Council News

GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Streaky Bay School Community Library Deputation – April 2021

Council received a deputation to the ordinary meeting of Council outlining current School Community Library Operations and future funding arrangements.

Andromeda Mining Operations – April 2021

Council received a deputation from landowners within the district outlining their concerns on the proposed mining operations and future implications. These concerns were forwarded to Andromeda as part of the mining consultation process.

- Provide regular (at least monthly) air quality testing and reporting during the first year of operation to Council and the regulator
- Should the air quality level reach 100ppm (poor or more) that the road be bituminised immediately and
- Bituminise the Poochera Port Kenny Road immediately before operation in any rate
- Present all the concerns raised by the Inkster community including school bus safety, air quality measurements and water usage

Streaky Bay and District Medical Board – Council Representative

Council resolved that Philip Wheaton continue his tenure on the Medical Clinic Board as Council's representative. Mr Wheaton has been involved in the board since its in inception and will continue to report back to Council on meeting outcomes.

Performance Development Framework and Policy

Council received at its April meeting draft Performance Development Framework and Policies relating to staff development. Council resolved to endorse those documents and copies are available on Council's website.

Reconciliation Action Plan

Council resolved at the April 2021 meeting of Council that they did not support the development of a Reconciliation Action Plan at this time and defer the decision to engage until the finalisation of the current Golf Club appeal process.

Acknowledgement of Country

Council resolved to commence all formal meetings with the following wording for their acknowledgement of Country "I would like to begin by acknowledging the Custodians of this land we pay our respects to elders past and present".

Community Strengthening and Planning

Committee – Vacancy

With the resignation of Cr Lauren Karp from Council it has resulted in a vacancy on Council's Section 41 Committee. Council resolved to advertise for another independent committee member.

Local Government Act Delegations

Council received a report providing updated Delegation Schedules under the Local Government Act, Council endorsed the proposed amendments to delegations.

Local Government Reform

The Local Government Reform Bill has been discussed regularly during the past 12 months. It is expected to pass during the May sittings of parliament and now has around 200 amendments from the original document – most of those amendments are in response to Local Government and Local Government Association requests to both parliament and the opposition.

Approximately 150 changes are now expected to come from the Local Government Act and range from superficial policy changes through to new panels and a model which will see ESCOSA oversight the rating process of Councils.

Implementation timeframes are expected to be very tight due to the delays in the parliamentary process. As such the next 18 months will prove very difficult for those responsible for working through the implementation especially given the fact that the timeframe will include a general election. Local Government Association advice to Council is therefore to carefully consider the capacity of their staff to deliver both these changes and their works and service programs for the 2021/2022 financial year in particular. A considerable amount of training will also be required of staff and Elected Members to ensure they are up to date with the changes as they are implemented, including understanding the implications on various roles and responsibilities for Elected Members and staff.

Council endorsed a budget increase in the 2021/2022 financial year to ensure that these requirements will be met.

Acting Chief Executive Officer

Council endorsed following the resignation of Karina Ewer, Chief Executive Officer that current Manager, Community and Economic Development, Penny Williams be placed in the Acting role until the recruitment process is completed.

Dog and Cat Registration Fees 2021/2022

Council endorsed new fees for dog and cat registrations. The fees and charges proposed will remain as is.

Council News Cont'd

Council Representation Review – Final Report

Council undertook the final community engagement process for the representation review. This feedback was considered, and Council resolved in respect to the future composition and structure of Council to reaffirm its support for.

- The principal member of Council continues to be a chairperson (with the title of Mayor) selected by and from amongst the Elected Members
- The future elected body of Council continue to comprise of eight (8) Councillors
- The existing two ward structure be retained
- The wards continue to be named Flinders and Eyre
- The wards both be represented by four (4) councillors

PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT

Land Management Agreement Waivers

Council considered Land Management Agreement waivers for Herbert Edwards Drive and Oscar Williams Drive, Streaky Bay. The reports and resolutions can be found in the Agenda and Minutes for the April 2021 ordinary meeting of Council. At the May 2021 ordinary meeting of Council, a LMA Waiver request was received for Flinders Drive, Streaky Bay, full details of this request and resolution are available on the website.

Golf Course Native Title Update

Council's Mayor and Acting Chief Executive Officer will be attending the Court Mediation in the second week of June where Council is hoping for a positive outcome and agreement of the Golf Club land is reached.

Oyster Lease Application

Council has received many submissions both for and against the new Oyster Lease application. The decision is not Council's to make as it is a PIRSA responsibility. PIRSA has asked for Council's submission in this matter if they wanted to make a submission.

At the March 2021 meeting Council resolved to provide a submission to PIRSA regarding Council's Coastal Management Plan which outlines the protection of "The Spit" and does not support the application. In addition, Council requested a comprehensive review of PIRSA's Management Plan be undertaken as soon as possible. The letter sent to PIRSA included <u>all</u> <u>correspondence received by Council</u> on the matter.

At the May 2021 meeting a motion was moved that "Council withdraw our opposition to Mr Evans' oyster lease application" that motion was seconded and subsequently carried. A division was called and the outcome of that division and full motion is available at Item 16.1 Motions with Notice from the Minutes of the May 2021 Ordinary meeting of Council. A copy of those minutes is available at either the Principal Office, Visitor Centre or online at <u>www.streakybay.sa.gov.au</u>.

A further letter was sent to PIRSA advising them of the motion moved at the May meeting, advising consideration was given to the age of our Coastal Management Plan, however, Council continues to support the request that early notification of Local Governments of such decisions be included in PIRSA community engagement processes, so that Council are more aware and able to assist should that be required.

Council also reinforced its desire to see the Department of Primary Industries and Regions (PIRSA) review the current Management Plan as it relates to this area, and as noted in its 19 March 2021 letter.

Streaky Bay Men's Shed Lease

Council resolved to support the ongoing lease of the Streaky Bay Men's shed and include exemptions for white ant treatment, CWMS Levy, Waste Collection Levy and water metre charges that will be reviewed on an annual basis.

Poochera and Districts Bowling Club Lease

Council resolved to support the Poochera and Districts Bowling Club in continuing their lease of facilities, with the exemption of a sinking fund.

Airport Landing Fees Waiver Request

A request was received from a member of the public to waive all landing fees at the Streaky Bay Aerodrome for the 2021/2022 financial year. Council will review the fees as part of the 2021/2022 Annual Business Plan and budget process.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Coast Protection Board Legislation Submission

Council considered, prepared, and submitted a submission outlining key concerns regarding the Coast Protection Board. Following this submission an onsite meeting and site visits will be held in and around the Streaky Bay Coast.

Streaky Bay Foreshore Tourist Park – Tariff Schedule

Council considered a report to amend the tariff schedule at the park, Council endorsed the schedule amendment, full details are available in the April 2021 Council Agenda.

Streaky Bay Rural Women's Gathering

Council resolved to reappropriate funding that was previously allocated for the 2020 New Year's Eve Children's Festival (that was cancelled) to host the 2021 SA Rural Women's Gathering in Streaky Bay.

Buy Local Gift Cards

Council endorsed the further investigation and cross Council collaboration of a buy local Gift Card that can be utilised across businesses and Council districts.

Mobile Food Vendor Policy

Following a community consultation period Council resolved to endorse the reviewed Mobile Food Vendor rules and set fees for the 2021/2022 financial year. A copy of the new Policy and associated details are available on Council's website www.streakybay.sa.gov.au.

General Advertising Signage Policy

Council has received several requests regarding advertising signage in recent months and its existing Policy was restrictive. The Policy was reviewed to provide further guidance and opportunities for advertising. A copy of the Policy and fact sheet is available on Council's website www.streakybay.sa.gov.au

Moveable Signage Policy (A Frame Signage)

It had been identified that most of the A Frame signage throughout the district was non-complying with Council's By-Law and such By-Law restricted almost all potential usage of such signage. A Policy has now been introduced that will enable the usage of signage (ascertaining to certain conditions). Those businesses with A Frame signage will be contacted in coming weeks to complete an appropriate application form and register their signage use. Holiday Visitation Issues – Discussion Paper

That following community engagement on the discussion paper, with limited feedback provided, Council considered further actions surrounding this paper and resolved the following actions.

- Continue to budget existing additional waste measures
- Continue to budget for RV Park toilet to remain open
- Investigate options for RV Park dump point
- Continue negotiations with Landscapes SA regarding Coastal Access
- Write to the Department of Environment to suggest a toilet be installed at Point Labatt
- That the Perlubie stack site seating and shelters remain the responsibility of the Department of Infrastructure and Transport.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Parking – Streaky Bay

Following a report to the March 2021 meeting and subsequent community engagement period. Council received a report to the May 2021 meeting providing feedback from the community, this feedback was considered, and Council resolved the following;

- Installation of a no standing zone from the northern side of Wells Street from Bay Road to Alice Haddy Naturopath
- Required line marking and double entry to Council carpark, Wells Street side
- Investigation of all abilities parking behind Chemist
- Trial of parallel parking for a period of 12 months in front of EP Marine (Bay Road)
- Installation of angle parking only signs to all existing angle parking areas with the exclusion of the area from Phillips Street to Streaky Bay Marine Products on the northern side.

Footpath/Retaining Wall Upgrade Request – Alfred Terrace, Streaky Bay

Council received a report outlining a request to upgrade a section of footpath along Alfred Terrace, Council resolved that at this point the upgrade was not required.

Waste Transfer Station Proposal

The current Waste Transfer Station contract is due for renewal in the current months and Council received a report regarding future operation of the site in Streaky Bay. Council resolved for the operation of the site to revert to Council operated, with a restructured kerbside collection contract to be negotiated with EP Recycling. This operation will require the engagement of further staff, community engagement and participation strategies, modification of operating hours, and sourcing of additional grant funding for further works.

Local Government Infrastructure Partnerships Program Funding

Council has received \$392,287 through the State Government Local Government Infrastructure Partnerships Program, this funding was a competitive grant round and will be applied to the Western Transit Loop Project (Wells Street, AB Smith Rd, Alec Baldock Dr, Wallschutzky Rd project). Plans for the proposed upgrade will be available to the public as soon as possible.

Streaky Bay Hall Airconditioning Upgrade

This project was funded under the Drought Communities Program 2020, due to an unforeseen power upgrade requirement, Council endorsed to allocate a further \$12,000 of its own source expenditure to the project.

From Tuesday 25 May, all adults aged 16 to 49 living in Eyre and Far North will be eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccine, in addition to the currently eligible groups.
