Council News

FROM THE CEO'S DESK

This year's annual business plan and budget is now out for public consultation. This document sets out Council's proposed priority projects, services, programs and other initiatives for the coming financial year.

The Annual Business Plan and Budget 2023-24 demonstrates our intent to continue to deliver quality services, maintain financial accountability, sustainability and work with our communities.

Our goal is to create a strong, sustainable Streaky Bay and District for today and for generations to come. We want to ensure your rates are working for what you tell us matters most to you. We've heard you are seeking balanced and connected ways of working to deliver well-kept roads, efficient waste management, and services to build and support communities, as well as new projects to get us ready to face the future.

This year, to enable us to meet our obligations, your expectations and set in place the conditions for a sustainable budget, our rate increase will be 8.5 per cent. This is aligned with the CPI inflation levels of Adelaide and of course, Council administration will work very hard on our efficiency in all areas of the business to ensure Council can continue to keep rate increases to a minimum.

In 2022/2023 works commenced on the Pioneer Park Redevelopment project and the construction of the Streaky Bay Youth Precinct, this will see the creation of a new adventure play space, new areas for family and friends to gather, activity spaces for young people and vital upgrades to the existing Skate Bowl, as well as other enhancements to the two areas. Major projects will continue to be rolled out throughout the coming year and we are looking to commence the following projects in 2023/24:

Streaky Bay:

- Design, Procure and Installation of a new Airport Lighting Control System complete with new Pilot Activated Lighting controller with voice recognition.
- Procurement and replacement of aging Christmas Decorations
- Upgrades to the Streaky Bay Tourism Foreshore Park (Caravan Park)
- Development of a secondary dump point in Streaky Bay
- Replacement of the aging Massa Bridge
- Installation of a back-up power generator for the hall and Council administration centre
- Upgrades to the Waste Transfer Station
- Replacement of the bollards at the end of Bay Rd

Sceale Bay:

- Opening of the Heart Bay Road

Poochera:

- Installation of a Dump point
- Development of the Poochera Landscape and Playground plan and costings

Wirrulla:

- Installation of a Dump point
- Sealing of the bike and pedestrian path from township to sporting reserve

Perlubie:

- Redevelopment of the Wharff Road and Perlubie Beach Intersection

Haslam:

- Repairs to the Haslam Jetty to ensure its longevity

We will also commence, as well as finalise some important community planning activities, including the development of an Economic Development & Investment Attraction Strategy, Storm Water Management Plan, Waste Management Strategy, Township Master Plans, Caravan and Camping Strategy, Youth Development Strategy and Asset Management Plan.

Internally within Council, there will be investment in systems, technology, plant, equipment and business processes as we look to modernise and provide our workforce with the tools that they need to continue to improve the way we do business and improve the provision of services to the community. A large investment is being made into refurbishing the Council Depot and Alfred Terrace Administration Office, including addressing noncompliance's at the site, replacing end of life infrastructure and creating new office space and facilities. This will also see the consolidation of the infrastructure team at the depot.

Ultimately, this year's Council activities will position Council to better understand its future priorities, improve the way we do business and improve the provision of services to the community, whilst delivering some key projects across the entire district.

For more information, please refer to the full Rating Review Paper 'A Review of the Basis of Rating Consultation Paper'. This summary provides a summary of the reasons for and impact of the changes that will occur in how the Council rates properties in its district.

How do Councils calculate Rates?

Councils calculate rates by dividing the total rates needed for council operations by the total valuations of all rateable properties in the council area. This results in a Rate in the Dollar (RID), which is used to calculate the rates charged on a property by multiplying its value by the RID.

What is changing?

Council previously used the Site Value of your property to calculate rates. The Site Value is the value of the land only.

Local Government legislation in South Australia has changed, which means that Council will be required to calculate your rates using Capital Value instead of Site Value. Capital Value is the value of the land plus the value of all improvements, such as buildings.

Council is also considering moving to rating by Land Use which considers what properties are used for instead of where they are. Rating by Land Use divides the properties in the district into categories that are more simply defined.

This allows Council to see more clearly how different types of ratepayers are being affected, and then Council can determine if support is needed for specific categories.

The Land Use categories are:

- Residential
- Commercial (Shop, Office and Other)
- Industrial (Light, Other)
- Primary Production
- Vacant Land
- Other

The Locality of Employment Bulk Handling and Land Use Commercial will be retained to identify the Silos in the district.

Council has analysed the effect of the change to Capital Value on properties and, to minimise the impact, will also increase the Fixed Charge to \$695.

What will be the effect of these changes?

The effect of these changes is a distribution of rates across properties in the district. Many properties will have lower rates than in the past, but many will have higher rates.

The table below shows the expected changes for each category. Your current rate notices show the Land Use rating category for your property.

Valuations of properties will continue to change until Council adopts its rates. The figures below are based on valuations available to Council at this time but will vary with final valuations.

How will I know what is happening to my rates?

Council will hold an information session to explain the changes. There will also be the opportunity to ask about your property and see the expected changes.

- Presentation - Thursday 1st June, 6.00 pm

Council staff will be available at this session and the following sessions for you to see how changes are expected to impact them.

- Drop-in Sessions - 29th May to 31st May
- Public Meeting - Tuesday 20th June, 9.30am-10.30am

What can I do if I have trouble paying increased rates?

Council understands that some ratepayers will have higher rates to pay than the previous year, which might be difficult for them. Council can support ratepayers in this situation by making arrangements to pay rates over a period of time.

Ratepayers who hold a Seniors Card can apply to Council to postpone payment of the portion of rates on their principal place of residence that exceeds \$500. Interest accrues on the postponed amount. Postponed rates are not required to be repaid until the property is sold.

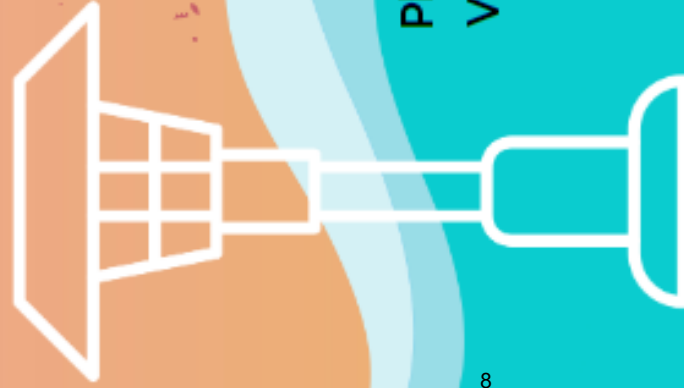

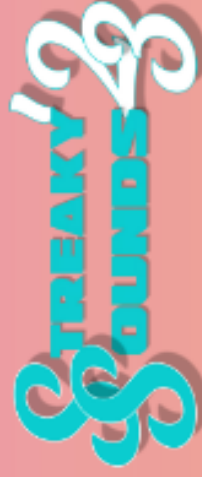

Community News

FAITH NOTES

Initially, Anzac Day commemorated those who sacrificed their lives in World War I – the Great War.

However, in the years since World War I, Australian troops have answered the call to serve in conflicts across the globe, and today has become the day on which the nation remembers all those who have served and all those who have made the ultimate sacrifice in all the conflicts they have participated in.

At Dawn on Anzac morning many gathered at the Streaky Bay Jetty with people across the cities, towns, small communities, churches and aged care homes of our nation to remember and honour those who made the supreme sacrifice at Gallipoli in 1915 and all who have given of their lives and skill to enable us to have the freedom and prosperity which Australia has known ever since.

We remembered with pride and gratitude those of our town and district who served in World War I, World War II and in the theatres of Korea, Malaysia, Borneo, Vietnam, Iraq and Afghanistan.

We remembered, too, the sacrifice of almost 9,000 Australians who died at Anzac Cove and the 18,000 who were injured.

Australia's losses on the Western Front were staggering, with more casualties in the first six weeks of our involvement than the entire eight-month Gallipoli campaign. By the end of 1918, 46,000 Australians had lost their lives and 132,000 were wounded.

The human toll measured in loss of life was enormous. Nearly 100,000 Australians died in the two World Wars and a further 155,000 were injured.

The human toll is not measured simply in lives lost but needs to embrace the impact of war on economic, social and family life, the physical injuries sustained, the often prolonged mental and emotional anguish of those who returned and the diminishment of their quality of life.

Our community is grateful to President Peter Elyward, Secretary, Mick Stewart and their Executive for their efforts in bringing us together to keep the ANZAC story alive in our community.

Anzac Day enables us to pause with grateful hearts remembering what others have done for us, to ponder the values we want to underpin our way of life and to pray for our Australian and New Zealand servicemen and women who have given their lives in love for us and our nation.

May they rest in the peace and presence of our resurrected Lord. Lest we forget.

On the 27th of April some members of Probus visited Gracie's succulent gardens on the Sceale Bay road.

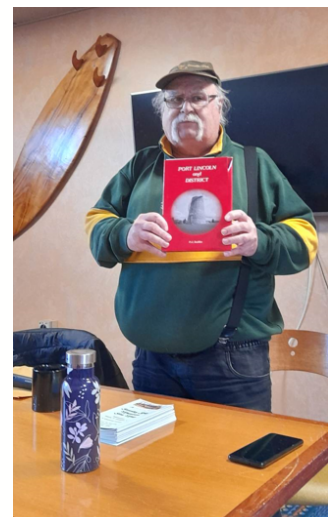
At our meeting on the 20th we had a guest speaker in Neil Humphry Morgan. This was a Q & A format.

EP LANDSCAPE BOARD UPDATE

Pest Plants

The Board continues weed control in the region. During May the following works are planned:

- Boxthorn control along Back Beach Road and Cape Bauer Road
- African Lovegrass control within the township of Streaky Bay
- Ongoing Gazania control to halt the spread outside of the Streaky Bay township into our vulnerable coastline, vegetation communities and pastoral lands. Control in the Wirrulla area is also planned.

Pest Animals

Fox population sightings have been higher than average with landholder baiting groups now complete. Fox Baits for landholders can still be purchased from the Streaky Bay or Ceduna Eyre Peninsula Landscape Board offices.

Bilbies at Venus Bay CP

Remote camera monitoring and feral predator control continue at Venus Bay Conservation Park. Recent camera data indicates increased sightings of endangered species' the Greater Bilby. Monitoring and Feral predator control is occurring under the Saltmarsh Threat Abatement and Recovery Project funded by the Federal Government, and assists protect a number of threatened species including the Hooded Plover and Greater Bilby, along with migratory and resident shorebirds.

Grant Opportunities

Heritage Agreement Grant Funding

The Native Vegetation Heritage Agreement Grant Program is now open. Grant funding is available to provide support to landowners to help manage biodiversity on their properties and may include assistance for fencing, pest plant and animal control and biodiversity monitoring.

Grants are available for works on individual Heritage Agreements or works spanning multiple Heritage Agreements. There are three tiers of grants available (GST inclusive), up to \$100,000. Grants can be for one-off activities or activities that span multiple years.

CHANGES TO GREEN WASTE

As part of Council's Environment Protection Authority (EPA) Licence No. 2108 for the Streaky Bay Transfer Station, it is a statutory requirement that the green waste drop off area needs to be securely fenced with restricted and supervised access during transfer station opening times only.

A contractor has been engaged and will soon commence the construction of a secure chainmesh fence which will adhere to Council's statutory requirements of its EPA Licence No. 2108 for the Streaky Bay Transfer Station.

Access to the green waste drop off area once the fence is constructed, will be via the main entrance gate and then via a new access gate into the green waste drop off section.

It is also a requirement that all waste loads are inspected, including green waste prior to drop off. Customers are to present to the attendant on arrival, the load will be inspected and the attendant will advise where to offload.

Please ensure that your green waste is free of contaminants such as plastics, steel and other materials as Council reserves the right to refuse the load until the green waste is clean.

A WORD ON CARDBOARD

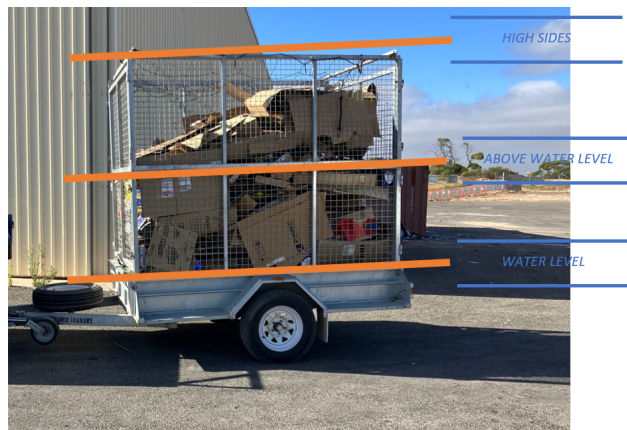
We are seeing huge amounts of cardboard being deposited at that Transfer Station that is becoming increasingly difficult to manage and noting large amount of contamination that is occurring that requires staff to sort and dispose prior to baling.



Council Officers / Transfer Station attendants will be monitoring this and loads may be rejected should they deemed to have high levels of contamination.

All Cardboard should be cut to size of 500mm x 500mm (or fees apply)	
All Cardboard MUST be flattened	
All packaging MUST BE REMOVED from the box and disposed of in general waste	
No Magazines, Paper, Wrapping Paper, Polystyrene, Plastic or Bubble Wrap as these are considered contaminants
