Council News

GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Council Meetings November 2019 – Change of Times Council have agreed to change the times of the 21 November 2019 Ordinary meeting of Council to commence at 2.00pm.

Informal Gatherings and Fraud, Corruption, Misconduct and Maladministration Prevention Policy

Council was presented with an updated version of the existing Informal Gatherings Policy relating to the organisation and implementation of Council related Informal Gatherings, and a Fraud, Corruption, Misconduct and Maladministration Prevention Policy. The Policies were adopted at the October 2019 meeting of Council.

Public Interest Disclosure Procedure

This Procedure, and the Council's Public Interest Disclosure Policy, are designed to ensure that procedures are in place for the making of such Disclosures and for dealing with such Disclosures, and by providing appropriate protections for those who make such Disclosures. The procedure was presented and adopted at the October meeting of Council.

Local Government Reform Submission

Investigations into potential Local Government reform are currently being undertaken. The reforms suggested are wide reaching and have been grouped into four Reform Areas: Reform Area 1 - Stronger Council Member Capacity. This area covers everything from Councillor behaviour, to the role of the Mayor, to CEO Remuneration and performance management. Reform Area 2 - Lower Costs and Enhanced Financial Accountability This area considers possible reforms to audit and risk committees, the introduction of governance committees, how financial reports and presented and how they are consulted upon. Reform Area 3 – Efficient and Transparent Local Government Representation This area questions the timing of local government elections, through to election processes, candidate reporting, how the votes are counted and how vacancies might be managed. **Reform Area 4 – Simpler Regulation** This area consists of topics including community engagement, internal review of council decisions, publication of information, register of interests, community land revocations, and the management of council roads.

Council was presented with a report detailing a response from Council regarding the reform and this document was endorsed by Council. A full copy of the response is available in the October Council Agenda.

Sale of Properties – Non Payment of Rates

Council were provided with a report and list of proposed properties to commence sale of due to ongoing non-payment of rates. Council endorsed to commence the process at the September meeting. Council staff will endeavour to provide a community education program prior to the commencement of this process.

Road Naming and Numbering

A further report was presented to the September 2019 ordinary meeting of Council. At that meeting a new Rural Property Addressing and Residential Numbering Policy, and Road and Place Naming Policy was presented, both policies were endorsed by Council. Council in addition to this endorsed the review of current road names with a view to official gazettal of road names in the future. A report will be presented to the November meeting of Council with recommendations for amendments if requested.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Baird Bay Telecommunications Tower

Council have been successful in gaining blackspot funding for a telecommunications tower to be installed at Baird Bay. Discussions regarding the size and location of the tower prior to the confirmation of the successful bid, led to some confusion regarding the size of the tower to be installed. Advocacy at the State and Federal level by the Mayor and CEO has resulted in the Federal Minister for Grey, Mr Rowan Ramsay MP meeting with Telstra and the relevant communications Minister in an effort to assist with delivery of the correct telecommunications tower. A 20m tower will now be installed with a 2km radius. The permit has been placed out for public consultation. This does not preclude Council from applying for a larger tower in the future.

Draft Eyre Peninsula Regional Transport Strategy

The Eyre Peninsula Regional Transport Strategy is currently under review. This document is a collaborative approach to a regional hierarchy for road upgrades across the region. The hierarchy is then utilised to strategically source funding. Council staff prepared feedback via a submission that was endorsed by Council at the October meeting. A full copy of the submission is available for viewing within the Agenda document.

TOURISM

New Year's Eve Event and Dry Zone

The Annual Fireworks and Children's Festival event is planned and will be held in the same format as previous years.

Council News Cont'd

New Year's Eve Event and Dry Zone

Council considered a report regarding Dry Area's for New Year's Eve with the designated dry areas to remain the same as previous years.

Street Banner Signs – Streaky Bay

A report will be presented to the November 2019 meeting of the Community and Economic Development Committee providing options for future signage.

RV Campground - Toilet Facilities

Council considered a report following the recommendation of the Community and Economic Development Committee to open the toilet facilities at the RV Park, Streaky Bay. Council resolved to only open the toilets during peak periods.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Childcare Feasibility Study

Child Care study has been presented to the Community for feedback and the consultation period closed. A report was presented to the October 2019 meeting of Council outlining the community response to the report and Council at that meeting resolved to receive the report. There will be no further commencement of further investigations at this stage.

STORMWATER MANAGEMENT

Philip Street – Stormwater Management

A request was received for Council to investigate stormwater management solutions for the end of Philips Street, Streaky Bay. There is currently no stormwater infrastructure in place. Council considered a report to the October 2019 meeting of Council and Council resolved at that meeting to budget an additional \$17,000 in the current financial year to undertake the required works.

HEALTH MANAGEMENT

Regional Health Plan Review

Currently being reviewed by all CEOs from the four Councils. Input has been provided and a draft final report should be ready for the December meeting of Council for consideration.

PLANNING & REGULATING

Eyre Peninsula Joint Planning Board and Regional Assessment Panel

A meeting was held 6 November 2019 with Eyre Peninsula CEOs and Victoria Shute from Kelledy Jones to discuss options regarding the formation of Regional Assessment Panel(s). A report will be provided to the Ordinary Meeting of Council in November for consideration.



AUSTRALIAN CITIZENSHIP

Sirinthip Makklieng and Thuy Hong Ninh were officially recognised as citizens in front of friends, family and community at the Supper Room Studio Gallery on Thursday 19 September. Deputy Mayor Philip Wheaton conducted the ceremony and Member for Flinders Peter Treloar then noted "Australia was a melting pot of cultures from throughout the globe", before Ms Makklieng and Ms Ninh took the citizenship pledge and received their certificates.

Ms Makklieng, originally from Thailand, said it was a wonderful experience after living in Streaky Bay for eight years with her son.

Community News

STREAKY BAY GOLF

This year the Streaky Bay Golf Club has re-invigorated its Junior Golf program, after a seven year absence, with regular sessions each Sunday morning running from 9.00am through to 11.00am. Currently up to 15 juniors attend each session, with the junior program focussing on skills development and a 3 hole competition and the senior kids playing a 9 hole competition. This is the only junior program operating in the Far West and we think across Eyre Peninsula outside of Port Lincoln and Whyalla. This Saturday the Streaky Bay Junior Golf Open will be held at the Streaky Bay Golf Course commencing at 9am and finishing with trophy presentations and a sausage sizzle.

The Streaky Bay Golf Course has undergone substantial upgrading in recent years, with the installation of the grey water fairway watering system and replanted fairways which has resulted in year round high quality fairways. In the past couple of years the club has planted three greens, which have replaced old scrapes, resulting in higher levels of challenge and assisted players to gain skills in regularly putting on greens. The availability of green play has enabled our junior golfers to qualify for state level competitions without having to travel to and qualify on courses with greens such as Whyalla or Port Lincoln. A fourth green has been planted and will come into play over the summer with plans afoot to convert all sandscapes to greens in the coming years. The club has experienced ongoing challenges in maintaining sand scrapes after the previously used furnace slag became unavailable.

There has been major re-shaping of scrapes over the past few weeks (some multitiered) in preparation for grassing which has now occurred. The re-designing was carried out by Roxby Downs Golf Pro - Wade Cooper, Nigel Brace and Graham Redding using machinery donated by Nigel Brace, Graham Redding and Cactus Feltus. Seven pallets of santa-anna grass was transported over from Adelaide by McEvoys (who donated the transport), the grass cost approx. \$3300. \$2500 has been donated by Streaky Bay Marine Products (Dion and Damon Edmunds), \$500 by Streaky Bay Hotel (Tony Hogan, \$200 Mark Wrigley) and \$300 by Killer's (Nigel Brace). The grass has cover two scrapes and the rest of the scrapes were planted out using scarifying off cuts by volunteers over the last few weeks. Temporary greens have been established in front of all holes - so the course is still perfectly playable with a slightly shorter layout. We are asking the public to please stay off the re-planted greens whilst they get established over the next couple of months and to seriously consider getting involved in golf given the shift to grass putting greens that is occurring.



New Adult Safeguarding Unit opens to take reports of elder abuse

South Australia's new Adult Safeguarding Unit (ASU), located in the Office for Ageing Well is open for business.

The ASU is empowered to act upon reports of abuse or neglect of adults who, through their health, life or other circumstances, may be vulnerable to abuse or neglect.

The ASU will assess all reports of abuse and will then decide on the appropriate action. This could include investigating the situation further or taking immediate action, depending on the situation.

For the first three years, the ASU will respond to reports of abuse of people 65 years and older, or 50 years and older, if the person is Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander. From October 2022, the Unit will take reports about all adults (regardless of their age) who because of their vulnerability may be experiencing abuse or harm.

The ASU will also focus on the prevention of elder abuse by raising awareness within the community.

Members of the public can report abuse, and seek free confidential advice and support, by contacting the Adult Safeguarding Unit through the SA Elder Abuse Prevention Phone Line 1800 372 310.




