Finance and Risk Audit Committee

A meeting was held on 1 November 2022 to review its work program, review policies, consider WHS Management Planning, Asset Management Plans, Draft Financial Statements and Budget Review 1.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Local Drug and Alcohol Action Team LDAT

The Community Development Supervisor is working with the LDAT Committee and the Alcohol and Drug Foundation to create its second Community Action Plan. The first CAP plan enabled the Parents Night Out and the two-day Skate and Scoot Family Fun events. A survey has been distributed online and throughout the school to gain feedback on what the community would like to see, this information will be used to create the plan. Implementation will begin in early 2023.

Volunteer Training Program

A survey was distributed to various sporting and recreational groups seeking their feedback on training/education priorities and that information has now been collated. The survey feedback has indicated the community groups would like to see workshops focusing on grant applications and management, sport and recreation visit, event management, governance, and work health/food safety. The team will now work towards engaging appropriate personnel to deliver the training which will commence early in 2023.

Australia Day Award Nominations

Nominations opened in October and will close on November 18, 2022 for Australia Day Award recipients.

Stephen Yarwood City 2050 – Streaky Bay Area School Workshops

Council were successful in gaining \$5000 funding through the Commissioner for Children and Youth and engaged Stephen Yarwood director of City 2050 and previous Adelaide Lord Mayor to deliver future thinking workshops to school students from Streaky Bay and Miltaburra schools.

The workshops were well received and key themes for the students included; maintaining our environment, jobs, more food options, improved connectivity, art works, increasing numbers of trees, more spaces to hang out, sustainable tourism, jetty improvements, more cycling and walking trails, recycling, and vet services.

Streaky Bay Area School Year 9 Healthy Living Workshops

The General Manager – Prosperity and Community Development Supervisor have been attending the school on a weekly basis facilitating 1-hour workshops with the Year 9's around initiatives that can contribute to healthy living. Discussions have included; what Council is and isn't responsible for, costs of projects, how we get funding, how we make decisions for projects, street audits and project ideas. We are aiming to get a collation of project ideas that will be circulated to Council for information purposes.

Community Grants Program

Council released it's reinstated Community Grants Program in October 2022 and applications were assessed and awarded in November, successful applications and projects were;

The opening of the season was delayed until 1 December due to the availability of pool supervisors.

With the power outages in late December, it damaged the chlorine controller and the pool was again closed for a period of time while the appropriate parts were delivered for repairs.

Santa in Streaky

Santa once again made his presence known in Streaky Bay, visiting the supper room and made 80 local and visiting children happy with a conversation, discussing their Christmas wish lists and a lolly bag to keep them going for the day! We thank Santa again for making the long trek and look forward to his visit again next year.

Christmas Lights Competition

Council this year ran a community Christmas Lights competition, there were some fantastic displays around town from both private residents and businesses, providing a great level of competition. First Prize for a joint win was with Warren Habel and Rosie Pepper and Best Business Front went to Streaky bay Motel & Villa's. Thank you to everyone that participated.

New Years Eve

The Family Festival was a great success seeing over 290 children participating in the 4 hours of fun with Xtreme Kites and Paddle. Feedback received on the night and over the last week has been positive.

The Men's Shed, Thip Thai, Basil and Belle, Pizza 4Shore and Streaky Bay Tourism and Business Association all reporting great sales for the evening and a worthwhile event for their fundraising.

Streaky Bay Tourism and Business Association sold Glow Sticks in partnership with Council, with the profits from this donated to the Fireworks committee.

The Fireworks were fantastic as usual thanks to the Streaky Bay Community Hotel Board.

INFRASTRUCTURE

PLEC Undergrounding of Power – Eyre Avenue

Council received a report and endorsed the application for funding of overhead powerlines along Eyre Avenue and adjoining streets, this endorsement was an in-principle support subject to future costings and budget considerations.

Roads Construction

- Emerald Rise Road 2 sections completed
- Westall Way Loop 5km Completed
- Barrets Road 2.5km to be completed

Streaky Bay Jetty Pool Platform Extension and Shade

Lions Park Development

Council has received funding for and commenced the design process for the Lions Park Upgrade in Streaky Bay. WAX Design who are also undertake the township planning have been engaged to undertake design and contract specifications for the development. Community consultation for the concept designs will commence later this month. The project will include a new toilet facility, shelter and seating area, low scale play space, greening, improvement of water and dump point access.

Streaky Bay Town Entrance Statement Design

Council has engaged Armsign consultants to undertake design and implementation of the signage. One sign will be installed at either entrance to the township of Streaky Bay.

Streaky Bay Way2Go Program

Way2Go is a state-wide South Australian program promoting <u>safer</u>, <u>greener and more active travel</u> for primary school students and their communities. It uses a <u>whole school approach</u> built on a <u>partnership</u> between local councils, school communities and the Department of Infrastructure and Transport (DIT). Council Officers and the Streaky Bay Area School recently partnered to undertake a localised study. Teachers, Students and Parents were consulted as part of the project and the report has been received with relevant Council Officers identifying key project and appropriate areas of support that can assist with and encourage safer, greener and more active modes of travel, a follow up meeting between DIT

staff involved in the project and Council Officers was recently held.

Stormwater Management Plan Development

Council will over the coming months be seeking to begin the process of the development of a detailed stormwater management plan for the region.

The scope of the project will be as follows;

- Historical Flood event assessment, including flood modelling validation of observed rainfall event, comparison to anecdotal evidence
- o Detailed flood mapping (including hazard mapping) and network capacity
- o Existing stormwater infrastructure
- o Community Consultation
- o recommendations in relation to Water Sensitive Urban Design (WSUB)
- o Inclusion of Future Development in modelling
- Inclusion of non-structural mitigation options
- Strategy and Action Plan that includes both capital and recurrent costs
- Wirrulla, Poochera and Sceale Bay Stormwater Issue and Reuse possibilities high level qualitative assessment and strategies
- o Robinson Basin Reuse high level qualitative assessment

Waste Management Strategy

Council will seek to develop a 5–10-year waste reduction, resource recovery, and circular economy strategy (Strategy) that includes:

- Summary of Council services, facilities, and performance including a regional summary
- Implementation plan of 5-10 years incorporating annual measures
- Information and findings for the background and opportunities report
- Potential future infrastructure needs and investment opportunities to inform investment and grant funding decisions.
- High-level costs.
- Grant funding

Waste management is a large expenditure are of Council with no *detailed* waste strategy in place. Reviewing current practices and developing or strategy that Council can work towards to improve environmental performance and balance service costs and meeting community needs.

Streaky Bay Tree Management Assessment

As part of the Lions Park Redevelopment and Streaky Bay Foreshore Tourist Park Development tree assessments are required prior to any development. In assessing this Council Officers agreed that it would be worth investigating a whole of town assessment being undertaken.

A consultant has been engaged to undertake the process.

The key aspects of this will include;

- Arborist Report (this will consider species, health and structure, arboricultural rating, safe useful life expectancy, risk posed)
- Priority Action Plan (including high level costing)
- Tree Species List Development
- Review of Council Tree Management Policy

This project is due to commence in late January 2023 and be completed by the end of the financial year.

TOURISM AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Responsible Camping Campaign

Prior to this holiday season, Council successfully implemented its responsible camping and holidaying campaign.

This campaign included signage relating to waste disposal, camping, grey/black water disposal and general behavior. In addition to signage flyers and pamphlets were distributed throughout a variety of outlets and a social media campaign.

Murphy's Haystacks Development

Road intersection development has been progressed during the month of December, upon completion of the intersection upgrade the require infrastructure will be purchased for the site, designs and styles have been selected in conjunction with the site owner, it is hoped to have the project completed prior to the end of January 2023.

Business Use of Roads and Policy Guidelines

Council endorsed the above policy in recognition and support of the practice of selling or promoting some products from public roads within the Council area and acknowledges the need for appropriate permit procedures and guidelines for these activities to ensure public safety and fair sharing of Council's Road reserve spaces.

This permit system is intended to guide how public road verges are to be used for business and other related purposes in ways that ensure an appropriate balance between the interests of the Council, street traders, residents, and visitors.

This Policy does not apply to:

- permanent or all year-round fruit sales outlets within private property
- stalls of any type intended to be located at one site for more than 3 months;
- Mobile food van vendors (separate Policy)

Council Officers in coming months will be seeking to renew and implement all permits relating to the Policy.

Township Future Planning

Council commenced in early 2022 the engagement process for the selection of consultants to undertake the development of Township Management (Master) Plans for 6 key townships, a Caravan and Camping Strategy and review of the Coastal Management Plan.

Community Drop In sessions were held across the district in mid September 2022, following these sessions a consultation summary report was completed and is available on Council's website www.streakybay.sa.gov.au/majorprojects

Streaky Bay Youth Precinct (Skate Park)

Council received a presentation from CONVIC and a report in which the draft concept plans were endorsed. Engineered Drawings and Site Plans have now been developed and Development Application has been submitted.

Tractor Beach and Speeds Point Crown Land Licence Agreements

The Tractor Beach and Speeds Point applications to gain a licence of the land to enable Council to have Care and Control have now been received. Tractor Beach will come online to bookings in line with Perlubie and discussions will now commence regarding the appropriate levels of camping for Speeds Point.

Cutty's Boat Tours

It has been great having Cutty's Boat Tours undertaking crab tours in Streaky Bay this summer, whilst the weather has been challenging at times for them, staff have reported tours have been steady.

Township and District Management Plan Reviews

CEO UPDATE

From the CEO's desk

Holiday Season Report

After an initially quiet start, it would be safe to say that the summer holiday period is here with an influx of visitors coming to Streaky Bay and the district.

Visitor Centre numbers suggest we so far have had a bigger than normal year with many tourists who traditionally holiday in the Riverland having changed their plans and have visited Streaky Bay.

The biggest change Council has undertaken this summer period was taking care and control of Perlubie Beach and introducing camping permits for there and the Tractor Beach campground. Ultimately, the reduction in camping numbers has been received positively with feedback provided, such as:

- Local families have enough room to undertake day trips to the beach again
- Accommodation providers were able to again send visitors to the beach to visit for the day
- Those staying at the beach have enjoyed the size of their sites and commented that less individuals staying on the beach has meant less vehicle movements which has made it a safer experience for their children
- Everyone who stayed on the beach were supportive of the changes and for those who stayed at the beach the previous summer, they could see why we had to make the changes

There has no doubt been a few learning lessons for us and these include:

- We have an ongoing issue of individuals paying to stay, not cancelling their booking and/or then not showing up. Leading to many sites which were booked and paid for, being left vacant
- This is apparently an issue with all the campgrounds across the Eyre Peninsula who have introduced permits for camping
- There was little interest in the Perlubie sites allocated to the locals meaning most of the sites remained vacant for the majority of the holiday period. The other sites were fully booked for the entire period

We will take these learnings back to the Perlubie reference group to develop solutions for them.

In terms of enforcement, we have undertaken numerous patrols on different days and at different times. As a result of these patrols we have issued a number of expiation notices (fines) and moved on numerous individuals with warnings. I have heard of some stories about illegal camping across the district and the note the following:

- Council only took care and control of Perlubie Beach and the Tractors Beach campground. Many other locations, including many beaches are still under the care and control of State Government which means Council Officers cannot enforce in those areas.
- Council has limited human resources at its disposal so we can't be at all places at once. So, if you have any concerns, please refer them to Council so they can investigate them. In terms of Council's response to illegal camping, this summer Council has responded to every single complaint which has been logged with them.

In terms of our efforts in managing the extra influx of visitors, I'm proud of the efforts our team has undertaken this year and the improvements we have undertaken since I arrived at Council. However, I still concede we still have plenty of work ahead of us.

Participants came from as far away as Perth, Darwin, Alice Springs, Bendigo, Melbourne, Adelaide, from across the lower and upper Eyre Peninsula, Oklahoma USA and Cork Ireland.

From the moment the siren signalled the start of the competition there was intense fishing. The rules stipulate the event has a catch-and-release policy and that only scaled fish were applicable.

The Fisheries department were in attendance and handed out a pamphlet on the various fish species which was helpful to the young anglers.

Local fishing aficionado, Dion Edmunds of Streaky Bay Marine Products and Vice President of Streaky Bay Tourism and Business Association, was on hand encouraging the anglers and identifying the species caught. Dion commented how great it was to have locals and visitors enjoying the day together and that the Association could continue to offer this as a free community event.

The winner on the day with the Biggest Catch was by angler Indi Climas with a Flathead weighing 0.58kg. Indie a 14-year-old from Henley Beach won \$300 cash, a fishing rod and trophy.





Runner up was 4 year old Iggy Chynoweth from Streaky Bay scoring \$200 cash, a fishing rod and trophy for his catch of a King George Whiting weighing in at 0.33kg.

Cash prizes of \$5 were awarded to 24 angler's catching 3 or more species. The 11 angler's catching the heaviest of each species received \$10.

To commemorate the event, organisers Streaky Bay Tourism and Business Association, acknowledged the contributions of Life Member and Founding Member of Family Fish Day - Mr Graham Redding with a trophy. Fifteen years prior to current event, the competition was known as a Snapper carnival that ran for the season. Mr Redding has been involved since the very first event 35 years ago.

Local couple Donald and Janet Williams donated a quality rod and reel to the Unluckiest Angler. A young man from Perth that didn't catch a thing despite trying hard, didn't go home disappointed.



Major sponsor Killas Fuel, Tackle and Outdoor Equipment owner-operator Nigel Brace was on hand to award the trophy's. Nigel and his team have championed this event over many years and organise the equipment required including feeding and quenching the thirst of the early rising anglers.

Rules


The following rules must be observed by pool patrons at all times when using the pool and its facilities.

- Persons are not permitted to enter the pool without payment of fees. Pool supervisor reserves the right to check for Annual Pool passes.

- Appropriate swimwear must be worn at all times (see details below)
- Do not use pool if you are feeling unwell or showing symptoms of cold or flu, or directed to be isolating in accordance with SA Health Regulations
- Do not use pools if you have suffered from diarrhoea in the past week.
- Do not use pool if you have any open wounds
- Members and guests, not toilet trained must wear swim nappies.
- In the instant that faeces enters the pool the Pool Supervisor MUST be notified immediately and the pool must be closed immediately
- The pool is a multi-use pool.
- Nappies are not to be changed at poolside. Please make use of the toilets or lawn areas.
- Safety Equipment must not be tampered with
- Pool Users are not permitted to enter the Plant Room
- Pool Users are not permitted to use school equipment relating to the pool
- Do NOT RUN
- Do NOT PUSH or THROW People In
- Diving and Jumping are only permitted in the deep end of the pool
- NO glass, food or drinks (other than water) are allowed in the pool area.
- NO Smoking or alcohol is allowed within the school grounds
- Soft Water toys may be used at the discretion of the lifeguard.
- Body boards and surfboards are not permitted.
- Sitting or hanging on lap lanes is prohibited.
- Avoid eating or consuming alcoholic beverages before using the pool.
- Animals are prohibited.
- If animals are found within the pool (i.e. Snakes), notify the supervisor immediately
- Behaviour deemed not conducive to public safety will not be permitted.
- Boisterous or dangerous behaviour will not be tolerated.
- The pool must be vacated during electrical storms.
- The lifeguards have full authority to enforce rules in pool facilities
- All rubbish and waste must be removed from the Pool area and users are responsible for the disposal of their own waste

Child Supervision

Council Waste Matters

Cardboard is free to drop off at the Transfer Station and greatly reduces the volume in your kerbside bin reducing what goes to landfill.

The cardboard is baled on site and freighted to YCA Recycling in Adelaide for recycling. A truck load of 80 bales was transported in January.

A reminder that the transfer station accepts the following non-deposit items for recycling:-

- Plastic milk and cream bottles, washed with the lids removed opaque in colour
- Cardboard, cut or broken up into pieces that fit into a 240litre wheelie bin (please note that cardboard and cardboard boxes not to the correct size will be charged)
- Tin and steel cans, e.g. fruit tins, soup cans, etc. washed with the lid put inside the tin

Please ensure your waste is sorted prior to arrival, this avoids contamination of waste.

The Environment Protection Authority (EPA) has imposed strict conditions on the disposal of waste in South Australia. The attendant will direct you to where your waste is to be placed – penalties will be imposed on Council for contaminated waste by the EPA. Your cooperation in sorting your waste is greatly appreciated.

The attendant has the right to refuse any waste that is not sorted.
