Council News

GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Annual Business Plan and Budget

A workshop was held on Monday 9 March 2020, with the budget presented and endorsed at the 18 June 2020 Finance Risk and Audit Committee with the recommendation for Council to take the proposed budget out for Public Consultation. Council resolved at the June ordinary meeting of Council that the budget be adjusted with two (2) options to be reworked and provided at a Special Meeting to be held July 2, 2020.

Strategic Management Plan Review

The process of redeveloping the Strategic Management Plan and subsequent implementation of the Corporate Plan will continue in the following manner:

- A workshop for Elected Members will be held on 1 September 2020;
- Presentation of the Draft Strategic Management and Corporate Plans to the Elected Body will be undertaken at the 17 September 2020 Ordinary Council meeting
- If endorsed at the above meeting with documents will go out for Public Consultation from 21 September to 21 October 2020
- A second workshop will then be held with the Elected Members on 28 October 2020 to consider all public feedback received
- Presentation of the Strategic Plan and Corporate Plan for Adoption will be made at the 19 November 2020 Ordinary Council Meeting

Genetically Modified Crops – Determination of Council's Position

Council received a report at the May 2020 ordinary meeting of Council outlining the State Governments decision to lift the moratorium on genetically modified crops in South Australia. The State Governments legislation required individual Council area's to decide if they were to retain the moratorium (criteria was required to enable moratoriums to remain). Council resolved at that meeting to enable the lifting of the moratorium for the area of the District Council of Streaky Bay and that Council supports the growing of Genetically Modified Crops. A division was called and full details are available within the Minutes.

Sale of Land for Non Payment of Rates

A report was presented to the April 2020 ordinary meeting of Council, with the purpose of this report to present to Council the current status of the sale of

properties for non-payment of rates for 3 years as per Section 184 of the *Local Government Act, 1999*. During March 2020 staff have posted 14 Notices of Intent to Sell. Property assessments, location, land status and the amounts owing at the time of notice were presented in that report. Council resolved at that meeting to continue to follow up some properties and other properties to go to auction.

Royal Commission into Local Governments Role in Natural Disasters

Council staff have submitted a submission in response to the Governments Royal Commission. Council provided responses to what Councils capabilities and role has been in various aspects of disaster recovery including planning, preparation, response and recovery. A full copy of the submission is available in the June 2020 Council Agenda.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Drought Funding – Federal Government \$1m

Grant Agreement has been issued and signed. Staff met with all community group representatives in February and have continued to liaise with these groups and advised them to continue with planning and getting appropriate approvals in place. The Tennis Court Projects planned to begin in October (COVID dependant), other projects to commence in July.

Andromeda Road Development

Discussions have commenced with Andromeda regarding their requirements for the Poochera-Port Kenny Road section they will need to utilise. They have completed engineering drawings and plans and these have been submitted to Council. Council will assist in trying to facilitate access to funding through the Special Local Roads Program to ensure this development is supported in its efforts to be ready for production. The Pre-Feasibility for the project has been published and Andromeda will now move to the Definitive Feasibility Study as part of the mining approval process. Representatives from Andromeda presented to Council at the June Council meeting.

Wells Street – School Zone Precinct

Council has been investigating options regarding the speed zones along Wells Street, including discussions with School Governing Council Committee. The initial recommendation from SBAS Governing Council/SAPOL Meeting has been presented to Department Planning Transport and Infrastructure for feedback. Consensus at the meeting was to investigate a "School Zone" –

25km/h when Children present, with Flashing Lights still in place. DPTI to respond shortly regarding acceptability. A further Meeting with the Road Safety Group is proposed for July 27, 2020.

Bay Road Streaky Bay – Stage 2 (Anderson/Redding Intersection)

Stage two of the Bay Road Project being the Anderson Road and Redding Road Realignments. Majority of the works have been completed including sealing and the remediation of the reserve at the intersection of Park Avenue/Redding Road and Bay Road. Works still to be completed include line marking.

Gibson Peninsula – Roadworks Remediation

Bitumen works complete. Stormwater swales to be completed by end of financial year.

Road Construction

Works on the Kingoonya-Yantanabie Road, Haslam Highway, Dog Fence Road, Poochera Port Kenny Road and Wallala Hill Road have been completed. The construction crew are now finishing up on Emerald Rise Road. The construction team plan to then start works on Benbarber Road.

Roads budgeted for the 2020/2021 Financial Year are; Anderson Road, Haslam Road, Dog Fence Road, Emerald Rise Road, Poochera Port Kenny Road, Wallalla Hill Road, Kingoonya-Yantanabie Road.

Road Maintenance

Patrol grading

The patrol grading program is in full swing, graders will be working their way around the district over the coming months (moisture permitting). As of the 26/06/2020 approximately 1402 kilometers of patrol grading has been completed this financial year, with approximately 425 kilometres being completed since the 2020 program commenced in April.

Finlayson Road Intersection with Highway (both ends) Development

A draft Deed has been provided by the solicitors requiring some further information before it can be finalised. This information is being followed up by the CEO with a view to finalising the Deed as soon as possible.

Tyringa Road Realignment/Land Swap

The land swap and realignment have been gazetted as part of the public consultation process. No objections, nor requests for the easement were received. The surveyor will now complete the final survey and complete the process to conclude the road opening and closing process.

STORMWATER MANAGEMENT

Philip Street

Staff have been liaising with local contractors to develop a localised solution in this area. A quote has been received and works are currently underway in line with existing building activities in the area.

PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT

Eyre Peninsula Joint Planning Board and Regional Assessment Panel

The Panel must be in place by end of July 2020. The Assessment Manager position will report to the Panel. Each Council party to the panel will be required to pay an annual fee and the cost of accessing the services of the panel for each development application that is to be assessed at that level.

The selection of the Assessment Manager process has been finalised, however the shared services agreement is yet to be finalised.

Development Act Delegations – Planning Consultant

Whilst the shared service agreement is being finalised the appointed Regional Assessment Manager is unable to assist Council. In the interim Council has engaged a consultant planner to undertake the required duties.

Wirrulla Triangle Use

The CEO has signed the application to dedicate crown land for the purpose of having the parcel of land locally known as the “Wirrulla Triangle” dedicated to Council and required trust account to be established. Council is currently awaiting confirmation of this application. Once that is received works may commence on the “Triangle”.

Baird Bay Township Coastal Wall

A meeting with Baird Bay residents on Monday 2 September 2019 proved very successful with a number of residents attending. Residents' ideas were considered against the Baird Bay Coastal Adaptation Study and priorities regarding mitigation etc were also discussed. A grant application was submitted to the Coast Protection Board to survey and develop a concept design (Stage one) and detailed design works

(Stage 2) which meets Council responsibilities and residents' concerns regarding amenity.

Tender closed and awarded to WGA Design. Proposed design has been presented following meetings with DEW, NRM and WGA.

Through approval with DEW & NRM, design will now be presented by 30 June 2020. Consultation/discussion with residents underway. WGA visited Baird Bay 24th June.

WASTE MANAGEMENT

Cungena Landfill Land Purchase

Council considered a report to the May 2020 Ordinary meeting of Council regarding the purchase of additional crown land for the purpose of expanding the Cungena landfill site, Council resolved to not pursue and that Council form a working party to assess all options for a long term landfill site for the Streaky Bay District.

Review CDL Operating

New Opening hours were implemented (to bring in line with Transfer Station and increase Safety of Workers). These hours began on 2 June 2020. The hours will be reviewed over the coming weeks, once backlog begins to reduce due to the CDL being closed for a period of time due to COVID-19. Operational costs to be considered in "whole of Waste & Recycling review".

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Baird Bay Telecommunications Tower

The tower has been installed and is operational. Positive feedback regarding reception in the area has been received.

Foreshore Tourist Park Development

A full survey of the Tourist Park has been completed including new and existing infrastructure. These new survey plans will be used for the future development of the Tourist Park. Renewal/upgrade of amenities has been bought forward as a priority.

Andromeda –Poochera Kaolin Mine

Pre-Feasibility Study has been completed and published. The next stage of the mining approval process will now commence to the Definitive Feasibility Study. The current study has confirmed the use of a wet processing option onsite and has flagged the possibility to include a dryer in the onsite processing. This will allow reclamation of 30% of the water used in processing. Under the latest Pre-feasibility Study the

mine life has been extended from the initial 15 year estimate to a 26 year project.

Mobile Blackspot Funding – Round 5A – Discussion Paper Submission

Council staff have prepared a submission for the Government in response to a submission paper regarding the guidelines and priorities of the next round of Mobile Blackspot funding. The submission included a response to shared networks, infrastructure, priority locations, funding provisions and partnerships. A copy of the submission is available in the June 2020 Council Agenda.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

National Reconciliation Week – Flag Raising and Activities

Cr Karp raised a question on notice to the June ordinary meeting of Council regarding the flying of the Aboriginal Flag during National Reconciliation week and activities that celebrate the week. Council staff apologised as the opportunity was missed, Council currently do not undertake activities as there is no budget allocation for this. The CEO advised that following the Wirangu Consent Determination finalisation, Council may need to develop a Reconciliation Action Plan that could include dates for the flag to be flown and suitable events to celebrate the week.

REGULATING

Moore's Boat Ramp By-Law

To ensure the structural integrity of the new boat ramp for the long term, Council will implement By Law No 4 provisions to restrict the use of the ramp and pontoons to only the launch and retrieval of vessels. The mooring of vessels to the boat ramp will be strictly prohibited and become an offence subject to expiation.

ANIMAL MANAGEMENT

Dogs On Leash Signage

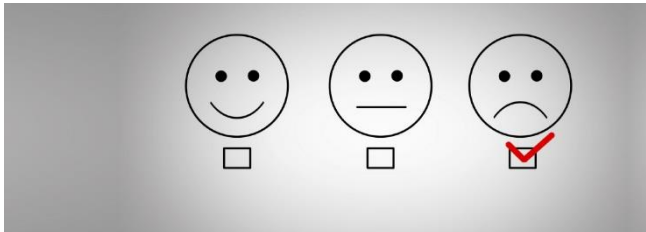
As per the Animal Management Plan, the General Inspector and works staff have undertaken the installation of Dogs on Leash signs at Scales Bay, Back Beach, Haslam, Perlubie, Surfers Beach, Hallys Beach, Yanerbie. Streaky Bay signs will be installed shortly, on arrival of the signs.

Dog Holding Facility

Early in May 2020, the operators of the Dog Holding Facility advised that due to changes to their insurance conditions, they would not be undertaking the operations of the Dog Pound, including members of the public.

Council News Cont'd

Council, currently owns two of the holding pens, that are located on this land, and there has been no planning in relation to the relocation of these facilities. So, in the short term, the owners have agreed to the DCSB being able to use all of the dog holding facilities, when required, and that staff will undertake the responsibility of running the dog holding, for impounded dogs only.

From 29 June the Planning and Design Code (the Code) for South Australia's outback and rural areas is available to the general public for familiarisation purposes. The Code is accessible via the ePlanning platform at www.code.plan.sa.gov.au.

The community familiarisation period has been provided to make sure that all South Australian's are confident and familiar with the new planning system ahead of the Minister's formal adoption of the Code and the planned implementation for Phase Two (Rural Areas) on 31 July 2020.

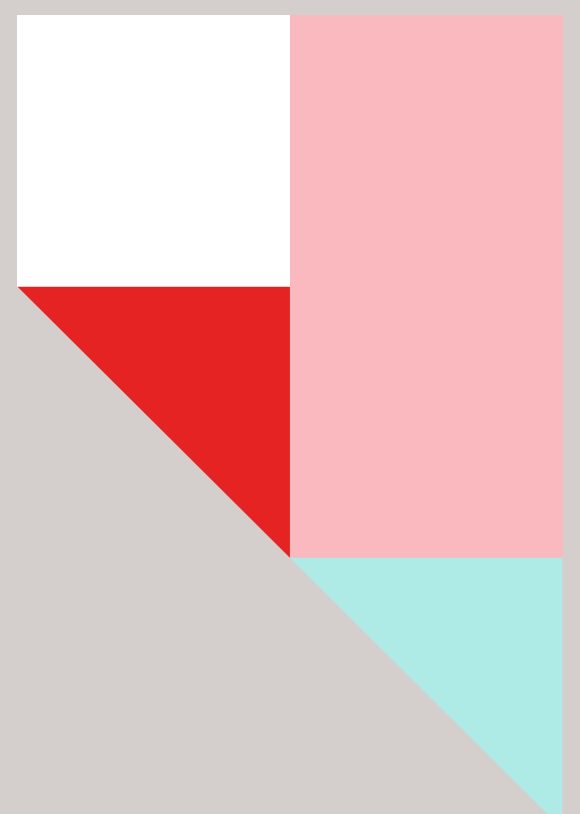

Metropolitan addresses, whilst able to be entered, will not display a result as the Phase Three Planning and Design Code has not yet been added to the ePlanning system.

The third and final phase of SA's new planning system for urban and metropolitan areas of South Australia is under active consideration and on track to be implemented later this year.

Council has identified a number of significant projects and/or activities for the coming year:

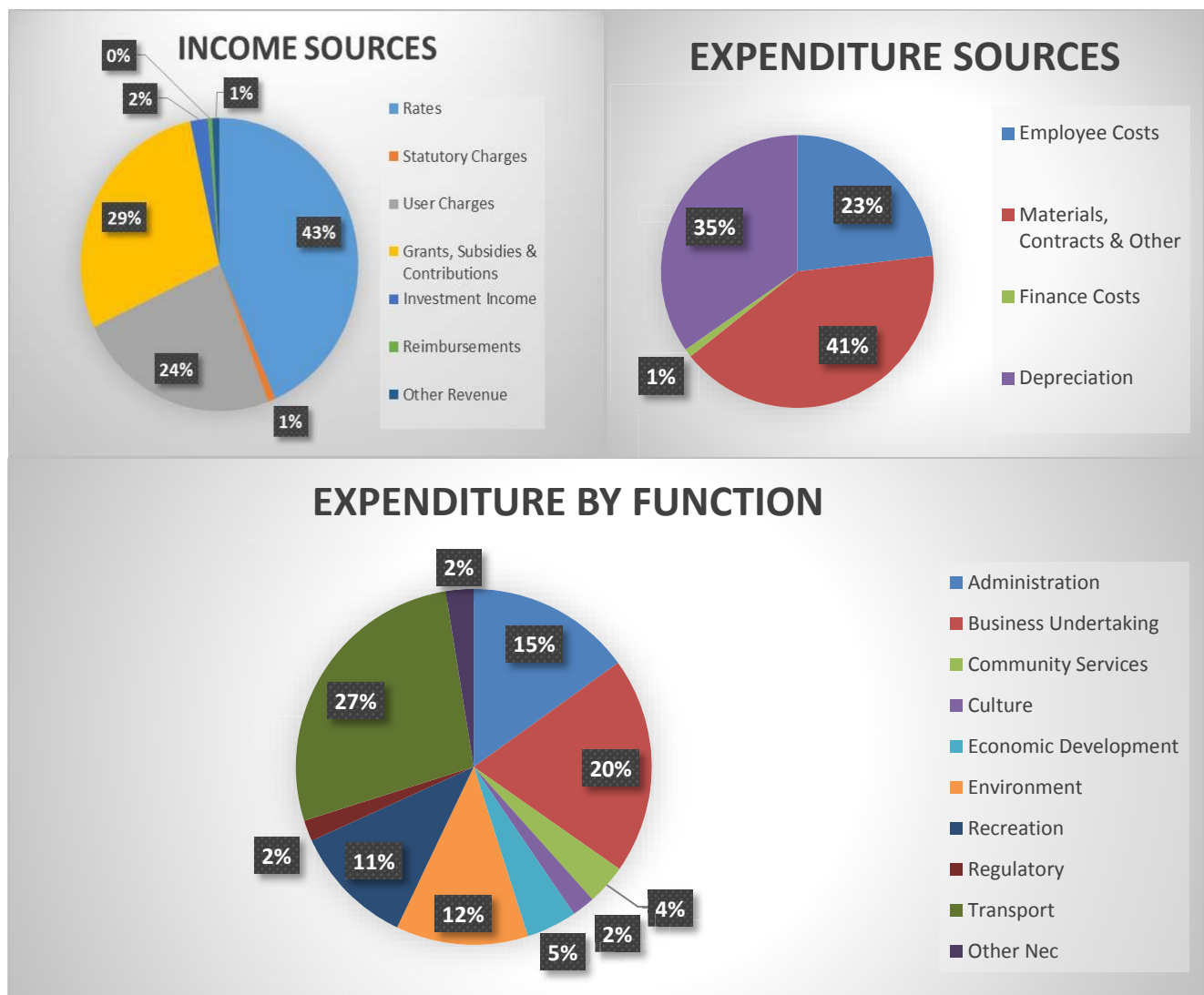

Council has budgeted for an *operating* deficit of \$704,241. Council has budgeted for an operating deficit over the last 5 years, however, Council has generally delivered an operating surplus.

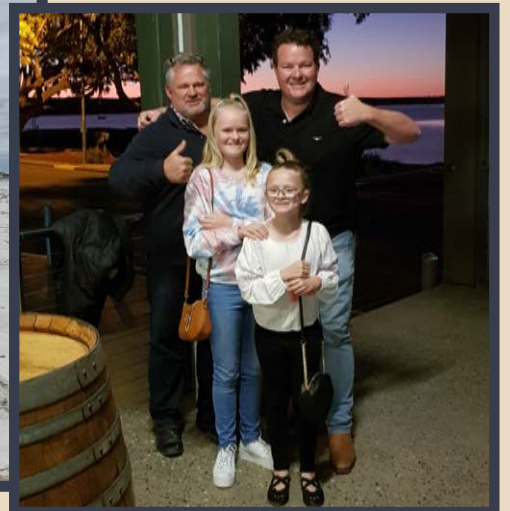
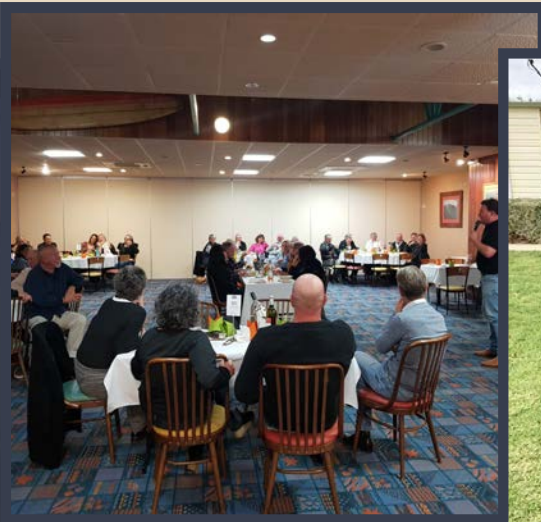
Filming was taking place at Murphy's Haystacks as part of the SATC segments, and further filming was then undertaken around Westall Loop and the Streaky Bay Township.

Marine Safety Notice—Streaky Bay, Sceale Bay, Baird Bay & Haslam

Locally available 24/7 Adelaide Monitored VHF Marine Emergency Radio Service is on Ch 16 and on supplementary CH 67, via equipment on Government Radio Network towers at Elliston and Streaky Bay's Gibson Peninsula and is well receivable within Streaky Bay. However in some areas both inside and outside of some of the other bays, that signal can be marginal due to terrain shadowing.

Daylight Hours Local VHF Marine Radio Services:

The call signs are **VMR Baird Bay**, **VMR Haslam** and **SES Streaky Bay** these are manned by SES members. Call sign **VMR Streaky Bay** is a non SES operation from Killas Service Station, Wells Street -manned during business hours.

Local Services Provided:

Locally operated stations primarily monitor for general calls and the hours are usually 8.00am to 5.30pm varying to 8.30pm. Some stations can provide you with a signal check, but they do not normally offer a regular voyage booking/tracking service unless that is agreed by prior arrangement. They also can be used for emergency calls and will monitor emergency calls.

Local Streaky Bay UHF CB Repeater is CH7 and can often be used for all types of emergencies during long term blackouts to Streaky Bay area mobile phone services. Radius is approx 35kms from Streaky Bay

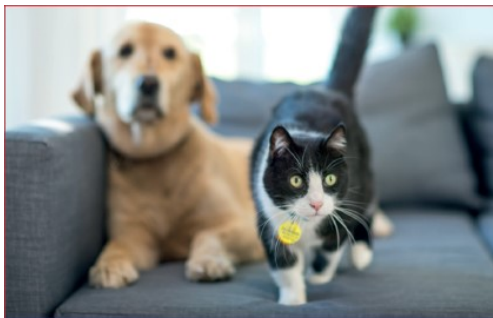
In light of the Coronavirus, the District Council of Streaky Bay has decided to waive all fees associated with local businesses and community groups advertising in the Criterion until the end 2020.

Transferring your dog or cat to a new owner

South Australian law requires Dogs and Cats Online to be updated if ownership of an animal is transferred.

To transfer an animal:

Go to dogsandcatsonline.com.au, **Login**, select **Commence Ownership Transfer**, select the dog or cat to transfer, **Initiate transfer** and enter the new owner's details.

New owners must be provided the certificate of registration (renewal notice), registration disc last issued and transfer code.



Do you intend to sell dogs or cats you have bred in 2020/2021?

- The renewal process will allow you to **Renew** your breeder registration or **Register as a breeder**
- **Log in** anytime and register as a breeder prior to advertising your dogs or cats for sale

Any person who sells a dog or cat they've bred must be a registered breeder on Dogs and Cats Online.

Breeders are allocated a lifetime DACO breeder registration number, which must be included in all advertisements for sale.

Breeder registration expires 30 June each year.

Are you required to register as a breeder in 2020/2021?

DACO breeder registration should not be renewed if the person does not intend to sell dogs or cats they have bred in the coming financial year. Simply deselect the checkbox, **intend to sell dogs or cats you have bred**, when completing the renewal.



Before buying a dog or cat, check that the person you're buying from is registered using the **Breeder Search** at dogsandcatsonline.com.au

As a buyer you should expect the following:

- Name, address and phone number of the seller.
- Name, address and phone number of each breeder involved in breeding the dog/cat for sale and their DACO (Dogs and Cats Online) breeder number(s).
- Any vaccination detail, the name and address of the vet who desexed the dog/cat (if desexed), and any other vet treatment the animal has received.
- The dog or cat to have been microchipped prior to sale
- Name and address of the microchip implanter, microchip number and date of procedure, and registries the microchip information is stored on.
- Any vet exemptions from microchipping or desexing.
- Details of any known illness or medical condition.
- For dogs, any control order on the dog.

Breeders are required to follow the South Australian Standards and Guidelines for Breeding and Trading Companion Animals.



DISPOSAL OF FISH FRAMES

Council has received reports of fish frames and offal being dumped at our boat ramps and popular swimming beaches.

This practice is illegal and can lead to expiations or fines being issued.

Unfortunately, some people believe that pelicans, seagulls, stingrays and fish will appreciate a free feed and will consume the mess left behind by some fishers.

Decaying fish heads, frames and offal could attract all sorts of opportunistic scavengers, including Sharks, impacting on other beach and boat ramp users.

Please be considerate to others and the environment and freeze the frames and offal at home and dispose of it on the day of rubbish pick up. Alternatively frames can be used for crab bait or bury it to fertilise your garden.
