Council News

INFRASTRUCTURE

Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Funding (Phase 4 – Part B)

Additional funding has become available specifically for roads under the above program. The following projects were considered:

- Road project, focusing on tourism Sealing of Scales Bay to Point Labatt Road
- Road project focusing on community connectivity – Sealing of Mount Cooper Road
- Road project focusing on pedestrian safety

 East to West Pedestrian and Cycle
 Pathway (Montgomerie Tce), incorporating linkages from Montgomerie Tce to Bay Road.

With Council resolving to deliver the Sealing of Mount Cooper Road with the funding.

Lions Park Project Development

The Lions Park project developed has commenced the demolition stage and now earthworks associated with the road, toilet, and swale construction. All play equipment and other infrastructure has been ordered and awaiting delivery.

Youth Precinct

The precinct is at about 70% completion and has been open to the public. It was disappointing in the first few weeks of it being open that Council Officers received concern about the behaviour of users with some of the equipment and infrastructure at the facility, our community is very fortunate to have this facility and would be unfortunate should this equipment be broken and subsequently removed from use. The delivery of the toilet facility is still outstanding and the installation the facility will require further trenching and construction works and therefore final works to the facility will not be undertaken until this facility is installed.

Depot Office Transportable

Council committed to and have had installed additional demountable office buildings at the Streaky Bay Depot. The additional office space has enabled the Infrastructure Management Team of Council to relocate from the Main Office to the Depot. This project has been completed.

Council Office Lift Installation

The Lift installation to the Main Council Office has been completed. The lift is a legislative requirement within the Local Government Act as Council Meetings must be able to be accessible by all persons. The lift itself is located within the Council Chamber room, with entry from the front foyer of Council.

REGULATORY AND DEVELOPMENT

Informal Caravan Parks

Council has received over the past year an increase in the number of informal Caravan Park complaints, with many landowners seeking to take advantage of an increase in the self-drive market and low cost camping opportunities.

Whilst many parcels of land permit this type of land use, a change in land use is still required in most circumstances, requiring a development application. Council Officers have been pro-active in following these up and providing the required responses to land holders to advise them of their obligations.

Caravans Stored on Land

Council Officers have undertaken inspections across the district and subsequently notified relevant landholders of their obligations. This has been a lengthy process, however continued follow up has resulted in the removal of many vans throughout the district to ensure that they are stored appropriately.

Home Based Businesses

The area has always been subject to many home-based businesses due to the lack of retail space and the benefits of having businesses at home. However, there are regulations around the permission of home-based businesses and the amount of m2 that are dedicated to a home-based business before a development application is required for change of land use, to residences hosting multiple businesses. Council Officers will continue to monitor this and address where and when required.

Food Handling Safety and Food Business Inspections

Council Officers recently engaged Environmental Health Consultants to undertake legislated food business inspections, this included mobile food vans, home based businesses, main street businesses, education facilities, Council and sporting group facilities. Reports following this have been provided and will be reviewed by Council Officers accordingly.

The process has included correspondence to all Food Businesses outlining their new Food Handling Responsibilities under the Food Safety Act, and a community information session that was facilitated by Council Officers with the Consultants undertaking a presentation on these responsibilities, and an opportunity for questions and answers, this was well attended with approximately 20 participants (information packs were also provided at this information session).

It will be important moving forward that Council continues its obligations and provides follow up inspections to ensure that businesses are meeting the required standards.

Footpath, Driveway and Roadway Alterations

Council would like to remind residents, businesses and contractors undertaking works that any works that involving changes to a driveway (between the property boundary and the kerb/road), footpath or road require a permit and approval from Council prior to works commencing. This is a legislative requirement under the Local Government Act.

Residents and businesses are reminded that you must also have a permit for placement of items on the footpath or roadway, planting of vegetation on footpaths or road verges, and the placement of items such as large rocks, timber or other items on footpaths or road verges, this includes rural and fringe roads.

TOURISM AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Speed Limits on Council Beaches

This review has been completed. A reduced speed limit from the 100kmh speed limit received an overwhelming response to reduce the speed limit to a default speed of 40kmh and 25kmh when passing or within 100m of a pedestrian. This was also supported by key stakeholders including National Parks and Wildlife and SA Coastal Councils Alliance.

All feedback from the engagement process is being considered to inform a final decision on a new default beach speed limit by the end of 2023. Perlubie Beach Speed Limit

Perlubie and Perlubie Beach (formal correspondence received from the Department of Infrastructure and Transport)

- o The 40 km/h Area speed limit will apply to all roads in the town, including Wharff Drive.
- An END Area sign is not required at the beach car park, as Area speed limits do not apply to road related areas, such as car parks or beaches.
- o Drivers will enter the speed limited Area applying to the roads in the town when they leave the car park.
- The entry to the beach will be signed 40 'On Beach" (a linear speed limit).
- oOn Perlubie Beach, 40 km/h linear speed limit signs will be placed entering the length of beach (from the Eba direction) designated by council for camping, with a **linear** END(40) sign facing drivers leaving the area in the direction of Eba.

Township Entrance Statements – Streaky Bay

Development approval has been received and Council are currently awaiting construction to commence.

Poochera Play Space Design

As per the Annual Business Plan for 2023/24 budget was allocated for play space design for Poochera near the Museum Precinct. Quotes have been received (within budget) for this project, however the project will await the outcome of the Masterplan for Poochera before progressing, therefore will seek to commence in early 2024.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Naidoc Week 2023

Council Officers worked closely with event organisers to deliver a Naidoc activity for the community on Thursday 7 July 2023. A great community attendance of members school/kindy classes attended the event, undertaking in activities including basket weaving, painting, story times and smudge sticks. This project was a joint initiative between Landscapes SA, Streaky Bay School Community Library, Naidoc Event committee and the District Council of Streaky Bay. Council assisted the event by providing venue hire, PA hire, advertising, tea and coffee facilities and staff assistance for the day.

Local Drug and Alcohol Community Action Plan

The first Community Action Plan workshop took place at Streaky Bay Area School on 26 and 27 June with Encounter Youth hosting Vaping Information Sessions with the year 7's to year 12's, approximately 132 students attended these sessions and assist in educating the youth on the risks of vaping.

Art workshops will also be offered to youth within the July school holidays, on Tuesday July 18 there are three sessions of clay plate painting being offered at just \$10 ahead thanks to the LDAT funding. Registrations are now open.

SUSTAINABILITY

Robinson Basin Lens

Council has proceeded with the engagement of a relevantly qualified consultant to undertake a review of the current and future options for the Robinson Basin water lens located just outside of Streaky Bay on the Flinders Highway.

Tree Management Policy Review

Following the completion of the community consultation sessions and arborist report on trees within Streaky Bay, a review of Council's Tree Policy

was undertaken, and this Policy was endorsed by Council at it's August 2023 meeting.

Recreational Fishing Tourism Strategy

Council considered a report that outlined the purpose and proposed outcomes of the South Australia's proposed Recreational Fishing Tourism Strategy for SA, that aimed at strategies primarily to increase the economic opportunities of fishing tourism within the state. Council considered the proposal and provided a response acknowledges the project, and advised it is not wise to be launching a strategy that focuses heavily on promotion and economic impact without balancing out sustainable fishing promotion, and potentially activities such as the implementation of a recreational fishing licence in which monies can be reinvested to increase compliance, education and supporting infrastructure.

CEO UPDATE

From the CEO's desk: Our Mayor: Going the Extra Mile for Our Community



Gazania (Gazania spp.)

Fact sheet

What do they look like?

Gazania is a drought tolerant perennial herb that is supported by a shallow rooted rhizome system. It grows to an average of 30cm tall. Originally from South Africa, the plant has daisy-like flowers ranging in colour from orange, red, yellow and purple. The leaves are dark green-silver and very hairy underneath. They are long and thin and measure 5-10cm long and 3-20mm wide. The tufts appear as a thick mat, displacing other vegetation in the area. The plants flower from June to December and are often seen in disturbed areas such as roadsides and coastal dunes.



The one seeded fruit is egg-shaped with scales and hairs. The plant reproduces from seed, which is spread by the wind and stolons (stems). The seeds are thought to be shortlived. The plant can also hybridise with other subspecies of Gazania (such as *linearis* and *rigens*.)

Why should Gazania be controlled?

A garden escapee, Gazania is commonly found on the Eyre Peninsula. It has become an environmental weed after being widely planted for ornamental purposes. It easily colonises disturbed ground such as roadsides but invades bushland, crops and vineyards. Once established gazania can form dense stands that exclude all other plants. It impacts on native vegetation by competing for moisture and nutrients. It spreads along road reserves, degrading remnant native vegetation. It invades and degrades coastal dune vegetation.





What are my responsibilities?

Gazania is a declared weed under the *Landscape South Australia Act 2019*. On the Eyre Peninsula the transport and selling of the plant is prohibited.

What are the best ways to control Gazania?

Established infestations can be difficult to remove, but a sustained effort can yield good results. The two main methods are physical and chemical control.



Physical control

Seedlings, small plants and small infestations can be grubbed, making sure all the rhizomes are removed. Correct disposal of grubbed plants is essential to prevent further spread of this weed. It is recommended that you first remove and bag the flower heads to prevent seed dispersal and place them in your red rubbish bin for deep burial at the dump. Once the plant is removed it is a good idea to compact the soil back down to prevent further weed infestation. Planting a competitive replacement is advisable to inhibit re-growth from the Gazania. Known sites should be regularly checked for regrowth.

Chemical control

Large infestations of gazania are best controlled with herbicide. Foliage should be thoroughly sprayed to runoff and care taken not to miss any part of the plant.

Here are some of the chemical formulation options:

Spray plants until just wet with a mix of 50ml glyphosate (450g/L) in 10L water.

In bushland areas use 4g of Lontrel®750 plus 25ml Pulse® in 10L water to reduce damage to companion plants.

200g/ha of Lontrel®750 plus 0.25% wetting agent can be used for roadside and overall spraying.

Roundup Biactive (glyphosate (360g/L) at a rate of 100ml to 10L of water can also be used for conservation areas, bushland and other non-crop areas.

In 100L of water mix 250ml of Lontrel advanced with 2L of Bioweed Organic pine oil. Or in 100L of water mix 500ml of Lontrel 300 and 2L of Bioweed organic pine oil.

The best time to apply herbicides is in autumn or spring, but good results can usually be achieved any time the plants are actively growing.

Do you have Gazania?

If you think you have Gazania on your property, Eyre Peninsula Landscape Board staff can provide advice on control and management.
