GOVERNANCE

Leasing and Licence Policy

Council has endorsed a revised Leasing and Licence Policy that will be applicable to all Council land and buildings that are leased or licenced to local community groups, organisations, businesses and private individuals. Those person(s) affected by the policy will be advised accordingly.

The CFS Shed lease is currently being negotiated and Council moved a motion without notice at the January meeting to pursue a lease amount of \$5000 for rent per annum.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Poochera Play Space Development

Council budgeted in the 2023/24 Annual Business Plan to undertake a design concept for a play space in Poochera. Council endorsed at the January meeting of Council that the budget scope for the playground design (the value of the playground space) be \$250,000, this will ensure that the design is within this budget scope. Community consultation on this play space will commence in the coming months.

Pioneer Park Development

Installation of concrete paths are continuing to progress as underground services and above ground works using heavy machinery is completed. Paths to dump point and bin bank still to be completed in line with road resheeting and bitumen sealing. Dump point will be closed for 2 weeks to complete this work and uses will be directed to the Caravan Park which Discovery Parks have said they will accommodate. All the flush kerbing has been completed. Crusher fine paths need to be finished to the edge of kerb. Toilet installation completed. The nature play equipment has been installed and the swale is 95% complete with rocks, logs, and log steppers. The crab climber (play equipment) has been installed along with the soft fall sand. Lawn has been laid and irrigation is working. Garden beds around pull in bay need to be prepped and planted. All other garden beds are ready for planting. require preparation ready for plants. Entrance statement rock wall has commenced.

Town Entrance Statements

The township Entrance Statements the bases and concrete has been poured and the signage installed. A false stone wall is to be installed along the front of the sign followed by backfilling and planting out to provide some low key landscaping.

Youth Precinct

Council endorsed at the January meeting of Council additional expenditure for the installation of the following at the precinct;

- CCTV Installation
- · Safety Railing to Western Ramp
- Footpath Realignment to Round-a-bout
- · Bollards to perimeter
- Signage

Streaky Bay Jetty Repairs

Department of Infrastructure and Transport Officers were on site to assess the current condition of the Jetty which will help them better understand the condition and status of the Streaky Bay jetty to help inform remediation works. The jetty was closed to the public for two consecutive days, on 23 and 24 January 2024. The Streaky Bay Jetty is different to the Haslam Jetty as it is owned and operated by the State Government. Hence, they are responsible for any possible remediation works. Contractors will be back in the later part of the year to repair the Jetty. This will see the closure of the Jetty whilst the repairs are being undertaken.

Montgomerie Terrace Bicycle Path Planning

Council endorsed the Grant Agreement for this project at the November meeting of Council. Council Officers have sent back the Grant Agreement and will begin the engagement process for the planning/engineering consultants in late January 2024. A meeting is scheduled with the consultants for Mid-February 2024 to commence the design process.

Finlayson Road / Eyre Highway Intersection

A motion without notice was moved to write to the Department of Infrastructure and Transport to advocate for prioritization of realigning the Finlayson Road intersection with the Eyre Highway. The Council are advocating for this work due to the ongoing safety concerns of heavy and long vehicles pulling out onto Eyre Highway. Letters have been sent and the Mayor and CEO met with Local Member for Flinders to discuss the matter.

Western Transit Loop (Wells Street/AB Smith Road Round a Bout)

Road counters will be deployed in the coming month to assess current traffic volumes. The information from this activity will be used to reassess the original design of the roundabout to ensure its suitability for current traffic numbers and movements.

The Cemetery Expansion project has been completed. Quotations for a cement plinth, will be sourced shortly, and will be included in the 2024/2025 budget.

PLANNING & REGULATORY

Land Management Agreement Waivers

Council received a request for an LMA waiver at Oscar Williams Drive Streaky Bay, with the approval of a reduced front set back requirement. A second waiver was requested on the same street and endorsed for increased fence height and spacing of fencing posts.

Chandada (Unmade Road) Partial Road Closure

Council endorsed this partial road closure that forms part of the Andromeda mining site to move to Stage 2 of the Road Closure Process.

Perlubie Road Opening and Closing

Council is pleased to have completed this process that has enabled the ongoing access to the beach to be retained through the formalization of a roadway to the beach. The new boundary alignments will now be fenced in the coming weeks.

Refueling in Public Places

A question without notice was raised at the January meeting regarding the requirements and responsible authorities for monitoring, safety, and spill aspects of refueling close to foreshore locations. Council Staff have investigated the matter and the regulatory responsibilities are with the Environment Protection Authority of SA.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT/TOURISM

Mobile Food Van Vendor Policy

Council reviewed its existing Policy with no major changes and the Policy is set for a review in another 12 months. A copy of the Policy is available on Councils website www.streakybay.sa.gov.au

Speeds Point

Council endorsed a draft layout for the redevelopment of the Speeds Point Campground. However, the intent is to be that development is like the Tractor Beach Campground. The works are dependent on ongoing negotiations for long term dedication from the State Government.

District Masterplan(s) Endorsement

The Council endorsed the township masterplans following an extensive consultation process at the December 2023 meeting, copies of these documents are available on Councils website www.streakybay.sa.gov.au.

Caravan and Camping Strategy Review

The existing document has been reviewed by WAX Design in line with the Masterplan Development process and current trends. The document has undertaken its initial review and feedback provided; a second review is underway prior to being presented to the Community Strengthening Planning Committee for comment in March 2024.

Tractor Beach Toilet - Hybrid System

Funding was allocated in the 2023/24 budget to convert the current labour-intensive compost system into a non-flush hybrid system. Gough Plastics have provided options and a price, and the Manager Prosperity is discussing with local plumber to ensure the appropriate system is selected and check that the size of the new system can be retrofitted to the current toilet structure.

Surfers Beach Carpark and Staircase

Council considered a report at the October 2023 ordinary meeting of Council regarding a proposal from Crown Lands to dispose of a portion of the land on which the surfers beach carpark and staircase reside on to the Council. The Council considered this proposal noting that it would increase Council's operational costs through asset acquisition, increased maintenance costs and depreciation, however considered the economic and social value of the asset needed to be maintained for the future.

PLANNING & REGULATORY

A proposed plan was provided by Crown Lands following this endorsement, clarification that the proposed boundary encompasses the entire carpark and allows for future expansion as requested by the Elected Members has been further sought.

SUSTAINABILITY

Tree Assessment Report

Council endorsed the Tree Assessment Reports that were undertaken in mid 2023. A copy of those reports is now available on Councils website www.streakybay.sa.gov.au

Eyre's Waterhole Overnight Camping

No further updates at this time.

Stormwater Management Plan Development

The first round of Community Consultation sessions and on-site visits were held in mid-September along with a face-to-face Councillor workshop. There has been an identification of missed LidAR mapping data when this was undertaken which diminishes the accuracy of modelling for the South Eastern corner of the township, this has now been completed.

Council Officers have met with the Consultants to review initial mitigation measures and provided preliminary feedback, a follow up meeting is scheduled in the coming weeks. A workshop is planned with Councillors for Mid March 2024.

Speed Limits on Council Beaches

A reduced speed limit from the 100kmh speed limit received an overwhelming response to reduce the speed limit to a default speed of 40kmh and 25kmh when passing or within 100m of a pedestrian. Signage has now been installed across the relevant locations.

Waste Management Strategy

Council received a Draft of the Strategy and endorsed the Strategy to go out to Public Consultation. Consultation details will be published in the coming weeks.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

SA Youth Week Grants Program

Council Officers have applied to the SA youth week grants program for youth activities including art workshops and laser tag to be delivered in March 2024.

Council once again held its annual skate and scoot workshops at the Streaky Bay Youth Precinct. It was fully booked out and was great to watch the youth of the district under guidance test out and learn some new skills to navigate the new precinct. Community School Pool

The community school pool is open every day from 2pm-6pm on weekends. Pool passes are available from the Visitor Information Centre. Users can now pay via direct debit on site. Due to public holidays and thunderstorm activity the pool was open for 25 days out of the 31 and recorded 301 users for the month of December 2023.

Recruitment and Attraction Short Video Development

Shooting has been undertaken for the video, thank you to all those that participated, and Council is now awaiting the draft cut for review.

Santa in the Centre

The visitor centre space was a mini-Christmas wonderland with decorations, photo opportunities, activity tables for children to make reindeer food, decorate Christmas baubles or complete a Christmas colouring or activity sheet. The Men's Shed built a Santa sleigh which was very popular with the kids. The Santa event held on Thursday 21 December from 10am to 2pm had 167 visitors. The VC has had nothing but positive feedback for this event.

New Years Eve

The Family Fun Fest was again successful, Xtreme kites and paddle hosted jumpy castles, zorb balls and the clown and duck trailer and was very popular with families, food vendors Thip Thai, Basil and Belle, Pizza Foreshore and the mens shed all reported a succesful trade.

January was a big month for the Streaky Bay indoor bowlers. So much was achieved.


There was the organised spring clean on 3/1 plus several individual extra tasks undertaken and importantly a screen door was installed at the clubhouse northern entrance

Have you visited this tiny little oasis? Please do.... you may be surprised! There are many bargains to be had.



Come and visit us at the Museum and see the extensive range of artefacts and information that we have. We have large model boats of fishing boats, grain carriers and general cargo carriers on display. The Harold, which had carried grain from Streaky Bay in the 1930's was commandeered by the United States in WW2 and never returned. The Yandra which bought supplies to Streaky Bay for 30 years, served in the Australian Navy in WW2. The Yandra picked up survivors from the Kormoron, which was the German ship that destroyed the HMAS Sydney. The Yandra was also involved in the hunt for the Japanese midget submarines that were inside Sydney Harbour. After it's war service the Yandra was welcomed back to the West Coast with welcome home parties in several towns.

Rules

The following rules must be observed by pool patrons at all times when using the pool and its facilities.

• Persons are not permitted to enter the pool without payment of fees. Pool supervisor reserves the

- Do not use pool if you have any open wounds
- Members and guests, not toilet trained must wear swim nappies.
- In the instant that faeces enters the pool the Pool Supervisor MUST be notified immediately and the
 pool must be closed immediately
- The pool is a multi-use pool
- Nappies are not to be changed at poolside. Please make use of the toilets or lawn areas.
 - Safety Equipment must not be tampered with
- Pool Users are not permitted to enter the Plant Room
- Pool Users are not permitted to use school equipment relating to the pool
 - Do NOT R
- Do NOT PUSH or THROW People In
- Diving and Jumping are only permitted in the deep end of the pool
- NO glass, food or drinks (other than water) are allowed in the pool area.
- NO Smoking or alcohol is allowed within the school grounds
- Soft Water toys may be used at the discretion of the lifeguard
- Body boards and surfboards are not permitted.
- Sitting or hanging on lap lanes is prohibited.
- Avoid eating or consuming alcoholic beverages before using the pool.
 - Animals are prohibited.
- If animals are found within the pool (i.e. Snakes), notify the supervisor immediately
 - Behaviour deemed not conducive to public safety will not be permitted.
- Boisterous or dangerous behaviour will not be tolerated
- The pool must be vacated during electrical storms.
- The lifeguards have full authority to enforce rules in pool facilities
- All rubbish and waste must be removed from the Pool area and users are responsible for the
 disposal of their own waste

Child Supervision






