Council News

GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Local Government Act Delegations

Council received a report providing updated Delegation Schedules under the Local Government Act, Council endorsed the proposed amendments to delegations.

Local Government Reform

The Minister is proposing to have two proclamation rounds that will commence the reforms in stages to enable time for councils and other relevant bodies to prepare for the changes.

The Minister has indicated that reforms that require minimal to moderate implementation tasks or supporting regulations will likely commence in early August 2021, these include:

- changes to informal gatherings and internal reviews of council decisions;
- clarification of the roles of principal member and members of council; and
- the requirement for independent advice on CEO appointment, performance review and termination.

Other provisions required by the amendment are as follows;

- Rate monitoring provisions and the new Community Engagement Charter are expected to commence in the 2022 calendar year.
- The new behaviour management framework will be in place by the start of the next council term.
- Financial management reforms will be in place by the 2023-24 year.
- Changes in the basis of rating (where all Councils will be required to rate on Capital Value) will commence in time for the 2024-25 year. This has been legislatively mandated by the State Government. DC of Streaky Bay currently rates by site value only.

The reform will also include the inclusion of a "Councils in Focus Website" where all Councils will be required to submit a base set of data that can be viewed by the public and comparisons between like Council's can be made.

Finance Risk and Audit Committee and Community Strengthening Committee Council Member Vacancies

Newly elected Councillor – Greg Limbert, was nominated and appointed as the member to fulfill both of these vacancies. Council is still looking for an

independent community member for the Community Strengthening Committee.

Organisational Structure

Council was provided with an updated structure and information regarding staff changes due to resignations, long service leave and acting positions. A copy of Council's organisational structure is available at www.streakybay.sa.gov.au

PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT

Land Management Agreements Audit

Council were presented with a report and documents from an Audit undertaken regarding the application of existing Land Management Agreements, validity of Agreements, Waivers and proposals for moving forward that included a delegation framework for waiving by the Chief Executive Officer. Council resolved at the meeting for the application of the LMA's to be further investigated, advisory notices to be developed and that all LMA Waivers continue to be presented to the full Council for decision.

Code Amendment Loveshack Route

Council received a detailed report outlining the proposed Code Amendment for Loveshack Route, this included the Public Consultation Plan. Council endorsed that Report to be taken out to Public Consultation in accordance with the Public Consultation Proposal.

As part of this process Council endorsed that a Deed be established between the proponent and Council to formalise the payment of associated costs.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Streaky Bay Jetty Platform

It is anticipated that works will begin sometime this month.

Construction Grader Replacement

Council has purchased and received a new Cat Grader.

Streaky Bay Jetty Pool Platform Extension and Shade

Agreement in principle with West Coast Welding and Thirsty Constructions. Works to be carried out in conjunction with Jetty Platform contract.

Streaky Bay Foreshore Tourist Park Development

Two contractors have been engaged to provide pricing and design options for Western Amenities.

Survey and construction drawings/plans are being finalised for underground water, effluent and electrical components for the fire protection design.

Western Transit Loop

Council was successful in attaining grant funding for this project. Drawings have been sent to Adelaide Civil for some minor changes identified by Elected Members and Staff. They are expected to be ready to return to Council and Community Consultation shortly.

Finlayson Road Realignment

Meeting with representatives from DIT on July 7 to decide next steps.

Designers incorrectly calculated the boundary alignment of the Roberts Road / Finlayson Road intersection. The MICW has met with the Surveyor and it was decided that the transition could be altered to avoid the Land Parcel.

Robinson Basin Water Reserve

Currently progressing through taking Care and Control. Meeting to be held with relevant stakeholders in coming weeks regarding demand and control. Costing provided to date suggest that, should consent be reached, an outlay of approximately \$95k would be required to connect Robinson Basin to Wallschutzky Road catchment.

Roads Patrol Grading

June has seen considerable disruption to the routine program as the team have reacted to weather related issues in the area. The team has achieved some great outcomes through this period and received a number of messages providing positive feedback.

REGULATORY SERVICES

Broadacre Burning Code of Practice – Consultation Draft

Councils were asked to comment by the State Bushfire Coordination Committee on the Code of Practice including whether the Code of Practice should be mandated or voluntary. Council elected to recommend as part of the consultation that the minimum amount of water to be stored on site be 1000L (from 400L), that the Code remain as voluntary, and that stubble dump size maximums be increased.

District Council of Streaky Bay welcomes Damian Carter (and his family) as Council's newly appointed Chief Executive Officer. Damian was previously employed as the Director of Corporate Services with Barkly Regional Council in the Northern Territory. We touched base with Damian to provide us with a little insight into his desire to be Chief Executive Officer and his move to Streaky Bay

Damian, where did you previously reside and what attracted you to the Position of Chief Executive Officer?

My family and I are moving from the beautiful Barkly region (Tennant Creek) in Outback, Northern Territory. The attraction to the position of CEO is the opportunity to grow in the position, whilst contributing my skills and experience to the betterment of Streaky Bay. Locating to a regional community where my young family can grow and thrive is also a significant attraction as well.

Can you briefly explain what has been your previous employment and experience?

I've worked in both the private and public sectors across a wide variety of fields and countries. This experience has allowed myself to gain managerial experience over a diverse range of areas, including; soft and hard facilities management, customer service, operations, welfare service provision, corporate services and project management. Within Local Government, I've worked mainly in Corporate Services and Economic Development, however I've also had an interesting stint in local law enforcement.

Upon your first visit to Streaky Bay what were the stand out highlights of the region, the district and our townships?

What do you think the 3 biggest challenges for Council will be in the next 3 years?

1. Trying to obtain external funding from grant sources after Covid 19 stimulus spending starts to dry up,
2. Managing Council's aging infrastructure and assets with limited revenue growth, and;
3. As international travel recommences, trying to retain strong domestic tourism visitation in the region.

What do you think the 3 biggest opportunities for Council will be in the next 3 years?

1. Converting visitation to the region and the growth in remote working arrangements into new resident attraction,
2. The Covid 19 pandemic has seen a renewed focus in domestic tourism, which offers the region numerous opportunities in leveraging off this renewed focus, and;
3. Linking educational pathways to employment to try and grow the capacity of the Streaky Bay community, whilst encouraging the retention of young people in the community.

What do you believe is Council's (and or the Districts) biggest asset that will help us overcome those challenges and realise our opportunities?

Council's biggest asset is the community. Its diversity, knowledge and willingness will help overcome any challenge and realise any opportunity.

What do you find the most exciting, challenging or rewarding working for Local Government?

The most rewarding thing about working in Local Government is helping facilitate local decision making. There is nothing more rewarding than having the community come to you with an idea and you in your role with Council help the community see their idea come into fruition.

Is there anything you would like to add or say to the community prior to your arrival?

Personally, my family and I are looking forward to embedding ourselves into the Streaky Bay community. Professionally, I'm looking forward to working with the Council team to ensure the work we undertake is of the best possible value to the ratepayer.

Regional Events Fund

The South Australian Government recognises the huge impact that COVID-19 has had on the events sector in South Australia.

The Regional Event Fund is designed to strengthen the state's regional events calendar and drive economic stimulus across the regions beyond the traditionally peak summer tourism period.

Through the South Australian Tourism Commission, the State Government is committing an additional \$1 million to South Australia's regional events in 2021/22 to strengthen the regional events calendar by encouraging the development of new and innovative regional events, grow existing events, and drive increased visitation and economic stimulus to the regional economy. The Regional Event Fund aims to:

- Strengthen the regional events calendar
- Drive regional visitation in the immediate term and lead to repeat visitation
- Increase event specific visitor expenditure, particularly from interstate

Assistance for businesses employing young people

YOUTH JOBS PaTH (Prepare – Trial – Hire) provides funding to trial a young person aged between 17 - 24 to find out if they're the right fit for your business. If the trial is a success and you hire the young person, you may be eligible for further funding. Grant funding available of up to \$10,000 for Australian businesses.

- Prepare: Young people will undertake Employability Skills Training to prepare them for work.
- Trial: You can trial a young person in an internship for between 4 and 12 weeks and receive a payment of \$1000 (GST inclusive) to help cover the hosting costs. Interns will receive a \$200 fortnightly incentive payment on top of their income support and are covered by insurance, both paid by the Australian Government.

BUSINESS

Business Support Package

The new Business Support Package will assist an estimated 50,000 eligible* SMEs across the state, including restaurants, cafes, hotels, and tour and experience operators, affected by the new restrictions to help stop the spread of the highly-contagious COVID-19 Delta variant.

Grants will help businesses cover ongoing operating costs such as rent, power bills, supplier costs and other fees, and help them to re-open when restrictions ease.

The major support package also includes a new \$1,000 cash grant for eligible** small businesses who don't employ staff (e.g. non-employing sole traders).

How to access business support:

- To register interest in Business Support Package cash grants, complete the form at treasury.sa.gov.au/sbg or email smallbusinessgrant@sa.gov.au. Applications are expected to open within the next two weeks via treasury.sa.gov.au and grants will be processed as quickly as possible.

*To be eligible for the one-off \$3,000 emergency cash grant, a business must, as at 12:01am Tuesday 20 July 2021:

- Be located within South Australia
- Have an annual turnover of \$75,000 or more in 2020-21 or 2019-20, and be registered for GST
- Employ people in South Australia
- Have an Australia-wide payroll of less than \$10 million in 2019-20
- Have a valid Australian Business Number (ABN)
- Experienced at least a 30 per cent reduction (compared to the week prior) in turnover due to the restricted trading conditions

**To be eligible for the one-off \$1,000 emergency cash grant, a non-employing business must meet the criteria listed above excluding the requirement to employ people.

Jobs & Economic Growth Fund

The Economic and Business Growth Fund was established as part of the 2018-19 Budget to promote economic growth in South Australia by encouraging growth of existing industries, developing new industries, building international connections, and attracting foreign and national direct investment.

From 1 July 2021, the Fund will be renamed the Jobs and Economic Growth Fund and will have funding capacity of \$200 million over four years to focus on supporting initiatives that create long-term sustainable jobs and economic growth.

Boosting Apprenticeships

The Boosting Apprenticeship Commencements wage subsidy supports businesses and Group Training Organisations to take on new apprentices and trainees, to build a pipeline of skilled workers to support sustained economic recovery.

Through the subsidy, any business or Group Training Organisation that engages an Australian Apprentice between 5 October 2020 and 31 March 2022 may be eligible for a subsidy of 50 per cent of wages paid to a new or recommencing apprentice or trainee for a 12-month period from the date of commencement, to a maximum of \$7,000 per quarter. There is no cap on the number of eligible trainees/apprentices.

Loveshack Route Code Amendment Public Consultation

The District Council of Streaky Bay is proposing a Code Amendment which seeks to rezone 13 hectares of land located on Loveshack Route, referred to as the Affected Area shown in below. The proposed amendment seeks to rezone the land from Deferred Urban Zone to Neighbourhood Zone, to allow for low density residential development that provides housing options adjacent the Streaky Bay Township.

The Streaky Bay Township Master Plan, adopted in 2010, recommended the rezoning of the land to 'Residential' as a 'high priority'. Accordingly, the Code Amendment proposes to rezone Lot 615 Loveshack Route from the Deferred Urban Zone to the Neighbourhood Zone.

The Code Amendment will be on consultation from 2 August 2021 to 10 September 2021.

During this time, the public and identified stakeholders can lodge a written submission about any of the changes proposed in this Code Amendment.

The list is endless as what you can make with this gear. We will make some and put them in the craft shop. We are also making some wooden frames (see pic below)

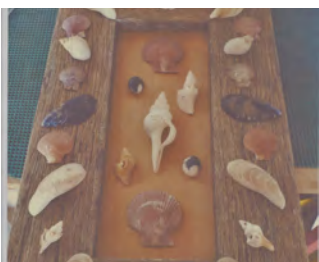
One of our newest members in Owen Pritchard has been making some plant holders for home. Well done Owen. It is good seeing you keeping in the good books.

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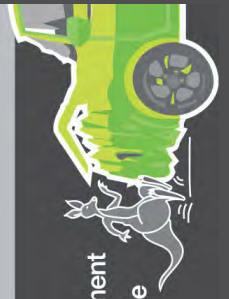

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
