#### Council News

#### **GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATION**

#### Strategic Plan 2040

At the November ordinary Council meeting, Council endorsed its new Strategic Plan. A copy is available on Council's website <u>www.streakybay.sa.gov.au</u>

#### Council Meeting Days and Times

Council was required to consider the days and times of Council meetings for the 2021 year. Council endorsed to continue with the third Thursday of every month, with alternate day and afternoon meetings to commence at 9.30am and 2.30pm respectively.

#### Acting Chief Executive Officer – January 2021

Council endorsed the Manager, Community and Economic Development (Penny Williams) as the acting CEO whilst the current CEO is on leave.

#### **BUSINESS AND ADMINISTRATION SERVICES**

#### Streaky Bay Area School Pool

Cr Wheaton asked a question without notice to the November meeting on the status of the School Pool Agreement for Public Opening. Staff advised at that meeting that they are awaiting further correspondence or a revised agreement from the School/Department of Education.

#### INFRASTRUCTURE

#### Streaky Bay Aerodrome Lighting

Recent inspections have revealed that a significant upgrade is required to the lighting at the Streaky Bay Aerodrome to ensure its ongoing compliance for use, including that of the Royal Flying Doctor Service. Council endorsed the submission of a funding application to the Regional Aviation Access Program – Remote Airstrip Upgrade Program, and that Council agree to seek funding for the aerodrome

#### Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program – Further Funding – Wells Street

Council has received notification that the federal Governments Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program will be extended to provide additional Funding. Council endorsed that the Wells Street Streetscape Project be initiated as the priority project for this funding, with authorisation for staff to continue with developing final concept plans with the project to be constructed under the funding program during the 2020/2021 financial year.

Council will also consider leveraging this funding to apply for the State Government Local Government Partnership Program to undertake further projects.

#### Caravan Parking – Streaky Bay

Cr Wheaton raised a question without notice to the October meeting of Council regarding what actions are Council currently taking or able to take in the future about parallel parked caravans and trailers over multiple angled parking spots? Residents and business owners have had enough of the parks being used for a long period of time before moving their vehicles.

The following response was provided at the November meeting.

Over the past 12 months, new signage has been installed at strategic locations around the Streaky Bay Township, directing visitors to appropriate Parking Areas.

Plans have also been discussed to create an "Information Bay"" at the Lions Park to assist travellers when first entering the township. With the Bay offering such an attractive aspect when entering the township, we feel that some important signage is missed leading to travellers making poor decisions when parking. It has also been noted that we are currently experiencing an influx of "first time" travellers to town, which may be exacerbating the situation.

We feel that a greater emphasis needs to be placed on the two "major" car parks; Council Car Park and the Hotel Car Park. Discussions will be needed with the Hotel Board. This would include clearly delineated Parking Bays etc.

We have also had discussions, and performed inspections, regarding Disabled Car Parking in Streaky Bay's Shopping Precinct. Unfortunately, in its current set up, further Disabled parks will result in a reduction (approximately 2 into 1) of parking spaces.

It is also our intention to investigate improved parking options around the Wells St / Bay Road intersection, particularly east of the roundabout. Many people are parking vans and 4wds in this area, and it is becoming a Safety Risk. My initial thoughts are to consider a "No Parking" area on the Southern side of Wells St, outside of Mitre 10's trade entrance. Further work is required before a submission to Council is prepared.

#### Yanerbie Road (Streaky Bay) proposed Road Name Alteration

Council considered a public request to amend Yanerbie Road to Greenwood Road. Council resolved that it does not wish to proceed as Council is satisfied that signage improvements will alleviate the issue raised in the application.

#### **COMMUNITY & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT**

#### Photographic Competition/Calendar

The Community Calendar has been finalised and Council are expecting delivery of the Calendar in the next few weeks and will then be available to the community in late December.

#### Streaky Bay Foreshore Tourist Park due Diligence Report

Council conducted a workshop and further discussion at the Ordinary Council Meeting in November to determine Council's considerations regarding future management of the Streaky Bay Foreshore Tourist Caravan Park.

#### Wirrulla Oval Playground

Council received a report to the November meeting of Council regarding a proposed new playground for Wirrulla Sports and Recreation oval precinct. Council resolved that they agree to support the Wirrulla Sports and Recreation permission to erect a playground on Councils land. That Council agree to support Wirrulla Sports and Recreation playground project by contributing \$35,000, and that this amount is to be included in the 2021/2022 budget subject to grant funding.

#### Jetty Pool

Council has been working closely with the Department of Infrastructure and Transport to ensure appropriate maintenance works are undertaken to reinstate the use of the Streaky Bay Jetty Platform. It is pleasing to advise the community that Council endorsed acceptance of ownership of the Jetty Platform as a Council owned asset, including allowing the CEO to accept the \$500,000 grant from the Department of Infrastructure and Transport, to undertake the required upgrade works.



#### Sustainability and Environment Policy

Council has reviewed its existing Policy and endorsed the new policy. The objectives of this policy are:

- Protect existing natural environments and biodiversity
- Enhancing the condition and extent of natural environments
- Avoiding impacts from excessive resource use, waste generation, pollution, and pest species
- Adapting to a changing environment and developing resilience to changes in our climate
- Mitigation and adaptation to a changing climate through statutory responsibilities and regulatory powers relating to land use planning, asset and infrastructure management, environmental planning
- Building human connections to the natural world whilst respecting cultural, social, and economic values
- Community support through education and encouraging behaviour change and build resilience to changes in our climate
- Council will work regionally and at a state and federal level to increase the resilience of our communities to climate change and support appropriate policies and strategies that support a low carbon economy

#### Gawler Ranges Nation Parks – Roads

Council endorsed to provide correspondence to the relevant minister, outlining the benefits to the entire region of the Gawler Ranges National Park and encouraging the government to invest future funding into the improvements of affected sections of road that provide access into the park.

#### Tractor Beach Campground Development

The Development Application for the development of this site has been submitted. Minor works will commence in the coming weeks.


#### PUBLIC NOTICE SHORT TERM DRY AREA - STREAKY BAY

Notice is hereby given that a Short Term Dry Area will be applied during the following period: 6:00pm on Thursday, 31 December 2020 to 8:00am on Friday 1 January 2021

The possession and consumption of liquor is prohibited in public areas (excluding licensed premises and privately owned land) in the designated area within Streaky Bay during this period as shown in the map below.

The area includes the whole of any jetty, boat ramp, slipway or other structures that projects below the low water mark from within the area described (as well as any area beneath such a structure).



Also the possession and consumption of liquor is prohibited in public areas (excluding licensed premises and privately owned land) in the area commonly known as Little Islands car park comprising the whole of that part of the government road (the access road between Little Islands Road and the Little Islands car park) that lies between the north-eastern boundary of Lot 101 DP 70670 and the south-western boundary of Lot 102 DP 70670; and

The area at the north-western end of that part of the Government road (including the car park and other land) bounded on the south-east by the south-eastern boundary of Lot 104 DP 70670 from a point 140 metres south-west of the north-east of the south-western boundary of Lot 102 DP 70670 ("point B"), on the north-east by a straight line along the shortest route from point B to the low water mark of Blanche Port, on the north-west by the low water mark of Blanche Port and on the south-west by a straight line along the shortest route from the low water mark of Blanche Port and on the south-west by a straight line along the shortest route from the low water mark of Blanche Port to point A.
