Council News

GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Disability Access and Inclusion Plan

The Plan was endorsed by Council at the August 2020 ordinary meeting of Council. The requirement to gazette the document was removed from legislation on 27 August 2020 and the Plan will now be uploaded for access directly via the Council website, https://www.streakybay.sa.gov.au/your-council/latest-news/draft-disability-access-and-inclusion-plan

Wirrulla Triangle Use Negotiations

This action is currently on hold due to other Native Title hearings occurring in the area. Staff will progress this again when the timing is appropriate. Please contact the Council CEO should you have questions regarding this.

Andromeda –Poochera Kaolin Mine

This project has been renamed the Great White Kaolin Project. The group are currently in the Definitive Study Phase. Council has issued a letter of support to the group to allow continued access to the site across an unmade road reserve. This is an administrative matter and will be dealt with in stages as the project commences.

Wirangu No. 2 Tenure Dispute Status Update

The hearing over the only tenure dispute of the Wirangu No2 Determination (the Streaky Bay Golf Course area) is now being heard "on papers". Council's solicitors are positive regards the possible outcomes but further information will be given when the judge hands down her findings. We are expecting the Consent Determination hearing to occur in Streaky Bay in October 2020 and will commence discussions with representatives of the group for Council to support that process.

SAROC (SA Regional Organisation of Councils) – call for membership

Council endorsed at the August 2020 ordinary meeting of Council that Mayor Barber be nominated on behalf of the EPLGA group of Councils to sit on the SAROC Committee.

Local Government Reform Bill

Council has submitted a document outlining Council's support and objections to various areas of the Bill. Council has opposed only those areas that will increase costs to Council and are not practical in application. Much of the reform suggested is in areas Local

Government has been suggesting and requesting for some time.

A meeting was held on the evening of 26 August 2020 with the Opposition Bench regarding the Bill. Feedback was very positive regarding their support for the work Local Government is doing to provide services and support to communities.

BUSINESS AND ADMINISTRATION SERVICES

Community Bus Hire Policy Review

Staff have reviewed the Community Bus Hire Policy and Procedure to include actions relating to processes in relation to the pandemic. A fact sheet and checklist in relation to cleaning, has been included our processes, to ensure that hirers are aware of their new responsibilities.

Streaky Bay Hall Hire Procedure Review

Staff have reviewed the Streaky Bay Hall Hire Procedure, to include actions relating to processes in relation to the pandemic. A fact sheet and checklist in relation to cleaning, has been included our processes, to ensure that hirers are aware of their new responsibilities.

Street Stall Procedure

Staff have developed a fact sheet to assist community groups in understanding their responsibilities in relation to undertaking a Street Stall.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Carawa Cemetery

Council endorsed to proceed with the transfer of land to the Council that is currently the site of the Carawa Cemetery. The Manager, Business and Administration has engaged a Landbroker to undertake this process.

Foreshore Tourist Park Development

A full survey of the Tourist Park has been completed including new and existing infrastructure. These new survey plans will be used for the future redevelopment of the Park. Renewal/upgrade of amenities has been bought forward as a priority.

Poochera/Wirrulla/Piednippie Court Resurfacing (Drought Communities Fund)

Contractor has been engaged. Wirrulla & Piednippie programmed for November 2020. Poochera programmed for January 2021.

Council News Cont'd

Kerrin McEvoy Sculpture Project

Council received a request from the project committee seeking Council's endorsement for Council to take ownership of the statue following installation. Council accepted ownership of the statue subject to a formalised MOU regarding the ongoing management and maintenance of the asset with the current Committee.

Men's Shed Shipping Container

Council endorsed a request from the Men's Shed to place a shipping container on the existing site of the Men's Shed. Council agreed to the placement of the container on the subject land with the colour of the container and surrounding aesthetics to be considered to minimise the visual impact of the building.

Council staff met with the Men's Shed representatives and it was identified there is limited location options due to underground infrastructure however an initial plan to install the container to the west of the main building is favoured. Painting and screening will be undertaken as required.

Wells Street – School Zone Precinct

MICW has held discussions with the Principal of the Streaky Bay Area School and Department Planning Transport Infrastructure. DPTI are forwarding a design recommending that the bus location be slightly modified, and signage altered. Design will be finalised first week in September.

Wells Street – Review of Plans

Draft designs / plans have been received and discussed at Council's Roads Consultative Committee. Committee Members are given time to consider and report back.

Streaky Bay Heavy Vehicle Bypass – Plans Development

Draft designs / plans received and discussed by Roads Consultative Committee.

Road Construction

The construction team are currently working on Finlayson Road, moving onto Dog Fence Road.

Road Maintenance

Graders will be working their way around the district (moisture/weather permitting). During this patrol grading season (commencing in April) staff have patrol graded approximately 685 kilometres. Now working on

the Carawa/Petina Roads moving to Haslam / Dog Fence Road. The other Grader is moving to Jessie Flat Road to perform private works.

Poochera Oval Complex – Ceiling Replacement

Quotations have been received for Ceiling removal / reinstatement. Further damage has been located and a full report is being prepared for Council.

Jetty Pool Shade Shelter/Platform Extension (Drought Communities Program)

Design meetings underway. MICW has met with the Jetty Pool Committee and held discussions with a couple of suppliers around design concepts. Next discussions will be with a local engineering company.

PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT

Planning Reform

Phase 2 Councils (which includes Streaky Bay) are now live on the ePlanning Portal. All development applications must now be submitted through the ePlanning Portal for processing.

The Eyre Peninsula Regional Assessment Panel has been approved by the Minister and the Regional Assessment Manager has been appointed.

PDI Act Fees and Charges

A report outlining the fees and charges was presented to the August ordinary meeting of Council. Please see report and minutes for full details.

Finlayson Road Intersection with Highway

The Required Deed has been executed and the surveyor will now prepare final drawings for Council approval to complete the process for submission to the Land Titles Office. Council's solicitors are preparing the Form 3 Waiver and registering the Deed with RevenueSA as Council is responsible for the Stamp Duty pertaining to the execution of the Deed.

Tyringa Road Realignment/Land Swap

Road Opening Process Documents and associated plans have been received by Council and a report has been prepared for the September Ordinary meeting to allow the Mayor and CEO to finalise the required documents for lodging with the Lands Title Office.

Gibson Peninsula Code Amendment

A request for a Code Amendment has been submitted to DPTI for consideration. This is the first Code Amendment submitted under the new Planning Act. The Regional Assessment Manager is working closely with Council and DPTI to finalise the matter as soon as practicable.

Sceale Bay Solar Peer to Peer Pilot Project

The proponents of the project presented to the SA Power Networks Regional and Remote Communities Working Group.

SA Power Networks Customer Consultative Panel Updates

The Customer Consultative Panel has continued to meet via Zoom. Submissions have been made to the AER regarding new pricing arrangements and regarding rural and remote isolation of services.

SA Power Networks Regional and Remote Communities Working Group Updates

The working group has been meeting regularly and are about to undertake a project prioritisation process to provide support to relevant rural and remote projects to address electricity access inequities.

REGULATING

Dog Holding Facility

Council now has officially taken over the use and maintenance of the animal holding facility on Jessie Flat Road.


Animal Registrations

Council has had a fantastic response to the Dogs and Cats Online (DACO) registrations this year. As of 28 August, 82% of dogs and cats have been renewed which equates to 227 extra animals registered compared to the same time last year. The Dog and Cat Board sent out an automated message to pet owners who were yet to register their animals in the middle of August.

The General Inspector investigated and initiated the sending out of targeted SMS messages to owners of unrenewed animals in the week prior to late fees being applied, resulting in an extra 15% of dogs and cats being registered. This pushed the District Council of Streaky Bay to the equal top 3 percent of its dog and cat registrations of all 68 Councils within the state. An automatic late fee of \$20.00 will be charged on the 2 September for any unpaid registrations.

Fire Prevention

From 31 August the General Inspector will start conducting grassland fuel load and curing assessments throughout the district. This information is provided weekly to CFS and distributed to the CFA and BOM organisations, to assist in making decisions regarding upcoming weather events throughout the season eg. Fire ban declarations of certain areas. The information gathered and collated is used for up to date online mapping showing the rate of curing of grassland/crops state-wide. This information is collected until the grassland is at 100% cured – which normally coincides with the start of the Fire Danger Season – normally the 1 November each year.

SERVICE CHARGES

EFFLUENT MANAGEMENT

Council maintains and manages a Community Wastewater Management Scheme and charges for all properties serviced by these schemes. The service charge is set at \$477.

KERBSIDE COLLECTION

The Council charges a service charge to offset the cost of kerbside waste collection. Council has not increased this for this financial year. The service charge per 140 litre bin is \$200.00

REGIONAL LANDSCAPE LEVY (RLL)

The Regional Landscape Levy, formerly the 'NRM levy, is a state government tax which Council is obliged to collect on behalf of the State Government for no net gain to Council. The rates are as below

- Residential \$79.15
- Commercial \$118.72
- Industrial \$118.72
- Primary Producers \$ 158.30
- Other Vacant Land \$79.15

ANNUAL BUSINESS PLAN & BUDGET SUMMARY

2020/2021

RATES AT A GLANCE

Comparing rates between Councils is difficult as every Council has different attributes and provides varying services or similar services at different standards. Council deliver an extensive range and level of service to the community with the greater part determined by the expectations of our communities.

METHOD USED TO VALUE LAND

All land within a Council area, except for land specifically exempt (e.g. Crown land and Council occupied land) is rateable. The Council may adopt one of the three valuation methodologies to value the land in its area. They are: Capital Value, Site Value or Annual Value.

Council has decided to continue to use *site value* (the value of the land and any improvements which permanently affect the amenity of use of the land, such as drainage works, but excluding the value of buildings and other improvements) as the basis for valuing land within the Council area. Council considers that this method of valuing land provides the fairest method of distributing the rate burden across all ratepayers on the following basis:

GENERAL RATES

Council sets differential general rates of: Residential, Town Centre, Industry, Light Industry (Aquaculture), Primary Production, Rural Landscape Protection, Rural (Deferred Urban), Coastal, Country Township, Settlement, Rural Living, Commercial (Bulk Handling), Recreation and Tourist Accommodation (Coastal). These differential general rates are further divided between land uses.

A fixed charge of \$600.00 will be levied against each separate assessment with only one fixed charge levied against two or more pieces of adjoining land. An overall rates increase of 1% has been applied. However, the actual increase payable by any individual rate payer may be more or less than this, depending on the movement in the site value of each property.

RATE REBATE

A rebate of rates of any rateable land in the Council area will be in accordance with the Local Government Act and Council's Rate Rebate Policy.



The Annual Business Plan sets out the District Council of Streaky Bay's proposed services, programs and projects for 2020/2021.

The budget will be funded by;

- Overall rates increase 1%
- Fixed charge of \$600.00, levied against all rateable properties CWMS Levy \$477 (all applicable land)
- Waste Levy \$200 (all properties within the waste management collection area with an occupiable dwelling)
- Fees and Charges
- Grant Funding
- Council Loans

Council's expenditure is more than its projected income. However, Council has indicated that they may borrow for the Streaky Bay Foreshore Tourist Park Upgrade, which equates to \$1,075,000, if Council does this, then the net borrowing will return a net lending amount of \$145,000.
