Council News

GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Local Government Reform Bill

It was initially thought the Bill would be considered at the December meeting of Parliament, however further requests for changes were received and the Bill has been delayed until the first New Year sitting of Parliament.

Representation Review Options

Division 2 of the *Local Government Act 1999* (LG Act) sets out the requirements for Councils to undertake a Representation Review, including the process which must be undertaken to complete the review. As per the requirements of the LG Act, these reviews are undertaken every 8 years and gazettal by the Attorney-General for Streaky Bay's review has occurred indicating our review must be commenced by October 2020 and concluded in October 2021.

Council was required, prior to the document being placed out to Public Consultation, and in consideration of section 8 of the draft document, to decide on two or three options to include regarding the Ward Structure. One of those options is required to be an option to abolish Wards (as per section 12(6)(b) of the LG Act. Another would be to maintain the current structure and it is recommended one other be chosen to include, though that is not necessary.

Public Consultation regarding the first draft of the Representation Review has finalised with six responses being received. An Options Paper will be presented to Council at the January meeting and once Council's decisions regarding that Paper are known, a finalised document will be sent out for 3 further weeks of Public Consultation as required by the Act.

CEO Key Performance Indicators

The CEO provided a report to the December 2020 Ordinary meeting of Council outlining the achievements against the agreed key indicators for the position. See the report to that meeting for full details.

Council Meeting Days and Times

Council at the December meeting rescinded the previous motion of the November meeting regarding Council meeting times and new times were set. The Day of the meeting will now be held on a Wednesday (instead of Thursday), day meetings will commence at 9.30am and night meetings to commence at 4.00pm.

Streaky Bay Supper Room Hire

Council endorsed to include an hourly rate fee for the hire of the Supper Room. That fee was set at \$15 per hour.

Perlubie Land Swap

Council have signed the Agreement under seal with documents forwarded to the appropriate legal representatives.

Real Estate Agents – Blancheport Development

Council received a report to the December 2020 ordinary meeting of Council regarding the expiration of agreements between Council and any real estate agents to sell Council land. Council requires the establishment of an agreement with a real estate agent to enable the sale of any of its land. The report noted that Mayor Barber is the owner of one of the proposed agents and Council resolved at the meeting seek further legal advice to ensure that no conflict of interest exists between Mayor Barber and Council regarding this matter.

BUSINESS AND ADMINISTRATION SERVICES

Blancheport Rise Vacant Land – Lease

One application was received that applicant has been advised informally that they have been successful in their bid to lease the land. This will enable them to spray the land ready for sowing in the growing season. A formal agreement will be drawn up in the New Year.

Carawa Cemetery

The transfer of this property to the District Council of Streaky Bay has been deferred until time is available to search for the old trustees and or relations. Council will need to consider the cost of this land transfer as part of this process.

Boat Ramp Fees and Charges

Council received a report at the December meeting to reintroduce Boat Ramp Fees and the Moore's launch facility following the recent upgrade. Council endorsed a fee rate for the remainder of the current financial year and the 2021/2022 financial year, please see the minutes to that meeting for a full list of fees relating to this matter.

Streaky Bay Community Complex – Courts Resurfacing

Council at its December meeting endorsed a request from the Complex Committee to resurface their courts at Streaky Bay. The Committee did not request any funding amount from Council and were only seeking permission to undertake the project.

Streaky Bay Area School Pool – Public Opening Agreement

Council has been advised by the Department of Education that the School Governing Council has been given interim approval to open the Pool to the public.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Poochera/Wirrulla/Piednippie Court Resurfacing (Drought Communities Fund)

Wirrulla and Piednippie Courts complete. Poochera to begin in January.

Streaky Bay Youth Precinct

Council has received amended plans and will review the plans and costing in the New Year.

Speed Hump Requests

Installation at Sceale Bay planned for early January 2021.

Jetty Platform Upgrade and Future

DPTI to provide whole of life costing (30 years) for Council as the proviso for allowing Council to take control of the works (including receiving the funding to do so) is that Council take ownership of the infrastructure. A report will be presented to a future meeting regarding those asset management and financial impacts for Council to consider. Students have prepared Tender Documents ready for upload to Vendor Panel.

Jetty Pool Shade Shelter/Platform Extension (Drought Communities Program)

Designs are being sought in conjunction with Platform Extension. A decision will be made early in January to go to tender for the design and construction.

Poochera Oval Complex – Ceiling Replacement (after Asbestos Removal)

Asbestos has been removed from kitchen, bar, storeroom & safe room ceilings along with back wall of kitchen. Reinstatement to commence shortly.

Robinson Basin Lease

Letter of intent sent to SA Water regarding the hand over, pending contract details. Application to be sent to Crown Lands, pending agreement by all parties, to transfer land. Following this process identification of any further permits that may be required, or Native Title considerations can be identified, no further correspondence has been received.

COMMUNITY & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Andromeda (Great White Kaolin Project) – Poochera Kaolin Mine

Andromeda (Great White Kaolin Project) have applied for a Mineral Claim over the section of Carey's Well. Council have supplied a letter of support with regards to the section of the claim that crosses an unmade Road Reserve. Andromeda will have to apply for a section 221 and section 222 permit once the Mineral Claim process is complete.

Wirangu No. 2 Tenure Dispute Status Update

A decision regarding the Golf Club Tenure was handed down on 18 December 2020. Council called a Special Meeting on 22 December 2020. The meeting was well attended by the community and Golf Club members. Further legal advice is being sought before Council considers whether an appeal against the decision on the matter of 'earthworks' is made.

Foreshore Tourist Park Development

Survey Work now complete. Design and works will begin on the Eastern Amenities Block, Ensuites, Fire Protection, Vast TV and Big Rig Sites.

Child Care Centre – Business Case

A further report was presented to the November 2020 ordinary meeting of Council providing information and a quote for Council to proceed with the development of a business case. Council at that meeting laid the report on the table.

MCED, CEDO and Deputy Mayor Wheaton visited Karoonda Child Care Centre last week. This was very informative and we were able to gain some insights and further information regarding future planning.

Santa in the Visitor Centre

The CED team arranged a day to visit Santa in the visitor Centre. The day was a great success with approximately 50 children coming through to say hello to Santa, and it was very well received by the Community. Thank you very much to Santa and his helpers for coming all this way just before Christmas.

EPLGA – Regional Capacity Building Funding

Council received a report to the December ordinary meeting regarding a report from the Eyre Peninsula LGA that proposed a number of projects to be funded by the EPLGA under a capacity building framework. Council at that meeting endorsed the CEO to complete an application regarding a regional signage project in conjunction with DC of Lower EP and potentially Franklin Harbour to submit to the EPLGA.

The second part of this was a letter of support to RDAEP to consider seeking funding from the EPLGA to allocate a resource to assist all Council's across the region to progress their Eyre's on Eyre Projects, this also was supported by Council.

An arrangement Xmas gift to Hospital and Elmhaven was approved.



Stars Align for ArtsUp and Country Arts SA Media Release

Arts funding will give Streaky Bay some sparkle and much needed activity for artists of the Eyre Peninsula region thanks to Country Arts SA and volunteer grant writers of local active Community Group "Streaky Bay ArtsUp".

Over \$23,000 has been dedicated by Country Arts SA to go towards the "Stars Align" project in Streaky Bay. The project will see 7 South Australian artists work together to create artworks for use as part of the Streaky Bay Youth Precinct Development (Skate Park). The project is strongly supported by the District Council of Streaky Bay with all stakeholders excited about the projects outcome that will further enhance this valuable community asset. Port Lincoln artist, Karen Carr, will reside on site whilst she chain-saw carves a fallen tree. Streaky Bay's Lauren Karp will work with renowned play-space artist Jason Balmer to make a dig pit that is inspired by our histories. Liz McTaggart, of Sceale Bay, will create a nautical inspired compass rose to be used as a feature for people to get their bearings within the town. Ruth Gregor will mentor Streaky Bay artist Susie Betts to create a limestone carving reflecting on Betts' recent worldwide fellowship study.

ArtsUp member and artist Lauren Karp stated the funding grant was a welcome surprise, and that the volunteers behind the project had been working towards securing artists and funding for almost a year. "The Stars Align project not simply provides work for established artists, but provides those emergent artists a boost to reach their dream trajectories and encourages others to see the value of arts in Streaky Bay," said Karp.

Arts tourism is a great economic driver, and when the project is complete and the site open to public, there will be a unique addition to the attractions for Streaky Bay residents and visitors to enjoy for many years. "It is wonderful to receive grant funding from County Arts SA and support from the District Council of Streaky Bay" said ArtsUp President and artist Liz McTaggart, "Practising and honing your skills to create interactive community involved art pieces is a wonderful opportunity and will enhance the landscape of Streaky Township".

With dates to be announced in early 2021, the injection of investment into artists of Eyre Peninsula will see some great opportunities for local people, with Gregor and Streaky Bay artist Abbey Dunbar offering limestone and wood carving workshops in the first half of the year. Karp also states "By securing funding for workshops, we are also encouraging people to up-skill, work with materials they perhaps have never dreamed of, and participate as changemakers in their own community."


