Council News

GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Acting Chief Executive Officer

Manager, Infrastructure and Civil Works, Darren Walker was nominated to act in the position for this period of leave from 27 July 2020 to 17 August 2020.

Public Consultation Policy

A report was presented to Council outlining a review of the existing Public Consultation Policy that will include requirements under a pandemic. The amendments to the Policy were endorsed by Council. Delegations attached to the legislation were also endorsed.

Genetically Modified Crops – Determination of Council's Position

Council received a report at the May 2020 ordinary meeting of Council outlining the State Governments decision to lift the moratorium on genetically modified crops in South Australia. The State Governments legislation required individual Council area's to decide if they were to retain the moratorium (criteria was required to enable moratoriums to remain). Council resolved at that meeting to enable the lifting of the moratorium for the area of the District Council of Streaky Bay and that Council supports the growing of Genetically Modified Crops. A division was called and full details are available within the Minutes.

Streaky Bay and District Medical Clinic – Council Representation

Council resolved following a question without notice at the May 2020 meeting to endorse Cr Philip Wheaton to remain as Council's representative on the Streaky Bay and District Medical Clinic.

Planning, Building and Development

Council no longer has on staff a Manager, Regulatory Services. All enquiries regarding Planning, Building and Development can continue to be directed through the Regulatory Administration Assistant, Mardi Schumann on 08 86261001.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Wirrulla Public Toilet – Retention of Asset

Council recently received feedback from the Wirrulla Community that they wished to retain the existing public toilets at Wirrulla in addition to the new facility at the Wirrulla Campground. Council moved to rescind a previous motion to remove the toilets.

Streaky Bay Youth Precinct

A report was presented to Council providing details of a concept plan for the development of the Skate Park, a subsequent funding application that was submitted was unsuccessful.

Streaky Bay Area School Pool

A draft three (3) year lease agreement has been received and will be presented to the June meeting of Council.

Jetty Platform Upgrade and Future

Council received a report to the May ordinary meeting of Council outlining the proposed upgrade information and short term closure of the Jetty Platform located in Streaky Bay. That report included options for Council to consider pursuing ownership of the facility. Council resolved at the meeting lay the report on the table until further asset costing considerations are available.

Tractor Beach Campground Development

Native Vegetation Survey completed. Application Submitted. Environmental Management Plan drafted for submission with DA. Negotiation to commence with DEW re obtaining Care and Control over a small area of the site currently not under care and control. Site Management Plan has been completed and is awaiting adjoining landholder confirmation.

Speeds Point Campground – Care and Control

Council have endorsed to commence the process for care and control of the Speeds Point site.

Sceale Bay Beach Camping

A report was presented to the May 2020 meeting of Council outlining the control of the beach area. A letter will be forwarded to Sceale Bay residents outlining this information.

Boat Ramp Tender – Streaky Bay

The tender has closed and tenders have been assessed. A confidential report will be presented to Council for the successful tender to be endorsed with a public announcement to follow.

Infrastructure SA – 20 Year Strategy

The quality of South Australia's infrastructure is critical to its economic performance and social capital and the 20-Year State Infrastructure Strategy represents a new discipline for infrastructure planning and development.

WASTE MANAGEMENT

Cungena Landfill Land Purchase

Council considered a report to the May 2020 Ordinary meeting of Council regarding the purchase of additional crown land for the purpose of expanding the Cungena landfill site, Council resolved to not pursue and that Council form a working party to assess all options for a long term landfill site for the Streaky Bay District.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Economic Recovery Plan

Each of our State's seven RDAs – funded and supported by local councils - are developing Recovery Plans for their regions in consultation with councils, industry and businesses.

All of these plans will be available individually, and they also be consolidated in a regional state-wide blueprint.

This blueprint will be a "live and evolving document" that will contain a "qualified pipeline of available stimulus projects to stimulate economic recovery for the regions," and it is scheduled to be released on 7 July.

This is another great example of councils working with business and communities to ensure we are on the front foot to help South Australia's economy recover from COVID-19.

Industrial Sub Division

Cr Wheaton previously raised a question on notice regarding the establishment of a new industrial site to allow for the support of such projects as Andromeda Metals and the expansion of other heavy industry. Council economic and works staff have been investigating options and will continue this in the future.

Local Roads Community Infrastructure Fund

The Australian Government has committed \$500 million to the Local Road and Community Infrastructure Program (LRCI Program) to support jobs, businesses and the resilience of local economies. Local governments have a critical role in delivering vital services and ensuring the quality of life for communities across Australia.

Councils will be able to access the funding from 1 July 2020 to support delivery of priority local road and community infrastructure projects. Councils will be

able to select the projects to be funded in their community according to priorities at the local level. Projects need to be additional to Councils pre-COVID work plans and must be completed by the end of the 2020-21 financial year.

District Council of Streaky Bay \$551,708 allocated.

The District Council of Streaky Bay will be presented with a report to endorse what projects the funding will be allocated to.

Fishing Reforms

The biggest ever reform of <u>South Australia's</u> <u>commercial fishing industry</u> is now under way with the Marine Scalefish Fishery (MSF) voluntary licence surrender program open for applications. The voluntary licence surrender program is part of the South Australian Government's \$24.5 million reform package to increase the profitability of fishing businesses, grow sustainable fish populations, and improve opportunities for recreational fishers. Fishers looking to leave the industry can submit their offers to surrender their licences at any stage from now until 13 November 2020, with a process in place to enable the first assessment of offers to occur by the end of June for those wanting to exit before the end of the financial year.

TRAINING

Working with Children Check

REMINDER: People have until July 1 to make sure they have transitioned to a "working with children check". The stronger and more effective screening laws for people working or volunteering with children came into effect last year and replaces the Department of Human Services child-related employment screening, or a National Police Certificate.

Anyone who held a valid screening or registration was able to continue to use it in the transitional period until July 1, 2020.

Benefits of the new system include people being able to apply themselves, the WWCC is valid for five years (instead of three) and is portable across organisations and roles in SA – so if you change jobs the check goes with you.

The changes are the result of recommendations from South Australian and Federal Royal Commissions, to help increase the safety of children in our communities.

News from DHS Working with Children Check



Monday, 11 May 2020

Does your organisation require employees to have a valid Working with Children Check?

As you know, the government introduced the new Working with Children Check (WWCC) on 1 July last year to help keep children safe in our communities.

From 1 July 2020, organisations will no longer be able to assess a National Police Certificate to allow people to work or volunteer with children in South Australia.

All South Australians in relevant roles using a National Police Check need to apply for a WWCC by 1 July 2020, if they haven't already.

Engaging a person in paid or volunteer work with children without a valid WWCC is an offence, so this is also an important reminder to organisations to ensure their staff and volunteers have the correct check

Certain transitional arrangements are still in place to make it easier for people to move into the new scheme. Previous Child-Related Employment screenings are recognised as a WWCC and remain valid until they expire.

Working with Children Checks are valid for five years, transferable across jobs and remain com-pletely free of charge for volunteers. For paid employment, the check costs \$113.30.

The updated <u>Working with Children Check Information Kit</u> provides further details and resources for you to share this information with your networks and staff.


LIBRARY OPENING HOURS





Locally available 24/7 Adelaide Monitored VHF Marine Emergency Radio Service is on Ch 16 and on supplementary CH 67, via equipment on Government Radio Network towers at Elliston and Streaky Bay's Gibson Peninsula and is well receivable within Streaky Bay. However in some areas both inside and outside of some of the other bays, that signal can be marginal due to terrain shadowing.

Daylight Hours Local VHF Marine Radio Services: The call signs are **VMR Baird Bay**, **VMR Haslam** and **SES Streaky Bay** these are manned by SES members. Call sign **VMR Streaky Bay** is a non SES operation from Killas Service Station, Wells Street -manned during business hours.

Local Services Provided:

Locally operated stations primarily monitor for general calls and the hours are usually 8.00am to 5.30pm varying to 8.30pm. Some stations can provide you with a signal check, but they do not normally offer a regular voyage booking/tracking service unless that is agreed by prior arrangement. They also can be used for emergency calls and will monitor emergency calls.

Local Streaky Bay UHF CB Repeater is CH7 and can often be used for all types of emergencies during long term blackouts to Streaky Bay area mobile phone services. Radius is approx 35kms from Streaky Bay






