Council News

GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Local Government Act Delegations

Council received a report providing updated Delegation Schedules under the Local Government Act, Council endorsed the proposed amendments to delegations.

Local Government Reform

The Minister is proposing to have two proclamation rounds that will commence the reforms in stages to enable time for councils and other relevant bodies to prepare for the changes.

The Minister has indicated that reforms that require minimal to moderate implementation tasks or supporting regulations will likely commence in early August 2021, these include:

- changes to informal gatherings and internal reviews of council decisions;
- clarification of the roles of principal member and members of council; and
- the requirement for independent advice on CEO appointment, performance review and termination.

Other provisions required by the amendment are as follows;

- Rate monitoring provisions and the new Community Engagement Charter are expected to commence in the 2022 calendar year.
- The new behaviour management framework will be in place by the start of the next council term.
- Financial management reforms will be in place by the 2023-24 year.
- Changes in the basis of rating (where all Councils will be required to rate on Capital Value) will commence in time for the 2024-25 year. This has been legislatively mandated by the State Government. DC of Streaky Bay currently rates by site value only.

The reform will also include the inclusion of a "Councils in Focus Website" where all Councils will be required to submit a base set of data that can be viewed by the public and comparisons between like Council's can be made.

Finance Risk and Audit Committee and Community Strengthening Committee Council Member Vacancies

Newly elected Councillor – Greg Limbert, was nominated and appointed as the member to fulfill both of these vacancies. Council is still looking for an independent community member for the Community Strengthening Committee.

Organisational Structure

Council was provided with an updated structure and information regarding staff changes due to resignations, long service leave and acting positions. A copy of Council's organisational structure is available at www.streakybay.sa.gov.au

REGULATORY SERVICES

Broadacre Burning Code of Practice – Consultation Draft

Councils were asked to comment by the State Bushfire Coordination Committee on the Code of Practice including whether the Code of Practice should be mandated or voluntary. Council elected to recommend as part of the consultation that the minimum amount of water to be stored on site be 1000L (from 400L), that the Code remain as voluntary, and that stubble dump size maximums be increased.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Assets and Infrastructure Advisory Committee

Council have considered the Assets and Infrastructure Advisory Committee and have nominated and endorse Councillor Greg Limbert and Councillor Neville Trezona as Committee Members, and are seeking applications from a suitable community member to be on this Committee – see page 8 & 9.

Jetty Platform

Currently undertaking Independent Engineering Certification. Once complete, work can get underway.

Streaky Bay Foreshore Tourist Park Development

Two contractors have been engaged to provide pricing and design options for Western Amenities. Survey and construction drawings/plans are being finalised for underground water, effluent and electrical components for the fire protection design.

Council News

CWMS Telemetry & Controls

Works will begin in the coming weeks to install and improve our control systems. This will enable Council to improve Safety and Reliability of the system as well as providing the earliest possible notification of faults.

Western Transit Loop

Community Consultation has been completed and Elected Members were presented with Community Feedback.

Finlayson Road Realignment

Meeting with representatives from DIT on July 7 to decide next steps.

Designs are being finalised and construction works being coordinated with DIT for the connection to the Eyre Highway.

Robinson Basin Water Reserve

Currently progressing through taking Care and Control. Meeting to be held with relevant stakeholders in coming weeks regarding demand and control. Costing provided to date suggest that, should consent be reached, an outlay of approximately \$95k would be required to connect Robinson Basin to Wallschutzky Road catchment.

Roads Patrol Grading

Council has engaged a Roadside Vegetation contractor to begin works on the 6th of October. Should the works prove satisfactory, future planning will be undertaken with the Contractor.

Caterpillar 1 (Tow Roller)

- Carawa Wirrulla area Caterpillar 2 (Hitch Roller)
- Colley Hall, Pt Kenny-Poochera & Inkster/Chandada area

Bitumen Delays

There have been some delays to scheduled bitumen works and roadside vegetation clearing. The reason for the delays was the availability of contractors with substantial projects like the DIT highway project putting a strain on the region's resources. Contractors have now been engaged and this work should commence in the week commencing the 4th of October.

Waste and Recycling Matters

The District Council of Streaky Bay has been in the process of restructuring the operation of its Transfer Station. Over the coming months many changes will be implemented to the operation of the facility to allow for a more fluent and viable operating facility for both the public and for Council.

One of the major changes will be the increase in opening hours which will enable more accessibility for the public and alleviate frustrations with the short opening hours window that has previously been encountered.

Recycling and reducing waste that goes to landfill is a major component of the restructure and you the public, along with Council can all play a major part in eliminating a lot of this waste from landfill which attracts a very high fee from the Environmental Protection Authority.

At present the Transfer Station takes your:-

- Cans and bottles which have the 10 cent deposit refund
- Flavoured milk containers and other deposit drink containers
- Wine bottles, glass bottles and jars, spirit bottles these are non refund but very welcome

There are many more items that Council will now take (no refund), including:-

- Plastic milk and cream bottles, washed with the lids removed opaque in colour
- Cardboard, cut or broken up into piece sizes that fit into a 240 litre wheelie bin (please note that cardboard and cardboard boxes not to the correct size will be charged)
- Tin and steel cans, i.e. fruit tins, soup cans, etc. washed with the lid put inside the tin

All of the above items can be dropped off at the Transfer Station for recycling. Every bottle, tin and cardboard box that does not go to landfill does help to reduce costs and the landfill filling up too quickly.

Markets for the above recyclable items are already in place and many more items will be added to the list once markets are sourced and established.

Council would like to thank you in advance for your patience and understanding during this on going transition and appreciates any feedback that you may wish to provide.

BUSINESS

Jobs & Economic Growth Fund

The Economic and Business Growth Fund was established as part of the 2018-19 Budget to promote economic growth in South Australia by encouraging growth of existing industries, developing new industries, building international connections, and attracting foreign and national direct investment.

From 1 July 2021, the Fund will be renamed the Jobs and Economic Growth Fund and will have funding capacity of \$200 million over four years to focus on supporting initiatives that create long-term sustainable jobs and economic growth.

Business Support Package

The new Business Support Package will assist an estimated 50,000 eligible* SMEs across the state, including restaurants, cafes, hotels, and tour and experience operators, affected by the new restrictions to help stop the spread of the highly-contagious COVID-19 Delta variant.

Grants will help businesses cover ongoing operating costs such as rent, power bills, supplier costs and other fees, and help them to re-open when restrictions ease.

The major support package also includes a new \$1,000 cash grant for eligible** small businesses who don't employ staff (e.g. non-employing sole traders).

*To be eligible for the one-off \$3,000 emergency cash grant, a business must, as at 12:01am Tuesday 20 July 2021:

- Be located within South Australia
- Have an annual turnover of \$75,000 or more in 2020-21 or 2019-20, and be registered for GST
- Employ people in South Australia
- Have an Australia-wide payroll of less than \$10 million in 2019-20
- Have a valid Australian Business Number (ABN)
- Experienced at least a 30 per cent reduction (compared to the week prior) in turnover due to the restricted trading conditions

**To be eligible for the one-off \$1,000 emergency cash grant, a non-employing business must meet the criteria listed above excluding the requirement to employ people.

Boosting Apprenticeships

The Boosting Apprenticeship Commencements wage subsidy supports businesses and Group Training Organisations to take on new apprentices and trainees, to build a pipeline of skilled workers to support sustained economic recovery.

Through the subsidy, any business or Group Training Organisation that engages an Australian Apprentice between 5 October 2020 and 31 March 2022 may be eligible for a subsidy of 50 per cent of wages paid to a new or recommencing apprentice or trainee for a 12-month period from the date of commencement, to a maximum of \$7,000 per quarter. There is no cap on the number of eligible trainees/apprentices. For further information visit:

The following helps us to keep sporting fame in a more balanced perspective.

A story is told about a young boy.

He is a great runner in the making. He wins a number of events at his school's sports' carnival. He asks his parents whether he might train with the local athletics' club. He makes a clean sweep of the events there. He is supported and makes it all the way to the state trials. Again, instant success. A wise man spots his amazing gift and provides plenty of encouragement. He alerts to boy to a big athletics meet in a few weekstime and enquires whether he's up to the challenge. The young boy accepts the invitation without hesitation. He arrives and the wise man introduces him to three people ... a tiny child, an old person and someone who was blind. The gather at the starting line. The gun fires. The young boy is off and using his gift runs the whole circuit of the oval past the finishing line. There was no cheering. The young boy wondered why the large crowd was silent. No clapping rang out. Sensing something was not right, he sought out the wise man. The wise man then pointed to the tiny child, the blind person and the old person. They had hardly started their races. Look what you have left behind. Then the wise man said: Go back to those three. Hold their hands ... walk with them round the track and finish the race.

The four walked together ...

the young boy guided the blind person and helped the young and the old. The crowd clapped and cheered raucously. All four crossed the finishing line together.

For the young boy this victory was bigger than all his previous wins. Service rather than speed is what matters in the race of life.

Here we are reminded about the true meaning of greatness in the eyes of Jesus. Greatness lies in the depth and generosity of our love for God and others.

In St. Mark's Gospel (9:33-34) Jesus asks His disciples: What were you arguing about on the road. They said nothing because they had been arguing about which of them was the greatest.

They were preoccupied with precedence, power and popularity. This too can be a reality for us. Or maybe we are swept up in a fervor of fame, fortune and finishing first. None of these rate on Jesus' radar. If anyone wants to be first they must make themselves last of all and servant of all (Mark 9:35b).

This was the lesson the young runner learnt. In Jesus' Team service, sacrifice and selflessness are all that matter.



National Parks and Wildlife Service Friends of Parks - Partnership Grants Program


The Minister for Environment and Water has announced a new Friends of Parks - Partnership Grants Program with up to \$500,000 available for projects that may be delivered for a maximum three year period.

The Friends of Parks -Partnership Program is directed at conservation-based activities to be delivered both on-park and off-park.

This can also include the purchase of minor plant or equipment and other materials or services that supports the group's project conservation outcomes.

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



Streaky Bay Property Owners Are You Prepared for the Fire Danger Season??







With the commencement of the Fire Danger Season on 1st November 2021, the first round of property inspections will occur in early October.

Properties with undergrowth exceeding the legislative requirement will be receiving a Section 105F (Fire and Emergency Services Act) Notice which requires the landowner to cut/slash the undergrowth to the required level applicable to that property.

Landowners will have 21 days from the Notice's issue to make their properties compliant.

All properties receiving a Section 105F Notice will be reinspected near the 1st November, and if they remain non-compliant the landowner will be required to pay the cost of having their property cut by Council or it's contractor, as well as an administrative fee.

Council has set a charge of \$1135.00 (GST ind) to compulsory mow outer township and outlying area properties that are non-compliant.

Property owners within the Streaky Bay area will be charged \$630.00 (GST incl) per property for the compulsory mowing of non-compliant blocks.

The 105F process is a legal obligation on the landowner to minimise risk to both their and the neighbours' life and property

Any queries regarding 105F Notices should be directed to Council's Fire Prevention Officer in the first instance on 8626 1001.
