product commands a US\$500/t (AUD\$700/t) value in the ceramics industry of China, throughout Asia, the Middle East, and several European countries.

The Great White Kaolin Project has:

- A 26-year life-of-mine (LOM), at the planned mining rate of 500,000 tonnes per annum.
- A pre-production capital estimate of A\$13M, with a maximum cash requirement of A\$28M prior to initial revenues being received.
- Plans for an onsite wet-processing plant and infrastructure, which will be funded by revenues received from DSO (Direct Shipping Ore) production. Commencement of construction of this plant has an estimated cost of A\$56M and would commence in the second year of operation.
- Budgeted construction capital of A\$69M for Stages One and Two.
- An estimated pre-tax cashflow of A\$1.97B, which would move through the South Australian economy over the course of the Project.

## Maximum Amount

One cubic metre (about a 6x4 trailer filled to the level of normal height sides)



## The following items are accepted for free disposal:-

- Fridges, freezers, airconditioners (MUST BE DEGASSED)
- Household white goods (washing machines, stoves)
- Household furniture (cupboards, chairs, beds (frames only no mattresses)
- Scrap metal and Scrap timber
- Electrical appliances (TV's, etc.)
- Carpet (rolled up)
- General household materials (doors, kitchen sinks, etc.)
- Hot Water Services (250lt)

## The following items are **not** accepted:-

- Mattresses
- Commercial Waste
- Liquid Waste (motor oil, paint, chemicals, chemical containers)
- Concrete, bricks, rock, dirt, sand
- Gas bottles, asbestos
- Ammunition/explosives
- Car bodies, car parts, tyres

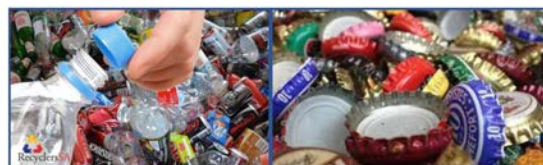
