Council News

DENTISTRY STUDENTS

Streaky Bay was delighted to roll out the welcome mat to a cohort of dentistry and oral health students from La Trobe University. The six students visited the region for two weeks as part of the Rural Areas Experiences Program, which was developed to provide students with insights into the rewards and challenges of delivering oral health services to regional Australia.

During their visit, the students got to spend time at both Streaky Bay and Wudinna dental clinics and participated in structured activities designed to help develop skills for living, working and integrating into rural areas.

The trip was facilitated by Jeanie Pty Ltd in partnership with the District Council of Streaky Bay and Angel Flight Australia. The District Council of Streaky Bay provided the venue for the group's sessions and assisted the group connect with local community groups. Whilst Angel Flight Australia flew the students directly into Streaky Bay, so they could spend a maximum amount of time in the area. The program aims to highlight the attraction of living and working in regional Australia and hopes to attract some of the visiting students to the region in the longer-term. This has been a success with four of the previous year's participants requesting to return to assist in delivering the School Dental Program this year.

In the mist of the busy trip, the students got a taste of the liveability of the region. Having gone to Baird Bay to swim with the dolphins and visited other popular recreation spots.

In addition to advertising the region to skilled workers as a viable location to deliver their skills, the visit also facilitated over \$15,000 in local spending.

In speaking about their experiences at Streaky Bay, Latrobe University student Denise Ignacio highlighted the impact the visit had on their future ambitions, stating "What surprised me the most was how welcoming and appreciative the locals are I consider working in a rural area to be a reality for me now. The rural areas experience helped me feel more prepared for the workforce because I know value and the opportunities and the opportunities/resources available to me. A word to describe this Rural Areas Experience would be: lifechanging".

Council's CEO Damian Carter saw great value in the program, outlining "the key to attracting skilled workers to regional areas was demystifying what it is like working in regional Australia and highlighting to individuals the experiences which can only be obtained when you work in regional Australia. This program very much achieves this and, in the future, will be seen as the catalysis which attracted dentistry and oral health practitioners into the region".

LCRI FUNDING PROGRAM

At March's Ordinary Council meeting, Council had nominated its preferred projects to be delivered with its allocation of Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program (LRCI) — Phase 3

funding. These projects

- Wirrulla Oval Playground Development (\$35,000)
- Delivery of the final stage of the Streaky Bay Youth Precinct Development (\$300,00)
- Development and installation of entry statements at both entrances into Streaky Bay (\$150,00)
- Design and facilitation of the Bay Road Entry Streetscape Revitalization Project (\$618,416)

The projects have been selected based on feedback population community and demographics, with Mayor Travis Barber outlining that "the landscape projects are evidence that Council has listened to the concerns of community about the entry ways into Streaky Bay looking tired and needing revitalisation. Interestingly, Streaky Bay is one of the only townships in the district that doesn't have entry statements, hence the need for this project. Nearly a quarter of Streaky Bay's population is aged between 0-19 years, hence there was a need to develop a precinct to provide a space and activities for the district's youth. The precinct will also provide additional activities for tourists visiting the region and in terms of precinct development this will be one of the most significant project Council has delivered in recent times".

The LCRI program is a Federal Government economic stimulus program which supports councils to deliver priority local road and infrastructure projects community Australia. The aim of the program is to support job creation and develop the resilience of local economies to bounce back from the COVID-19 pandemic. In support of the program, Mayor Travis Barber said that the program has been instrumental in supporting Streaky Bay's local economy, whilst delivering key road and infrastructure projects. He thanked the Federal Government for their support and specifically thanked the Federal Member of Grey (Rowan Ramsey MP) for his advocacy for the region.

PERLUBIE BEACH

A rise in popularity in Perlubie Beach as one of Australia's premier on-beach camp sites is seeing it struggle under the weight of numbers staying at the location. This is leading to a rise in concerns about the damage to the beach's environment, public safety issues and equitable access for the community.

During the peak tourism season, the location can host anywhere from 80 to over 100 caravans/campers leading to numerous complaints regarding the damage these numbers are doing to the beach. These complaints cover a gamut of issues, including:

- Non-self-contained campers using the sand dunes as a toilet area, leading to them being littered with human faeces and toilet paper
- Campers filling up the carpark, leading to the beach access being blocked at night and leaving no areas for day-use visitors to park
- Vehicles speeding along the beach
- Erosion of the beach
- Damage to the habitat of the shore birds and other wildlife
- Reduction of access to the beach for local residents, including the occupying of day-use shelters by campers; this includes pulling down the signs highlighting the shelters are for day use only
- Campers staying at the beach area longer than the legal limit of 21 days

Being under the care and control of the South Australian State Government, Council is limited in what measures it can undertake to deal with these issues. Conversations have been ongoing with the State Government in terms of the handover of care and control of the beach to Council so it can be effectively manage the situation.

In terms of future management of Perlubie Beach, Council proposes the following:

- Introduction of a permit system for the beach, so Council can cap numbers at a sustainable level Limiting camping on the beach to self-contained campers only
- Introduction of speed limits on the beach
- Stopping campers from occupying the day use shelters
- Development of the carparking area to have defined carparks and camping spots
- Limiting the area along the beach allocated to campers so habitats of shore birds and other wildlife can be maintained

To this end, Council is keen to facilitate discussions with the new Labor State Government about expediting the handover of the care and control of the beach as the area is struggling under the weight of numbers. Mayor Barber in support of this, said "while we're enjoyed the exposure Perlubie Beach is giving the region. The growing popularity of the destination as a camp site is placing significant pressure on the beach and we've reaching a tipping point in terms of sustainability. Understanding that no one predicted the surge in popularity of the destination, this issue needs to be addressed now. This isn't a situation where Council is saying 'not our problem', this is a situation where Council is saying 'we have a solution, help us address the problem', with the solution involving expediting the care and control of the beach to Council so we have the localised resources on the ground to effectively manage the destination".

In terms of current use, Council is asking visitors to consider the beach and other users when coming to the region. Council's CEO Damian Carter said "we understand the attraction of Perlubie Beach as it's a muchloved beach to our community as well. However, you need to consider others and your overall footprint on the beach".

Part of these considerations include:

- Not camping on the beach if you aren't self-contained
- Limiting your stay to a few nights and moving on to other camp sites across the region
- Leaving space in the carpark for day-use visitors to park
- Using the awning/annexure on your caravan or camper and leaving the shelters for families visiting the beach for the day
- Being mindful that the beach is also a habitat of the shore birds and other wildlife and don't journey too far down the beach to camp
- Taking your rubbish with you
- Be mindful of individuals using the beach when driving up and down it
- Ensure your dogs are under effective control and kept away from the sand dunes and shore bird nests

FROM THE CEO'S DESK

We have had a couple of incidents relating to dogs which were off the leash and through my own personal dealings, I've noticed that there is a lack of understanding amongst some of the community about having a dog off the leash and still being required to maintain effective control over the dog.

Even though you may be walking your dog in an "off the leash" area, you still need to maintain effective control of that dog. This means that the owner/person responsible for the dog can voice control their dog in a manner that ensures the dog will obey. The dog needs to remain in close proximity and in sight of the owner/person responsible, at all times. When the dog is called (one call only), the dog should immediately respond and return to its owner/person responsible. The owner/person responsible should be able to display control over the dog with verbal commands only (not physically holding the dog). If you are unable to achieve this, your dog isn't under effective control and your dog will need to be on a leash regardless of which area you are at.

An excuse often used by owner/ person responsible when their dog hasn't been under effective control is "they just wanted to say hello". Such a response lacks insight, as other individuals and/or their dog may not want to say hello back. Additionally, if a dog is running towards an individual, that individual not being familiar with the animal won't know whether they are being friendly. As a rule of thumb in an off the leash area, if another dog is on a leash or walking to heal, you shouldn't let your dog approach that dog unless you have asked the owner for permission and the same rule applies to individuals walking in the same area without a dog.

Although, this can be enforced through the issuing of an expiation notice. I would like to think as a respectful community member, individuals would ensure their dog isn't annoying others wanting to enjoy the use of the same public spaces and pathways.

There are four categories in the Regional Event Fund:

- Significant Event Funding
- Established Event Funding
- Development Event Funding
- Emerging Event Funding

Applicants can seek funding from \$5,000 to more than \$50,000 (excluding GST).

Major Events Support Grant

A Major Events Support Grant of up to \$25,000 is available for the operators of major one-off events impacted by the health-related trading restrictions. These include major public events in South Australia, organisations will need to provide proof of non-recoverable financial loss - this grant is not industry specific.

To be eligible for the grant a business must:

- have a valid and active ABN (Australian Business Number) and be registered for the GST.
- have an Australia-wide payroll of less than \$10 million in the 2019-20 or 2020-21 financial year.
- employ people in South Australia.
- be the organiser/operator of an event scheduled over the period from 27 December 2021 and 31 March 2022, which was required to be cancelled/postponed.
- the event was a one-off event with an approved COVID Management Plan or COVID Safe Plan catering for an event of over 1,000 combined capacity in one or across multiple locations.
- entities with an on-going COVID-19 Management/Safe Plan for regularly scheduled events are not eligible.
- have incurred a non-recoverable financial loss as a result of the cancellation or postponement of the event.

To receive the full \$25,000 grant, organisers must have experienced a non-recoverable loss that was greater than \$25,000.

The Gospel: A Message of real Hope

Our world could use some good news, could it not? I suspect for most people their hope is that we will eventually "weather this storm" and things will slowly get better, ..., back to normal! But that doesn't seem to be happening. Does it? Unfortunately, the human race is unaware and blind to the direction in which it is going.

There is I think a real sense of hopelessness because expectations are not being met. God did not create humanity to live in a hopeless world. Rather, He created humans to live and have a relationship with Him.

Humankind in general now lives life without the knowledge of its intended purpose. Jesus Christ came to the earth with a message. It was a message of hope, as a witness against the cause of humanities hopelessness. It was a message filled with expectations that could only be realised through the life of the One who brought the message — Christ himself. St Paul, passed on the "good news" of the Gospel in very simple terms when writing to the church in Corinth:

"Now I would remind you, brothers, of the gospel I preached to you, which you received, in which you stand, and by which you are being saved, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you – unless you believed in vain. For I deliver to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, that He was buried, that He was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, and that He appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. Then He appeared to more than five hundred brothers at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have fallen asleep" (1 Cor. 15:1-6,).

This gospel message that Christ brought to humanity – the gospel of God – is a message of hope. It demonstrates God's great love and desire for His creation. God desires a relationship with all of humanity whom He created in His image.

GREAT WHITE KAOLIN PROJECT

Andromeda is developing the Great White Kaolin Project, located 15km southwest of Poochera. The mining operation to extract and refine bright white halloysite-kaolin clay is expected to create up to 75 direct jobs and add a significant economic boost to the region over a 26-year Life of Mine.

Mining tenements for the Great White Kaolin Project were granted on 17 December 2021. These include Mining Lease (ML) 6532 over the Great White Deposit and Miscellaneous Purposes Licence (MPL) 163 for a water pipeline supporting operations and MPL 164 for an access road from Poochera – Port Kenny Road to the ML.

Andromeda's focus is now on the second stage of approvals under the South Australian mining tenement system, the preparation of the Program for Environmental Protection and Rehabilitation (PEPR). In compiling the information for the PEPR, Andromeda will explain its operational plan for the Project. Andromeda will also show how compliance with the outcome criteria specified with the grant of the mining tenements will be achieved and measured.


