ANNUAL BUSINESS PLAN SUMMARY 2021-2022

The 2021-2022 Annual Business Plan aims to strike a balance between the level of services the community has expressed a desire for, and the need to ensure the long-term financial sustainability of Council. The primary source of income for Council is property-based tax (rates).

RATES AT A GLANCE

Comparing rates between Councils is difficult as each Council has different attributes and provides varying services or similar services at different standards. The District Council of Streaky Bay delivers an extensive range and level of services with the greater part determined by the expectations of our community.

METHOD USED TO VALUE LAND

All land within a Council area, except for land specifically exempt (e.g. Crown land and Council occupied land) is rateable. Council has decided to continue to use **site value** (the value of the land and any improvements which permanently affect the amenity of use of the land, such as drainage works, but excluding the value of buildings and other improvements) as the basis for valuing land within the Council area. The site value is determined by the Valuer-General, not by Council. Council considers this method of valuing land provides the fairest method of distributing the rate burden across all ratepayer.

GENERAL RATES

Council sets differential general rates by the following zones: Neighbourhood, Town Activity Centre, Strategic Employment, Rural Aquaculture, Rural, Employment (Bulk Handling), Deferred Urban, Caravan Park and Tourist Park, Township, Rural Settlement, Rural Shack Settlement, Conservation Visitor Experience, Rural Living, Rural Neighbourhood and Recreation. These differential general rates are further divided between land uses. **A fixed charge of \$640.00** will be levied against each separate assessment with only one fixed charge levied against two or more pieces of adjoining land. **An overall rate Increase of 2.85%** has been applied. The actual increase payable by any individual rate payer may be more or less than this, depending on the movement in the site value of each property.

RATE REBATE

A rebate of rates of any ratable land in the Council area will be in accordance with the *Local Government Act 1999* and Council's Rate Rebate Policy.

SERVICE CHARGES

EFFLUENT MANAGEMENT

Council maintains and manages a Community Wastewater Management System. A charge is applied to each property that is serviced by this system. **Council has increased this service charge by 3% to \$491 for the 2021-2022 financial year.**

KERBSIDE COLLECTION

The Council charges a service fee to offset the cost of kerbside waste collection. **Council has not increased this for the 2021-2022 financial year.** The service charge per 140 litre bin is \$200.00 per annum.

REGIONAL LANDSCAPE LEVY (RLL)

The Regional Landscape Levy, formerly the 'Natural Resource Management Levy'. Council is required to collect this levy on behalf of the State Government for no net gain to Council.

Road Damage Caused by Ribbed Rollers

Managing the life cycle of our road network is a tricky business, balancing costs against rates while trying to keep our road users safe. One issue that comes up regularly is the towing of ribbed rollers on our unsealed roads. This practice is illegal and has a significant impact on the life of our roads. As the attached photos highlight, the rollers break the hard surface resulting in accelerated wearing, and eventually potholes, particularly on the crown where most traffic travels.

There may be simply a lack of awareness in the community. We've had rollers towed past our working graders on a couple of occasions. The fact is that these types of plant need to be floated or driven along sidetracks. We can no longer bear the cost of this happening to our roads.

Deliberate Damage Caused to Road Safety Signs

Assistance for businesses employing young people

YOUTH JOBS PaTH (Prepare – Trial – Hire) provides funding to trial a young person aged between 17 - 24 to find out if they're the right fit for your business. If the trial is a success and you hire the young person, you may be eligible for further funding. Grant funding available of up to \$10,000 for Australian businesses.

- Prepare: Young people will undertake Employability Skills Training to prepare them for work.

- Trial: You can trial a young person in an internship for between 4 and 12 weeks and receive a payment of \$1000 (GST inclusive) to help cover the hosting costs. Business Support Package

The new Business Support Package will assist an estimated 50,000 eligible* SMEs across the state, including restaurants, cafes, hotels, and tour and experience operators, affected by the new restrictions to help stop the spread of the highly-contagious COVID-19 Delta variant.

Grants will help businesses cover ongoing operating costs such as rent, power bills, supplier costs and other fees, and help them to re-open when restrictions ease.

The major support package also includes a new \$1,000 cash grant for eligible** small businesses who don't employ staff (e.g. non-employing sole traders).

How to access business support:

- To register interest in Business Support Package cash grants, complete the form at treasury.sa.gov.au/sbg or email smallbusinessgrant@sa.gov.au. Applications are expected to open within the next two weeks via treasury.sa.gov.au and grants will be processed as quickly as possible.

*To be eligible for the one-off \$3,000 emergency cash grant, a business must, as at 12:01am Tuesday 20 July 2021:

- Be located within South Australia
- Have an annual turnover of \$75,000 or more in 2020-21 or 2019-20, and be registered for GST
- Employ people in South Australia
- Have an Australia-wide payroll of less than \$10 million in 2019-20
- Have a valid Australian Business Number (ABN)
- Experienced at least a 30 per cent reduction (compared to the week prior) in turnover due to the restricted trading conditions

**To be eligible for the one-off \$1,000 emergency cash grant, a non-employing business must meet the criteria listed above excluding the requirement to employ people.

Jobs & Economic Growth Fund

The Economic and Business Growth Fund was established as part of the 2018-19 Budget to promote economic growth in South Australia by encouraging growth of existing industries, developing new industries, building international connections, and attracting foreign and national direct investment.

From 1 July 2021, the Fund will be renamed the Jobs and Economic Growth Fund and will have funding capacity of \$200 million over four years to focus on supporting initiatives that create long-term sustainable jobs and economic growth.

Boosting Apprenticeships

The Boosting Apprenticeship Commencements wage subsidy supports businesses and Group Training Organisations to take on new apprentices and trainees, to build a pipeline of skilled workers to support sustained economic recovery.

Through the subsidy, any business or Group Training Organisation that engages an Australian Apprentice between 5 October 2020 and 31 March 2022 may be eligible for a subsidy of 50 per cent of wages paid to a new or recommencing apprentice or trainee for a 12-month period from the date of commencement, to a maximum of \$7,000 per quarter. There is no cap on the number of eligible trainees/apprentices.

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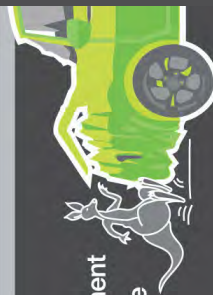

The Australian Border Force protects Australia. Our officers work to prevent dangerous items like illicit drugs and firearms from crossing our border, and to stop visa fraud and the trafficking and exploitation of foreign workers.

Sometimes, threats can be detected within our border. So if you see something suspicious—or something that just doesn't feel right—flag it anonymously with Border Watch and help the Australian Border Force keep our community safe.

CUSTOMS AND BORDER PROTECTION OFFENCES INCLUDE:

- importing illicit or performance enhancing drugs
- importing firearms or other weapons
- people smuggling or human trafficking
- wildlife smuggling
- illegal foreign fishing
- importing illegal pornography and child abuse images
- importing counterfeit goods.

WHAT TO FLAG:

- Yachts and pleasure craft in remote or unusual locations
- Unusual activity on beaches, remote areas or at sea
- Evidence of interference with wildlife, flora or fauna
- Unusual aircraft movements or unusual use of airstrips
- Aircraft or vessel loading or unloading goods in unusual locations
- Someone attempting to take delivery of goods at odd hours of the day

Information provided to Border Watch by members of the community and industry has been instrumental in hundreds of seizures of illicit drugs and weapons. This information has also supported investigations related to illegal work operations and the exploitation of foreign workers.

VISA AND IMMIGRATION OFFENCES INCLUDE:

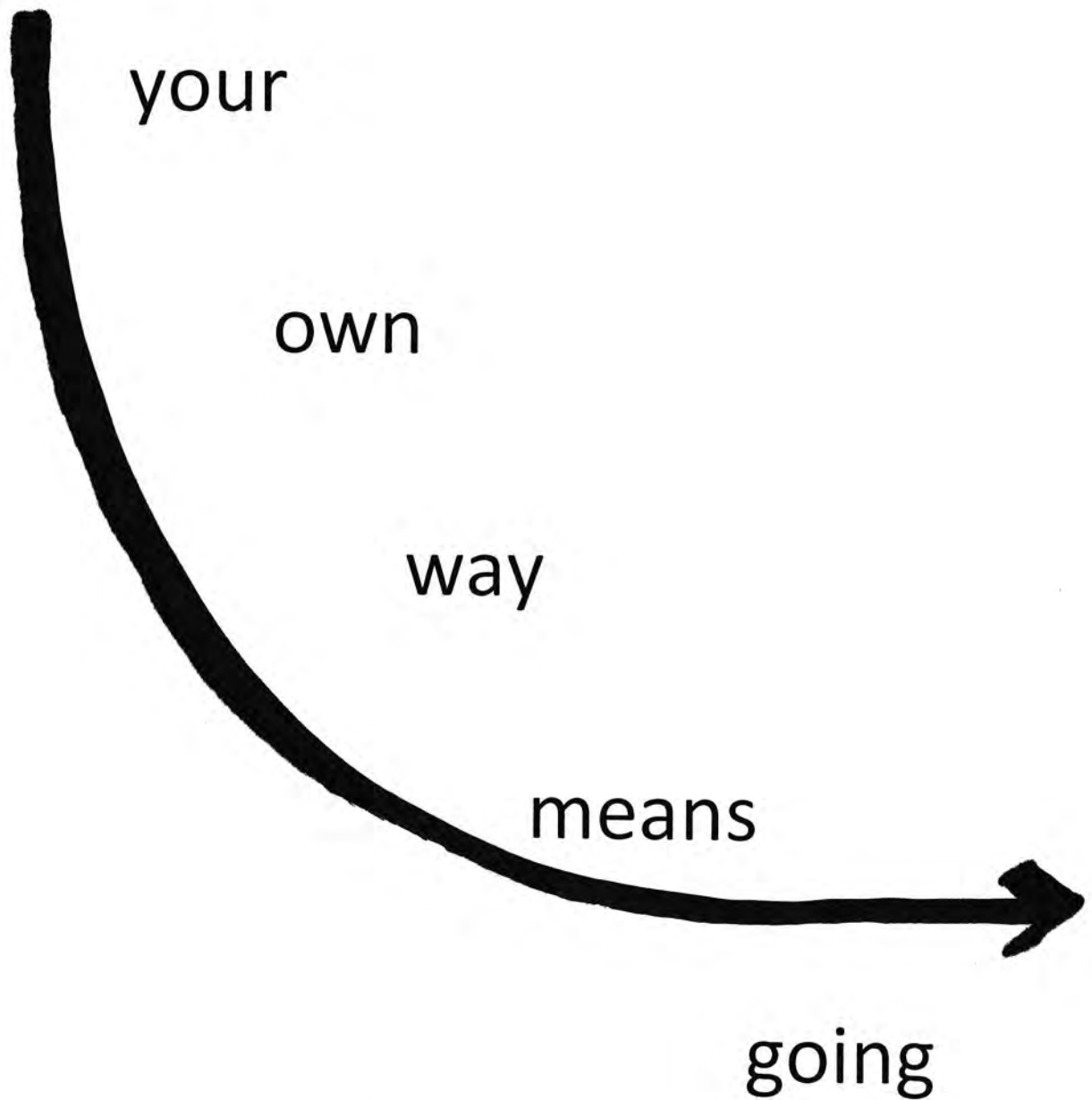
- trafficking and exploiting foreign workers
- breaching visa conditions
- travelling to, or residing in Australia, in order to work unlawfully
- committing identity fraud, entering a fake marriage or relationship, providing fraudulent documents, or lying to obtain a visa
- providing immigration advice without being a Registered Migration Agent.

WHAT TO FLAG:

- Agricultural businesses offering financial and other incentives to people travelling on tourist visas
- Someone using an obvious fictitious or generic name or trying to conceal their identity
- Someone offering incentives to businesses to sponsor their stay in Australia
- Someone entering into a relationship with an Australian citizen to support a visa application
- Foreign workers receiving cash payments from businesses
- Foreign workers claiming to be underpaid or mistreated
