GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Strategic Plan Review

Following community consultation and elected member workshops a very draft document is currently being considered. The Strategic Plan review will continue during this time but may be slightly delayed. Further engagement will be placed online once Council is able to approve the draft document (currently expected for the May Ordinary Meeting).

Live Audio or Video Streaming of Council Meetings

Legislation has recently been amended in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic. Governance staff and Elected Members are currently investigating appropriate electronic means of meeting. If you have questions regarding public access to the meeting or potential deputations, please contact the Chief Executive Officer.

Finance, Risk and Audit Committee Meeting

A meeting was held on 5 March 2020 resolutions from that meeting included; Finance and Risk Work Program, Annual Business Plan Program, Strategic Plan Reporting, Register of Policies, Long Term Financial Plan/Draft Asset Management Plan, Budget Review 2, Land Building Structures Revaluation, Accounting Policy Review, Procurement Policy Review, Prudential Management Policy Review, Asset Management Policy Review, Disposal of Land and Assets Review, Review of Investments and Borrowings, Finance and Risk Audit Committee Annual Report, Emergency Management Policy, DCSB Work Health Safety and Injury Management Program and Plan 2020-2022.

Boat Ramp Fees

Council considered a report to waive boat ramp fees due to the impending boat ramp development. Council approved the waiving of boat ramp fees, to the public for the remainder of the 2019/20 financial year, and the waiving of boat ramp fees for industry for the 2020/21 financial year. Boat Ramp Fees to be reinstated for the public once facilities have been reinstated, at a date to be advised, in the 2020/21 financial year. A division was called during voting and these details can be viewed in the minutes of the meeting.

South Australian Productivity Commission Report

The South Australian Productivity Commission (SAPC) commenced an inquiry into Local Government Reform

in September 2019. Council provided submissions to the Commission in October 2019.

The SAPC's final report was submitted to the South Australian Government in November 2019 for review, with the content of that document becoming available in February 2020.

The South Australian Government's response to the report is available via the report included in the Agenda.

National General Assembly Motions

The Australian Local Government Association (ALGA) sent out a Call for Motions in December 2019 for the National General Assembly. Council met as a working party on 6 February 2020 in order to develop a range of Motions to be sent to the ALGA for consideration.

After the 6 February 2020 meeting the Chief Executive Officer sent out a range of motions discussed at the meeting and their supporting information. Two responses to those motions were received and that information incorporated where appropriate, into the document provided.

- That further funding be allocated to rural and remote Councils to address upgrade of aerodrome facilities to support linkages between larger international ports and rural and remote areas.
- That Research and Development Funding be made available to take advantage of Australia's unique opportunities to explore new and developing agricultural opportunities, including seaweed farming, equal access to genetically modified species of grain and vegetable products etc to meet the increasing food supply needs of the Asian market.
- That rural and remote Councils of Australia are provided infrastructure, or alternate systems, that enable the adoption of renewable energies in larger numbers.
- That Local Councils are provided support to access partnerships with national and international businesses to allow access to such emerging technologies as micro-satellite communications options.
- That a way to facilitate effective communications between states, including Local Councils, during national crises be developed to ensure a single point of truth is possible for all responding and affected agencies.
- That subsidies be provided to low income community members, particularly those in

community and low cost housing, to allow them access to renewable energies.

 That partnering arrangements in rural and remote areas provide access to whole of life infrastructure options and planning and zoning requirements are designed to more easily accommodate these requirements.

Although the June 2020 National General Assembly has been cancelled, the Australian Local Government Association (ALGA) will consider all motions submitted and respond as to how the ALGA will assist with raising the issues to higher levels of Government.

Road Naming Review Process

Council considered a report providing feedback on all the proposed road names following the Public Consultation period. Council resolved to adopt all the road names listed in attached Road Naming List including any recommend changes listed in the Recommendation Column. In addition to this Council resolved:

- a. That Grace Frances Byway (Council Decision) remain Byway
- b. That Woorong Boolong Road (Council Decision) remain Woorong Boolong Road
- c. That the road naming and proposed changes comes into effect from 1 July 2020.
- d. That the road naming and proposed changes will be provided to the appropriate agencies and gazetted in accordance with the Local Government Act 1999 and Council's Road and Place Naming Policy.
- e. That Wallabia Hill Road to be renamed to Herreen Road

The road naming amendments will come into effect July 1, 2020.

As part of the road naming process Council agreed to and will budget to immediately replace the affected road signs prior to the effect date and will arrange replacement of rural property address signs.

New Road Name Requests

During the road name review process Council received a number of road name review requests, further investigation of the existing proposed road name register indicated there were proposed road names that had not been resolved by Council. To consolidate the process a comprehensive report was presented to Council and the following was resolved;

That Council endorse the following proposed new road names to be added to the "Proposed New Road Names Register" for road names to be considered for use in the instance of new roads being developed or unnamed roads that require naming, in accordance with Council's Road and Place Naming Policy: Kenny, Sincock, Clarke, Irvine, Dale, Kammerman and Charlton.

Secondary to this was adoption and proposed naming of an existing unnamed road endorse the naming of "Lenamar Road" to the currently unnamed road located between Section S17HE and S17J Hundred of Murray (Medlingie Hill Road and Parraba Road) in accordance with Council's Road and Place Naming Policy, including a Public Consultation Period.

TOURISM

Sceale Bay Beach Camping

Cr Hackett raised a question without notice if staff could please provide a report to the March 2020 meeting regarding the petition received "opposed camping on Sceale Bay beach" presented to the February 2020 meeting and letters to all Sceale Bay Residents explaining camping rules. Council staff have sought advice from the Crown Land department and it was proposed to hold a community meeting, this meeting will be deferred until further notice due to the current pandemic.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Poochera Bowling Club Report

Cr Wheaton raised in the business arising from the February minutes if staff have investigated options regarding the Poochera Bowling Club. At the 20 February 2020 Council meeting the future of the Poochera Bowls club was raised as a question without notice. It was agreed that a report would be provided outlying possible disposal options.

The land is dedicated to Council as park land by gazette dated 22/05/2003. Council could allow the land to be used for recreational purposes by other community groups. The report detailed proposals and Council did not resolve a decision for alternative use at that meeting and resolved to receive and note the report.

Disability Access Inclusion Grant

Local Governments are required to develop a Access Inclusion Plan by October this year. Training is being offered to staff later this month and preparation of the plan will be undertaken shortly after.

However, the Council has been advised that the National Disability Insurance Agency (NDIA) established the Information Linkages and Capacity Building Program (ILC) to create connections between people with disability and the communities in which they live. This programme is offering a funding round which closes on the 3 April 2020.

Staff consider this an opportune time to lodge an application and start the community thinking about accessibility and inclusiveness. Council endorsed to apply for the purchase of a portable disability toilet and to lodge an application or an alternative project.

Security Training

Cr Wheaton raised a question without notice regarding if the CEO could investigate if Council could arrange for security training to be held in Streaky Bay. Initial investigations indicated that it is difficult to get it held locally due to the relocation of specialised equipment that is utilised as part of the training, indicative training costs are \$900 per person (not including travel/accommodation. Further investigations will continue to establish if any groups are willing to attend Streaky Bay.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Robinson Basin Deputation

Council received a deputation to the March ordinary meeting of Council to consider a proposal to investigate the purchase/lease of the Robinson Basin for the purposes of future water storage activities.

Finlayson Road/ Eyre Highway Intersection

Council received a report outlining the deed and for acquisition of required land and concept plans for the proposed intersection realignment. Council resolved to enter into the deed and the proposed concept plans.

HEALTH MANAGEMENT

Cr McGowan at the March 2020 Council meeting raised a question without notice regarding could Council provide details of its planning for COVID-19 if a case is detected in the Streaky Bay District? What are Council's responsibilities if this situation occurs? A discussion was held in reference to the Business Continuity Plan.

COVID – 19 COUNCIL UPDATES

Campgrounds

The majority of campgrounds are currently closed to any future campers. Haslam currently has campers that were located here prior to the pandemic and who will be staying. The RV Park has had little to no use. Wirrulla are still experiencing overnight stays from people transitioning between States, these sites will continue to be monitored.

Speeds Point and Perlubie beach are not under Council care and control and advisory signage has been put in place advising the sites are closed.

Camping on beaches has been raised as a concern at the State government level across the state and the LGA and Councils are awaiting a directive from the government on this matter.

Playgrounds and Skate Parks

All playgrounds and skate parks have been closed across the district as per the recent advice from the Federal Government.

Public Toilets

Council are not considering the closure of public toilets at this time. Cleaning regimes have been increased across all sites. Council will continue to monitor these sites.

Caravan Parks

Little Islands Caravan Park is currently closed with the exception of those who have no place to reside. Discovery Parks are working on a strict regime and are only accepting travellers transitioning between States, those with no place to reside, or those who are providing essential services to the community.

Marine Safety Notice—Streaky Bay, Sceale Bay, Baird Bay & Haslam

Locally available 24/7 Adelaide Monitored VHF Marine Emergency Radio Service is on Ch 16 and on supplementary CH 67, via equipment on Government Radio Network towers at Elliston and Streaky Bay's Gibson Peninsula and is well receivable within Streaky Bay. However in some areas both inside and outside of some of the other bays, that signal can be marginal due to terrain shadowing.

Daylight Hours Local VHF Marine Radio Services: The call signs are WMR Baird Bay, WMR Haslam and SES Streaky Bay these are manned by SES members. Call sign VMR Streaky Bay is a non SES operation from Killas Service Station, Wells Street manned during business hours.

Local Services Provided:

Locally operated stations primarily monitor for general calls and the hours are usually 8.00am to 5.30pm varying to 8.30pm. Some stations can provide you with a signal check, but they do not normally offer a regular voyage booking/tracking service unless that is agreed by prior arrangement. They also can be used for emergency calls and will monitor emergency calls.

Local Streaky Bay UHF CB Repeater is CH7 and can often be used for all types of emergencies during long term blackouts to Streaky Bay area mobile phone services. Radius is approx 35kms from Streaky Bay


COMFORT AND COOKING FIRES

People can have a fire for comfort and cooking purposes as long as it is:

- ⇒ Not a total fire ban day,
- ⇒ Is within a fire pit at least 20 cm deep,
- ⇒ Has a 4 metre clearance around the fire,
- \Rightarrow Is smaller than 1 m².
- ⇒ A person is always in attendance until the fire is totally extinguished,
- ⇒ An appropriate agent to extinguish the fire is on hand.







TRANSFER STATION FIREWOOD

The Council has recently been contacted by a few members of the community in regards to taking firewood from the Transfer Station (in regards to firewood being taken) and there has been some uncertainty about the Council stance on this matter.

The Council's response is that <u>under no</u> <u>circumstances may people access or remove "Fire</u> Wood" from the Transfer Station.

There are many safety risks associated with this, some of these being a high risk level of injury or snake bite.

The Council's primary concern will always be the safety and wellbeing of everyone who accesses the property. Any wood that is at the Transfer Station will eventually be converted to wood chips and used in and around the town for the benefit of all ratepayers.



NOISE - ROOSTERS IN TOWN

Roosters are a contentious issue among backyard chicken keepers. On the one hand, these charming chaps can be a huge benefit in keeping your flock safe and happy. On the other hand, a musical wake-up call can be too much to bear on an otherwise-lazy Sunday morning. Crowing can be a serious nuisance, but with a little patience and preparation, you can set up a backyard paradise that'll keep everyone happy.

The most infamous rooster crow happens at sunrise. Well, not exactly. Roosters actually base their crowing on a biological clock that anticipates sunrise rather than greets it. So rather than 1 nice 5 am sleep-in, the unprepared keeper will be bolt-awake at 3am. Morning after morning, you might get used to it, but your poor neighbors will be a little less patient.

Inexperienced chicken buyers inevitable return from the market with at least one rooster, because the boys are the best looking. If you're drawn, towards a particularly fine-looking chook, intoxicated with its pizzazz and personality, trust me, it's a rooster and your heart is about to hreak.


Some neighbors are willing to be bribed with fresh eggs or a placating jam sponge but, on the whole, many residence are:
